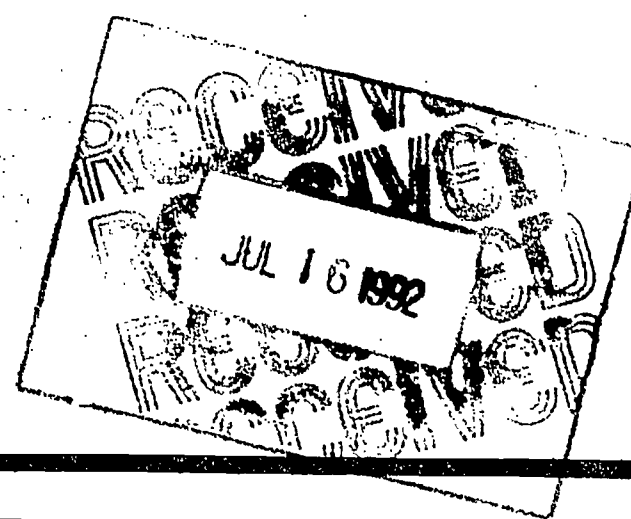

Niles Park Board confusion stalls funding for ice rink, pool

The Niles Park Board on July 14 postponed a decision to issue bonds to, in part, finance renovations at the Sports Complex, 8435 Ballard road. The Board is already committed to installing a new, year-round ice rink, but no

public decision has been made on the Complex swimming pool. Details surfacing in the Tuesday night meeting revealed the Board is considering buying real estate, but whether the real estate is related to the Complex

renovations was not explained. According to advance press notices, a half hour Park Board executive session was to precede a special meeting to consider passing a bond ordinance. **Continued on Page 13**

Chicago man, 27, found stabbed to death near Touhy & Milwaukee

Police investigate Niles murder

Police are investigating the death of a Chicago man, 27, whose body was found on the grounds of a Niles nursing home early Sunday. Officers found the body of Thomas J. Max, 2736 N. Odell Avenue, Chicago, lying on its back on the rain-soaked lawn of St. Benedict's Home, 6930 W. Touhy Avenue, Niles with seven stab wounds to his chest and abdomen. No weapon was found at the scene and there were no signs of a struggle, according to Niles police Sgt. Roger Wilson.

Wilson requested anyone with any information on the whereabouts or activities of Max last weekend contact Niles police at 647-0400 and ask for investigations.

Max's identification and \$300 were found on his person. He has no criminal or drug abuse history, Wilson said. He was unemployed, lived with his mother and reportedly, had recently been depressed.

Max was five feet, nine inches tall, had brown hair and eyes and weighed 160 lbs. When found, he was wearing a white tee shirt, blue jeans and work boots and appeared to have been dead for some time, because rigor mortis had set in.

Police responded to the scene at 9:43 a.m. July 12 when a nursing home employee called and **Continued on Page 13**

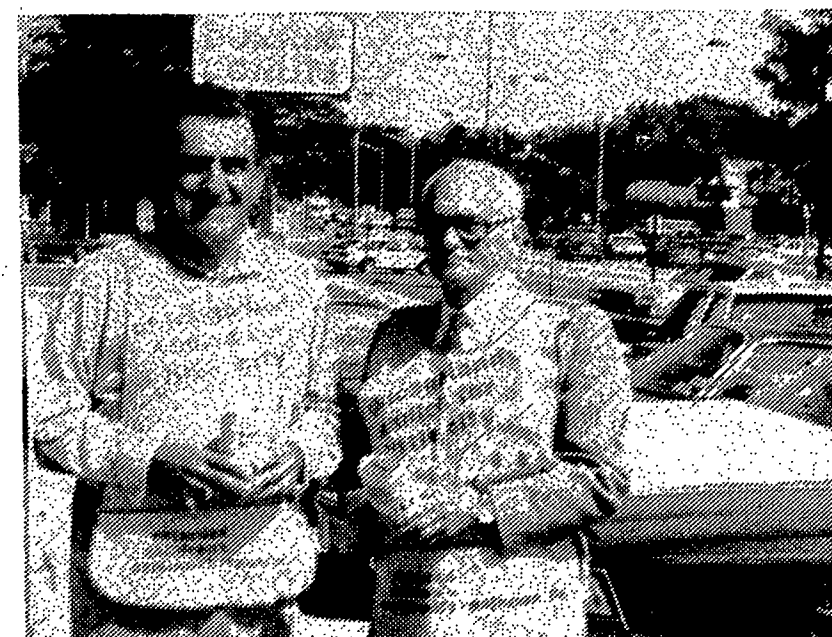

Township to hold drop-off recycling July 25

Saturday, July 25, will be the next date Maine Township will collect recyclable items. The collection will be held from 8 a.m. to noon in the parking lot of the Town Hall, 1700 Ballard Road, Park Ridge.

