

## From the Left Hand

End O' The Month Meanderings.....

.....Next Tuesday's annexation meeting at the Niles' Council Chambers is a meeting of great significance. So many groups have interests in the outcome the very nature of opposing interests should be thoroughly aired.

.....Our personal feeling is we would like to see Niles move to the north. The need to control that area by a local municipality has long been evident.

.....If Niles should take this first step, and many more will surely follow, Nilesites will have to re-adjust their thinking to belonging to a larger community, similar in size to Skokie.

.....While we wouldn't think of using a gambling term in this Mr. Clean column of ours, but if we did, we would have to "lay book" Niles' Mayor Nick Blase will aggressively push for the annexation. And we'll give similar odds Trustee Keith Peck will oppose it. With Trustees Berkowsky and Pesole likely to be in Blase's camp, he needs one more vote to start the ball rolling north.

Once Niles moves north she could cross into its 3rd township, Northfield Township, in pursuit of land north of Central Road and east of the tollway, where Zenith Corporation is planning an industrial complex. And while Niles' water is the pot of gold for another industrial area, it would not come into the 2 school districts there, unless Zenith voluntarily chose to come in. And knowing the burdens of the districts, plus the out of township area there, the chances for such annexation are problematical.

Nilesite Roy Makela was elected president of the Maine High School board Monday night.

In the high school election in Maine Township while the tremendous effort was made to defeat East Maine's Sylvia McNair, because of her liberal leanings, Des Plainesite Michael Bartos received no resistance. If our weathervane is reading correctly Bartos gave indications of being somewhat to the left of the school board, which may surprise some of the more fusty thinkers in the community.

Despite the denials of those who keep their head in the sand old Park Ridge does drum up support in a very chauvinistic fashion. In the April 9 issue of the Park Ridge Herald newspaper a headline in red ink above the flag of the newspaper relative to the Maine High election reads, "Cast a vote for Park Ridge Saturday."

There's little doubt we were genuinely piqued by the defeat of Sylvia McNair in the Maine High election. What was exasperating was the concerted effort by Board members and past members to defeat her, without giving Sylvia her day in court.

Two points bear mentioning. The caucus groups from the areas had a gentlemen's agreement the choice of one caucus would be the choice of all. The implication is members who choose the candidate in their home district are better judges than those outside the immediate area. When the East Maine caucus selected Mrs. McNair we assumed the agreement would be kept. And we assumed the selectees of Mrs. McNair were in a better position to make fair judgement. But even those persons who had previously accepted the East Maine caucus backing, and made themselves a party to the "gentlemen's agreement", bristled at the choice and actively campaigned against her.

## Developer Suson, Water Key Issues

# EAST MAINE ANNEXATION HEARING TUESDAY

In what must be considered the most important annexation meeting since the Golf Mill annexation to Niles 10 years ago, Niles will hear arguments regarding annexing 12 pieces of property in the East Maine area at next Tuesday's meeting at the Council Chambers. It is likely action will be taken at the meeting to proceed with annexation.

At the regular village board meeting Niles will be asked to annex a corridor of property in East Maine which heads north toward the now-being-built Maine North High school on Central rd. and the Apollo Junior High school, which is in school district 63.

All sorts of people have all sorts of desires regarding the annexation. Perhaps the key to the entire action is developer Morris Suson, who is seeking water for a future development in the Golf-Western area. It has been alleged Suson offered 11 homeowners \$500 each to seek annexation into Niles. These people are homeowners who live west of Greenwood along Emerson ave. Having been included in the petitions their annexation would give Niles a corridor along Emerson from Greenwood, to Niles' west border, west to Western ave. Suson's 3 twelve-story Kingston apartment buildings would then be annexed and then annexation would jump across Golf rd. where Suson owns property for future apartment buildings on Western ave.

The village of Niles would pursue annexation to the north on Western to Central rd. where the two schools are now being built. Both school districts desire village water and becoming a part of a municipality would enable them to receive police and fire protection. According to district 63 president William Grolnick, "We're building a multi-million dollar complex there and we would have a 3 county police department serving the area."

