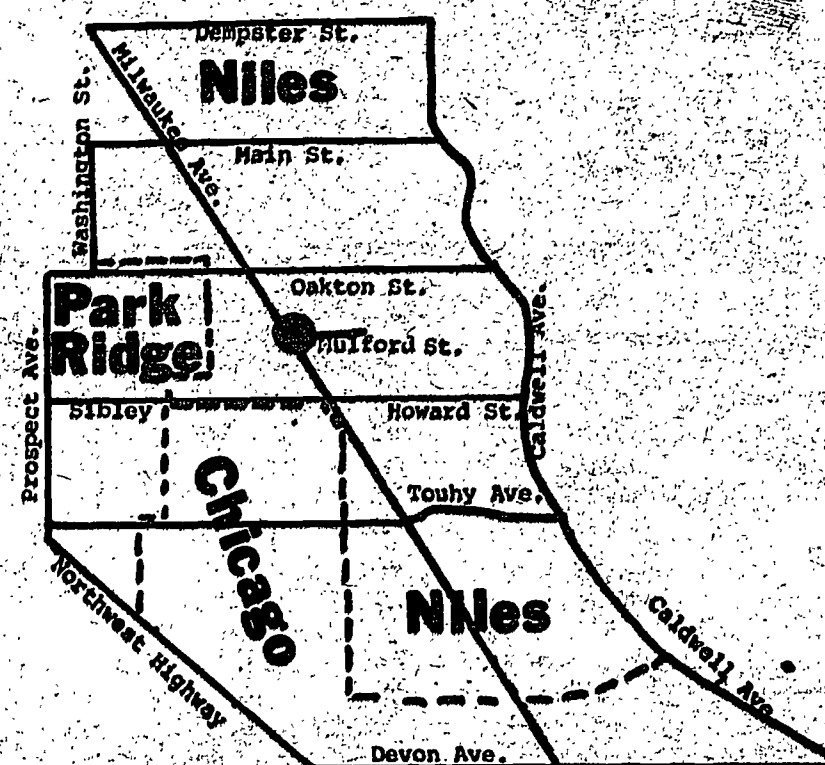

Cleaning Up Our Desk for November ...

Perhaps the most important man in Niles' history passed
away 2 weeks ago.

Jim Kozak, who was Village Clerk from 1941 to 1962, died
in mid-November.

Jim served the village during the Stankowicz years, during
the dormant 1940's, when the village extended primarily as
far south as Howard Street, with north Merrill Avenue and
one street north of Oakton Street in Grennan Heights
comprising most of Niles. Population during those days
hovered around the 3,000 figure. In the mid-fifties, Niles
became a community of 14,000 and by the time Jim left office
in '62, her residents numbered 20,000.

When Blase's ticket swept into office in 1961 only Kozak
was re-elected among the incumbents, manifesting the high
regard the community had for Jim. He quit office one year
later.

If ever a man could fitfully be named Mr. Niles, it was Jim.
While Frank Stankowicz and Bob Romey ran the town from
the Mayor's and Police Chief's perches, it was really Jim who
quarterbacked the town. Most villagers' problems were
referred to Jim's second floor office atop the old police station
at Milwaukee and Touhy, and they were handled with
old-fashioned aplomb. We call it 'old-fashioned' because only
Jim knew where all the records were. He had his own filing
system, consisting of stacks of records in nooks and crannies
of the office, which was under the sole proprietorship of
Kozak. In '62 when Marge Lieske moved into Jim's chair, she
was flabbergasted at the old-time Kozak business practices
which ran his office. But they worked, with a modicum of

Zoning Board o.k.'s Savings and Loan branch for Lawrencewood

The Zoning Board Nov. 19 approved a Special Use variation to Uptown Federal Savings and Loan of Chicago for branch banking in the Lawrencewood Shopping Center and for a Big Herm's Eatery in the Greenlake Shopping Center at Golf and Dee rd.

