The fee is \$10 for vehicles 35 horsepower and under, \$15 for vehicles over 35 horsepower, according to Stephen J. Stollen, Clerk. The horsepower categories are set by the State, he adds. Residents are asked to bring in their vehicle identification cards received with their Illinois license plates to assist in filling out the applications for county vehicle stickers.

## Assessor urges vacant lot owners to contact office

Robert P. Hanrahan, Niles Township Assessor, would like to advise those homeowners who own a vacant lot which is part of a complete residential homestead that they may be entitled to a reduction in the rate of assessment on that vacant property. These homeowners may also be entitled to a refund on their 1980 real estate tax bills for these vacant parcels.

Most vacant property is assessed at 22 percent of market value, however, if the property is actually part of the residential parcel the Cook County Assessor has been permitting a 16 percent assessment rate.

"Our office has already assisted 415 owners of vacant parcels adjacent to their homesites this year in obtaining reductions on their assessed valuations", Hanrahan stated.

"If you own a vacant lot that is part of your residential homestead we would urge you to contact our office as soon as possible so that we may assist you in filing for a reduction in the rate of assessment", Hanrahan said. The Assessor's Office is open Monday thru Friday 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. or call 673-9300.

## Bugle Digest Local News Briefs

Village Manager Ken Scheel reports Niles 20 snow plows were at work at 5 a.m. Monday morning following Sunday night's snow. In plowing Niles' 150 miles of streets the Public Works Department used 600 tons of salt last year and expect to use more this year.

The one lane still closed to traffic on Caldwell Ave. south of Dempster St. should be open to traffic within days. Because of this summer's road construction worker's strike, the Caldwell Ave. work left unfinished has been patched and will be resumed next spring. Also the straightening of the intersection at Courtland and Milwaukee Aves. has been completed except for some landscaping to be done next spring.

Niles' much publicized slogan contest stopped accepting slogan entries on Monday, Dec. 21. Trustee Bart Murphy, heading up the contest, will meet with contest judges after the New Year to find the ten best slogans. Top prize is a \$100 savings bond. Other prizes include old village street signs and very used office equipment. The contest was begun to find a new slogan to replace the much used "All America City" designation.

Bugle congratulations to Niles Police Sgt. Chuck Giovanelli and his wife Judy on the birth of their son, Nicholas Charles Nels. The baby weighed 6 lbs. 12 oz. even though he made his debut three weeks early. The Giovanelli's daughter Christina, 7, is eagerly awaiting the homecoming of her mother and little brother on Christmas Eve.

A \$1,000 reward has been offered by the employer of Anna Lucy Roberto, the 15-year-old Morton Grove girl who was killed on Golf Road in Skokie on Monday, Dec. 14 by a hit-and-run driver. Earl Wenzel, sales manager for Fergus Datsun said Miss Roberto who was a part-time clerical worker for the dealership had left the office early Monday evening on a supper break. She was waiting in the middle of Golf Road for a break in the traffic when she was struck by an eastbound car and was thrown 43 feet. Skokie police believe the car that struck Miss Roberto was a dark green, blue or brown with a dull finish. It is thought to be a full-size car and probably a 1976 or earlier model. Funeral services were held last Friday at St. Sophia Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Chicago. She is survived by her parents, Raul and Anna and a brother Reuben, all of Morton Grove.

Finishing touches are being made in anticipation of the opening of the renovated Grennan Heights Fieldhouse, 8255 Oketo. Grand Opening ceremonies will take place Monday, December 28 from 9:30 to 11 a.m. The fieldhouse renovation includes a new wooden gymnasium floor, increased locker room facilities and a new weight training room. In other park district happenings, there will be extended hours during the holiday season at the Ballard Ice Rink. Also, cross country skiing is again being offered this winter at the Tam Golf Course. Ski equipment can be rented at the course. For information call the Niles Park District at 967-6633.

Niles Park District Director Bill Hughes said the park district will acquire the deed to Chesterfield Park before the end of the year. Located in the 8600 block of Shermer Rd., the quarter-acre park belongs to the Chesterfield Country Club, Inc. which has leased the park to the Niles Park District for the past eight years for \$1 per year. In October officials of the Chesterfield group approached the Niles Park District offering the park land to the park district. It is thought the Chesterfield Country Club will lower its property tax assessment by the transfer of the deed.

The Niles Park District plans to survey unused land in Niles which has the potential to be converted to park district use. The survey will be conducted by the park district's new administrative assistant to be hired after the first of the year.