The village of Niles has expressed a desire to head north for its own reasons. Mayor Nick Blase has said Niles is the only community in the area which does not have its own public high school. He implied this was an opportunity for the new high school to come into the village. Aside from the high school, there are two other glittering properties which Niles covets. Blase has reported the Zenith Corporation's west border, west to Western

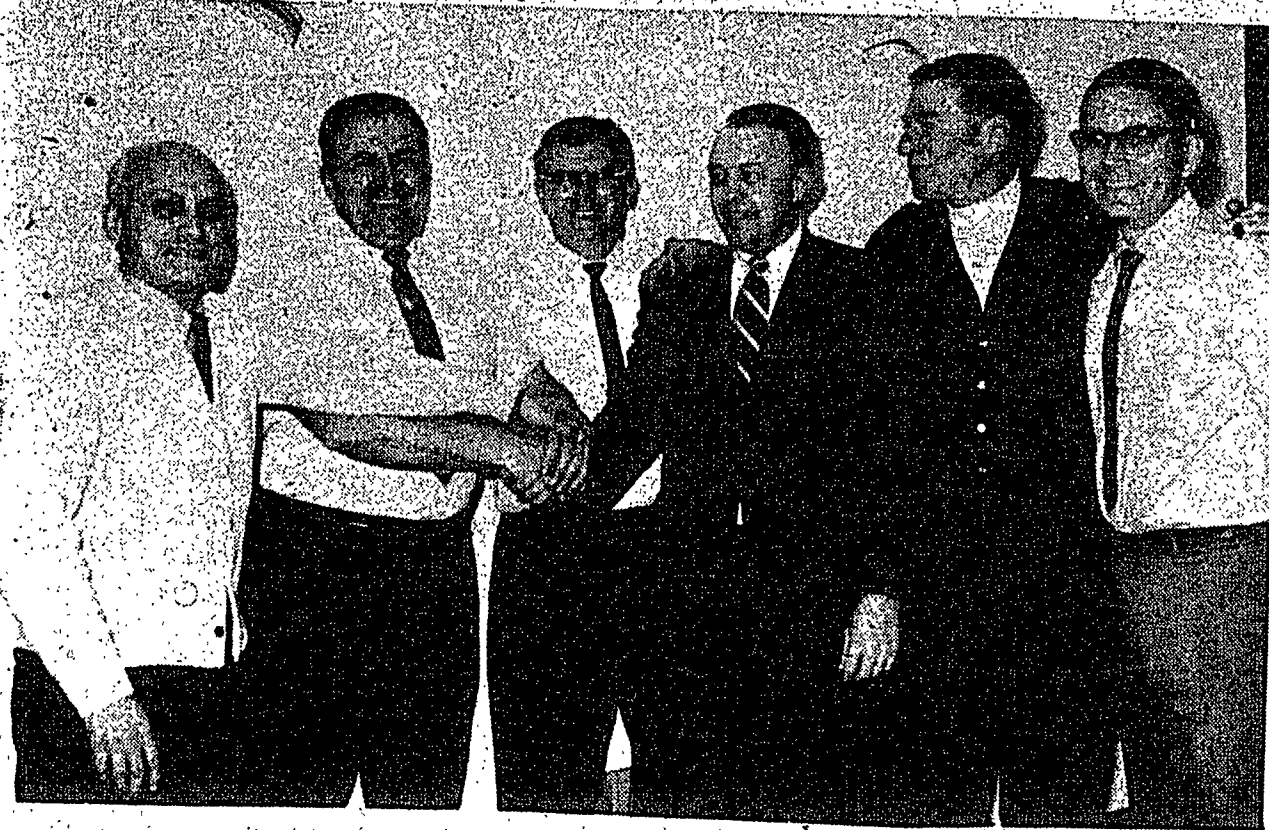

## Norman Named Director of Niles Parks and Recreation

Norman, who began his duties on April 1, was appointed to the post only after the board had reviewed some 20 well-qualified applications for the position.

Gerald Sullivan, President of the Niles Park District Board of Commissioners, announced the recent appointment of Webb's Norman, as director of Parks and Recreation for the Park District.

The appointment of Mr. Norman, who has served several park districts as both director and consultant, climaxes a six month nation-wide search to fill this position.

Ray Eagan, Board Vice-President, reported that over 20 well qualified and experienced professionals had applied for the position with the Board holding personal interviews with the three top candidates. Eagan stated that the Board was unanimous in its selection of Mr. Norman.

