## 1st in Fire Prevention Award FIRE DEPT. IS TOPS IN CHICAGOLAND FOR 3RD TIME

Niles has done it again! The Niles Fire Department was awarded the Grand Award in the annual Metropolitan Chicago Fire Prevention Contest, sponsored by the Fire Prevention Committee of the Chicago Association of Commerce and Industry. This is the third time that the department has been given the grand award. The honor is given to the fire department carrying on the most effective fire prevention campaign in an eight-county metropolitan area of Chicago regardless of population size. ### From the LEFT HAND

If you live in the unincorporated areas you're getting the short end of the stick, once more. Incorporated villages received the first half of their federal revenue sharing checks the past week, but unincorporated people are passed over in sharing this windfall. They help pay the bills but they ain't getting any kickbacks, like we city folk.

In Niles a check for \$140,416 was received from Washington while Morton Grove received a check for \$72,979. By the first or second week in January another check for an equal amount will be distributed to incorporated towns throughout the country. Subsequently, checks will be forthcoming each quarter and will be divided up according to a town's population, its own tax burden, and according to the average income in its community.

Ken Scheel, our favorite former fullback from Colgate U., and Niles village manager, spoke the words of many famous men, when he said he believed revenue sharing "was a lot of B.S.". He said Uncle Sam operated the country by means of deficit spending, and adding this additional tax burden merely means the government will have to borrow more money, pay additional interest on the loan, which drives the deficit ever higher and higher. It is Ken's thinking income taxes should be lowered, and loopholes should be tightened and eliminated, rather than passing out money in this manner.

The former FB, now VM, said, in our areas the parks and libraries, which could use the money, cannot share in the revenue. While villages and towns which include their parks and libraries as

## OCC to Grant Credit for Learning Experiences

A student now is able to earn college credit through Oakton Community College for learning experiences other than formal instruction in an accredited or recognized college, according to John Donohue, Dean of Student Personnel. The college credit can be earned through six different programs, he pointed out. They include the College Level Examination Program, service credit for health and physical education, armed forces study, Advanced Placement Program, transfer of credits earned at non-accredited or non-recognized institutions, and proficiency examinations through instructors.

The OCC policy for granting credit for these learning experiences was adopted by the Board of Trustees on Nov. 21. Oakton Community College recognizes credit by examination as a means of demonstrating college-level competence. The total amount of credit which may be accepted by examination is not limited, according to Mr. Donohue; however, credit equivalency may be granted only after an

individual has completed at least one three-hour credit course at Oakton Community College. Credit earned by examination will be granted without tuition charges. A service fee of \$2 per semester hour is applicable.

The College Level Examination Program (CLEP) embraces both subject examinations and general examinations. The basic purpose of CLEP is to enable those who have reached the college level of education in non-traditional ways to assess the level of their competence and to establish college credit, Mr. Donohue said.

Any veteran who has completed a minimum of six months of active duty in the armed forces may receive credit for Physical Education 101. This credit will be entered on the student's record without a grade and will not be included in the computation of the grade point average, he explained.

Mr. Donohue said that credit may also be allowed for group study or correspondence work taken through the United States Armed Forces Institute (USAFI).

In addition, certain training courses under the auspices of military service schools may be accepted for credit upon submission of official documentation that such courses were satisfactorily completed. Credit for these courses is entered on the student's record without a grade and is not included in his grade point average.

The Advanced Placement Program of the College Entrance Examination Board offers college-level examinations in 13 disciplines. Interested high school students are able to proceed at their individual paces through advanced studies without their achievement being ignored by colleges they may later attend. (These students should contact their high school counselor for direction.) Credits are granted in course areas where a student has successfully completed an examination.

Credits earned at non-accredited or non-recognized institutions that are applicable to the student's curriculum are conditionally accepted at the time of

admission. Final acceptance of these credits is granted when the student has earned a minimum of 25 per cent of any program less than two years in length, with a grade point average of "C" or better, and when those credits have been validated by OCC, according to Mr. Donohue.

