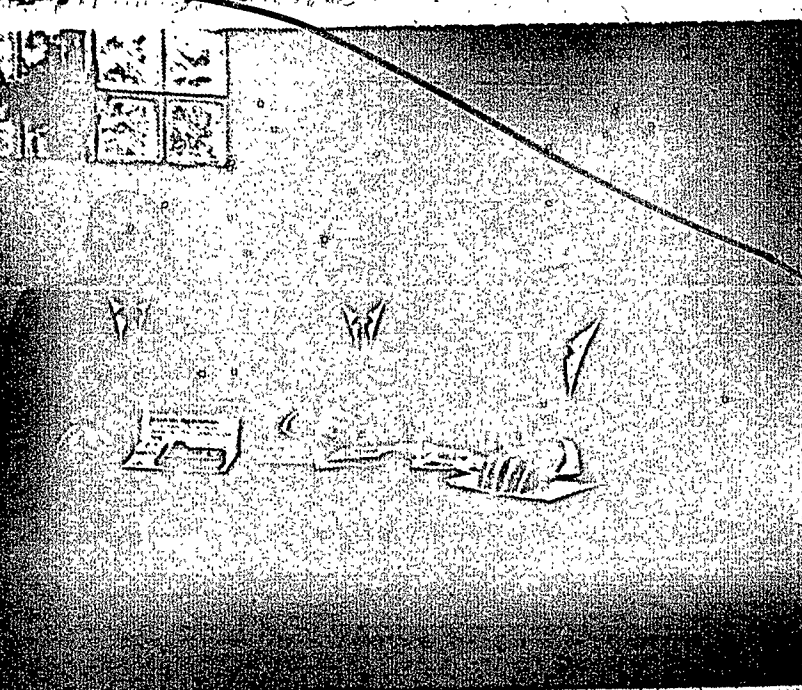

## Niles Safety Council Offers Driver Improvement Course

The Village of Niles Safety Council is offering free to residents, a Course in Driver Improvement, on April 13, 20, 27, and May 4, four sessions, two-hour sessions each of these evenings, from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m.

The course is outlined as follows:

Session 1: Defensive driving... how to avoid the 2-car crash... safe following distance... stopping distance.

Session 2: How to avoid the rear-end collisions... five elements of defensive driving... how to avoid head-on collisions... value of seat belts... driving on curves.

Session 3: How to avoid collisions at intersections... right of way rules at intersections.

## Firemen Attend Conference

Two Niles firefighters recently returned from a four-day instructors conference which was attended by over 4,000 firemen, instructors, and administrators from 13 different countries.

Lieut. Charles M. Bobula Jr. and Inspector Gordon Michalsen were among a 177 fellow fire officials who attended the 38 Annual Fire Department Instructors Conference in Memphis, Tenn.

The conference stresses new methods of fire fighting, training techniques and schooling methods. The men viewed 38 photo slides and over 5,000 feet of film covering 17 different program items.

Niles Fire Chief Albert L. Hoebl said that Niles firemen will attend all such training schools when possible in order to keep abreast of changes in the fire fighting profession.

## From The Left Hand

As one local Rabbi mentioned the past week, the Jewish community in Niles Township should be commended for the restraint they showed during the recent past weeks. The flames of hatred engendered there by a religious leader and a local newspaper were indeed a sad commentary.

One newspaper in Skokie will not make any comment on the racist advertisement which appeared in a second newspaper. Because the Skokie-based paper has Jewish owners it does not want to identify itself as siding with the Jewish community, lending itself to criticism of being prejudiced.

THE BUGLE has always stayed away from any in-fighting with other newspapers. It is not only in poor taste, but we believe it is boring to its readers and manifests a lack of civility. However, in this instance, the limits of decency were abandoned by the Pickwick newspapers and their owner and editor should explain to the community their inexcusable behavior in the Niles High election.

Since, both the owner and the editor are seeking the votes of local residents in June we would like to know if they created the racist ad in their newspaper themselves, or was it paid for, and by whom? And since John Birch literature has been distributed from their office is there an association between the editor and the JB group?

Along the election trail Nilesites might like to know there was a library election Tuesday, Diane Hanson and Clarence Culver were elected to the two posts and outgoing Board Member Sig Lewicki will be appointed to fill the vacancy caused by Edna Walger's resignation. We're afraid our friends on the library board preferred this method of insuring they would have seats on the Board, rather than risk an election which had three candidates compete for two positions.

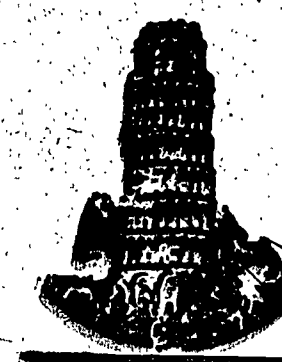
Niles residents in district 63, 64 and 219 once again have no representatives on their school boards. Since they're paying the major part of their tax bills to the school districts it would seem they would want someone from their area to watch the store.

