Cub Scouts Prepare 'Family Alert' Plan

The "Family Alert" plan of the Boy Scouts of America will be the feature of Cub Scout packs during January as Cub Scouts and their families learn how to prepare for emergencies.

The 150 Cub Scout packs in the Northwest Suburban Council, Boy Scouts of America, have received information packets for the month's theme, Robert Gillilan of Barrington, Scout Commissioner, explained.

"The basic unit in any emergency plan is the family," Gillilan said. "Cub Scouting's place is to help build a family into a prepared team that can survive a natural or man-made disaster because they know the essential skills to protect themselves and because they planned in advance what action each member is to take and prepared supplies to make them independent for at least two weeks."

A "Family Alert" pack citation will be presented to each pack that meets requirements related to fitness and training. Cub Scouts will be encouraged to meet health and fitness achievements and activities which are required for advancement in rank. The training will include a family-preparedness session at the pack's regular monthly meeting to include exhibits prepared by the eight, nine and ten-year-old boys and a dramatized information session for boys and parents, Gillilan said.

Items to be included in the month's program are how to avoid fires, emergency cooking, improvised lighting, actions to take in any emergency, and simple first aid.

The Northwest Suburban Council is an active participating member of the Des Plaines, Schiller Park and Suburban Councils.

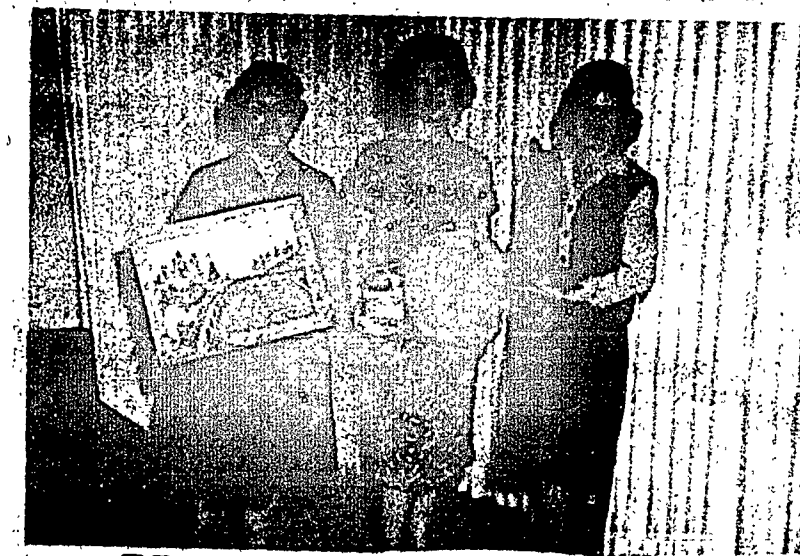

Nilehi Juniors Prepare For Merit Scholarship Exams

About 500 Nilehi juniors next month will take the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. This is the first step in their bid to become National Merit Scholars in their senior high school year.

He said last year there were 240 Nilehi West juniors and 229 Nilehi East juniors who took the tests in March.

Those who do an outstanding performance on the tests will become semifinalists. These students are informed of this distinction in early fall of their senior year, reported Ryden. Last year, there were about 13,000 high school seniors in the country who attained semifinalist status.

Each semifinalist must substantiate his qualifying test performance on a second examination, be endorsed by his school, and fulfill certain routine requirements to become finalists. All Merit Scholars are selected from the finalist group. Merit Scholars are announced in the spring of the student's senior year.

Each Merit Scholarship is a four-year award to cover the expenses of the undergraduate college years. The recipient's stipend is tailored to his need. The same day that the juniors take their qualifying tests, but in the afternoon from 1:15 to 4:40 p.m., more than 450 Nilehi sophomores will take the National Educational Development Test.

35 TB Patients Enter Hospital In January

Thirty-five TB patients were admitted to the Niles Community Hospital in January, reports Dr. Robert A. Pizzocci, the hospital's chief physician.

Dr. Pizzocci said that more than half the patients hospitalized in tuberculosis sanatoriums were just the age of 35. These individuals were born and raised in the peak period of TB - before the days of pasteurization of milk, before the widespread isolation of active TB cases, and during the time when TB was a leading cause of death.

Dr. Pizzocci said 132 patients were receiving TB treatment as of February 3. This includes 10 residents from Du Page County who are cared for through contractual agreement with the Du Page County Tuberculosis Sanatorium District.
