Mayor comments on efforts to dissolve park district

To all Niles residents:

I have been asked to comment on the proposed effort to dissolve the Niles Park District and have its functions taken over by the Village of Niles.

I want to point out first that the Village of Niles Government is separate from the Niles Park District Government and the Niles Library Government. All of these bodies are separate taxing bodies which have their own elected Board and run separate from one another.

The present problem involving the Park District has to do with money. It is not a matter of who the people are that serve on the Board, but it is strictly a matter of money. Unfortunately, Park Districts function almost completely on revenues produced by the property tax. Their only other real source of revenue is money they receive from individual programs they provide. As we all know, reliance on the property tax is not favored by the general public. Compounding this problem is the fact that the Park District is limited in the amount of money they can raise by property taxes. This forces them to concern themselves about all recreation programs because they always have to ask, "Can we afford to do this?" For instance, at present there is a question of repairing the ice rink. If the expenditure involved in repairing the rink is extensive, then this could well take away from other programs that are necessary for Park District recreation purposes. Yet, to close the ice rink would be a bad idea. Our ice rink is one of the few around. Ice skating is a great recreation activity and must be preserved if we are to have first class recreation facilities. We should not go backwards!

Unlike the Park district, the Village of Niles has a great variety at its disposal in terms of ways of raising money. It does not have to rely on the property tax. The Village does not have a limitation on its ability to raise money. The Village of Niles Government is capable of providing the best of services to its residents. Under the circumstances, therefore, as Mayor, would say to you the residents of the Village of Niles, that if you decide to dissolve the Niles Park District at a properly called referendum, I, as Mayor, will recommend to the Village Board of Niles that the Village of Niles assume the responsibility of running all Park District affairs.

The advantage of having the Village of Niles run local Park District affairs is simple. And it all has to do with money. The Village of Niles Government, because of the variety of ways that it can raise money, is in a better position to fully fund recreation programs in this communuity than is the Park District which has to rely almost entirely on the Real Estate Property Tax.

Again, I repeat, the Park District's inability to raise monies to do all the things necessary to run a first class recreation program is caused not by any failure on the part of the Commissioners of the Park District, but by laws of the State of Illinois which limit the Park District in its ability to raise monies other than by property taxes.

LEGAL NOTICE

Village Of Niles, Illinois

The Village of Niles, Illinois, hereby announces its sponsorship of a program to reduce home loan financing costs within the Village. The Village has established a mortgage credit certificate program which will entitle first-time homebuyers and borrowers of qualifying home improvement loans to a federal income tax credit. A tax credit is a direct reduction of taxes due. Under the program a homebuyer would receive a mortgage credit certificate entitling homebuyers to reduce their taxes by fifty percent (50%) of the amount of interest paid on their home loan. The tax credit is available each year that the borrower continues to live in the home financed under the program. In order to qualify for the program, federal law requires that a

homebuyer satisfy each of the following guidelines: 1. First-Time Homebuyer. Each homebuyer must be a first-time homebuyer. Any person who has not owned his/her principal residence at any time during the three years prior to closing a loan under the program is considered a first-time homebuyer. This requirement

does not apply to qualifying home improvement loans. 2. Income. Because the program benefits low and moderate in come persons, federal law imposes limitations on the annual gross income of homebuyers. The current limit on gross income for households or families of 2 or fewer persons is \$46,900; for households or families of 3 or more the limit is \$53,935. These limitations are subject to adjustment each year. It is expected that the first adjustment (which may result in an increase in the above limitations) will be made within the next few months. Gross income includes salary and wages, including overtime, as well as dividends, alimony, public assistance, social security, unemployment compensation and invest-

3. Purchase Price. In addition to income, federal law also imposes limitations on the purchase price of homes financed under the program. The current maximum purchase price for a new home is \$144,090 and for an existing home is \$104,580. These limitations are periodically adjusted, and may be increased in the near future. The purchase price limitation does not apply to qualitying

4. Principal Residence. The homebuyer must occupy the home financed under the program as his/her principal residence within a reasonable period not to exceed 60 days after the financing is provided. A principal residence is a home occupied primarily for residential purposes. A principal residence does not include a home used as an investment property, as a recreation home or a home 15 percent or more of the total area of which is used in a trade or business.

5. Single Family Home. The residence financed must be a onefamily residence. This includes a detached home, one unit of a duplex, a townhouse or a condominium unit. Manufactured housing or mobile homes qualify only if the unit has at least 400 square feet of living space, if it is more than 102 inches wide and if it is permanently affixed to real property. Land adjoining the home is considered part of the home only if it maintains the home's livability and is not, other than incidentally, a source of income to the owner.

6. New Mortgage. The mortgage loan financed in connection with issuance of a mortgage credit certificate is required to be a new mortgage and may not replace a prior mortgage on the home (whether or

7. Program Area. In order to be eligible for a certificate, the home financed under the program must be located in the Village of Niles,

8. Home Improvement Loans. Home Improvement loans of up to \$15,000 are also eligible for a mortgage credit certificate. To qualify, the home improvements must substantially improve or protect the livability or energy efficiency of the home; such as new or renovated plumbing or wiring, renovation of the kitchen, or a new or improved heating or cooling system. Installation of a swimming pool, tennis court, hot tub or other recreational and entertainment facilities will

Under the program, mortgage credit certificates will be issed to eligible borrowers on a first-come, first-served basis. The certificates are available in connection with any type of mortgage loan (except loans from tax-exempt bond programs), including fixed rate and adjustable rate mortgages. Any lending institution is eligible to provide

loans under this program.



Procrastinators, take heart. A special tax form can be of great help in the eleventh hour of the income tax filing season, according

your 1040 or 1040A, fill out and mail in Form 4868 by the regular April 15 tax deadline.

taxes owed, the IRS emphasizes. Payment for any amount due must be included with the exten-

According to the IRS, you will owe interest on any taxes paid after April 15. In some cases, a-late payment penalty may also be due. By accurately filling out Form 4868 and mailing it by the deadline, you will get out of the much larger late filing penalty. This penalty can amount to as much as 25 percent of the unpaid tax, the IRS says.

You can order the extension form by calling the IRS toll-free at 1-800-TAX-FORM (829-3676). For more details on the extension form, call Tele-Tax, the IRS' automated system of prerecorded tax information. Dial 1-800-829-4477 and request tape number 457. Tele-Tax is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.


