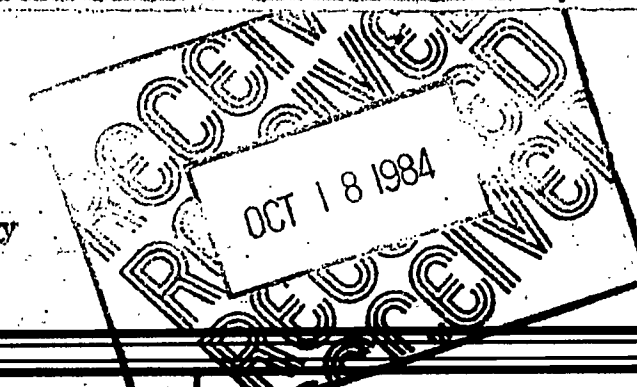

Consider tax levy to finance major park improvement

Building addition in park plans

At Tuesday's Niles park board meeting, park board president Mary Marusek said the board attorney would study the feasibility for a tax levy in anticipation of a major improvement for the park district.

Ms. Marusek said the board might consider the building of a maintenance garage or the closing of the atrium at the Schreiner Grennan Heights center or the replacement of park buses as a major improvement requiring the use of tax money.

The improvement would not result in any park tax increase to residents. It was pointed out the readjustment and purchase of new bonds last year freed the district to have more tax revenue available. Prior to the last year's bond readjustment the district's tax revenue maximum was used up preventing any further tax moneys going for such expenditures.

No time table was set and the determination of any project

Maine Township Hall designated disaster site

The Maine Township Town Hall has been designated as an official Red Cross disaster site to be used as a shelter in case of emergency, Township Supervisor Paul K. Halverson has announced.

Halverson said the township signed an agreement on Oct. 5 with Allen Graber, Red Cross area representative. "This will allow the Red Cross to come in and set up facilities to provide food and lodging to victims in the event of tornadoes, major floods, fires or other disasters," Halverson said. "The township is committed to providing community services, and there is no more vital services we could possibly provide than the use of the Town Hall as a disaster shelter."

A questionnaire aimed at assessing the needs and desires of the Oakton Community College district residents will be enclosed in more than 200,000 issues of the College's Oakton Report newspaper being mailed this month to households in the district and Evanston. The questionnaire is part of an intensive new effort by the College to identify community needs.

A steering committee has also been formed to assist the College in focusing on needs of the eastern part of the district. "The committee will provide input and guidance as we assess the needs of the eastern part of our district, develop alternatives and options to help us meet these needs, and implement those programs and courses authorized by the Board of Trustees," said Trudy Bers, OCC director of research and a member of the steering committee. Telephone surveys and other information gathering methods will be used to assist the committee.

Committee members are: Joseph W. Hill, Evanston; Kathy Hurley, New Trier; Morton

Paradise, Skokie; Sally Freeman, OCC student; Frank Fonsino, OCC associate professor of history; Sandy Veracka, OCC classified staff; Dr. B. Diane Davis, OCC vice president for community and administrative services; Dr. Carol Davis, acting assistant vice president for educational services and chief administrator of OCC/Skokie; Diana Loveland, liaison from the OCC Board of Trustees; and Bers.

"We have enclosed the questionnaire in the Oakton Report so that everyone in the community will receive it," Bers said. "The information that we get from this survey is crucial as we plan for the future, so we're hopeful that people will take the time to complete the survey and return it."

The Oakton district serves more than 400,000 people in Niles, Maine, Northfield, and New Trier Townships. Though Evanston is not part of a community college district, many of the city's residents attend Oakton on a charge-back basis.

Serving Up Food & Fitness

The coming of cold weather usually means football, runny noses, and heavier eating. Unfortunately, it also means less activity to burn off those extra pounds. It is true that the human body needs more calories to burn in the colder weather but if one doesn't watch their intake of extra thick soups and stews, dieting will be the first thing on next Spring's agenda. Cutting calories

Reduced Calorie Beef Barley Soup Makes 6 servings

- 1 lb. Beef, lean and cubed
- 1 Tbl. oil
- 8 Cups Beef Broth, Homemade or low salt
- 1/2 cup barley
- 1 Tsp. Basil
- 1 Cup peas
- 2 Cups Carrot slices
- 1/4 chopped Onion

In a large dutch oven, brown beef in the oil. Add broth and bring to a boil. When boiling, add the barley and the basil. Simmer for an hour. Add the vegetables and cook until the carrots are tender, season to taste.