Should the zoning variations be approved by the Village Board, which makes final decisions on variations, savings facilities in Niles will total 13 in number. Eateries continue to increase.

Previously citing an excess of 'glut' of savings institutions in Niles, the Zoning Commissioners' approval of the Lawrencewood banking facility carried with it a commendation that the Uptown Savings & Loan would be 'good' for the Center.

Already approved in recent zoning action were a Unity Savings & Loan branch bank at 8361 Golf rd., a Madison National Bank facility and drive-in at Greenlakes Shopping Center,

Golf and Dee rd.; a Four Flags bank for location in the Four Flags Shopping Center on Golf rd.; and an Evanson Savings & Loan branch bank in The Treasury, 8510 Golf rd.

Thomas Peter, vice president of Uptown Federal whose main offices are at 430 N. Michigan ave., told zoning commissioners Wednesday night that the proposed branch bank for location in the former S & H stamp building on Waukegan rd. north of Jonquil Terrace would be the fourth Uptown facility in the Chicago area.

Indicating awareness of the increasing number of savings institutions in Niles, the Uptown official stated one reason for locating in this area was because of "a large, available savings market in the area of \$150 million, which is a large number of dollars to be shared by numerous banks". Secondly, he said, numerous customers had moved from the Chicago Uptown areas in to the suburbs and "it is our

desire to serve these customers". He noted \$45 savings accounts with Niles residents and 199 mortgage loans in the aggregate area of \$4 million.

All of the potential financial institutions seeking to relocate for branch banking have cited reasons of convenience to Niles residents who are among their current depositors as basis for moving into the village.

The Uptown facility will have 3 tellers and a manager, with no drive-in banking. An "open space" concept is projected by bank architect Joseph Kobylecky with redesigning of the original entryway. A community room accommodating 20 to 25 people will be made available to local residents' use. The branch bank is under a 5-year lease with a 5-year option.

In second action zoning commissioners recommended approval of a Planned Unit Development variation for construction of a "Big Herm's" restaurant at 9078 W. Golf rd., predicated upon sufficient parking in the PUD.

The drive-in with a 50-seat capacity is companion to "Herm's Palace" in Skokie which seats 100. A family-type operation, said owner Herman Gelford, will serve a limited menu of hot dogs, beef, sausage and hamburgers. Customers will pick up their food and seat themselves.

In other business the Zoning Board:

... announced a change in date of Plan Commission and Zoning Board Hearings to the first Wednesday of each month beginning in January of 1976.

... discussed and continued action to Dec. 17 on a B2 Special Use and variation petitioned by O'Brill Company, 6626 Milwaukee ave., a firm which sells concrete materials and supplies. Delayed action was due to non-notification of the petition to owners of adjoining 2 lots.

... continued action to Dec. 17 on discussion of a change in zoning petition fees as recommended by Director of Building and Zoning Joseph F. Salerno. Commissioners were not in agreement of the reduction in fees to homeowners desiring 'minor variations'.

The delay in action, recommended by Commissioner Ken Cohen, followed a proposed review of all zoning petition fees.