Maine Township has been able to resume taking some plastic materials and will also accept magazines and catalogues. The township's recycling contractor, Cleveland Corporation, had temporarily discontinued taking plastic bottles and containers at the current market conditions. The recycler will now take plastic soda, milk and water containers. No other plastic containers can be accepted.

The following items also will be accepted: newspapers; magazines and catalogues; corrugated cardboard; aluminum and metal cans; and green, brown and clear glass bottles and jars. All items

Judge retains bail of 3 accused in youth's death

Three northwest suburban men accused in the March 25 shooting of a Maine East High School student on July 8 lost a legal effort to reduce their bail and returned to Cook County jail.

Last week, Circuit court Judge Margaret Frossard declined to reduce the \$1 million bail placed on Richard Martinez, 21, of Wheeling, and Mt. Prospect residents Baltazar Rodriguez, 18 and Antonio Delgado, 18. The men's lawyers argued they were unaware of the gun carried by Dylan Metzel, 17, of Wheeling, the reputed triggerman. Through his lawyer, Metzel asked to talk with a psychologist, but made no effort to

reduce his \$3 million bail. A plea by Martinez's legal counsel that he tried to stop the shooting failed to persuade Judge Frossard and she retained the \$1 million bonds.

The night of March 25, John Anzelmo, 17, of Des Plaines was shot on Dee Road near Dempster Street, near Maine East High School. The four accused men reportedly had been in the area earlier to drop off one of the men's girlfriend, became involved in a dispute with some reported gang members, left and later returned, with bats in their car trunk, looking for revenge.

Sheriff establishes suburban gang hotline

Cook County Sheriff Michael F. Sheahan has announced that the Sheriff's Police Department is offering a 24-hour telephone hotline for suburban residents who wish to report suspected gang activity in their communities.

Sheahan is urging Cook County residents with any information on suburban gang activity to call 1-800-339-GANG. The hotline will be monitored by officers from the Sheriff's Communications Center.

The new hotline is being unveiled in connection with the Sheriff's increased efforts to combat gang activity in suburban Cook County.

Since the expansion of the Sheriff's Gang Crimes Narcotics Unit in late 1991, the Unit has made more than 500 gang and drug related arrests and has assisted other suburban police agencies in 57 separate investigations.

During the same time span, the unit has seized more than three quarters of a million dollars in narcotics and currency from suburban drug dealers.

Residents can call the hotline with anonymous tips or information if they have witnessed what they believe is a gang-related crime or if they have any information that can help police track

This program is partially supported through grants awarded to Maine Township by the Suburban Cook County Area Agency on Aging. To date, the township has received ten awards from the Suburban and referral services. Krusinski is also available to help seniors with Medicare forms and insurance questions. She has been certified by the Illinois Department of Insurance Senior Health Insurance Program

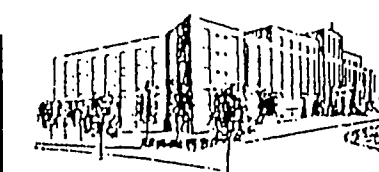

Social Security continues battle against misleading advertisers

The Social Security Administration is increasing its efforts to alert the public to misleading advertisers who use Social Security as a "come on" for profitmaking and fundraising ventures.

That's the message from Trish Butler, Social Security's Associate Commissioner for Public Affairs, who pointed out that "These misleading ads are often a part of direct marketing campaigns that are designed to capture the public's attention and money."

"Social Security is actively working to protect the public from this fraud and deceit."

Butler explained that the ads offer Social Security services for a fee, but that these same services and information are available free of charge from the Social Security Administration.