Both Oakton Community College students and residents of the college district should expect to be paying more to the college after the first of the year. The OCC Board of Trustees are expected during their January meeting, to raise class fees charged to students from the current \$12 per credit hour to \$14 per hour. Additionally, the college trustees are expected to soon seek an increase in the property tax rate assessed homeowners from 21.3 cents per \$100 to possibly 22.5 cents.

## MG Parks set limit on convention expenses

Morton Grove Park Board members were finally in unanimous agreement on the convention expenditure issue, as they voted to limit allowances to \$25 per day for state and \$50 per day for national meetings. This action was taken at their December meeting last Monday evening.

Trustee Nick Boznos, who has for months been under criticism by his fellow board members for publicizing their past convention funds, which were far in excess of

surrounding park districts, made the motion to place limits on the advances. While no receipts would be required, commissioners must return any money not spent. Boznos said, "It is assumed that commissioners can use their consciences to return any extra money, as long as the people trusted them enough to elect them."

In other park business, Park Director Dave Huber submitted a study of part time staff salaries, that included comparisons with surrounding park districts, and gave recommendations for raises. Boznos questioned if "there was absolutely a need for an increase in wages at this time, and Board President Ronald Piper appointed Trustees Eileen Courney and Dodee Connelly to review the proposals in committee.

The Park District will also hold ribbon cutting ceremonies, officially opening the gymnasium, at 11 a.m., immediately preceding the first basketball game of the park district sponsored by Holiday Basketball Tournament.

The Niles Park District has done extensive renovation and improvements to the facility - which include installation of a new wood gymnasium floor, and the purchase and installation of thirteen pieces of Universal exercise equipment for a Fitness Room. Other improvements to the facility include carpeting the Fitness Room, revamping of locker and washroom facilities and general painting.

All residents are invited to come through the facility during the Open House hours or at any time during the day while the Holiday Basketball Tournament is being held.

Our facility will be open throughout the Holiday Season from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. for open gym basketball play, etc. when the Tournament is not being held, and for general use of the fitness room.