"He has a sound understanding of our type of District, excellent experience in the areas of planning, finance, program and construction and the desire to serve our citizens in every way possible," Eagan said.

In accepting the position, Mr. Norman stated, "Niles has all of the qualities of a unique and highly successful park district; the Board members are dedicated, and the district has an excellent full time staff, its new facilities will offer ample opportunity for outstanding service oriented programs, and the citizens appear to be more than enthusiastic about these new service opportunities. Our goal will be to provide the maximum service possible to all of our citizens."

A graduate of the University of Illinois with a Master's Degree, Mr. Norman has had considerable experience in the area of Parks and Recreation Administration. He served the Park District of Oak Park from 1962 through 1968, four years as director. During the past two years, Mr. Norman has served the park field as a consultant. He recently assisted the Park Ridge Park District in its expansion program of constructing a new artificial skating rink, swimming pool and community center. He has recorded many outstanding accomplishments during his 15 years of professional experience.

"Our immediate plans will be to complete the present expansion program as soon as possible and to put those facilities into full time use," Mr. Norman said. "At the same time, we will be looking at all phases of the operations and making adjustments where needed. Such activities as swimming, the summer playground program, youth and adult activities will be given high priority. I plan to meet with our full-time and key part-time staff members to seek their suggestions and support in accelerating our services. Our approach will be based solid team-work with emphasis placed on grass roots communication with the Board, staff and citizens," Mr. Norman concluded.

Mr. Norman assumed his new duties on April 1. He, his wife and four children presently reside in Oak Park, Illinois, but plan to move to Niles during the summer.

## Largest Loyalty Day Parade in History May 3

Hovering U.S. Marine helicopters and 10 marching bands are among the many exciting features which will thrill area residents next May 3, when Niles becomes the site of one of the largest Loyalty Day parades in the history of the northwest suburban areas.

According to Ang Marcheschi, Niles VFW Post 7712 Loyalty Day chairman, over 100 different organizations and civic groups, comprising almost 2,000 members, have indicated they will participate in the three-hour parade.

The Loyalty Day parade is sponsored nationally by the Veterans of Foreign Wars as a rebuttal to the Communist May Day parades. Post 7712 was chosen as the host post for this year's area-wide celebration because of the village's continuous success in supporting civic and patriotic functions.

FLU AND YOU

One of our pharmaceutical journals says: "Soon it may be possible to immunize against influenza by spraying dead viruses directly into the nose. By inhalation, some of the material reaches the back of the throat and respiratory tract. Tests conducted by the University of Florida show that the spray is slightly more effective than flu vaccine. Scheduled for tests is an aerosolized product containing inactivated para-influenza viruses."

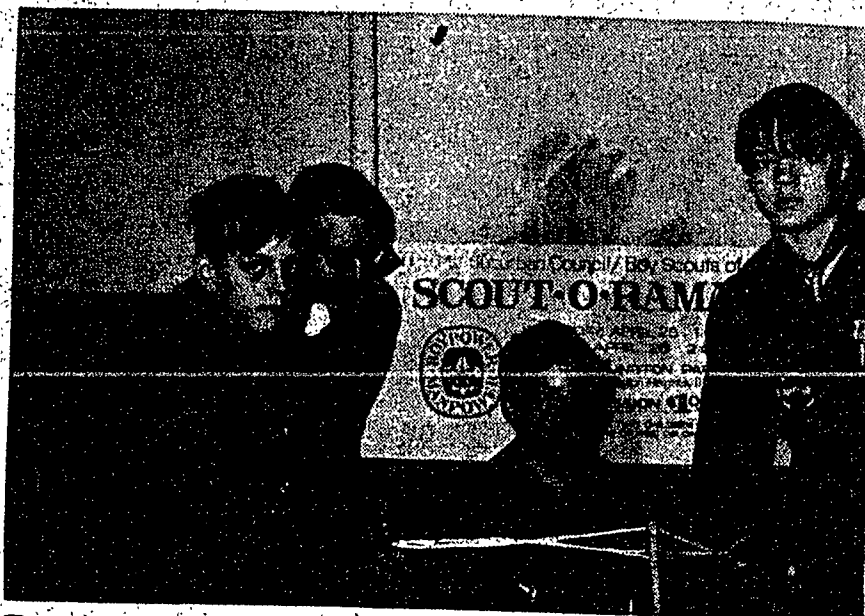

School board members actively sought to defeat her, a position which we believe is untenable and unethical. It placed them in a position of divisiveness, since her election would have meant she had to sit on a Board with those who tried to defeat her. Certainly, such action would not lend itself to the so-called harmony Board members speak about.