Oakton will also grant credit if a student is proficient in a particular subject area, but has developed that competence in a non-traditional way. The proficiency examinations are given by an instructor of the subject area. If the student's examination meets the standard required for "C" work, credit for the course is entered on the student's permanent record. No grade is recorded for this "credit by proficiency" and credits are not included in the grade average.

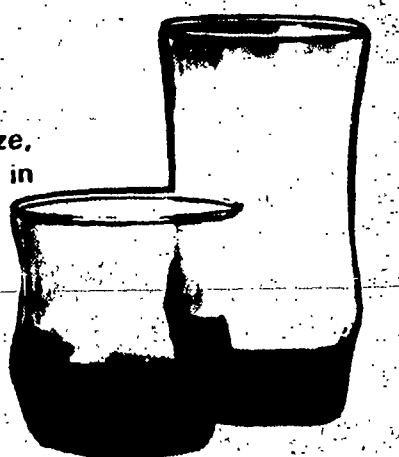

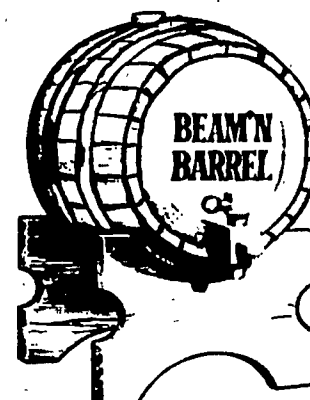

## Legion New Year's Eve Party

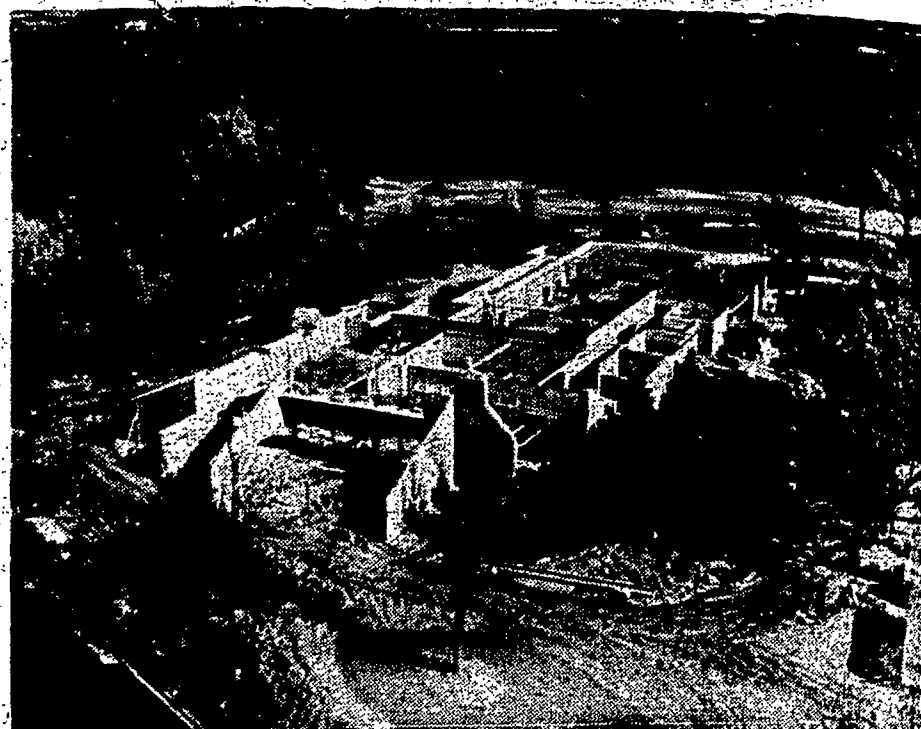

## Maine East Cagers Victorious

The Maine East Demons won two games this week-end, beating Morton East on Dec. 1 in Cicero, 49-42, and Niles East on Saturday, Dec. 2, 39-30, in Park Ridge.