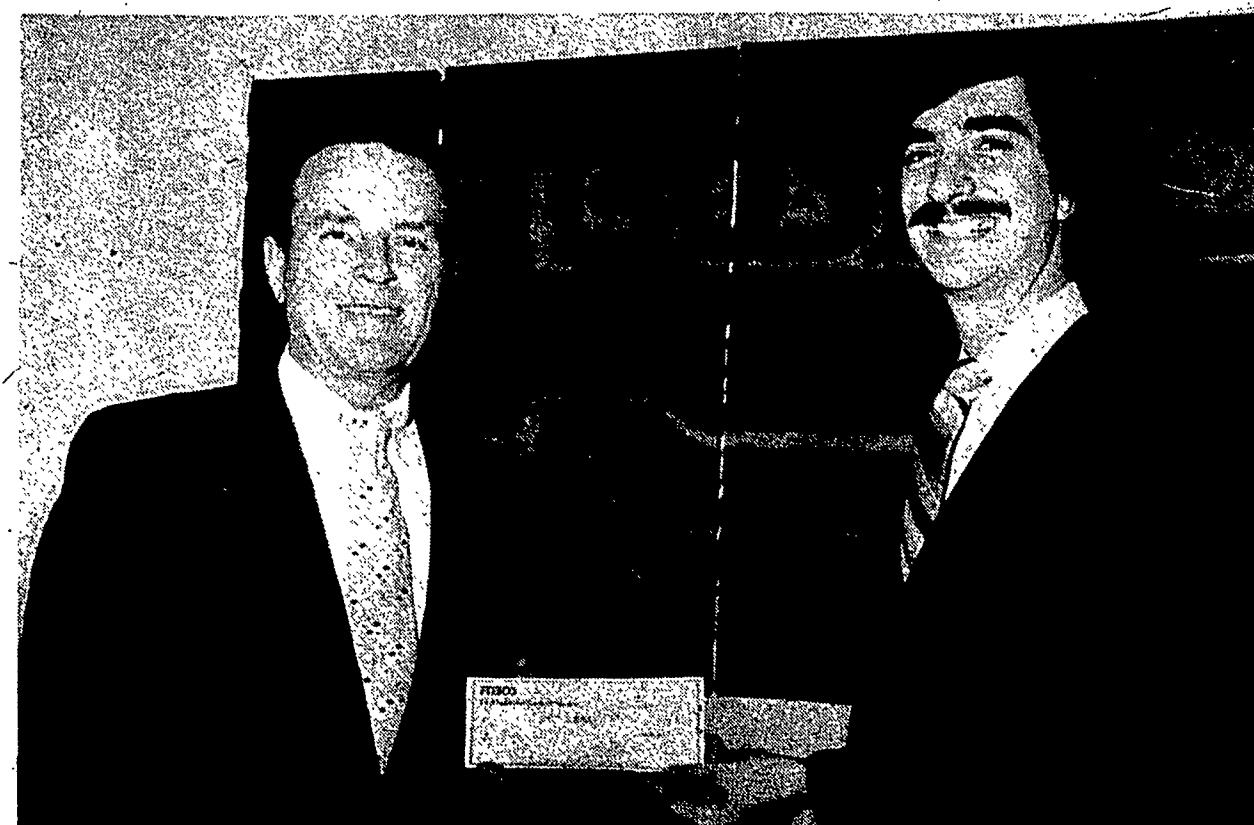

## Centel increases charges for service

A tariff filed by Central Telephone Company of Illinois (Centel) to increase charges for telephone service connections was

approved by the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC) and became effective Dec. 13. The tariff also gives single line business

and residential customers the option to avoid many of those connection charges by allowing them to handle some of the connection activities themselves.

The company previously issued an announcement on the tariff after it had been filed with the ICC in November, prior to commission approval.

Donald Adkisson, general manager-regulatory/planning for Centel-Illinois, pointed out that under previous regulations, the lowest total cost to connect basic service in a new home was \$23. "Beginning Dec. 13 the total cost of the service connection increases by only \$6.50 for customers who take full advantage of the new options and do some of the service connection work themselves," he explained. "This work may include picking up a phone at one of our Pick-A-Phone Centers or doing their own telephone wiring inside their residence, which of course is already installed in many homes."

Adkisson emphasized that the tariff represents a continuing effort by Centel to adjust rates to more accurately reflect the actual costs of providing particular kinds of services.

Under this new tariff Centel could charge a maximum of \$79.25 to install a new main telephone if a customer doesn't take advantage of the option to do some of the service connection work himself.

"By doing some of that work a customer could avoid as much as \$49.75 in service costs, which would reduce Centel's charge for a basic installation to \$29.50," Adkisson explained.

"With an extension outlet, a desk jack installed by Centel could require a maximum charge of \$45.25. But if a customer could use all the options to avoid costs, the total company charge could be

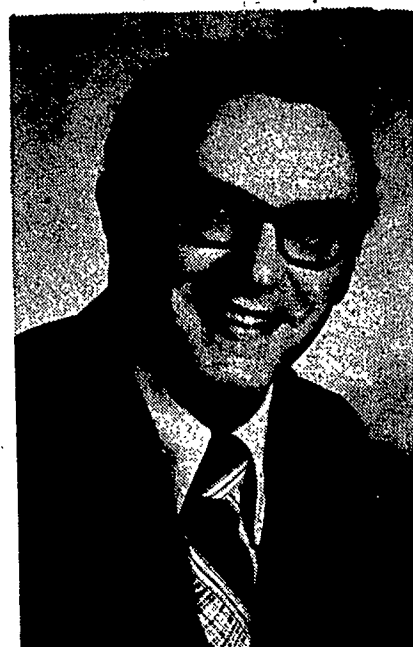

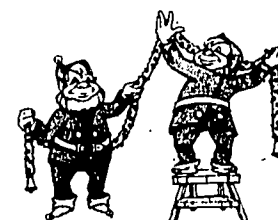

For the main telephone and extension package, Centel could charge a maximum of: \$79.25 for the main telephone, \$23.75 for inside wiring for an extension outlet, \$7.50 for a desk jack for connection of an extension outlet.

This brings the maximum total charge for this package to \$110.50. However, if customers use the available options and handle some of the connection activities themselves, Centel's minimum total service charge for this package would be \$29.50.

## Skokie restoring log cabin for historical museum

Utilizing revenue sharing funds, the Village of Skokie is relocating and restoring a log cabin that is believed to be one of the first dwellings built in what is now known as Skokie.

The log cabin, originally built by Nicholas Meyer in the 1840's, is now being reconstructed behind the original Skokie firehouse at 801 Floral. Architect Tom Hatzold planned the project, and Rick Bott is the general contractor for this unique reconstruction effort.

