

#### IRS ruling gives commuters a tax break

Commuting to all temporary work locations is now deductible from Federal income tax, advises Joan C. LeValley, a Park Ridge

Generally, costs of getting to work from home aren't deductible, although you could deduct commuting to temporary sites beyond the metropolitan area where you normally work. IRS Revenue Ruling 90-23 unexpectedly liberalizes the rules: People with regular places of businesses who go directly from home to any temporary site to work on an irregular or

short-term basis - for days or weeks - may deduct the cost. Thus, suggests LeValley, a doctor, architect or consultant who goes from home to see a patient, client or subject instead of to the office or regular work site may deduct unreimbursed costs. The ruling is retroactive, so many filers could amend past returns. The costs must be added, however, to miscellaneous items that are deductible only to the extent that they exceed 2% of adjusted gross income. The IRS warns, however, that auditors will look for a

"pattern of abuse" of the relaxed commuting-cost rules.
