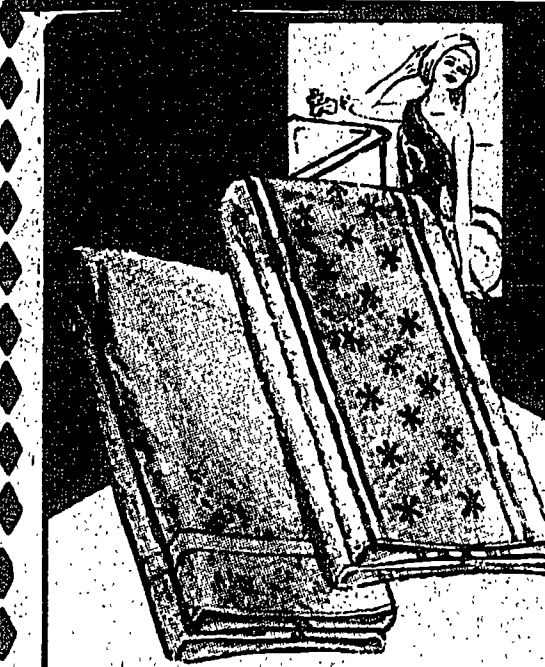

From The Left Hand Is Park Architect On Thin Ice?

End O' The Month Meanderings.....

When they divided up the faculty at the Maine High schools one area where Maine East was short-changed was in the varsity athletic coach department. The baseball coach, who had won a state baseball championship in 1958, went over to Maine West, and promptly won another championship there. Likewise, Bernie Brady, the basketball coach was transferred to Maine South, where its teams have been rated among the best in the Chicagoland-area thru the years (including this one). And since those hyacinth days in the late fifties, Maine East's athletic teams have never matched the efforts of the other 2 Maine High schools.

With the announcement of the resignation of a very fine guy, Bruce Brothers, there is a golden opportunity for the school board to try to improve Maine East's prestige in basketball. The present freshman team has the best record any team has had in our memory. And the nucleus of the team has come out of East Maine Junior High, where an excellent coach is now serving, a Mr. Gold. Since old hardwood fans know the 7th and 8th grade coaching is where it all begins, it might behoove the Board to consider Gold.

There's little doubt there's a great need to boost the school spirit in a school, which doesn't have any major sports teams winning very often. And considering Notre Dame, Maine South, Maine West and Niles West are top teams year after year, in the same community, the Maine School Board should look closely at a successful coach, who is needed here. While over-emphasizing sports has never been a concern in our school districts in Maine, nevertheless, improving the school's sports' winning ways would certainly be a great morale booster for the student body.

Since ecology and pollution seems to be the number one topic in the land, we like the idea of State Representative Bob Mann, who wants to press upon the legislature a bill of particulars to attack the problem immediately. We wonder aloud what the local communities can do to fight air and water pollution, as well as attacking the ever-increasing noise which has come into all of our lives?

While nobody asked me the annual Niles Days money donations seem to be wasteful. This year the hard-working committee donated a new fire ambulance to money-rich Niles. This makes 2 ambulances in a town which could well afford to buy its own. How much more worthy a project if the Committee contributed in an area where tax money cannot be used. And certainly aiding teens and senior citizens seems more worthwhile than efforts to contribute to a village which has revenue flowing in.

Along a similar tack, it seems surprising the Niles Lions are contributing around \$4,000 for a glass enclosure for the old blue fire wagon at the Dempster fire station. These guys, who by fire wagon at the Dempster fire station. These guys, who by knock themselves out providing money for the blind, again, seem to be spending money in an area which rightfully belongs to the village. One grumbler said "it's all a lot of politics", since one village official is also behind the Lions' efforts.

Niles Park District's architect problems are indeed unfortunate. Former Commissioner Lou Schreiner recommended the present firm, which is outstanding in certain areas, but had no previous park experience when it was hired. The delays, and now the incompatible Ballard Park bids, will delay Niles Park plans many months. Another year without a 2nd swimming pool will go by, and the ice rink plans may be delayed one more season. As laymen, none of us feel qualified to criticize professionals in fields where our knowledge is limited. Yet, there's little doubt the low bids were \$350,000 more than is available for the park project, and more than 30 companies submitted bids; it lends suspicion a major judgment error seems evident. And since the park board waited since last summer for the plans which have just been bid, there's obviously much soul-searching to determine whether to continue

1st Defeat After 10 Victories

DIST. 63 SAYS 'NO' BY 5 TO 3 VOTE

After successfully passing 10 referenda in a row, the long-fearing voters' revolt in school district 63 finally showed itself at the polls Tuesday when taxpayers defeated both referenda by a 5 to 3 margin.

