Mid-Month Meanderings

July 18 a meeting will be held at Des Plaines village hall at 8 p.m. concerning two parcels of property in school district 63 which its owner would like to use for multiple dwellings. At this hearing a recommendation will be approved which will go to the county commissioners.

The County Zoning Board had originally approved the plan for multiple dwellings. However, the County Board president felt that Simon used his veto power to block this zoning. Now the commissioners will have a chance to overturn Simon by mustering sufficient votes to upset Simon's veto.

Interestingly, there are 15 county commissioners and ten of them are members of Simon's Democratic Party, and are the controlling bloc among the fifteen commissioners. The ten Democrats are all from Chicago. The remaining five commissioners are out-of-Chicago Republicans whose five-member minority has had little expression of the fifteen-man board. But Simon has taken a very keen interest in district 63's (as well as other area's) problems, and his independent stand against his own party is indeed enlightening. In fact the very nature of his veto is most unusual in Democratic Cook County. Simon gives every indication that a new era may be making its entrance in County politics.

Be as it may, the attendance of interested residents at the Des Plaines meeting will certainly lend weight to those who've taken up the cudgel in fighting to block multiples in school district 63. Too bad the increased resistance to this type of zoning wasn't present three years ago when Niles helped to burden the school district.

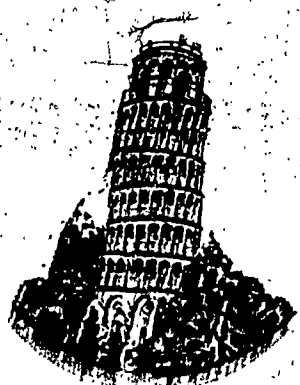
The possibility that Maine and Niles Townships may be found into one state district would create an opening for a Democrat for our area representative. The recent re-apportionment bill approving this redistricting was vetoed by Governor Kerner. However, a committee is studying proposals. If the committee doesn't come forth with an answer to the problem, all representative and senatorial candidates would run at-large in 1964. Thus, candidates getting the largest vote from the entire state would be seen in Springfield, without regard as to their residence. Such a likelihood is doubtful, since indecision on our present representatives would eliminate most of them from their posts.

If the opening for a third representative comes to pass the political big wigs in the area should look to the Niles-Morton Grove areas for their new representative. Skokie and Park Ridge will retain their home-grown representatives. Thus, it leaves Des Plaines, Niles, Morton Grove and part of Glenview without their own representatives. Since the Niles-Morton Grove area are adjacent neighbors, with similar township borders, and attendant problems, the area deserves its own township.

We all know that the Library is a tax supported body, but we also realize it will take a number of years for the Board to accumulate a sufficient amount of money to enter into a building program. In this interim, land, materials and labor can only go one way, and that, of course, is up.

We of the Niles Days Committee feel that any help the citizens of Niles can give the

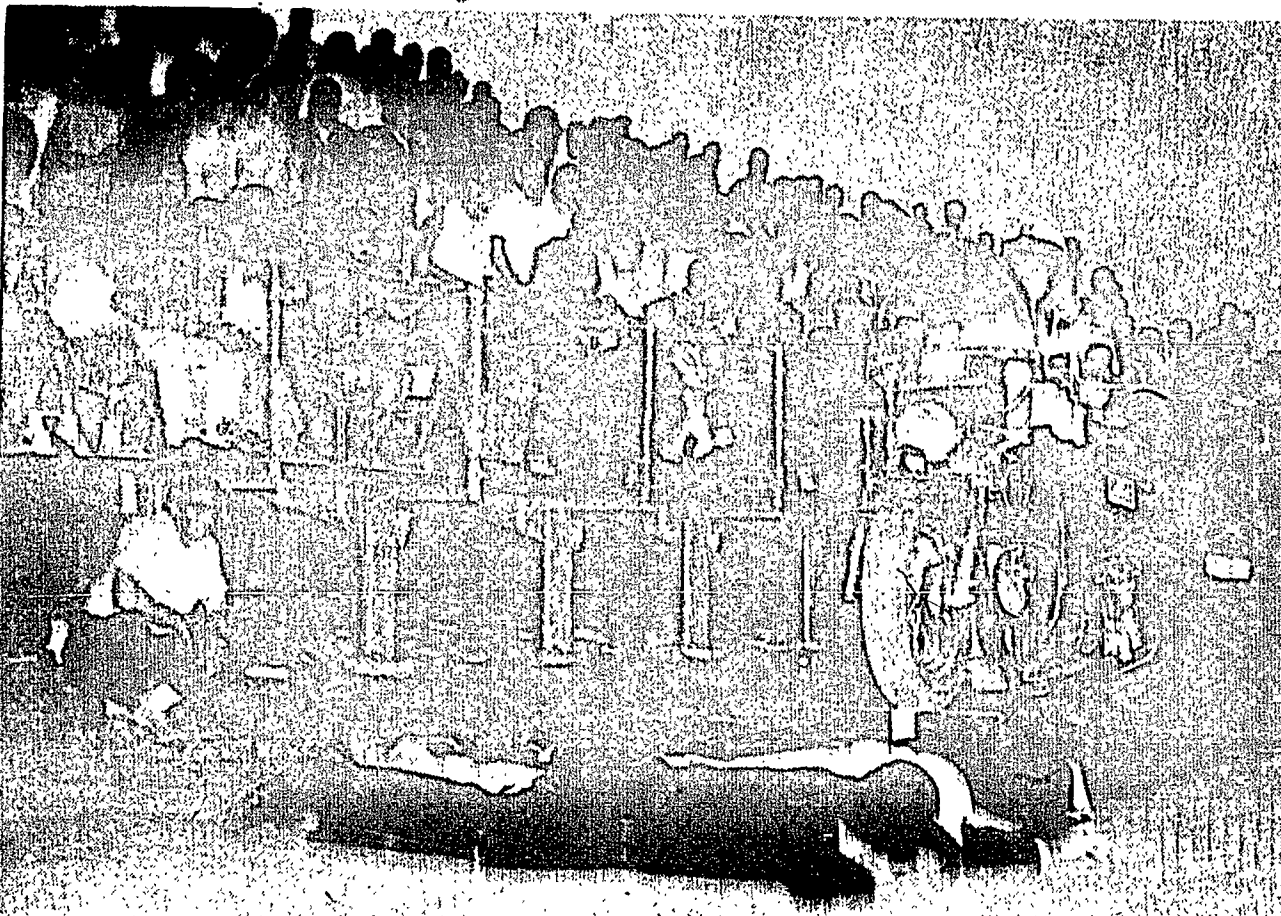

## Landowners Forced To Pay Share

The village will begin to build sidewalks in areas where landowners have failed to heed a May 13 letter, instructing sidewalks be constructed. The walks will be built on a special assessment basis and property owners will be billed for 50% of the costs of the walks, with the village paying the other 50%. Property along major streets in Niles (Milwaukee, Oakton, Quincy) will be affected by the decision.

In other Tuesday night trustee action Mayor Blase thanked the Niles Garden Club for donating approximately \$100 in landscaping which helped beautify the village hall building. Blase were read for a new dining trucks. They were referred to committee for study. Des Plaines and Glenview fire districts were disconnected, although people are paying taxes for fire protection.

Mayor Blase appointed trustee Ed Berkowicz to be chairman head for next year's Memorial Day parade.
