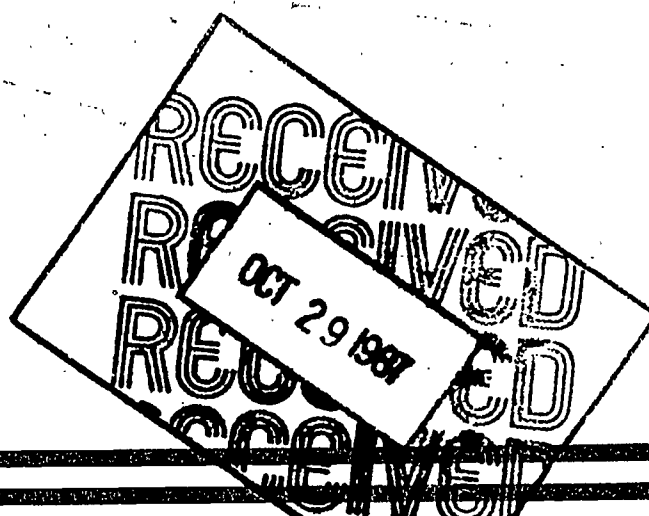

\$5 million bonds ok'd for Lawrencewood

Tuesday night the village board approved a resolution to borrow up to \$5 million worth of bonds for the public improvement and for facilities of the Lawrencewood Shopping Center. The board was told by its financial advisors by

purchasing the bonds before the end of the year. Niles would not be subject to arbitrage laws. The advantage to the 1987 purchase is Niles could invest the money up to three years and take advantage of higher interest

rates while having the resources available for the acquisition of Lawrencewood. The board also approved paying financial counselors Kane, McKenna and Associates Continued on Page 25

People will go to the polls Tuesday, Nov. 3 for election of school board members in various local elementary school districts, as well as Maine Township High School District 207 and Oakton Community College District 535.

One incumbent and two

newcomers are completing for three seats on the Oakton Community College board.

Newcomers John Di Leo of Park Ridge, Judy (Jatinder) Wadhwa of Northbrook and incumbent Cecile Vye running for two six-year terms on the college board. Ken Latos, who served for the last six years, is not seeking re-election.

From the Left Hand

We were talking to Niles police sergeant John Katsoulas about the number of relatively young Niles policemen who have passed away in recent years. While their deaths were due to a variety of causes, John startled us with one comment he made. He said policemen who retire only live about three years past their retirement. He noted the stress of the job plays a heavy toll on policemen in their later years.

We had heard firemen also have a higher rate of heart problems than the general population. It is likely due to similar stress.

Policemen and firemen, suffering from heart illness, are now eligible for disability pay. Not too many years ago this was not the case. But an abnormal heart conditions is now considered related to the work policemen and firemen have done and considered a causal relationship to this type of work.

People in many other lines of work probably have similar problems. Newspaper people, advertising agency workers and certainly stock brokers who have spent a lifetime in stress-related work, likely have similar life patterns.

School report cards mandated by the State and based on test scores for students in 3rd, 6th and 8th grades will be distributed tomorrow to students in East Maine Elementary School District 63, as approved at a regular board meeting, Tuesday, October 27.

Besides reporting measures of tests in reading comprehension, vocabulary, mathematics, science and social studies, report cards describe various characteristics of schools and districts as compared to other district throughout the state.

Bernice Goldberg, District Director of curriculum, noted that parents will not be able to make adequate comparisons between school districts or even

Halloween Safety Tips

Halloween is quickly approaching and children are excited for the ghostly event. To make sure the holiday is fun for everyone, the Cook County Department of Public Health suggests the following safety tips:

1. Look for flame-retardant labels when choosing costumes and masks in bright colors for easy visibility at night.
2. Masks should not restrict breathing or vision—better yet, use facial makeup.
3. Keep helmets on costumes short to avoid tripping.
4. Parents should give children a flashlight, not a candle or other open flame.

5. Make sure younger children are accompanied by an adult or responsible older children. In fact, no one should "trick or treat" alone. Make sure you know who your child will be with and where they will be "trick or treating."
6. Instruct children only to "trick or treat" at houses where lights are turned on. Tell them not to go inside any house or apartment.
7. Feed your children before they begin "trick or treating" so they won't nibble on treats before you have had a chance to examine them. Some area hospitals offer free x-rays of Halloween treats. Remember, home-made and unwrapped treats should be discarded.