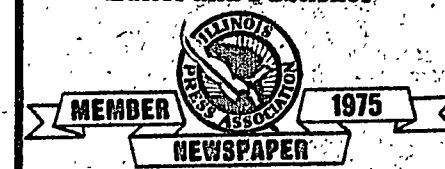

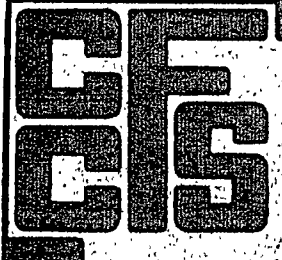

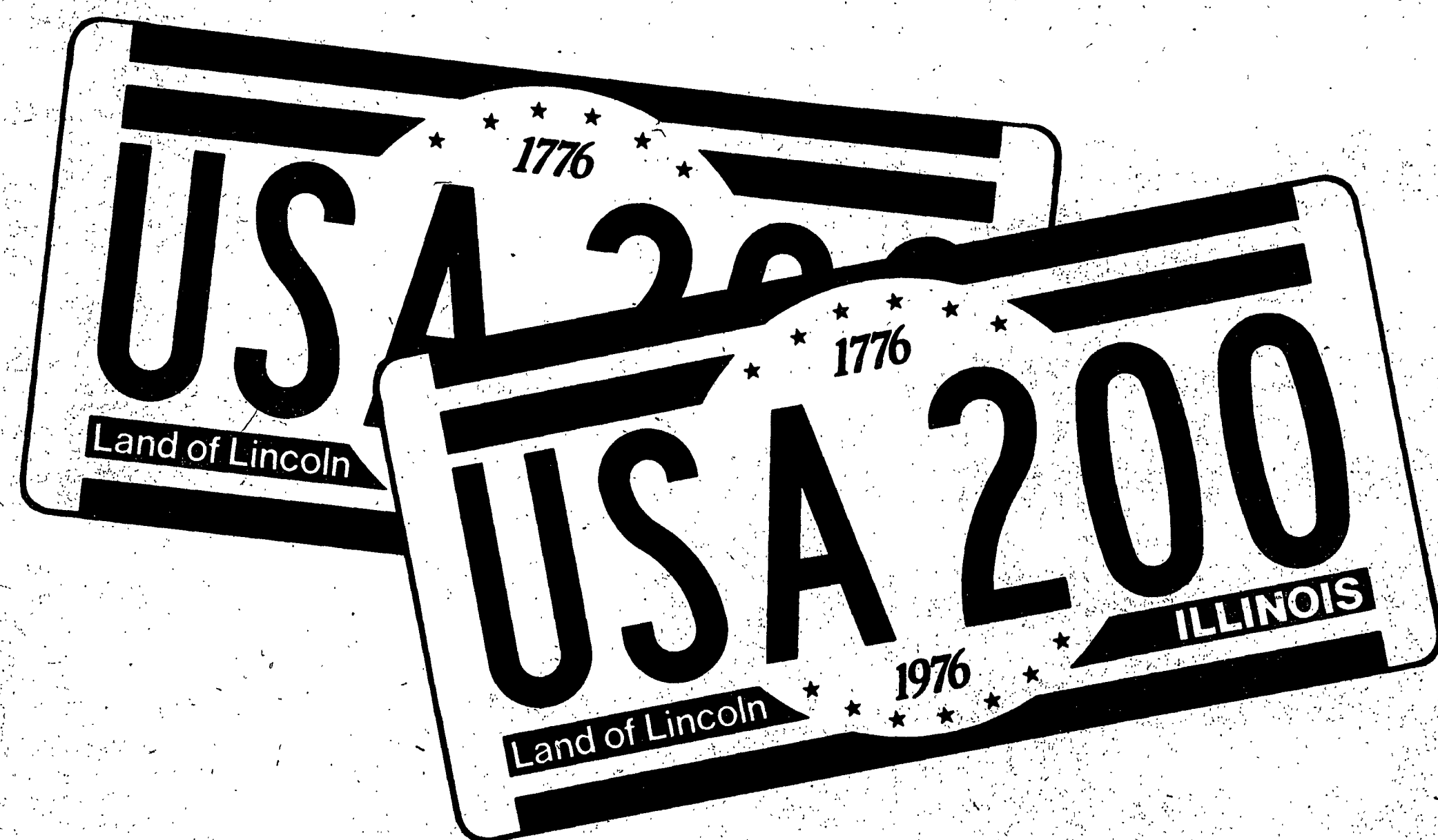

Suburban Police radio network in effect end of 1976

A new relay-type radio communications system linking 13 north suburban police departments is expected to go into operation some time in December of 1976.