The Morton East Mustangs were highly favored over the Demons due to their crushing 20 point win over powerful Proviso West of the West Suburban Conference and their 3 point overtime loss to York—both schools are contenders for the W.S.C. title. The Maine East quintet did an excellent job of stopping Morton's fast break, which has been devastating in the early season games. Probably the most significant factor in the game was Maine's total domination of the boards. Led by a front line of Mike Faden, Bill Castanzo, and Rich Schumacher, the Demons doubled Morton's rebounding totals 38 to 19.

Mike Faden, 6'4" senior forward, led all scorers with 19 points, probably playing the best game of his career thus far. He was 6 for 9 from the field and 7-10 from the line. Mike also pulled down 13 rebounds.

Once again, senior forward Greg Maloney came off the bench

and gave an excellent account of himself. Greg finished the evening with 12 points, including 8 for 8 from the free throw line in the fourth quarter when Maine scored 23 points and put the game out of reach.

The Park Ridge team slowed the game down to their advantage and led 7-6 at the quarter. Maine led 21-18 at the half. The Demons employed an aggressive 1-3-1 zone to keep the taller Mustangs off the boards and forced them to shoot from the outside. After trailing 28-26 at the end of the third stanza, the Demons broke out of their shooting slump in the tension-packed fourth quarter. Behind 34-30 with 3 minutes and 20 seconds to go in the game, Maine East cashed in with an unusual six point play. Maloney connected on a 20 footer and was fouled by Stelmanowski, the Mustangs sharp shooting 6'4" forward. Stelmanowski suddenly played a loss of temper because of his fifth foul and spit in Maloney's face. The officials immediately slapped a technical on the tall forward and ejected him from the game. The Maine East forward calmly made the free throw

and the technical shot. When Maine inbounded the ball, Mike Faden promptly hit a 15 footer from the wing and the Demons were never headed again. Maine East hit 12 of 13 free throws in the final quarter. This win left the Demons with a 2-2 record and a modest two game win streak.

Maine's trio of guards, Doug Moorad, Ron Parker, and Keith Larson did an excellent job of preserving the win by their steady ball handling through Morton's pressing defense throughout the second half.

The scoring was as follows: Faden with 19 points, Maloney with 12, Larson with 10, Castanzo with 7, and Schumacher with 1.

On Saturday the Demons opened the Central Suburban season by beating Niles East's Trojans, 39-30. Maine East suffered an expected let down after Friday night's thrilling win. Maine's Demons led all the way, but they looked sluggish and ragged while nailing down their third consecutive win. The game was a low scoring one, partly due to poor shooting on both sides and the evidence, once again, of a sticky

Demons defense. The Park Ridge five held their opponents under 42 points for the third game in a row, all East wins.

Maine led 11-10 at the quarter and stretched that lead to 23-17 at the half. Maine had a horrible third quarter for the second night in a row and scored only four points as Niles East closed the gap to 27-25. The Demons were the ordered into a diamond and one full court press, which broke the game open in the first few minutes of the fourth quarter. 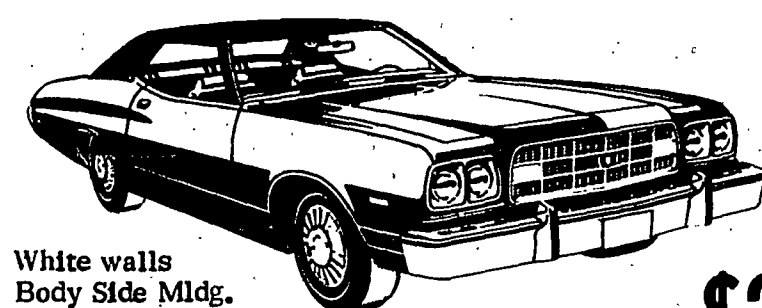