District 219 names 3rd head in 2 years

Niles Township District 219's Board voted to hire John Hinck to replace Kenneth Olsen as superintendent effective Dec. 1. Hinck, a former interim superintendent, is now the third head of the high school district in the past 2 years.

Hinck, 51, signed a three-year contract at \$95,000 annually.

Former superintendent Olsen cited "philosophical differences" with the board as reason for his resignation on Oct. 12.

Parents and residents criticized the board severely because Olsen was the second superintendent to resign in the last two years. James Erickson, now superintendent of Ken-

neville School District 20, resigned in 1985.

Since Olsen's resignation, interest in next Tuesday's school board election for four seats has increased dramatically. A parents' group has entered two write-in candidates for two of the seats.

Hinck, who calls himself a permanent interim superintendent, served as interim superintendent of the district from January to June, 1986, when Olsen was hired. He is serving as interim superintendent of Gurnee Elementary School District 56, where former Supt. David Parrish resigned in early October.

LVW discussion on human needs

"Meeting Basic Human Needs: A Crisis of Responsibility" is the topic currently being studied and discussed by the League of Women Voters of Morton Grove-Niles at the Trident Center on Thursday, November 12, at 7:30 p.m. Four aspects of this crisis will be examined: income assistance, food, housing and access to health care. The public is highly encouraged to participate.

Most of us take for granted that the American dream includes, at a minimum, food, shelter, medical care and an income sufficient to purchase these necessities. But what happens to that dream if you never finished school, or the father of your

children can't or won't pay child support, or the only job you can find pays the minimum wage, or you can't afford child care or health care, or the factory where you worked for 15 years shut down and you can't find another job?

These are the dilemmas that face more than 13.6 percent of America's population (32.4 million people/11 million children)—those living in or near the fringes of poverty. And their unanswered questions raise broader ones for our society at large. Where can people turn when their own resources fail them? Where does the responsibility lie?

Receiver will have responsibility for 90 days

Court appoints receiver for Golf Mill nursing home

Circuit Judge Thomas Rakowski appointed a receiver to take over operations at Golf Mill Plaza I Health Care Facility, 9777 Greenwood Ave. on Wednesday, Oct. 21, according to Linda Haase of the Illinois Department of Health (IDPH).

Healthcare Horizons Limited, which was selected over four other candidates, will have the responsibility of the home's residents for a period of 90 days, according to the court order. In addition, Horizons must report to the court on a weekly basis to detail what is being done to bring about improvements in Golf Mill Plaza I.

Haase said at the end of 90 days, the judge will decide whether to grant an extension, or allow the nursing home operation to revert back to its original owner.

The state had gone to court for the receivership, which Haase said was "rare action", noting the only other request for a receiver was made in 1981. "It determined in this case (Golf Mill Plaza I) an emergency exists."

Action against the home began Oct. 1 when the state cited 56 violations of the Nursing Home Care Reform Act, calling the

amount "virtually unprecedented" according to Haase.

Health inspectors cited alleged inadequate patient care and filthy conditions. The facility's present license is suspended until a review process gives nursing home officials an opportunity to answer the charges.

Attorneys for the home have requested a hearing on the case to be conducted by a hearing officer and a director from the Illinois Department of Public Health. The hearing board makes a decision on the revocation of a nursing home's license.

"However, it could take months or even years until due process reaches conclusion," she said.

Attorney Albert Milstein, representing the nursing home, has stated in the event the administrative hearing results in a negative decision, the home has recourse to bring its case to court.

Haase noted IDPH's action in seeking appointment of a receiver was determined under the "A" level emergency situation, in which there is "substantial probability" of physical and mental injury to residents of

Maine Township to distribute surplus cheese

Maine Township will distribute surplus government cheese from 1 to 3 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 5, in the Maine Township Town Hall, 1700 Ballard Road, Park Ridge.

Recipients must bring their surplus food identification cards issued by Maine Township. Those who do not have identification cards and would like to participate in the government surplus food program should bring verification of residency and proof of income to the township offices at the time of the distribution.

Proof of income must include one of more of the following: Social Security award letter; paycheck or stub; public aid card; pension award letter; and interest income verification.

Federal guidelines for income eligibility are: \$547 per month for one person; \$735 for a family of two; \$923 for three; \$1,110 for four; \$1,300 for five; \$1,485 for six; \$1,673 for seven; and \$1,860 for eight. Add \$181 for each additional family member.