Residents continue to wonder what is to become of the Mill Run theatre. According to Mayor Blase, it will take a bankroll of \$150,000 before the doors will be opened again. He mentioned the fear of under-financing prevents the Mill owners from leasing the theatre to persons with a less amount.

The upcoming release of returns of a survey on telephone service in Niles is not going to sit well with Middle States. While our mention of the survey last time caused scowls at the phone company, the overwhelming criticism of its

# CAUCUS CANDIDATES WIN IN ALL DISTRICTS



## In Nilehi Election

Caucus candidates were victorious in Saturday's Niles Township's Volatile high school election.

Votes for the caucus winners were Meyer Kamin, 7,289; Vivian Medals, 6,285 and Arthur Sablin, 6,668. Losers were Arthur Hanson, 5,696; Harold d'Earl, 5,543; Dr. Robert Cyrog, 5,543; and Benjamin Lipin, 1,856. None were incumbents.

## Maine High

In Saturday's school district 207 Maine High School election Nilesite Wes Hartzell and Des Plaines resident John Means were elected to their first terms on the high school board. The caucus candidates, who ran unopposed, received 6,860 votes for Hartzell and 6,877 for Means while write-in votes totaled 588. In Park Ridge district 64 there were 360 write-ins compared to 192 in Niles-Morton Grove district 63 and 36 write-ins in Des Plaines.

## District 64

Residents in school district 64 defeated Saturday's 21 cents tax rate increase in the Maine High school referendum, 1,865 residents favored the increase while 2,879 opposed it. In Des Plaines district 62, 831 residents approved the raise while 860 voted against it. Only in district 63 were residents favoring it in the majority 950 approved it while 902 voted against it. Total vote was 3,746 for the increase while 4,371 voted against it.

More than \$500 sales was recorded Saturday in the first Niles All America bake sale held at Niles Recreational Center. Village Clerk Marge Lieske, who said the response to the sale was overwhelming, as many hundreds of Nilesites bought the more than 500 items which

Vote totals were Blanchi 245; Hoppe, 244; Mangum, 130; Borowski, 125 and Shurt, 86.

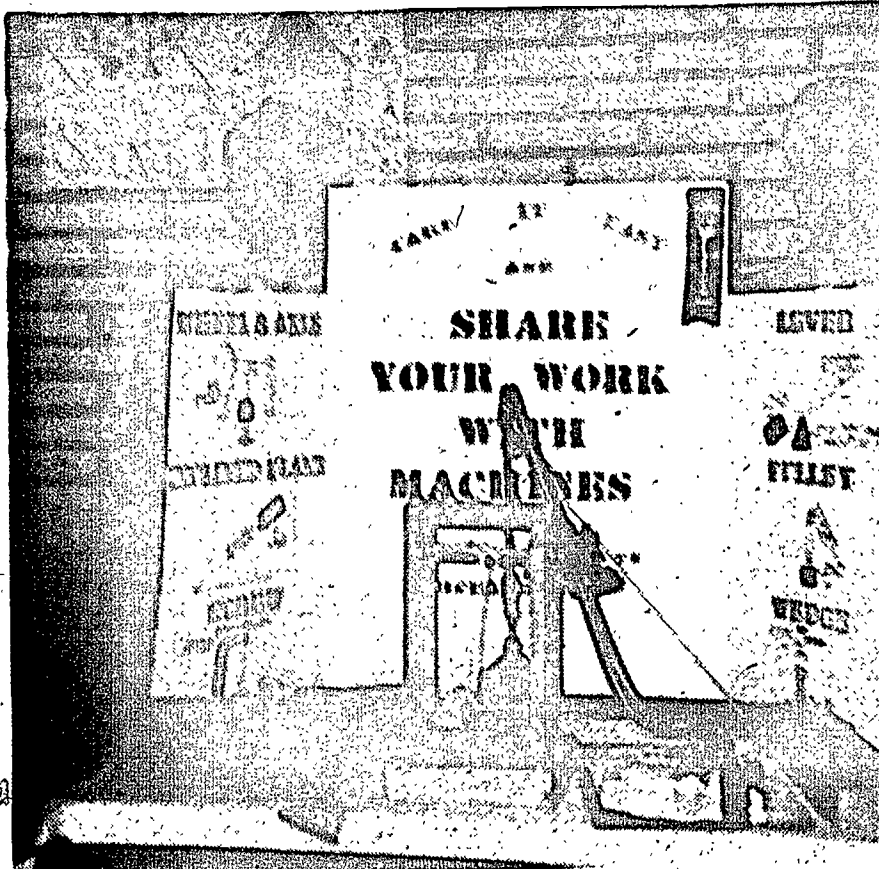
## Luck, Davis Win In District 63

## Independence Hall Essay Contest Winners

Names of the 180 winners and runners-up in the 10th Annual Independence Hall Essay Contest were announced Saturday, March 26, by Dr. Sidney L. DeLove, president of Independence Hall of Chicago which sponsors the competition.