For example, some advertisers offer to obtain Social Security numbers for newborns, to notify Social Security of name changes for brides, or to obtain an earnings and benefit statement for fees ranging from \$10 to \$50 or more. But all of these services can be obtained for free by calling Social Security's toll-free number, 1-800-772-1213, between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. any business day.

Butler noted that "of particular significance to the public should be an increased awareness of what unscrupulous marketers could do with the confidential information they solicit in the form of an SS-5 (Application for a Social Security Card.)"

"It's hard for me to believe that consumers would send the personal information needed for a Social Security number or a replacement card to an anonymous post office box. The information on a completed form is sufficient to establish credit, ap-

ply for a loan, buy a car, and conduct many other financial transactions."

Other advertisers deceive the public by suggesting that the future of social security is in jeopardy. Their direct marketing efforts mislead people, especially senior citizens, into thinking that they must respond with a donation or a membership fee to avoid losing their Social Security benefits or Medicare coverage.

"We are also seeing increased problems with direct mail campaigns from insurance vendors," Butler continued. "They're using Social Security as a 'come on' to encourage people to respond. Naturally, when people do follow up, they find that they're being sold insurance."

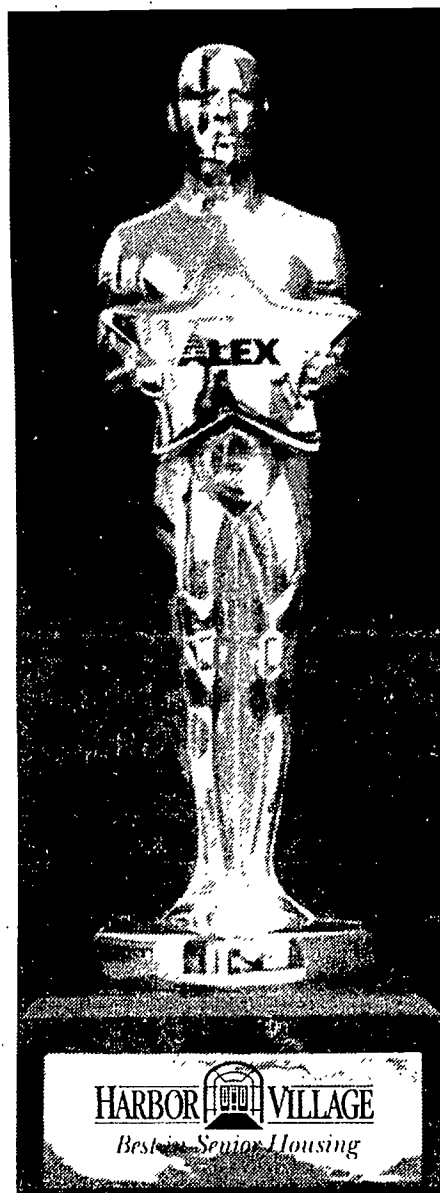
Recently the agency formed a coalition of representatives from intergovernmental entities, national consumer organizations and advocacy groups to expand their efforts to combat misleading advertising. "We're developing a three-pronged approach to this growing problem," Butler said. "It will address consumer information, industry education, and legislative recommendations for Congress that we hope will force this 'cottage industry' into bankruptcy. The young and old alike are being swindled through scare tactics and misinformation and it has to be stopped."

Anyone who receives misleading information about a "Social Security" service from a private organization seeking payment for the service should send the entire solicitation (including the envelope) to the Social Security Administration, Office of Public Affairs, Misleading Advertising, Box 17740, Baltimore, MD 21235.