Lamb and Vegetable Stew Makes 6 servings

- 1 Lb. Lamb, cubed
- 1 Tbl. oil
- 2 Cups water
- 2 Bay Leaves
- 1 Tsp. thyme
- 1/4 Tsp. pepper
- 8 Med. Carrots, quartered
- 8 small Potatoes, quartered
- 4 onions, quartered
- 1 Cup beef Broth

1 Tbls. Cornstarch in 1/4 cup water
Brown lamb in the oil in a large dutch oven. Add the water, bay leaves, thyme, garlic and pepper. Bring to a boil and simmer for a hour. Add the rest of the vegetables and the broth. Simmer for an addition 45 minutes until the vegetables are tender. Thicken with the cornstarch mixture before serving.

Extra Lean Chicken Casserole Makes 4 Servings

- 2 Large Whole Chicken Breasts, Halved, Skinned & Boned
- 2 Med. Potatoes, Quartered
- 2 Carrots, Quartered
- 1 Large onion cut into wedges
- 3/4 cup dry white wine or Chicken Broth
- 1 Bay Leaf

8 Oz. Frozen Green Beans, thawed
In a large casserole or baking dish arrange the chick, vegetables and Bay Leaves. Pour the wine or broth over all and cover tightly with foil. Bake in a 350 oven for a hour. Then add the green beans, recover, and return to oven for 15 minutes. Sprinkle with paprika if desired before serving.

Fish Chowder 4 (1 1/2-cup) Servings

- 1 lb. fish fillets
- 1 cup chopped onions
- 1 Tbls. Diet Margarine
- 2 Cups water
- 1 Large potato, cubed
- 1 Cup sliced carrots
- 1/2 Cup sliced celery
- 1 Bay leaf

1/2 Tsp. thyme
Dash of pepper
2 Cups skim milk
3 Tbls. flour
1/2 Tsp. salt
Chopped parsley and lemon wedges if desired
In Dutch oven or large saucepan, saute onions in margarine until tender. Add water, potato, carrots, celery, bay leaf, thyme and pepper; bring to a boil. Cover; simmer about 20 minutes or until vegetables are tender. Stir in fish and 1-3/4 cups milk. Stir flour into remaining 1/4 cup milk; stir into chowder. Cook until fish is opaque and chowder is thoroughly heated. Add salt, if desired. Serve sprinkled with parsley and a squeeze of lemon, if desired.

doesn't mean that you have to eat salad all winter. What you can do is cut down on as much fat, starch, and sugar as possible. Old favorite soups, stews and casseroles can be made leaner with slight modification and still be very satisfying.

Here are some ways to trim down calories from favorite recipes:

- Substitute more low calorie vegetables for red meat in stews and soups.
- Cut the amount of fat in a recipe in half and always drain your meat after browning.
- Always skim as much fat off of soups and stews as possible.
- The easiest way is to refrigerate food until fat hardens.
- Use as little cornstarch or flour as possible to thicken foods.
- Serve crackers or breadsticks instead of bread with a meal.

