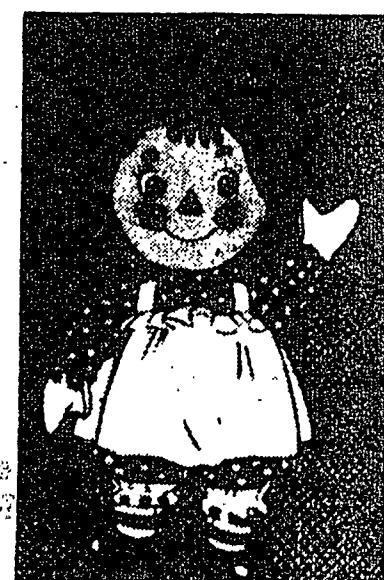

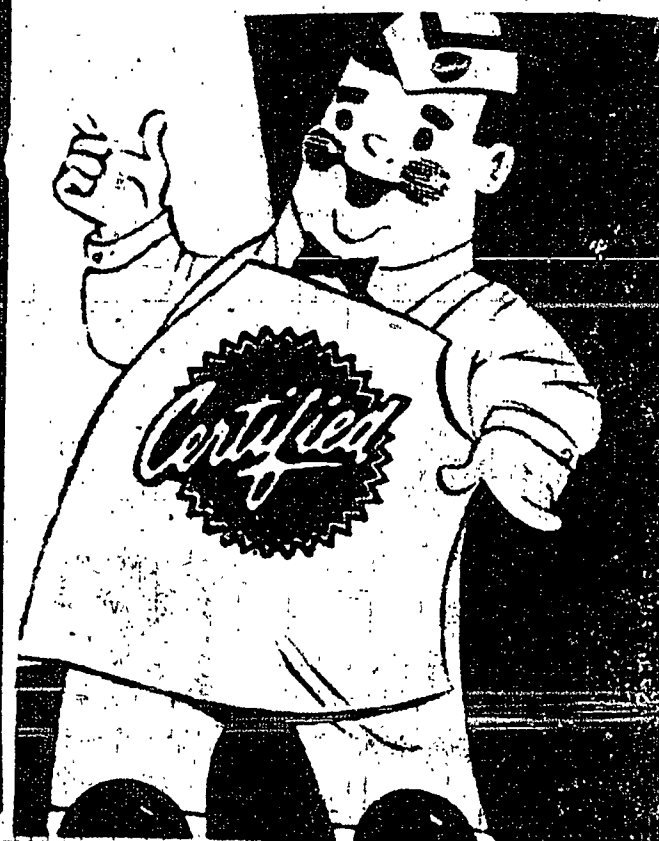

From The Left Hand

While Nilesites may think we're somewhat of a nut regarding our obsession about gambling we had a traumatic experience in our younger days which deserves mention.

Right after starting THE BUGLE we ran a small four inch story about two teenagers losing \$40 playing the pinballs in Niles. Since the boys were from Norwood Park the editor of the paper there played the story across his front page, replete with a 72 point headline.

The next day one of the most notorious hoods in the Chicago-land area dropped into the office of the Norwood Park editor and harassed the editor's secretary. The hood then went to the home of the newspaperman and harassed his family of four children. The editor luckily was not home. But for the next 7 days he couldn't be seen around town without a bodyguard furnished by the Chicago police department. The hood is now serving a 14 year penitentiary term. But while there he announced that he was the killer of a journalist editor who dared to fight the gambling in that area.

This fear and harassment which might have ended in bloodshed was the result of Niles Mayor Stankowicz, Police Chief Romey and Niles village trustees allowing gambling to exist here. Had there been bloodshed, it would have been on every one of their hands.

Blase, Scheel, Wente and Zyanski have youth, integrity and are not involved in any business ventures in and around the town. All men are well-educated and aggressive. Most important they've got guts. No village hall in this part of the state needs airing worse than Niles, and it will only be done if four men, unattached, and most important, uncommitted, are elected to the "Hall".

The issue concerning gambling is important for another reason. If the men in public office refuse to uphold the village gambling ordinance (which forbids gambling) WHAT LAWS DO THEY UPHOLD? Are the meetings held behind closed doors, in restaurants, in meeting places outside the village hall, held in the interests of residents? Or do the boys with the big bankrolls dazzle our public officials? If an obvious law such as gambling is violated EVERY law on our books is in constant jeopardy of being violated. Men who ignore the reputation of their village ignore the interests of the residents. It is one and the same.

The one observation which Nilesites keep mentioning is the tremendous amount of money which three of the parties are spending.

We've noted how little money the NEW ERA party has spent and yet have been much impressed with their method of campaigning. They've been out bell-ringing for the past two months and expect to reach 2-3000 homes before the election.

Village Election Tuesday

EDITORIAL The Issue Is Corruption

There is one basic issue which looms above all others in next Tuesday's election. It is the issue of corruption which exists in Niles. Our town has been issued seven gambling stamps by the Internal Revenue Service which is equal to the number in infamous Cicero. No other town in the north or northwest area has this number and none of our neighbors have any stamps. Only last week the Chicago Daily News had a story by editorial writer John Justin Smith about a new gambling game in four Niles taverns.

This continuous black eye which Niles receives is a result of the corruption which exists in our village hall. No illegal activities could exist if they were not condoned by the Mayor, the police chief and the trustees.

Thus, it is our opinion that only a clean sweep in Tuesday's election will end Niles 20 years of corruption. And the only party which has actively recognized this ill-bred cancer of corruption is THE NILES NEW ERA PARTY. We believe the election of their entire slate is Niles only hope for a genuine "NEW ERA."

