Six area police officers recently completed an intensive short course in Supervision of Police Personnel given by the Traffic Institute Northwestern University.

Skokie Police Dept. officers attending included Supt. Donald H. Blomgren, 6333 Lincoln Avenue; Harvey J. Carlstedt, 4249 Main Street; and Raymond V. Morton Grove. Attending from Niles were Cook County Sheriff Police Lt. Frank F. Jackie Jr., 9665 Niles Terrace; and Niles Police Dept. Detective Joseph H. Hanna, 7857 Harlem Avenue. The Morton Grove Police Dept. was represented by Sgt. Norman J. Schultz, 937 Oak Park Avenue.

Tips For Late Mailers

Christmas Card Week has passed and many businesses in Chicago have us a hectic hand in our attempt to handle this year's volume of Christmas mail with fewer employees by taking advantage of this suggested mailing period to send their greetings. However, those who did not mail during this important week can still be helped by following the suggestions of Postmaster Harry H. Sempron.

Sempron stated, "It's too late to mail now the early morning Christmas cards and gifts, but you can help by depositing the remaining cards today or tomorrow during the A.M. hours."

Sempron recommends that the last minute mailers sending gifts and cards to out-of-town relatives use the A.M. to insure fastest delivery. "Priority will be made to heavier items on time if you mail them today. Christmas cards should be sent at this late date, at the first class postage rate to receive every possible chance of delivery."

The 1963 Christmas Mailing Campaign will be a major success if everyone will follow these suggestions:

1. USE THE IMPORTANT ZIP CODE. The many thousands of Christmas assistants can assure mail bearing a correct ZIP Code. Chicago's ZIP Code is 60601 plus your local zone number. For example, the ZIP code for people living in zone 30 is 60630.

2. SEPARATE OUT-OF-TOWN MAIL FROM LOCAL MAIL. Hand delivery routes are making home-made boxes for separate local mail from other towns eliminates handling of every piece of delivery.

3. BROKER POSTAGE. When mailing a gift make certain the correct amount of postage is affixed. Unsold Christmas cards require a 4¢ stamp and unused Christmas Cards must

bear a 5¢ stamp. If in doubt about the postage, check your local postal station.

5. CONSULT YOUR LOCAL POSTAL STATION IF YOU HAVE ANY MAILING PROBLEMS.

Postmaster Sempron concluded his recommendations by stating: "This year, on Christmas Eve, I'd like to see every mail bag empty and every card and gift delivered so that nearly every postal employee can be home relaxing with his or her family."