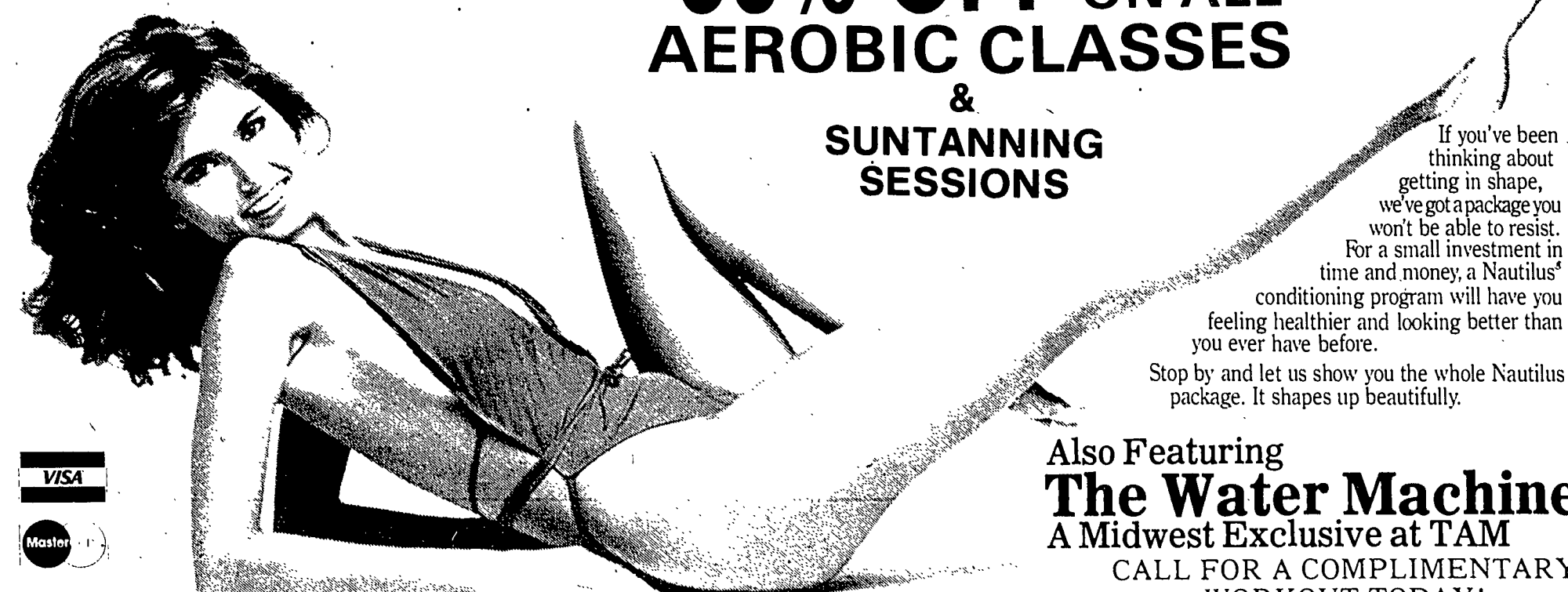

Special traffic laws for funerals

by Secretary of State Jim Edgar

Special traffic laws addressing funeral processions can help Illinois motorists avoid accidents.

Illinois law gives funeral processions the right to travel through intersections without stopping as long as due caution is exercised after the lead vehicle has complied with any traffic control devices.

If the funeral procession is crossing in front of you, stop and wait until all vehicles have

cleared the intersection before proceeding. If the procession is coming toward you, do not turn in front of it or cross its path.

Vehicles in a funeral procession must have their headlights on, and usually can be further identified by a funeral pennant, flag or windshield sticker displayed on each vehicle.

If you are following a funeral procession, you may pass the vehicles if you don't cause a traffic hazard or interfere with the procession.

Vehicles not in a funeral procession are not allowed to join the procession unless directed by a traffic officer, and cannot form a procession or convoy to obtain the special right-of-way privileges granted to funeral processions.



Capparelli and Egan launch school reform group

Area citizens, led by House Majority Whip Ralph C. Capparelli and State Sen. Robert Egan, launched the first of several local meetings to discuss key issues on educational reform in Illinois.

The group, made up of local educators, business people, parents, singles, seniors, and others, is one of 118 formed

across the state by the Illinois Project for School Reform. From these groups will come discussion, debate and ultimately grass-roots level support for the reform recommendations they will present to the General Assembly in Jan. 1985.

Performance standards, teacher certification, curriculum, funding alternatives, and the relationships between the local community and its school system will be among the topics discussed throughout the meetings.

"The problems confronting education are enormous," said Rep. Capparelli. "This group is a positive effort to try and resolve some of them through the legislative process."

The Illinois Project for School Reform is a bi-partisan, privately funded effort working on select reform issues in elementary and secondary education. The project hopes to improve not only the state's educational system, but also to improve the public's confidence in that system by strengthening the relationship between the community and the local schools.

The 16-month campaign is a joint project of Chicago United, an influential consortium of major corporations and the Roosevelt Center for American Policy Studies, a public policy think tank.

According to the project's executive director Michael Bakalis, a major thrust of the project will be directed towards that 78 percent of the state's adult population which he says has no children in the public schools.

