Mid Month Meanderings

July 18 a meeting will be held at Des Plaines village hall at 8 p.m. concerning two parcels of property in school district #3 which the owner would like to use for multiple dwellings. A hearing recommendation will be approved which will go to the county commissioners.

The County Zoning Board had originally approved the two areas for multiples. However, County Board President Seymour Simon used his veto power to block this zoning. Now the commissioners will have a chance to overrule Simon by musterizing sufficient votes to upset Simon's veto.

Interestingly, there are 15 county commissioners and ten of them are members of Simon's Democratic party, and are the controlling bloc among the fifteen commissioners. The ten Democrats are all from Chicago. The remaining five commissioners are one of Chicago Republicans whose five-member majority has had little expression of the fifteen-man board. But Simon has taken a very keen interest in district #3's (as well as other areas') problems, and his independent stand against his own party is indeed enlightening. In fact the very nature of his veto is most unusual in Democratic Cook County. Simon gives every indication that a new era may be making its entrance in County politics.

Be as it may, the attendance of interested residents at the Des Plaines meeting will certainly lend weight to those who've taken up the cudgel in fighting to block multiples in school district #3. It had the increased instances of the type of zoning wasn't present three years ago when Niles helped to burden the school district.

The possibility that Maine and Niles Townships may be formed into one school district would create an opening for a Democrat for our third representative. The 1962-63 appointment bill favoring this partitioning was voted down by Governor Kerner. However, a committee is studying proposals. If the committee doesn't come forth with an answer to the problem, all representative and senatorial candidates would run at-large in 1964. Thus candidates getting the largest vote from the entire state would be sent to Springfield without regard to their residence. Such a likelihood is doubtful, since apportionment on our present representatives would eliminate most of them from their posts.


If the opening for a third representative comes to pass the political big wigs in the area should look to the Niles-Morton Grove areas for their candidates. Skokie and Northbrook, Skokie and Park Ridge will retain their home-grown representatives. Thus, it leaves Des Plaines, Niles, Morton Grove and part of Glenview without their own representatives. Since the Niles-Morton Grove area are adjacent neighbors, with similar towns to the north and south, the area deserves to be one unit.

We all know that the Library is a tax-supported body, but we also realize it will take a number of years for the Board to accumulate a sufficient amount of money to enter into a building program. In this interim, land, materials and labor can only go one way, and that of course, is up.

We of the Niles Days Committee feel that any help the citizens of Niles can give the



The village will begin to build sidewalks in areas where landowners have failed to heed a May 13 letter, instructing sidewalk owners to construct the walks on a specific assessment basis and property owners will be billed for 50% of the costs of the walks, with the village paying the other 50%. Property along major streets in Niles (Milwaukee, Oakton, Tonawanda) will be affected by the decision.

In other Tuesday night trustee action Mayor Blase thanked the Niles Garden Club for doing approximately \$1000 in landscaping which helped beautify the village last summer. ... kids were ready for a new dump truck. They were deferred to committee for study.

Des Plaines and Glenview fire districts were disengaged although people are paying taxes for fire protection.

... Mayor Blase appointed trustee Ed Bernick to be chairman again for next year's Memorial Day parade.
