

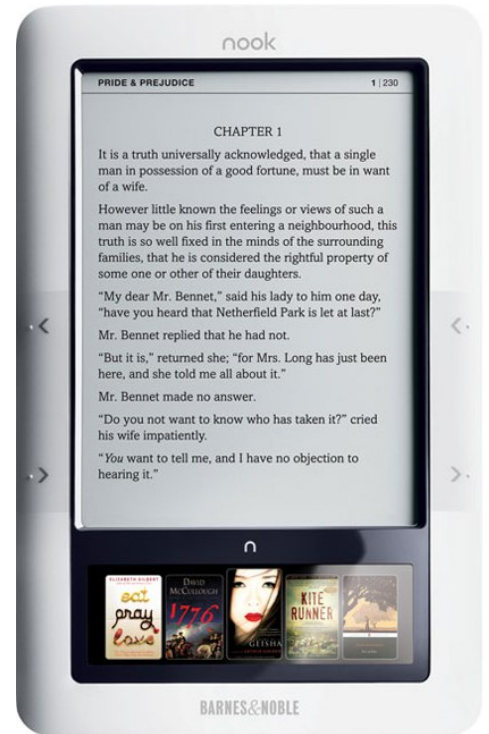
# Download eBooks to Your Barnes and Noble Nook

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## Step 2: Using Adobe Digital Editions

- Look down the left side of the screen until you find the blue, underlined link to *Adobe Digital Editions*.
- Click on that link and then click on “Get ADOBE DIGITAL EDITIONS”.
- This will take you down the screen to the *Adobe Digital Editions* Installer. *Adobe Digital Editions* requires *Adobe Flash* in order to run. If you do not already have *Flash* on your PC, the Installer will install that first, then install *Adobe Digital Editions*. There may be several steps on your PC, so read what the Installer box says and follow its instructions.
- *Adobe Digital Editions* will launch itself, as soon as it is installed. When prompted to create an Adobe ID and “authorize” the PC you are using, choose “yes”. All you need is an e-mail address and a password of six characters or more. Adobe will take you through the process and associate the MAC Address of your PC with your Adobe ID.



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You can read the book on your PC, or you can transfer the book onto your Nook.

## Step 4: Transferring an eBook to your Nook

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- Find your Nook and the cable you use to charge it with.
- Keep your Nook OFF.
- Connect your Nook to your PC.
- Turn on your Nook.
- The Adobe Reader Device Set-Up Assistant box will pop up.
- Click on **Authorize Device**.

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Disconnect your Nook and navigate to *My Documents* on it. This is a different file from your *B&N Library*. The Nook files books that you have purchased from Barnes and Noble in one folder and books that you add from other sources in another.



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
