Decide Sunday Liquor Hours Monday

In its second informal meeting with Niles trustees Niles Liquor Association stated Saturday it had no recommendation to make regarding the changing of its Sunday hours opening, which is presently 6 A.M. At a meeting two weeks ago Mayor Blase told the Association to consider a change and to report on their decision at this meeting.

At the end of the meeting Blase said trustees would reach a decision on whether or not to make a change at its April 13 meeting.

Attorney Jack Heckinger, representing the Liquor Association, said his group had no uniformity of thought regarding the changing of Sunday opening hours. He said each tavern had its own hours for activity. He noted stores in industrial

areas had a great deal of business during the early morning hours.

Heckinger noted the peak Sunday hours for many of the stores are from 7 to 9 A.M. Sunday morning.

Noting there was no definite record of complaints Heckinger said new restrictions would be due to capricious thoughts. He said the whims of the people

could determine the life or death of many of these businesses.

Mayor Blase answered that the Board was representative of the people and they were in office to serve the whims of the people. Blase said the Board was not acting on its own whims. In answer to a later comment Blase said the Board could not make any promises to the liquor people,

regarding present or future actions of the Board.

Heckinger noted 6 or 7 of 27 taverns were open for Sunday business between six and seven in the morning. Between 7 and 8 A.M. nearly all the stores were open and by 8 A.M. 90% of the stores were open. He emphasized the hours between 7 and 10 were most important for Sunday opening.

School District 63 is the only grammar school district in which there is competition for the three Board seats.

Tuesday night the eight candidates introduced themselves to more than 100 residents who turned out at the annual "Meet the Candidates" meeting. Interestingly six of the eight candidates are residents of unincorporated area which seems to indicate that those areas desire louder voice on the Board. Actually, there have been several present and past board members who have lived outside an incorporated village.

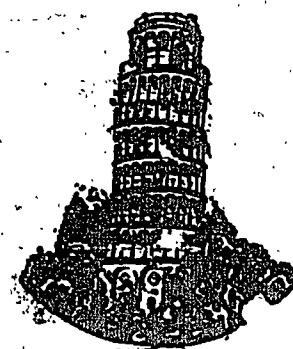
The argument has always been brought forth that representatives should be from the many areas in the community. Niles, Morton Grove, the Glenview unincorporated area and the Des Plaines unincorporated area have all been well represented in recent years. Thus, many interested persons believe all areas should continue to have representatives on the board. They contend it is of paramount importance that bond issues and other school matters can best be handled when a local representative brings the problems back to his neighbors.

This year Niles could easily be shut-out from having any one member on the school board. Interested Nilesites believe Dave Kazan and Sylvia McNair (who lives outside Niles border) should receive united support from Niles voters to insure a local resident serves as a board member.

The argument makes good sense. But the need to have a neighbor on the board is a secondary consideration. The most important need is to have the very best qualified candidates serve on the board, regardless of their home address. With this in mind we hope residents in the entire district will cast one of their three votes for William Gurolnick. Gurolnick stood head and shoulders above the remaining seven candidates who presented themselves at the "Candidates" meeting. He has been in attendance at more than 30 school board meetings over the past year, while the remaining candidates only began attending recently, when they cast their eyes on the school board posts. Gurolnick was the guiding light behind the high school caucus which will be sending a second high school board member from school district 63 to Maine High.

We're sure each area will get behind their neighbors in Saturday's election. A steamroller from the unincorporated areas could push three of their

Phone Service Restored

Vote For School Bd. Members



This was the scene at Kirk Avenue and Harlem Avenue early Monday morning as telephone repair crews worked to restore service to an estimated 703 telephone lines knocked out of

service for several hours due to water-damaged cable as a result of the heavy week end rainfall.

Illinois Bell Repair Cable Which KO'd 703 Phones

Illinois Bell Telephone's repair crews went swiftly to work early Monday morning to repair a telephone cable at Kirk Avenue and Harlem Avenue in Niles, which had suffered water damage from the heavy rainfall Sunday.

The men worked around the clock to restore service to an estimated 703 telephone lines which were knocked out of order before 5 a.m. Monday in an underground cable. An ob-

structed 642 residential telephone lines were affected, as well as some 54 regular business lines and seven other specialized business lines.

The affected area was bounded by Harlem Avenue on the east, Grisle Avenue on the west, Oakton on the north and Howard Street on the south.

"Despite our most careful preventative efforts," said Art

County Rejects High Rise

A proposal to build a high-rise apartment building in Maine Twp. was rejected because the plans contained at least 36 code violations, County Board President Seymour Simon disclosed Friday.