The North Regional Telecommunications Network (NORCOM) is a pilot program which will transmit communications by voice over an uncluttered radio network for police departments of Niles, Morton Grove, Skokie, Lincolnwood, Wheeling, Winnetka, Wilmette, Northbrook, Glenview, Golf, Glencoe, Kenilworth and Northfield.

A bid contract of \$819,579 awarded to General Electric Co. of Lynchburg, Va., was announced at a downtown Chicago press conference Monday, Nov. 17, for purchase of equipment with an expected delivery date around September, 1976.

An estimate of another 3 months to obtain the equipment for placement according to Niles Police Chief Clarence Emrickson will hopefully put the 13 police departments on a totally operational basis, using UHF, by Jan. 1, 1977.

Equipment for the project communications system includes installation of new radios in patrol cars and portable units for wear by detectives.

Emrickson said the system is planned to avoid the overcrowding of police radio frequencies that occurred in the 1973 Hillside policeman Anthony Raymond's kidnap and murder.

Formerly, he said, Niles shared a VHF frequency with Palatine, Elgin, Arlington Heights, Mt. Prospect, Buffalo Grove, Wheeling, Des Plaines, Park Ridge and Morton Grove. If several accidents occurred around the same time in different suburbs, he said, police frequencies were overcrowded with communications by police trying to cover their own incident. The new system uses a repeater-type communications by relaying messages.

NORCOM is financed under a 90% Federal grant (\$792,796) from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration; 5% state grant (\$44,044) from the Illinois Law Enforcement Commission and another 5% (\$44,044) in local monies from the combined 13 group suburban towns.

Niles' share of \$5,000 is provided under general funds of the village budget. Funding by each suburb differs, dependent on the size of the suburb and the amount of equipment needed for department personnel.

Northbrook was selected for administration of work performance specifics on the project, said the Niles police chief, and contacted individual suburbs for bid approval of equipment and project funding.

Combined operation of the 13 suburbs helped bring down the cost of the program, said Emrickson, who projected a similar

cost and workload "possibly in another year", for installation of digital computer code signals for use by the combined departments.

Altho NORCOM is a pilot project unique in its kind, according to Emrickson, there are at least two other pilot projects involving other police departments. Oak Park, River Forest and Forest Park have a pilot program using a computerized dispatch system centrally located in Oak Park with the ability by River Forest and Forest Park to transmit on the same channels.

Arlington Heights, Mt. Prospect, Buffalo Grove and Elk Grove are totally centrally dispatched out of Arlington Heights. Neither of the latter systems appealed to Niles said the Police Chief, resulting in selection by the combined 13-member group of the repeater transmittal, due to increased capabilities of the system.

Several years of street experience will be needed said the Niles police chief before determination of which pilot program is the better.

Mikva announces candidacy for re-election

Stressing a Bicentennial Theme, Mikva commented on the "sense of discouragement" that now pervades the American people and he challenged other public officials to join him in trying to combat this gloom by proving that government can work in the people's best interests.

"There is a grim irony that as we prepare to celebrate the Bicentennial, millions of Americans find little to celebrate about," Mikva said. "We cannot continue to allow the heavy hand of discouragement to cast a giant shadow over this country. We can

throw up our own hands in resignation, or we can resolve to translate our grievances into action - into reforms and programs that will give cause for true celebration."

Mikva outlined the "agenda for change" in an updated version of the Bill of Particulars, a list of grievances compiled in 1776 by the authors of the Declaration of Independence, who pledged to work to remedy those grievances.

The Congressman, 49, who is completing his third term in Congress, announced his candidacy in the Holiday Inn of Evanston, 1501 Sherman. For two terms he represented the then Second District of Illinois. Mikva was narrowly defeated in running for Congress from the Tenth District in 1972, but regained his seat in 1974.

He is a member of the House Ways and Means Committee, which is responsible for writing tax legislation, and of the committee's Social Security and Trade Subcommittees. He is also chairman of the Democratic Study Group's task force on health policy.