The 16 by 24 foot cabin was dismantled and moved from its original site of Harris and Lincoln Avenues, and stored at the village public works garage. It is now being restored at the Floral site to be used as a museum and serve as a reminder of Skokie's history. The Skokie Historical

Society will be providing furnishings and other materials of that era for use inside the building.

The restored building will have some advantages the original log cabin didn't. The building now sits on a concrete foundation and shingles on the roof will be fire-treated. Hatzold has also added some additional supports for the second floor of the building.

The project should be completely finished by spring of 1982, but much of the outside work is expected to be finished by Christmas Eve.

Nicholas Meyer, the man who built this cabin, was a Swiss immigrant who is said to be the first settler in this area. Meyer was a farmer and also hewed wagon wheel spokes, which were then transported for sale to Chicago.

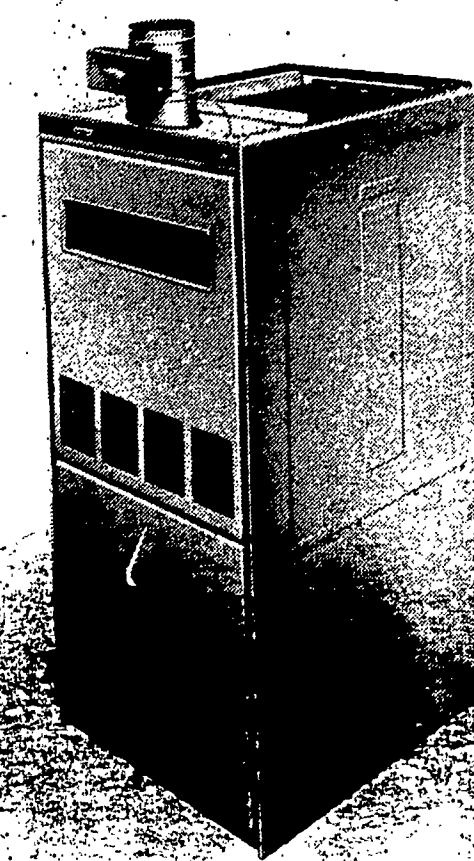

Murphy thought the village attorney was asking for a one year extension for the bonds and insisted the expiration period be July, 1982, as was agreed to in a previous resolution of the board.

In other actions Tuesday night the board approved the rezoning of 7847 Caldwell Ave. from B-2 to M Zoning for a Warehouse and Office Use for Arlington Heights Federal Savings and Loan and Amalgated Trust petitioners.

The warehouse is a conversion of the former Tam O'Shanter Tennis Club which, at one time, was under consideration for purchase by two members of the Niles Park Board... Referred to the Zoning Board a petition to consider placing all ground supported radio, television towers, antennas, and parabolic dish antennas (satellite antennas) to be permitted under R-1, 2, 3, and 4 Special Use.

Presently one homeowner has a 10 foot in diameter satellite antenna in his backyard in the Harlem-Dempster area. Since it was never approved by the village, the owner will be obliged to seek the new zoning or will have to remove it, according to village officials.

Ordinances approved Tuesday night include the following:

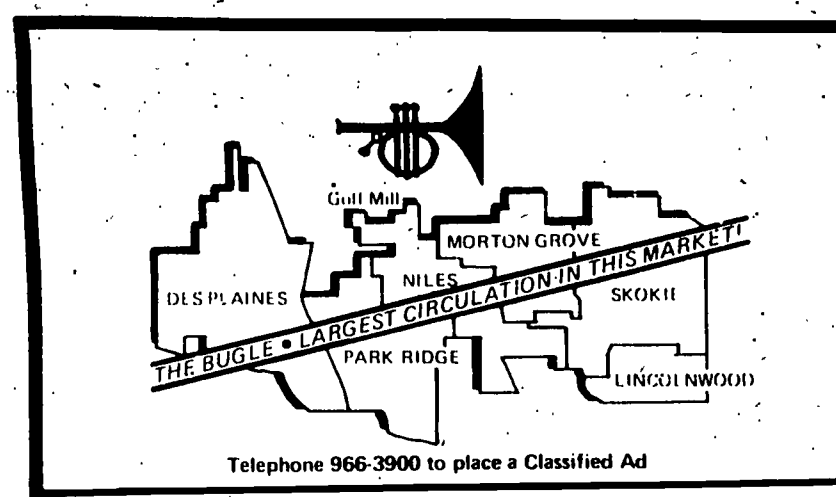