Led by voters in incorporated Niles who voted almost 4 to 1 against the issues and Morton Grove, who said, "No" by a 3 to 2 margin, the educational fund increase lost 3,074 to 1,882 and the building fund by a 3,185 to 1,758 vote.

Interestingly, the building fund's loss by 100 votes more indicated district 63 voters have blown the whistle on further building improvements.

While the negative vote is not uncommon in the Chicago-area these days, voters here may recall the impression the former superintendent left with the district when he indicated 3 years ago the voters would not go to the polls for at least 5 years, after passing the mammoth \$5,000,000 referendum in 1967.

Enlightened solutions will all require more money, and adequate financing for the district is already a severe problem.

"Knowing that these problems will require both immediate action and continuous attention over a period of years, I have decided that now is the appropriate time for me to retire from active educational administration."

"I deeply appreciate the privilege of serving as the Superintendent of District 64 since 1947. My work has brought many rewards, not the least of which are the friendships with pupils, faculty and others employed by the District, members of the boards of education, and people of the community. These friendships I will always cherish."

for the re-drawing of the plans. He said he was legally authorized to present plans for a \$672,000 project, but now the remaining money, after other park buildings are built is only \$600,000. This he indicated required the changed plans. Nevertheless, the cold fact stood bare that Alper's plans were low bid at \$350,000 over the \$672,000 figure.

Alper said the re-design would be "good" but not "elegant" as the first plans which had been over-bid. He also said, for his company to re-draw the plans for the \$600,000 figure, he would have to be "allowed a lot of freedom" in the re-design.

The architect continuously referred to the unfairness to his company to re-design the plans without compensation, contending it would absorb all the costs. He emphasized the more luxurious plans "would have to have the heart taken out of them."

Park Commissioner Jack Leske questioned whether the park district was getting the attention and the service from the company, since Alper spends much time out of the country. Alper said the 8-man company functions whether he's present or not.

The attendance this year was outstanding. seats were non-existent at many of the games. The sportsmanship, good will and competition at the tournament speaks well for all the schools participating.

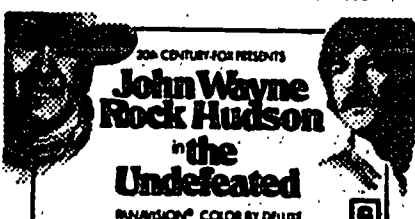

Parochial Unconstitutional

Dear Editor:

How ironic that the open meeting on Monday, Jan. 19, at Our Lady of Ransom church in support of the most divisive proposal in religious circles today, parochialism, should have been held during Religious Unity Week! (Parochialism is the term given to any scheme for affording public funds to private, usually parochial, schools.)

The meeting included a showing of the Illinois Catholic Conference's movie, "A Time for Action," and a question-and-answer period. The movie is a well-done if somewhat slanted survey of Roman Catholic schools in action. It begins with dramatic views of abandoned St. George High school, Evanston. It tells parishioners how much it would cost for students to be transferred from private to public schools, how to save their schools from closing through parochialism, and how to pressure legislators into voting for it.

What the movie does not mention, however, is the absolute constitutional ban in Illinois on public aid, the ban which faces such a grave threat in Con. Con. I would ask those who immediately jump into the financial pros and cons of parochialism, or, as a lawyer at the meeting did, into methods of "bending" the law to obtain it—I would ask them why they are so eager to support the many denominational and political schools which parochialism would certainly foster? I don't want to support them, and it surprises me that to get aid for their schools some Roman Catholics are so willing to give their tax money even to the Protestant schools which are already established.

Nonetheless, if we must, let's skip over the advisability and constitutionality to the financial. This past year there was a drop of 24,500 (to 299,000) in the Chicago city parochial school enrollment. "A Time for Action" warns that a shift of 50,000 students into public schools statewide in September would cost taxpayers \$36 million. (This figure is based on an average annual per-pupil cost of \$743.) How accurate is this figure?

Although many potential closed schools may not have student bodies as disperse as St. George in Evanston, let us take it as a concrete example. From its enrollment of about 800, only 23 transferred to Evanston Township high school. It is highly doubtful that those 23 cost \$17,089 (23x\$743) to educate in their new school.

Now it is obvious that many large, urban parochial schools would, if closed, cause school boards to purchase or rent additional facilities and hire more teachers. But it is just as obvious that (1) many parochial schools (Notre Dame, Hales Franciscan, etc.) would never even consider closing, and (2) in hundreds of medium-sized communities pupils from closed schools will be absorbed at far less than \$743 each. Even if all schools closed, would the cost of buying them back as public schools or replacing them reach the astronomical figure of \$1 billion which parochial leaders have been bandying about?