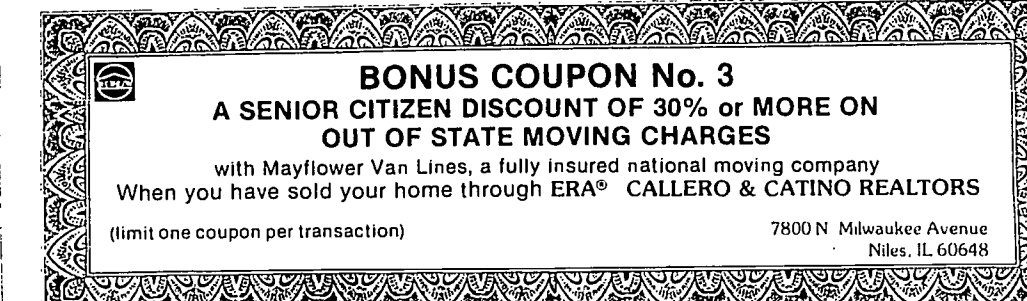
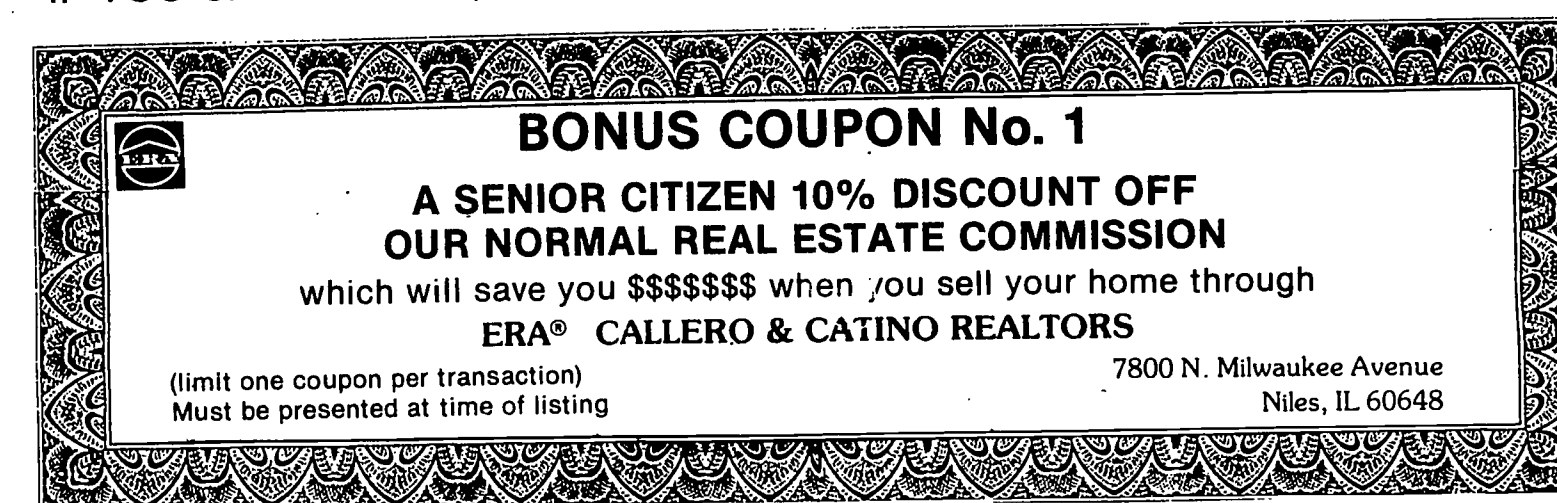

Lavin to receive agency on aging award



The Suburban Area Agency on Aging (SAAA) is proud to announce that Jonathan Lavin, Executive Director, has been selected to receive the National Association of Area Agencies on Aging (Washington, D.C.) Distinguished Area Agency on Aging Director Award. Each year the award honors one director from the 670 Area Agencies on Aging nationwide who has contributed significantly to both serving the needs of the elderly and instituting services and programs on aging which have national significance. Lavin was selected by the Awards Committee of the National Association of Area Agencies on Aging (NAAA) Board of Directors, and will be presented the award at the NAAA Annual Training Conference in Salt Lake City, Utah in July.

Lavin was nominated by Charles D. Johnson, Executive Director of the Northeastern Illinois Area Agency on Aging which serves the counties surrounding Cook County. Mr. Lavin has been director of the Suburban Area Agency since 1978. Since that time he has been instrumental in developing the suburban aging network which includes 28 community-based organizations. Those agencies receive federal and state funds through the Area Agency on Aging. Under his direction, programs have been designed to inform suburban older persons and their caregivers about available benefits and services, including the current program, "The Best Kept Secret," a grant from The Chicago Community Trust to reach thousands of older persons who are eligible for benefits and services but are not aware of them.

As Legislative Chairman of the Illinois Association of Area Agencies on Aging and also as Legislative Chairman of the Illinois

Coalition on Aging, Mr. Lavin has advocated for the rights and needs of older persons. Through his involvement, senior service funding has been increased or maintained over years that have seen major reductions for other human service programs.

