## Recycle holiday wrappings and cards

George Brabec, manager of the Niles Township Reclamation Center, announced this week that holiday wrapping paper and cards can be recycled at either of the area's recycling centers.

Their newest center opened last June at the Skokie Incinerator and is located on the corner of Cleveland and Central Park st. in Skokie. However, the incinerator center only accepts paper products, (newspapers and magazines).

It is open seven days a week, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Their main center is located behind the Niles West High School football stadium, 7929 Austin ave., Skokie, and accepts glass, cans, paper, magazines, and corrugated cardboard. It is open five days a week, Wed. thru Fri., noon to 6 p.m., and Sat. and Sun., 8 to 5 p.m. For further information, call 966-3800.

## New ruling set by Judge Smigiel on traffic offenders

A new Directive, issued last Dec. 12, by Anton A. Smigiel, Presiding Judge of the Third Municipal District, Circuit Court of Cook County, provides for the release of traffic offenders unable to post bond.

Motorists charged with an offense where a valid Illinois Driver's license, bail bond or \$25 in cash is required as bail can be released on their own signature (Individual Recognizance Bond) by the Chief of Police or his supervising officer, said Judge Smigiel.

The Directive is effective immediately.

Up to the present time, traffic offenders were required to appear before a Judge to be granted an Individual Bond.

The new Directive insures prompt release of motorists, eliminating detention or incarceration. The Chief of Police or a designated supervisor or Watch Commander will be the sole

person permitted to approve an "I" bond in a given situation. The "I" bond must be completed and executed in the police station or the arresting authority with approval of the Watch Commander.

The issuance of an Individual Recognizance Bond, in the amount of \$25 in the above situations will be at the sole discretion of the Chief of Police or his designated aide.

Excluded from the Directive will be motorists for whom a warrant is outstanding or if a bond forfeiture is pending in any court proceedings.

Any offender who is unable to post the bond set by the police, said Judge Smigiel, always has the right to request a hearing on the bond by a judge.

Innovation of the new procedure was approved by Chief Judge John S. Boyle.

## Centel prepares for holiday phone rush

With the holiday season less than a week away, Central Telephone Company of Illinois is prepared for one of its busiest long distance calling periods of the year.

J. Stephen Vanderwoude, Division Traffic Manager, said Christmas Eve ranks as the most heavily used holiday time for long distance circuits. Christmas night is a close second.

Vanderwoude advises Centel customers that by calling at less busy times such as the afternoon of Christmas Eve or morning or afternoon on Dec. 25, there is more assurance that calls can be completed when desired.

Customers may also direct dial their long distance holiday greetings, Vanderwoude said, thereby eliminating the need to go through an operator as well as affecting a savings with lower direct dial rates.

Although Christmas will be a holiday for most Centel customer, Vanderwoude said, it will be a full working day for operators who will be available to assist with long distance service.

## Fire Prevention Holiday tips

Albert L. Hoelbl, Chief of Niles Fire Department, has the following suggestions to help make the Christmas holiday season a safe one:

... Keep matches, lighters, candles out of the reach of children.

... Avoid smoking near flammable decorations.

... Avoid wearing loose flowing clothes, especially long, open sleeves near the open flames of a fireplace, stove or candle lit table.

... Never burn candles near evergreens on a mantelpiece or table. Burning evergreens in the fireplace can be hazardous. When dry, greens burn like tinder. Their flames can flare out of control, sending sparks flying about a room.

... Plan for safety, remember there is no substitute for common sense. Look for and eliminate potential danger spots near candles, fireplaces, trees, electrical

connections.

... Keep base holder for a fresh tree filled with water and do not block any exit with the tree.

... Make an emergency plan to use if a fire breaks out anywhere in your home. See that each family member knows at least two escape routes.

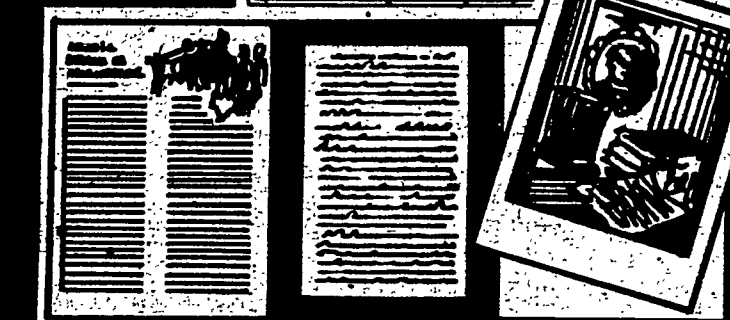

Why does a village as affluent as Niles as far as sales tax returns, etc., still tack the 5% Municipal Tax on all utility bills?

D.M. The Municipal Tax is only 3%, said Village Manager Scheel. The village is not affluent but is in the "black", so to speak. Niles provides more services than other towns, he said, so the tax monies are applied to these services, such as Family Service, Senior Citizens Program, Teen Program, and the Social Service Dept. out of the police department, to mention a few.

Please ask Park Comm. Walt Beusse what has been done about proper supervision of the youth at Grennan Hts. The washrooms are a terrible sight, glass is being broken continuously, the language is obscene and vending machines are continuously defaced, damaged or broken. If the park employees are afraid to stand up to these kids, can't you get someone like Officer Andy Cameron to police the area, who commanded their respect? The Ballard Sports Center is beginning to show the same conditions.