The winners are seventh and eighth grade pupils from 90 public, private and parochial schools in the northwest Chicago and suburban area. A winner and runner-up were selected from each school.

More than 12,000 essays on "What American Patriotism Means to Me" were submitted in the contest. Entries were judged by teachers from the 90 schools who volunteered for the tremendous task of selecting winners. Judges were not permitted to review the entries submitted by their own schools.

Winners, along with chaperones, will receive a 10-day all expense paid trip to national patriotic shrines. The winning youngsters and their parents will be introduced to the chaperones and learn the rules and regulations of the trip at a meeting at Von Steuben high school, 5039 N. Kimball Avenue on April 3 at 2:30 p.m.

The group will leave by bus from Independence Hall of Chicago on April 22, and will return to Chicago on May 1.

"We believe we have provided an incentive for thousands of children to learn more about American history and the heritage that is theirs as young Americans," declared Dr. DeLove, who originated the contest in 1956. "We're very proud of the winners of past years, who still write us to express their thanks for the opportunity the contest provided them."

The same basic tour has been taken each year, with the exception of 1959 when the winners

visited Alaska, then the nation's newest state.

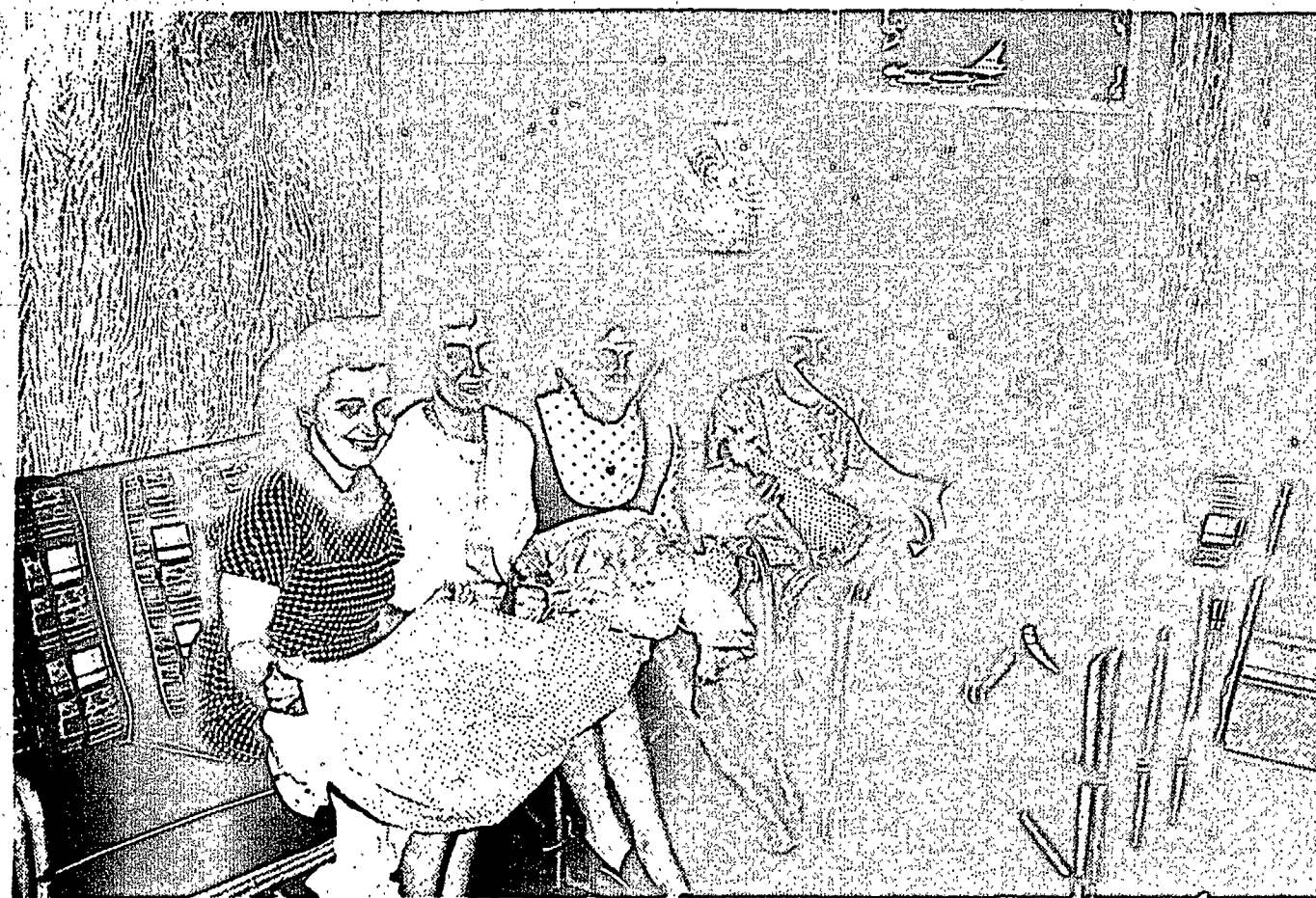

3-----A package of 200 napkins always selling for 25¢, still 25¢, but the napkin is so thin, that you will use three boxes where before only one was used.

4-----Liver advertised as baby tender, three slices to a package — opened to 5 cornerstones of cirrhotic liver in each package (Mottled, mangled chunks that were impossible to eat).

5-----A five pound sirloin tip, costing approximately \$7, one mass of gristle, couldn't cut it or eat it.

6-----A leg of lamb that was minus lamb and who wants to eat a leg bone?

It's up to us, housewives, to set up a darn loud howl and get on the backs of our "friendly neighborhood stores" and see that they stop cheating us, and taking hard earned money out of our pocketbooks for uneatable and wildly overpriced food. It's tough enough to get by without this continued gouging under the guise of satisfaction guaranteed.....right to the door of the poorhouse!

## Importance Of Selecting Superintendent

President Gordon E. Kopald, speaking in behalf of the Board of Education, school district #63 said "The single most important function of a school board, far outweighing any of its other activities, is the selection of a superintendent. We strive for the very finest teachers, principals, administrative staff, buildings, materials, equipment, etc., but only with outstanding leadership can it all be put together so as to develop its full potential. How, then does a school board, aware of this vital role, proceed to acquire such a person?"