The Suburban Area Agency on Aging has implemented a region-wide, multiorganizational case management program and an elder abuse intervention system. Needs assessment reports for the elderly have been implemented with the most recent entitled, "The Graying of Suburbia," surveying 1800 households with seniors aged 55 and older. The Suburban Senior Housing Alternatives Program (SSHAP) has identified affordable housing options for older persons and SAGE, a Suburban Advocacy Group for the Elderly, has shared information on public policy issues and spearheaded advocacy campaigns for improved senior transit and greater recognition of the multipurpose senior centers in Cook County and statewide.

Mr. Lavin, who resides in Skokie, is married to Robin and has two teenage sons, Aaron and Alexander.

The Suburban Area Agency on Aging (SAAA), located in Oak Park, is one of 13 agencies designated by the Illinois Department on Aging to plan, coordinate and fund services for people over the age of 60. A 21 member volunteer Board of Directors and 33 member advisory Council oversee the non-profit agency which has a staff of 25. Services are supported by the Older Americans Act, Illinois General Revenue Funds, local funds and individual contributions. Under the leadership of Mr. Lavin, the SAAA has been successful in its efforts to serve the needs of older persons in suburban Cook County.

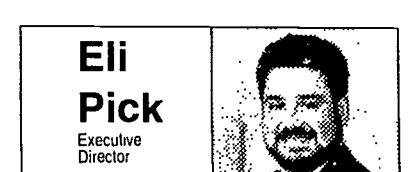

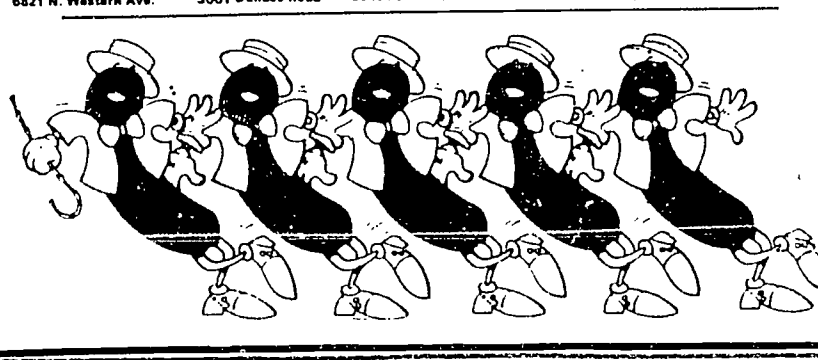

Water Reclamation District awards final mainstream tunnel contract

At a special board meeting held June 15, commissioners of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District authorized the District's purchasing agent to award a contract to construct the final leg of the District's Phase I-Mainstream Tunnel System.

The \$167,907,130 contract to build the 9.3 mile north branch tunnel segment was awarded to a joint venture comprised of Perini Corporation/ICA Construction/O & G Industries, Farmington, MA.

According to President Nicholas J. Melas, this contract is more than 23 percent less than the estimate. "Perhaps due to current economic conditions that may have been reflected in the bid price of this contract, the taxpayers of Cook County will realize a substantial savings, and they are the ones who are truly benefiting," said Melas.

In addition to the tunnels that will be built 200-250 feet underground, the contract includes the construction of 23 dropshafts connecting the tunnels to the surface. The tunnels will capture combined sewer overflows and prevent the pollution of the north branch of the Chicago River.

When completed, the entire mainstream system, including the north shore channel, the Chicago River and the sanitary and ship canal running from Wilmette to Hodgkins, IL, will be brought up to clean water standards and become an amenity to the community.

The new tunnel system will also provide protection from combined sewer overflows spilling into the homes of 562,000 residents living in the northern portion of Chicago, as well as the suburbs of Golf, Morton Grove and Niles.

A 5.5 mile section of the tunnel will be 30 ft. in diameter and run from the confluence of the north branch of the Chicago river and the north shore channel in the Village of Niles. The remaining 3.2 miles of 20-foot diameter tunnel will continue along the north branch of the Chicago river through Niles and Morton Grove, to the Forest Preserve District's Linne Woods, just north of Dempster St. An additional .6 miles of eight-foot tunnel will extend from Linne Woods to Austin Avenue and Church Street in Morton Grove.

Of the five joint venture bids submitted to the District on June 3, Perini/ICA/O&G was the lowest. Construction is expected to begin late this summer and be completed in 1997.