T.G. The vending machines are removed from Grennan Heights, said Walt Beusse. Last week's visit showed a 100% better appearance. Talks with Director Hughes have resulted in his updating responsibilities of park personnel as to supervision and maintenance. I believe you will see great improvement, because we continue to keep the Gym under close surveillance.

With reference to the new ordinance for inspection of homes for improvements, what can be done to get homeowners to paint houses badly in need of paint and keep them from getting run-down? Due to a heart attack suffered last January, long walks have become a part of my daily routine. It is sad to see the many homes in various areas of Niles which are in dire need of repairs and painting. Can Mr. Mankowsky do anything along these lines?

Mr. J.S. Please call me or send me a list of the house numbers and we will try our best, said Ben Mankowsky, Niles Housing Inspector. We take great pride in our Town and expect to have every unit (there are approximately 3,000) in Niles inspected within 3 years.

Why aren't fresh Christmas trees being flameproofed by the Fire Dept. this year?

T.A. Due to present economy, our budget excluded the flameproofing of Christmas trees, said Niles Fire Chief Albert L. Hoelbl. Last year's cost of spraying the trees exceeded \$400. It may be possible that we can include the tree spraying next Christmas.

Are door-to-door solicitors investigated by the Village of Niles?

E.W. Yes, said Niles Village Clerk Frank Wagner. All solicitors and peddlers are required to fill out an application at the village clerk's office, which is signed, attesting to its truthfulness. Each solicitor is fingerprinted and investigated for criminal or felony type records. Upon satisfaction, the village issues a 4 x 5 inch card to the solicitor, noting B.F. in bold letters, indicating the solicitor's name, the name of his company, date of card issue and expiration date. If he does not display the card, said Wagner, notify the Niles Police Dept.

Is Niles going to do anything with the old house at 8114 Dempster, located on the north side of Dempster st. and at the west end of the Milwaukee-Dempster Underpass? I drive past it everyday and it is an eyesore to the community. Every window is broken, it is in a state of general disrepair and has been vacant 4 to 5 months.

Mrs. C.K. (Des Plaines) Village Manager Scheel, who had first crack at answering this question, stated that the village is in process of sending letters to the owner, following legal procedures. He referred the questions to Housing Commr. Ben Mankowsky, who resents questions from Des Plaines residents. However, said Mankowsky, we are trying to find out who the owner of the property is. If we don't get action within the next 10 days, he said, "I am going to get a court order to demolish the property and put a lien on it, for expenses."

## Local Services merge into one agency

The Park Ridge Family Counseling Service (PRFCS) and the Maine Township Mental Health Association (MTMHA) have completed their merger into one service-provider agency called the Maine Family Service and Mental Health Association.

The announcement was made this week by Mrs. Mae Rowe, former PRFCS officer and now a vice-president of the new agency, and by Bob Schwarz, who retains the presidency from MTMHA.

The counseling service will transfer its current clients to the MTMHA building at 832 N. Busse soon after Jan. 1.

"There will be no interruption of service to current clients or to new clients," said Dr. Edward Baranowski, who retains his position from MTMHA as executive director. Claire Pelletier will head the family counseling function of the new agency. She had been the PRFCS executive director.

The merger increases the staff to 19 and the entire caseload to nearly 500. The agency's building is undergoing remodeling to accommodate this increase.

"The spirit behind the merger is to enlarge and consolidate and to therefore strengthen our services to all residents of Maine Township," said Mrs. Rowe.

The merger was approved by a board of 30 directors, 15 from each former agency. The only dissenting board vote was from former PRFCS member William Bowes, who had argued that PRFCS would lose its effectiveness in Park Ridge if merged with a township-wide agency and if treatment of mental illness were added to its services.

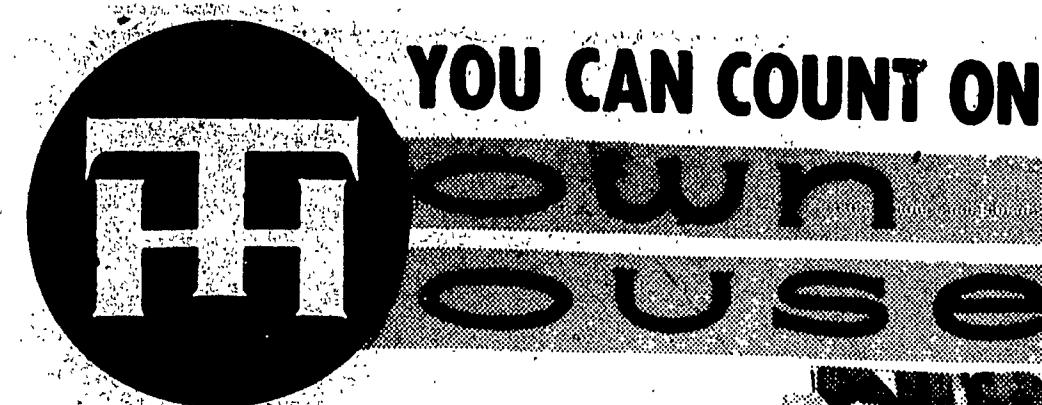

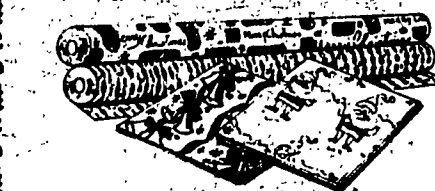
### A Tribute to 'Booby'
