



FOOT NOTES

By Dr. James Elipas

Podiatrists call it onychomycosis and it sounds really deadly. The textbooks call it Fungus Nail and that makes it sound really yucky. What this common foot ailment is, is nothing but an abnormally thickened toenail caused by a jungus infection.

While the thickened nail is, of course, cosmetically unattractive, the real problem with this type of ailment is the excessive pressure it puts on the toes when shoes are worn. Frequently we see patients with thickened nails who have sore and ulcerated toe tips caused by the downward pressure of the shoe on the nail.

Treatment of a fungus nail is through the surgical removal of the nail. While this used to be an uncomfortable procedure, it is now routinely performed in our offices with the latest in surgical technology, a carbon dioxide laser. Under local anesthetic, the nail is removed painlessly and quickly.

With the new laser equipment, this procedure not only cuts healing time in half but also sterilizes the nail bed, preventing a reoccurrence of the problem.







1 pound red snapper fillets 1 cup tomatoes, peeled, & chopped 1 cup green pepper strips 1 cup onion, chopped Garlic powder Salt and pepper