There are excellent candidates on some of the other tickets. However, splitting one's vote will only pave the way for the return to office of the Stankowicz forces. When the electorate vote all over the ballot they merely perpetuate the best-organized machine. For the machine has a strong basic support which generally gives it an advantage over less-organized groups.

In the race for the Mayor's office we prefer candidate Blase because of his forthright campaigning in exposing the corruption in Niles. He alone among the candidates went to the Internal Revenue Department and substantiated that Niles had the aforementioned gambling stamps issued to its businesses.

Blase, a Notre Dame University graduate, has only been in Niles a short time but in that time he has an enviable record of civic accomplishment. He was the first president of the Greenwood Homeowners Association and was president of the village-wide Niles Citizens Committee. His efforts led to the petitioning by 2500 residents who protested the avalanche of multiple dwellings being built in Niles. He is an attorney, young and aggressive, and would lead the clean-up of this village which is so desperately needed.

New Era running mate Ken Scheel is one of the trustee candidates. Two years ago Scheel ran independently and polled a tremendous vote without campaigning. This led to his appointment to the zoning board. He has served for two years on the board and has fought the multiple dwelling invasion, the building on 30 foot lots, and aided in the creation of the new zoning code. In the 1959 election Scheel was the only candidate who said he would actively eliminate gambling if he were elected. He is an outstanding candidate who all Nilesites should consider. He is a graduate of Colgate University, a self-employed businessman, received a commission in combat and headed a company of men in the Korean War in the Marine Corps. We mention this only to note his leadership ability. Scheel has one quality which this town needs above all...and its just plain guts...

His running mate Bob Wente is equally highly-recommended. A graduate of Elmhurst college, he also served on the zoning board and led the fight against multiple dwellings. In our four years covering the village hall we have never seen a more conscientious and hard-working public official. Wente laboriously fought builders and small-landowners who attempted to build small homes on under-sized lots. Wente's ability to stand up to the realtors and builders in town will give Niles what it most needs...a representative of the people.

The third NEW ERA candidate, Len Szymanski, has been president of the Kirk Lane Association for the past four years. A graduate engineer from the University of Illinois, Szymanski had been the number one agitator of village officials on matters concerning multiple dwellings to the creation of parks. He is adamant in his desires for improving the village and would also be worthy representative of all Nilesites.

The best candidate for the village clerk's office is independent candidate Jim Kozak. He is a man of unimpeachable integrity and has served the village with distinction. However, while we believe Kozak and the four aforementioned NEW ERA candidates would best serve the village, we fear any split voting would aid Mayor Stankowicz. NEW ERA village clerk candidate Marge Lieske has a fine record of business experience and has worked the past three years for the Niles Township Community Chest. She would make an able clerk.

Because the organized machines would profit most if Nilesites split their tickets it is our opinion that only a straight NEW ERA vote will insure Niles that we are at last entering into an era of honest government, free from trustee-big builder ties and free from the corruption which is bred by allowing illegal activities to exist.

Four political parties and one independent candidate will vie for the Mayor's chair, three trustee posts and the village clerk's office, in next Tuesday's village election.

Mayor Stankowicz, who has been elected for five 4 year terms will seek re-election for the village president's office. Stankowicz has held the post for 20 years. He heads the Progressive Economy Party ticket which includes trustee candidates Koven Barry, Joe DiMaria and John Sapit and village clerk candidate Ed Marszalek, himself a trustee the past eight years. The PEI party is running on the Stankowicz record which they contend has given Niles progress and economy.

Trustee John Stanley is running for Mayor for the second time and heads the ACTION party. Trustee candidates include Roy Berquist, Gregory Clark and Raymond Wilkins and village clerk candidate Walter Lorenz. Stanley points to the Golf Mill annexation which he was primarily responsible for and his party has been campaigning on more efficient fiscal and administrative functions for Niles.

Ed Ciccone opposes the three Mayor candidates and heads the Niles Independent Party. Trustee candidates are George Loeh, Douglas Strutz and Gerald Sullivan and village clerk candidate Mike Provenzano. The party is stomping for a village manager and decries the lack of leadership which now exists at the village hall.

Nicholas Blase heads the Niles New Era ticket. Trustee candidates include Ken Scheel, Len Szymanski and Bob Wente and village clerk candidate Marge Lieske. They have campaigned on charges that corruption and big builder-village official ties has hampered Niles name and progress.

Village clerk Jim Kozak is running for re-election as an independent candidate and is running on his record.

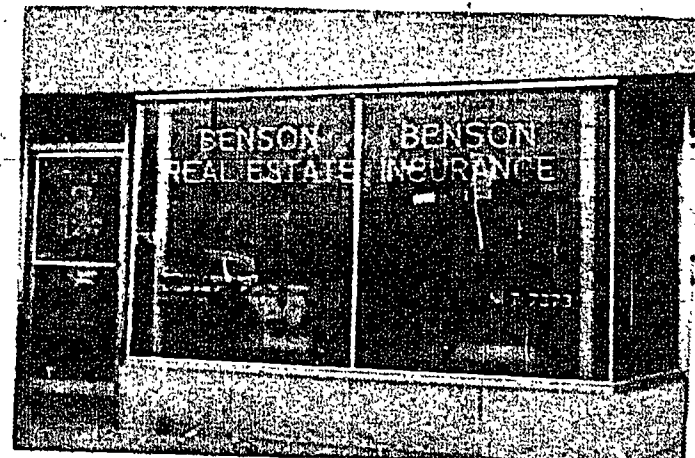
Gladys Kramer Killed In Auto Accident
