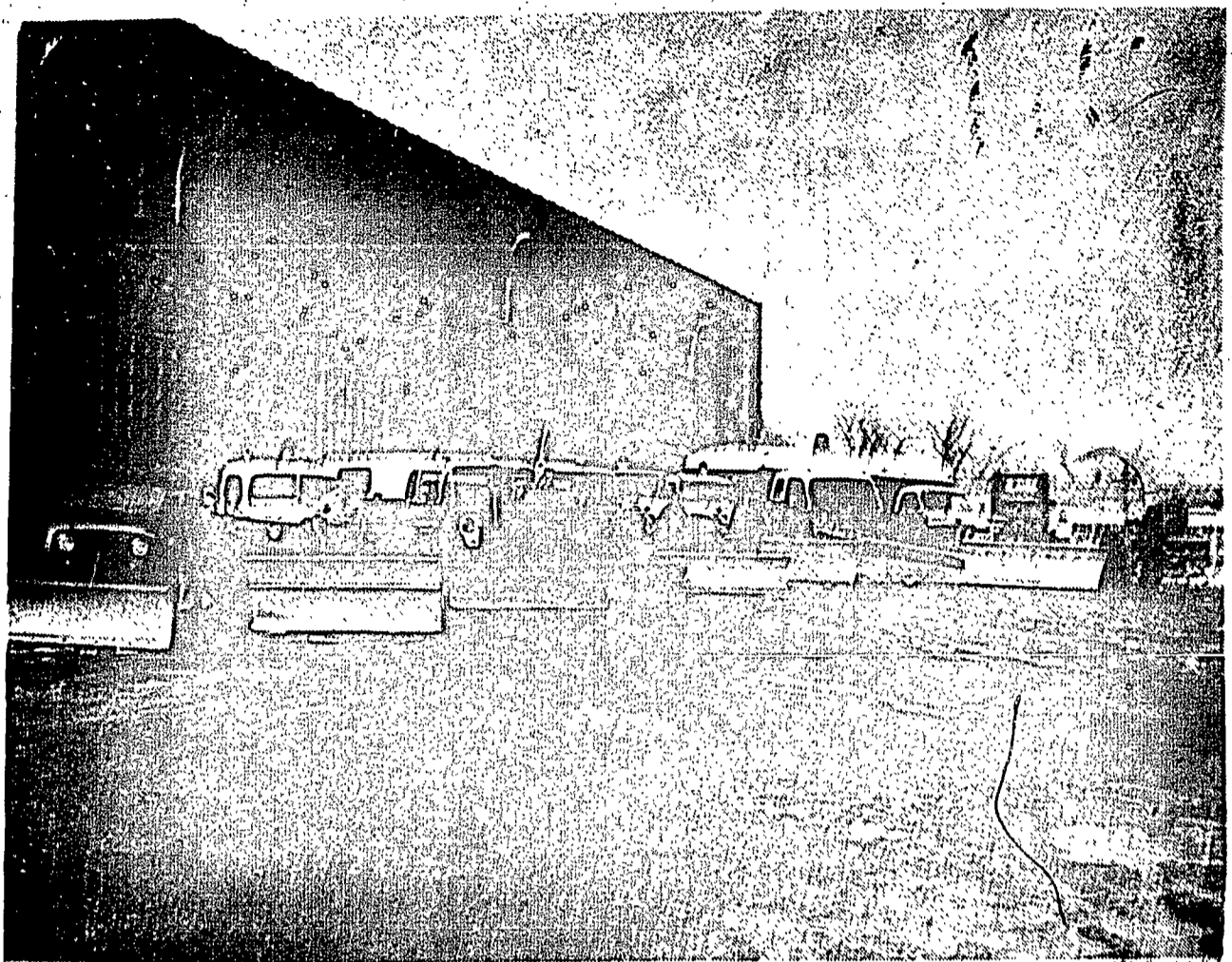
Niles Demos Show Party Saturday

As the year 1963 goes into its last two weeks we note with dismay that our 1963 batting average is pretty anemic.

In Niles we hoped to fight a fire under the Len Szymanski building which resulted in leukemia being made a reportable disease. It was our hope that interested residents in Niles, who had been following the leukemia stories in the village, might form a group to push for similar action, both at local municipal levels, as well as at the Chicago and state levels. Unfortunately no one came forth. When researchers Schwartz and Greenspan, of the Hektow group studying the disease said such reporting would benefit their fight against the disease, still no action came from citizens' groups.

In Morton Grove our hopes for more democratic practices at school board 70's meetings, went askew Monday night when the Board decided against even a meagre fifteen minute open forum discussion from the public in attendance. It seems incredible that such a lack of communication at this late date still exists.

Along the same line, our hopes of opening up the meeting to the public has been totally rebuffed. Private meetings before and after the regular meeting have continued, after our initial reports.