Proposed construction of the 11-story, \$1,500,000 building on Golf Rd., near Harlem Ave. in the township brought objections from residents of the area, who descended on the

Maine and Niles Township voters go to the polls Saturday from 12 Noon to 7 P.M. to vote for candidates for their Township high school boards, as well as in their elementary school district. Voters will elect both districts' candidates at their grammar school poll.

In East Maine district 63 eight candidates are vying for the three openings there. No incumbents are seeking reelection to the Board. One Board member, Stanley Osri, is a caucus-backed candidate for the high school board while the two other Board members, whose terms expire, are retiring from the school board.

First-time candidates seeking one of the three posts include William Gurolnick, 9521 Overhill, Morton Grove; David Kazan, 8526 Ciccola, Niles; Jack Levin, 8946 Lyons, Des Plaines; Robert Marciano, 2740 Norma Court, Glenview; Sylvia McNair, 8855 Greenwood, Niles; Albert Meschino, 9328 Clancy, Maine Township; Allen Schwartz, 8940 Church, Des Plaines and Kenneth Schwartz, Glenview.

In Niles school district 71 three incumbents are seeking reelection, unopposed formally. Former caucus-backed candidates now seeking their third term include Adolph Poss, Rudolph Hill and Don Kitzing.

In Morton Grove district 70 Sam English, 8826 Menard and Kenneth Bick, 6121 Elm, are the candidates for two posts. They are seeking the Board seats presently held by Dale Floyd and Bob Eick. Floyd is retiring after 13 years service and Eick after six years on the school board.

In Niles-Morton Grove district 67 two caucus-backed can-

Announce \$4.6 Million Lutheran General Hospital Expansion

A \$4.6 million program to expand Lutheran General Hospital, 1775 Dempster St., Park Ridge, has been announced by the hospital's board of trustees. The expansion will increase the hospital to 519 beds and greatly expand the outpatient department and ancillary services.

Construction is expected to start this summer with completion scheduled by the end of 1965 according to Dr. N.M. Nesset, president of the board of trustees of Lutheran General and Deaconess Hospitals.

"Because of the tremendous pressures being put on present facilities, it is a feeling of the board and administration that additional hospital beds must be built for the community," Dr. Nesset stated.

He pointed out that the expansion has received the approval of the Hospital Planning Council for Metropolitan Chicago.

Plans call for three stories on the present seven-story building and constructing a five-story addition attached to the west of the hospital.

Present size of the hospital is 316 beds. The expansion will increase medical-surgical beds from 204 to 297 and psychiatric beds from 35 to 81. New features will be a 23 bed intensive care area and a 46 bed chronic care unit.

"Because of high usage, Lutheran General has been operating at as high as 110 per cent capacity in psychiatric and over 100 per cent capacity in medical-surgical beds," Dr. Nesset noted. "The intensive care beds and chronic care beds are services which are greatly needed for the area."

A feature of the expansion will be an outpatient department of almost 17,000 square feet. Included in this area will be examining rooms, diagnostic areas, laboratories, X-ray, and minor surgical facilities.

The expansion will also include a doubling of the present emergency department.

"Originally we had planned to get started on the emergency department this spring," Dr. Nesset explained. "However, because of savings in construction we are waiting to build it along with the entire expansion program."

tioning equipment will also be added.

"Our present building was constructed with expansion in mind. This means that we will have to do practically no remodeling of existing facilities," Dr. Nesset said.

Lutheran General opened in January, 1960. Since then, over 140,000 people have been served by the hospital as inpatients, emergencies and outpatients. Over 10,000 babies have been delivered.

Funds for the expansion are expected to be received from Federal grants, funds on hand, mortgages and a community fund drive. Details of the fund drive will be announced later.

4 Week Maine Hi Summer Course

Preparations are being made for some 2500 students who are expected to attend summer school at Maine East high school this June. L. W. Rozdalovsky, summer school director, stated this week.

Thirty-four courses have been scheduled, two of which, auto body shop and English review, are new.

English review is designed for students who are weak in grammar and composition, in any year in school. Freshmen may take the course in preparation for English 1 in the fall and upperclassmen may take it as a strengthener.

Registration for all but two courses will open April 28. Students wishing to take biology may take only that course during summer school and will register in the school personnel office April 9 and 10. An early date will also be set for those registering for U. S. History if they are taking only that course, Rozdalovsky said.

Courses are offered for four weeks, June 15 to July 10, for half a credit, and for 8 weeks, or until August 7, for 1 credit. Unusual cases include certain courses for eight weeks at one-half credit, and others, such as metal shop, where one-half, 1, or 1-1/2 credits may be earned. Biology is a six-weeks course for 1 credit and both English review and reading development are non-credit courses.

Pamphlets giving course descriptions and other details were mailed last week to the homes of 1300 prospective freshmen at Maine East and Maine South.
