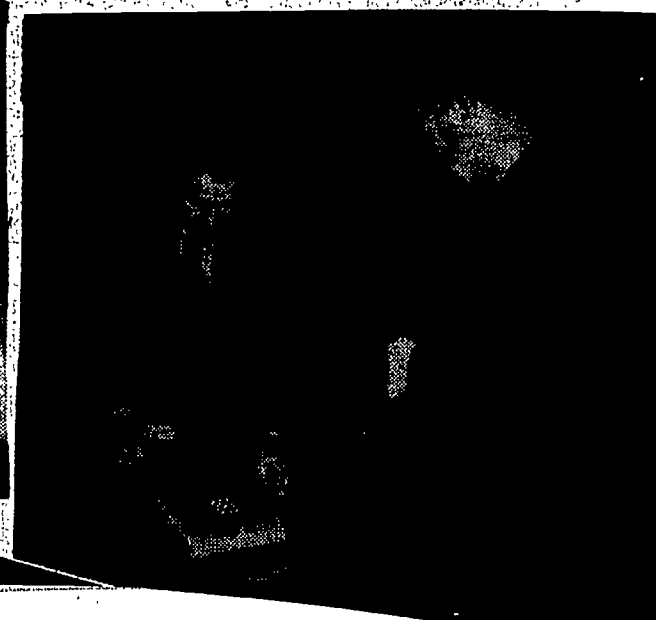
## MAINE TOWNSHIP HIGH SCHOOL NORTH OPEN HOUSE

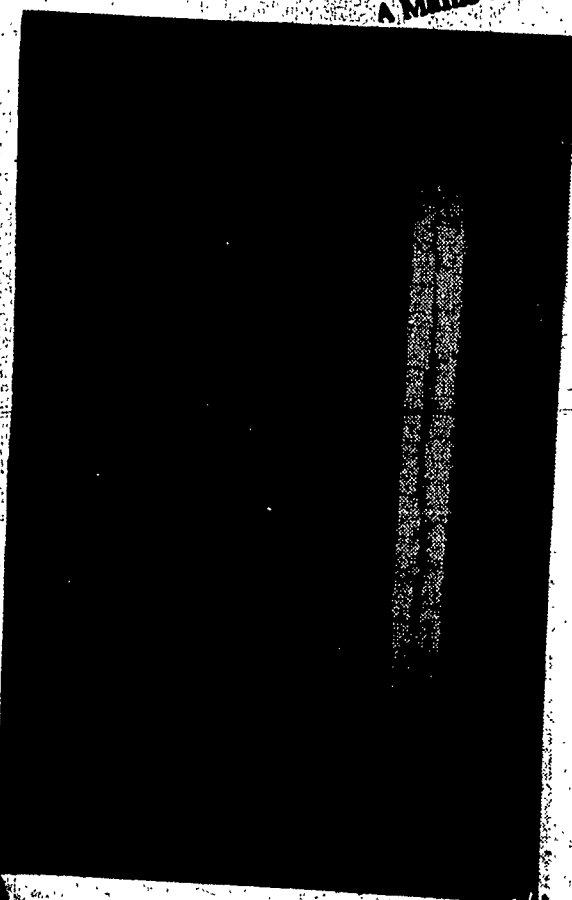

Junior College in which the applicant wishes to enroll.
4. Students who have been issued a letter of authorization  
to attend another public Junior College for the Fall and  
Spring semester of the school year 1970-1971 need not  
apply for a renewal unless the student will be attending  
another college other than the one attended beginning in  
the Fall of 1970.
5. All students presently having a letter of authorization  
for the Fall and Spring semester of the school year 1970-  
1971 must renew their letter of authorization if they de-  
cide that they will be attending a public Junior College  
during the Summer of 1971.