In Niles our hopes that the library board would get off its duff and get started on a library building is only in its initial stage of planning.

In Morton Grove the twinning of village fathers, and village barons, in hopes for a full-time department, has met with silence from the natives.

In Niles our objections to the new village hall, its location and the attendant "angles" surrounding the issue, were met with consternation, but empty ears.

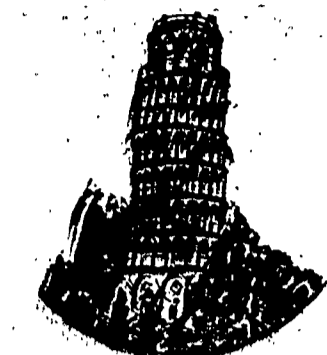

Board Plans New Library

Your library board and library administrator are working diligently on plans for a new library for the Niles Public Library District and early next year the proposal will be made public. In the meantime we must continue to build collections in all areas of reading and to provide as many services as possible in the facility that exists.

The children's story hour has proved to be very successful with the two sessions well attended by pre-school youngsters. There is available a duplicating machine in the library, that for a small fee will reproduce documents and reference material that is not allowed out of the library. In order that students may have material to take home, the board and librarian are investigating

the possibility of the acquisition of one of the very latest copying machines. This should greatly alleviate the problem of demand for a specific single assignment to several classrooms of students.

One problem exists, the solution of which the cooperation of all library users is requested. It has been brought to the attention of the board that during the hours when the library is most heavily patronized, those seriously intent on study and concentration have been disturbed by noisy activity on the part of some library patrons. The library does not have to become a noise of silence and the staff does not necessarily have to police the premises if each parent will instruct their children that there is certain conduct that must be followed while in a library.

Win Fifth Consecutive Year

For the fifth consecutive year Niles received a first place award in Class III (15,000 to 30,000 population) in the 21st Metropolitan Chicago Fire Prevention Contest.

Niles fire prevention program was judged the best all-around plan in its class of the communities in the Chicago-area taking part in the contest sponsored by the fire prevention committee of the Chicago Association of Commerce and Industry.

Evanson was named the grand winner, an honor Niles received in 1959. Neighboring Skokie was named winner of the Class I competition for cities with a population of 60,000 and up.

In Class II (30,000 to 60,000 population) Harvey and Elmhurst tied for first place. Niles won Class III (15,000 to 30,000). Broadview and Worth tied for first place in Class IV (8,000 to 15,000). Palos Park placed first in Class V (under 8,000).

Hammond took the Class I contest in the Indiana division. First place in Class II went to East Chicago.

Plaques to the winning fire departments will be presented early next year, officials said.