"There is no constituency out there for public schools," he said. "We've got to deal with the self-interest of that 78 percent. What we need is an aroused constituency that can be activated at the grass-roots level to move these programs."

"Consumers not only are concerned about public utility rate increases, but also worried and confused over the effect on their lives of the unprecedented changes in the telephone industry," Kustra said.

"This work of this committee in the coming year will be critical. Because of a recent change in state law, the Illinois Commerce Commission will automatically terminate unless the regulations governing it are rewritten," Kustra said.

Jaffe, who seeks election to his eighth term in the Illinois House of Representatives, has successfully sponsored major legislation dealing with child protection, crime victims' rights, the reform of ineffective criminal sexual assault law, and education.

trance down the middle of the dining room. When she entered flanked by secret service men, the inevitable T.V. camera was directly in front of her. As she wound her way to the podium Roman Pucinski led the cry of "Gerrrr-ee, Gerr-ee," as she walked behind the moving T.V. camera.

Onstage Congressman Dan Rostenkowski introduced her. He faux paused the word "close" for clothes once but recovered quickly joking he approved of Mrs. Ferraro's wardrobe as well.

Ms. Ferraro read her speech in a very subdued manner. We were a bit surprised. She was talking to a very partisan crowd who was just waiting to cheer her on. We expected some off-the-cuff freewheeling rhetoric. But the lady read her speech quietly.

These events seem mostly made for the media. Roped off, directly in front of the platform, were 10 to 15 T.V. cameras. Reporters, cameramen and their staffs were filming the message for the later news programs on Saturday. It obviously restrains the candidate. No longer are there any free-spirited colloquies between the candidate and her flock. The message goes across the airwaves all over the world. And what is said in Niles, Illinois on Saturday morning is seen and heard in London, Paris and Moscow by that evening.

Ms. Ferraro started off by saying she had beaten George Bush in last week's debate and Bush outdebated his running mate, President Reagan. She then began reading her prepared for T.V. and the world speech.

We were standing alongside the press rope at the center of the room. Just before the candidate came into the room, several young women began pushing their way through the crowd trying to get in front of the standees. When a slim young lady tried to elbow by me, I told her she was rude and unfair to the people who had been standing there for many minutes. She became quite indignant, told her friend

I was "sick" and said to her friend she felt like socking me in the mouth. Since this is the generation which brought in ERA, I felt obliged to tell her I would treat her equally and give her a shot right back in the same location. She looked at me with disdain and quickly left our area. But one of her cohorts stayed there. When the candidate began speaking, shouts about abortion were heard around the room. One of the shouters was one of the "pushers" in our area who stayed to shout down the speaker. Ms. Ferraro stopped her speech and told the audience her Mother long ago taught her about courtesy. She then mentioned free speech was what America is all about and the shouters stopped their yelling. Again, the T.V. people moved their cameras toward the shouters. We assumed the young women's efforts were also a part of gaining the attention of the media.

After the short bit of shouting the Democrats sent three women after the shouter in our area. She quickly retreated and left the room. While most of the people around her were not particularly angry, nevertheless, counter-shouters, tried to express their feelings. The most wicked comment came from one guy who yelled, "Don't worry lady, you'll never get knocked up. Nobody will ever want to sleep with you." At that moment the three Democratic lady workers were coming after her and she quickly moved to the rear of the room.

Ms. Ferraro spoke for no more than 20 minutes. The crowd cheered her speech. The entourage, replete with Secret Service men, T.V. people and campaign staff workers then marched back down the roped-off aisle, quickly filling out of the restaurant, heading for their next stop.

Outside the restaurant the anti-abortion people were waving signs as the crowd dispersed.

Everyone did their thing. And Saturday night the T.V. networks had a 30 second segment of Geraldine Ferraro visiting Niles.

