Deadline for 'Circuit Breaker' tax program

Congressman Abner J. Mikva has announced that December 31 is the deadline for Illinois senior citizens and disabled persons to file for tax relief under the Illinois law commonly referred to as the Circuit Breaker law.

Anyone who would like information on the tax relief program or a claim form to apply may call Congressman Mikva's Des. Plaines office, 297-0515. The law provides relief for property taxes and other taxes.

"Many senior citizens and disabled persons who live in the Tenth District and contact me for assistance in meeting their tax burden do not realize that the Circuit Breaker law exists, and those who know about it may not realize that the deadline for filing has been changed," the Congressman said. "The tax relief provided by the law is critical to those who live on fixed incomes and that would include most of our elderly and disabled people."

Mikva noted that the December 31 deadline applies to claims for tax relief based on 1976 taxes as well as for all retroactive benefits based on 1972-75 taxes. Starting with 1977 taxes, payable in 1978, all Circuit Breaker claims must be filed within one year of the taxes paid.

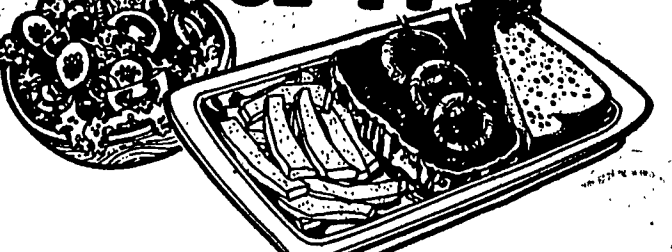

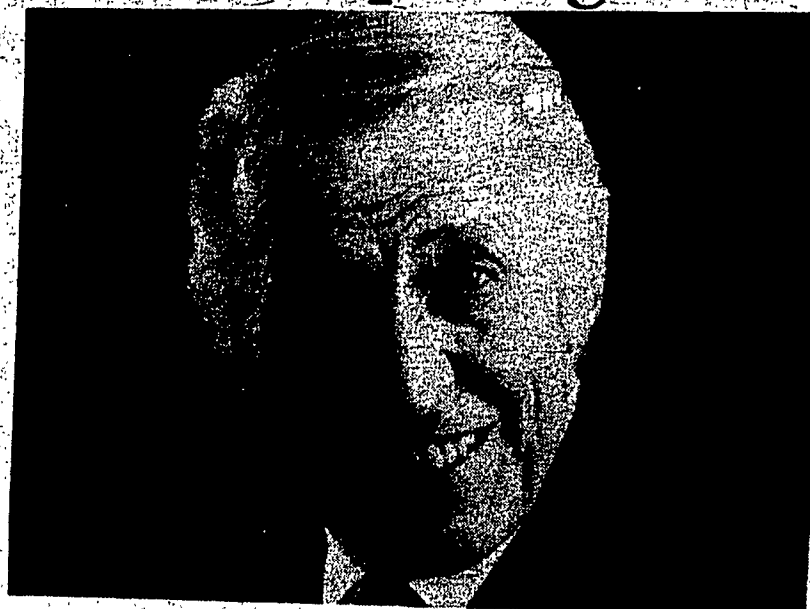

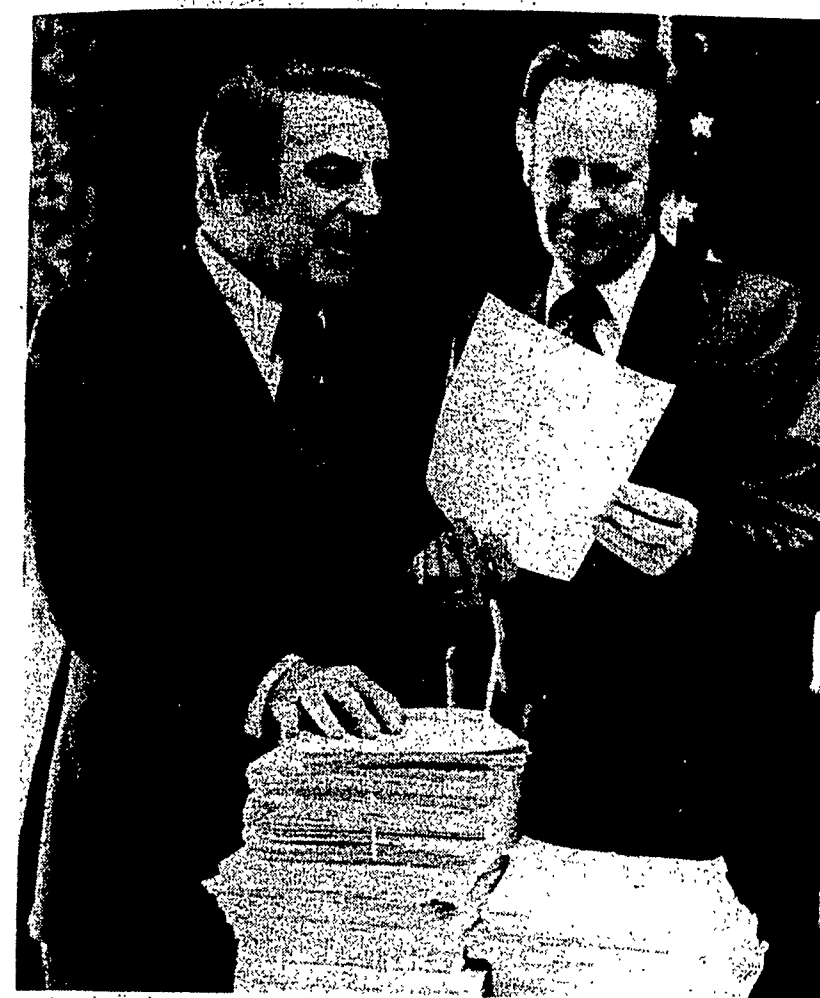

Mikva delivers O'Hare/SST protest letters

Mikva delivered the letters to Secretary Adams' office in Washington, D.C. In the letters, residents stressed the health hazard caused by the high-pitched and continual noise from aircraft, particularly its detrimental effect on children. They asked that the noise be curbed and that the supersonic transport aircraft (SST) not be allowed to land at O'Hare.

A group led by Mrs. Pat Galla of Des Plaines delivered the letters to the Congressman Nov. 12 in his Des Plaines office. More than 4,300 people signed the letters. Each person signed five copies -- for President Carter, Secretary Adams, Federal Aviation Administration Administrator Langhorne Bond, Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Douglas Costle and Congressman Mikva. Mikva has introduced legislation to curb noise inflicted on the residential neighborhoods around O'Hare, the world's busiest airport. He also opposes a proposal that the Concorde be allowed to land at O'Hare.