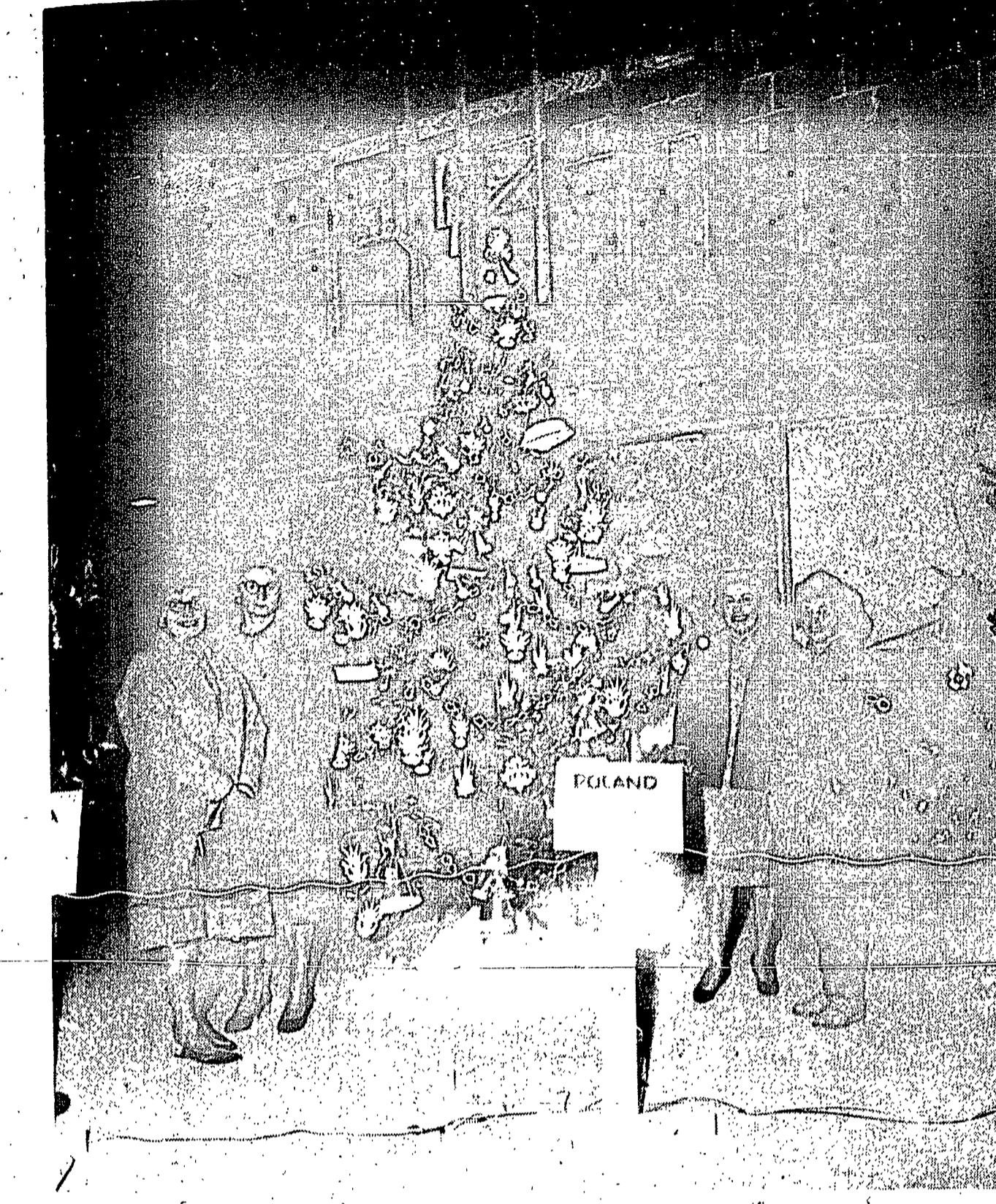

Ever seen a Russian Christmas tree? There's one on display now at Lawrencewood Center, Oakton and Waukegan rd., Niles.

It's part of a spectacular exhibition of "Christmas Trees Around the World" on view there daily (through New Year's Day) in the unit next door to Kimpsey's Shoes.

Besides the Russian tree, colorfully hung with red Kremlin towers, golden icons, luminous birds and cosack dolls, there are 19 other trees representing Belgium, Czechoslovakia, England, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Holland, Ireland, Italy, Lithuania, Mexico, Norway, Poland, Spain, Switzerland, Yugoslavia and the United States.

The trees are balsams measuring 12 to 16 ft. in height. The hundreds of ornaments used were all fashioned by hand by nearly 200 women and girls scouts, members of local club and girl scout troops whose organizations are credited on placards posted at each tree.

Co-ordinator of the ornament making was Mrs. Charles Norris of Franz Creative Corner, 8100 Oakton, Niles.

Every conceivable material from feathers and tin foil to egg shells and soda straws was used to make the handsome hangings.

Tips For Late Mailers

Christmas Card Week has passed and thousands of Christmas cards are being mailed. It is our hope that this year's volume of Christmas mail will be less than last year's because of the suggested mailing period to send their greetings. However, those who did not mail during this important week can still be helped by following the suggestions of Postmaster Harry H. Semrow.

Semrow stated, "It's too late to talk about the early mailing of Christmas cards and gifts, but you can help by depositing the remaining cards early of tomorrow during the 4-5 p.m. hours."

Semrow recommends that the last minute mailers sending gifts and cards to out-of-town addresses use Air Mail to assure fastest delivery. Every effort will be made to deliver local cards on time if you mail them today. Christmas cards should be sent at this late date, at the first class postage rate to receive every possible chance of delivery.

The 1968 Christmas Mailing Campaign will be a mutual success if everyone will follow these suggestions:

1. USE THE IMPORTANT ZIP CODE. The many thousands of Christmas Assistants can assist you in hearing a correct ZIP Code. Chicago's ZIP Code is 60601 plus your local zone number. For example, the ZIP Code for people living in zone 30 is 60630.

2. SEPARATE OUT-OF-TOWN MAIL FROM LOCAL MAIL. Using "first" postal labels or making home-made labels designating local mail from out-of-town eliminates handling charges assuring delivery.

3. PROPER POSTAGE. When mailing a gift make certain the correct amount of postage is affixed. Unsealed Christmas Cards require a 4¢ stamp and sealed Christmas Cards must

bear a 5¢ stamp. If in doubt about the postage, check your local postal station.

4. USE THE COMPLETE ADDRESS. Complete street number of rural route should be used on all mail. Be sure that the name of the street is complete with avenue, parkway or drive. Avoid abbreviations of street and state name. NEVER USE THE WORD "CITY". ALWAYS GIVE THE CORRECT CITY NAME, STATE AND ZIP CODE. Print if necessary to

assure fast delivery.