When one referendum was defeated for Maine South High School, the Park Ridgers came with hat in hand to the more liberal community in East Maine, in pursuit of support. Thus, it seemed when the district needed East Maine it sought its aid and assistance. But when board members said they want true representation from our district, they said it, but they didn't mean it. For when Mrs. McNair, a product of years of working to create a growing District 63, presented her credentials, she was turned down. And she was actively fought by the very same people who are always mouthing they want true representation from ALL of the district.

We thought it was a bad scene...and we've got a sour taste in our mouth...and in the words of a guy who's been eating too much matzos, "the hell with it."

poration is planning an industrial complex north of Central rd., in Northfield Township, along the eastern end of the highway. It is anticipated its value would be half of the assessed valuation of present Niles. Elase looks covetously at this property.

In exchange for the much-desired annexation of Suson property the Dempster Shopping Plaza at Dempster and Greenwood would also come into Niles. Suson, who built the center, has interests there, and he would seek annexing into Niles if he received the annexation corridor for his other properties.

Attorney Louis Ancel, representing Suson, told THE BUGLE last week the center's sales tax refunds from the state to Niles would be \$200,000 annually. He said property taxes to the village would also be another redeeming feature for the village.

Because of the magnitude of the action there are many other sidelights which bear mention. The annexation would mean Niles would bisect the North Maine Fire District and it has been alleged it is hinting it could take legal action to prevent the bisection.

Other residents in the unincorporated area are objecting to the limited annexation. They desire coming into a village and want to be included in a package annexation.

There's also the water problems which must be solved. At a meeting Monday night Maine High School's Board authorized its representatives to contact Victor Yachtman, owner of the Domestic Water Utilities Company, regarding feeding water into the new school. It's likely East Maine will take similar action since both schools need water by the opening day of the Fall semester. Even if Niles was to annex the property it could not feed water there this year, according to village manager Ken Scheel of Niles.

The water problems are a key to all these other problems. It has been alleged the quality of the well water of the private company and the Lake Michigan water which would be fed from

Yesterday, April 14, I attended a meeting on the 1971 Township Budget (Maine), which was scheduled for 8 p.m. and we arrived on time. In fact maybe too early - 7:45 p.m.

We came in on what was almost a filled hall. Yes, a large crowd, that I learned was Des Plaines residents, which made a stacked deck against anyone who would have anything in mind about changing a township government. That we of the village of Niles can well do without.

The first thing I noticed was a "moderator" was chosen who is a resident of Des Plaines or a Des Plaines official. He was selected and seconded by two men sitting in the Aldermen's section of the City Court room, where the meeting was held. The new budget was read and the figures doubled the 1970 budget. Even the rent paid for the use of the room, went from \$25 to \$150.

Any motion made to change these figures was booed and voted down. After 2 hours of this Kangaroo Court I went home, because if I stayed to 5 a.m., the next morning, which was peoples calculation of its length, I knew that myself and the few people from the village of Niles could not change a thing.

We were told that this meeting was publicized, but I didn't see it in the Bugle, a paper that is read by almost everyone in Niles. I hope next year you can publish a notice of this meeting and also agree with me that the Village of Niles does not need township government. Especially when a group from one city controls it.

These people have been in control about 13 years when Niles was a bit smaller. All of Niles is in Maine township, but only parts of Morton Grove, Glenview, Park Ridge and Rosemont. The Village of Niles is able to take care of themselves. Let's let them know it.

If we are concerned about reducing taxes in the village of Niles, I must state again, remember to get to the next Budget meeting of Maine township.

We were told by the Assessor that the Village of Niles was

given 25% raise in real estate taxes because they were previously underestimated followed by the regular 3%.

Maybe too they might make the mistake of holding this meeting in the Village of Niles, which is centrally located for it.