A year ago, shortly after Supt. Jim Bagg submitted his resignation, it was announced by the district #63 board that a nationwide search for an outstanding superintendent would begin.

Kopald stated "Our first step was to meet with, and seek guidance from, Dr. Robert Havighurst, a nationally recognized educational leader. Following his advice we retained the services of three prominent educators as a search and screening committee. They were: Robert M. Cole, Executive Director, Illinois Association of School Boards, Dr. Luvern Cunningham, Director, Midwest Administrative Center, University of Chicago and Dr. Guy E. Cornwell, Associate Director, I.A.S.B. Thus

the nationwide search began." In the interim, Dr. G. William Bullock, Jr., then assistant supt. for curriculum, was given a one year contract as acting superintendent. Kopald stated that "This was done to insure that the innovative programs the board sought would be implemented during the time of the search. Furthermore, Dr. Bullock's name would be implemented during the time of the search. Further, Dr. Bullock's name was placed in candidacy with the others."

In May, 1965, the board met with their screening committee. Kopald reviewed the course of events. "We followed their counsel every step of the way. Recruiting material was developed, including a comprehensive set of criteria for the man we sought. The screening committee began by contacting placement offices and universities throughout the country. A vast number of inquiries and applications came in from all over the nation. During this time the board met frequently with its committee. Then, during one of the meetings Dr. Cunningham said 'We have now refined this large group to a handful of men, any of which we feel to be eminently qualified to provide out-

standing leadership to district #63. You, as a board must make the final decision'. While all of this was going on Dr. Bullock had requested that his name be withdrawn from those in candidacy. We began by contacting the remaining candidates, inviting them to visit our district and meet with the board so that we might evaluate them. The number of finalists will then be further reduced, and the board will travel to their communities to seek further background on their qualifications. As such, a new superintendent will be named in the near future".

Kopald concludes "Only after all of this is accomplished will we feel we have fulfilled our single most important obligation...to the children of school district #63.

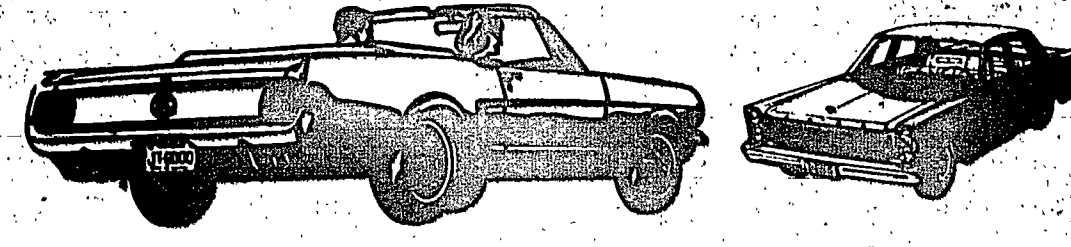