5. CONSULT YOUR LOCAL POSTAL STATION IF YOU HAVE ANY MAILING PROBLEMS.

Postmaster Semrow concluded his recommendations by stating: "This year, on Christmas Eve, I'd like to see every mail bag empty and every card and gift delivered so that nearly every postal employee can be home relaxing with his or her family."

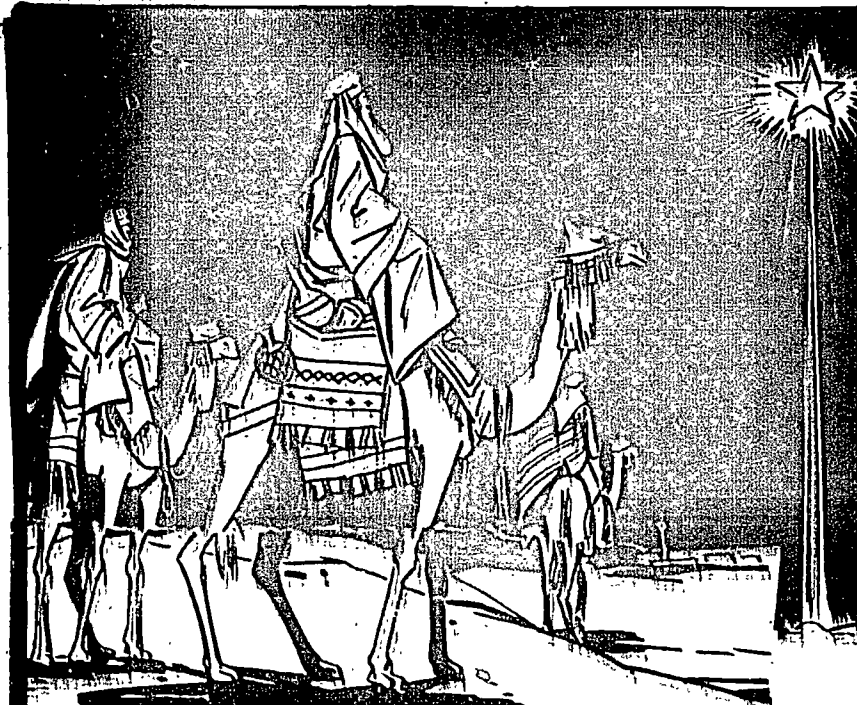

Results Of Suburban TB X-ray Program

The towns producing the highest incidence of TB suspects among suburban areas located North, South and West of Chicago proper were pinpointed by the results of the summer chest X-ray program.

According to suburban area the high numbers of TB suspect films were found in the following communities: Evanston 184 from 10,556 X-rays; Chicago Heights 68 from 3,380 X-rays; Blue Island 79 from 3,430 X-rays; and Oak Park 189 from 1,178 X-rays.

"Out of a total of 119,502 X-rays taken in the suburbs 2,129 (1.78 per cent) were identified as tuberculosis suspects" said Dr. Walter C. Bornemeier, president of The Tuberculosis Institute of Chicago and Cook County.

"From 254,003 X-rays taken in Chicago proper 1,521 (0.60 per cent) showed suspicion of tuberculosis."

The mass health survey in the county, June 3 through September 27, was conducted by Suburban Cook County Tuberculosis Sanitarium District in cooperation with the Institute (The Christmas Seal agency), and the local health departments.

According to Dr. Bornemeier, the number of persons X-rayed in suburban Cook County this summer was increased by 6,183 or 2.5 per cent.

Forty-three communities noted an increase in the number of TB suspects over that found in 1967. The towns and increase are: Des Plaines 8; Glen View 2; Hoffman Estates 5; Mount Prospect 36; Northbrook 30; Palatine 18; Park Ridge 24; Rolling Meadows 33; Streamwood 7; and Wheeling 5.

Communities south of Chicago include Calumet City 9; Chicago Heights 10; Country Club Hills 2; Dixmoor 2; Dolton 1; East Chicago Heights 4; Lansing 23; Markham 4; Oak Forest 3; Riverdale 22; South Holland 8; Tinley Park 10.

Towns located southwest of Chicago: Blue Island 4; Evergreen Park 4; Oak Lawn 11; Orland Park 4; Palms Heights 11; and Worth 3.

Western Suburbs: Argo Summit 8; Bellwood 7; Broadview 6; Brookfield 24; Elmwood Park 4; Franklin Park 22; Hillside 6; LaGrange 26; LaGrange Park 3; Lyons 2; Maywood 4; Melrose Park 14; Stickney and Stickney Two, 14; Westchester 3; and Western Springs 10.

A decline in the number of suspicious TB film findings was noted this year by four communities which led in number found during the 1967 survey: Oak Park with 2; Jessa Evanston with 49; Jessa Berwyn with 81; Jessa and Cicero with 31.

Dr. Bornemeier said the TB findings on small chest films were not entirely conclusive.