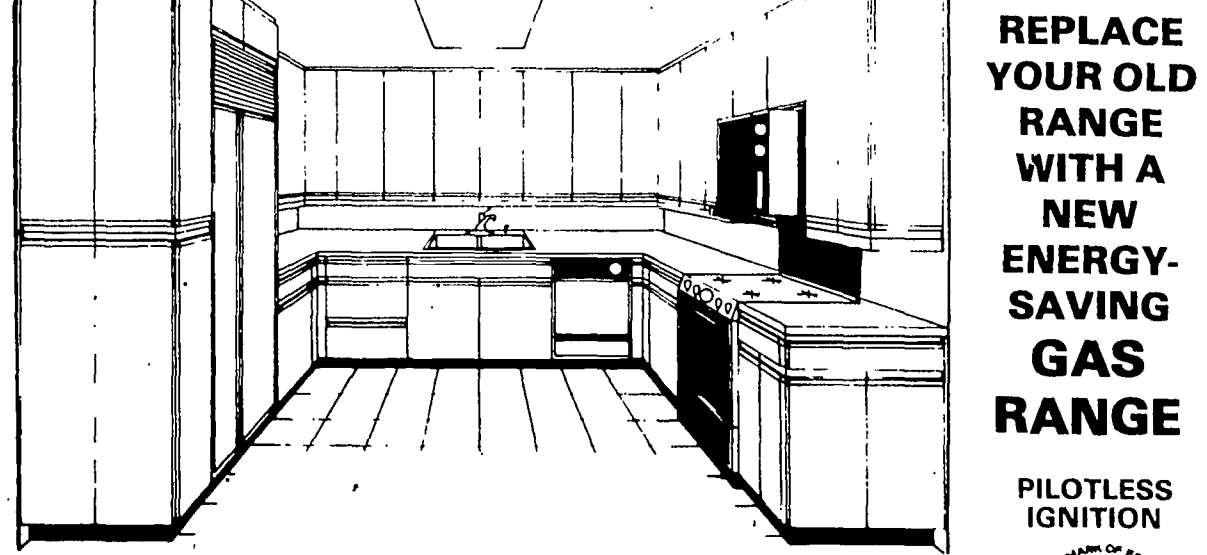

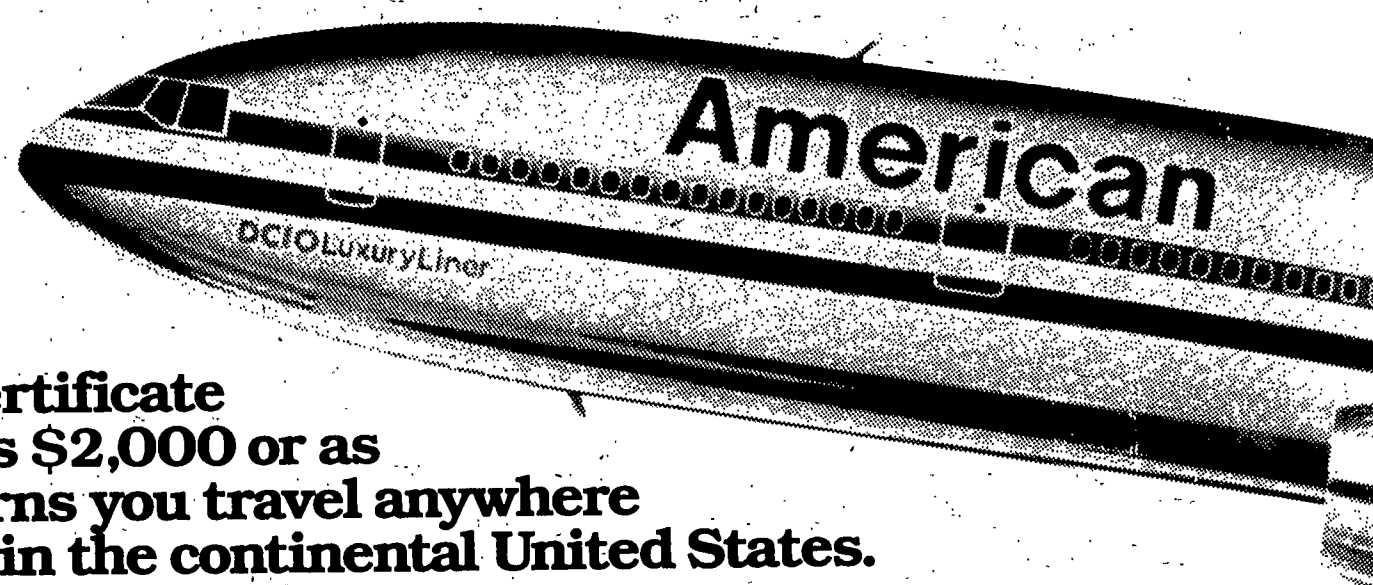