State grants and low-interest loans will pay for approximately 53 percent of the project cost. This contract includes the District's Affirmative Action Review Appendix D, which provides for women-owned and minority-owned businesses to obtain 10 percent and 20 percent of the contract, respectively.

What to do if Social Security check is late

When someone's Social Security or SSI check doesn't arrive on time, Social Security District Manager Tom Curin knows about it pretty quickly.

While the postal service routinely delivers benefit checks on time, there are times when mail is delayed. Normal policy is to allow three days for late mail deliveries before the Social Security Administration process a request for a replacement check.

The usual check delivery days are the 1st of the month for SSI checks and the 3rd of the month for Social Security checks. Social Security can process a claim for a lost SSI check on the 4th of the month or for a lost Social Security check on the 6th of the month.

If the delivery date falls on a weekend or on a legal holiday, checks are delivered on the last banking day before then. And claims for lost checks can be processed three postal delivery days later.

The most common reason checks are late is because changes of address aren't reported. If you move, be sure to put in a change of address form with the post office -- in addition to informing Social Security of your new address.

Many people use direct deposit to have their benefit checks sent to a savings or checking account at a bank. They generally find that direct deposit is safer and more convenient than getting their checks by mail.

If you want to start direct deposit, call your bank, or Social Security Administration's nationwide, toll-free telephone number 1-800-772-1213.

use and vice versa."

Village Manager Abe Selman said Pisa is mainly a college town with activity centering around the University of Pisa, but leather making and furniture manufacturing are local industries. "What kinds of opportunities (Niles) can pursue to generate (commerce) is very complicated, we're still waiting to see," said Selman.

Charles Barbaglia, Senior Vice President of the First National Bank of Niles, another tour member, emphasized the camaraderie evoked by the visit and recalled seeing the Pisa dignitaries who had visited Niles again was "like a reunion." The Nilesites' reception at Pisa city hall was impressive, he said and at the end of their stay when the two groups of city representatives said good-by, many of the Pisans were in tears.

Barbaglia's enjoyment of Pisa's sights was not at all lessened by the steel bands wrapped around the base of the leaning tower to keep it from cracking and the leading of one tower side as a counter balance, he said.

Val Marcheschi, wife of the late Niles trustee Angelo Marcheschi, had the opportunity to visit several of her relatives in the area. Her cousin's son, 26, served as the tour's official translator in Pisa.

Eighteen of the tour members continued on to see other parts of Italy and while in Rome were seated close to the altar when Pope John Paul II, said mass and presided over a ceremony honoring newly created archbishops.

Niles Trustee Bart Murphy's brother, Thomas J. Murphy, was present as the new archbishop of Seattle, Washington. Murphy said his only chagrin came when he and his tour companions had to leave Rome the day before his son, other family members and the Archbishop had a private audience with the Pope.

Marcheschi remembers the Rome ceremony as "thrilling" and the remainder of their sojourn in Italy as one marked with walking, climbing and seeing "a lot of the beautiful countryside." She was especially impressed with the cathedral in Milan.

Val Marcheschi, wife of the late Niles trustee Angelo Marcheschi, had the opportunity to visit several of her relatives in the area. Her cousin's son, 26, served as the tour's official translator in Pisa.

Eighteen of the tour members continued on to see other parts of Italy and while in Rome were seated close to the altar when Pope John Paul II, said mass and presided over a ceremony honoring newly created archbishops.

Niles Trustee Bart Murphy's brother, Thomas J. Murphy, was present as the new archbishop of Seattle, Washington. Murphy said his only chagrin came when he and his tour companions had to leave Rome the day before his son, other family members and the Archbishop had a private audience with the Pope.

gang-related activity or problems in a particular community. Callers can remain anonymous and all information will be confidential.

"With the problem of gangs increasing in so many communities, law enforcement agencies need the help of citizens to track and pinpoint where the problems exist," Sheahan said.

"This gang hotline will give citizens the tool they need to get directly involved in the fight against gangs in their communities."

In recent months, the Sheriff's Police Department has deployed a sophisticated computer network system that serves as a central repository for gang-related information throughout the County. The system, which is accessible to local, suburban state and federal law enforcement agencies, stores and tracks information on gangs and individual gang members.

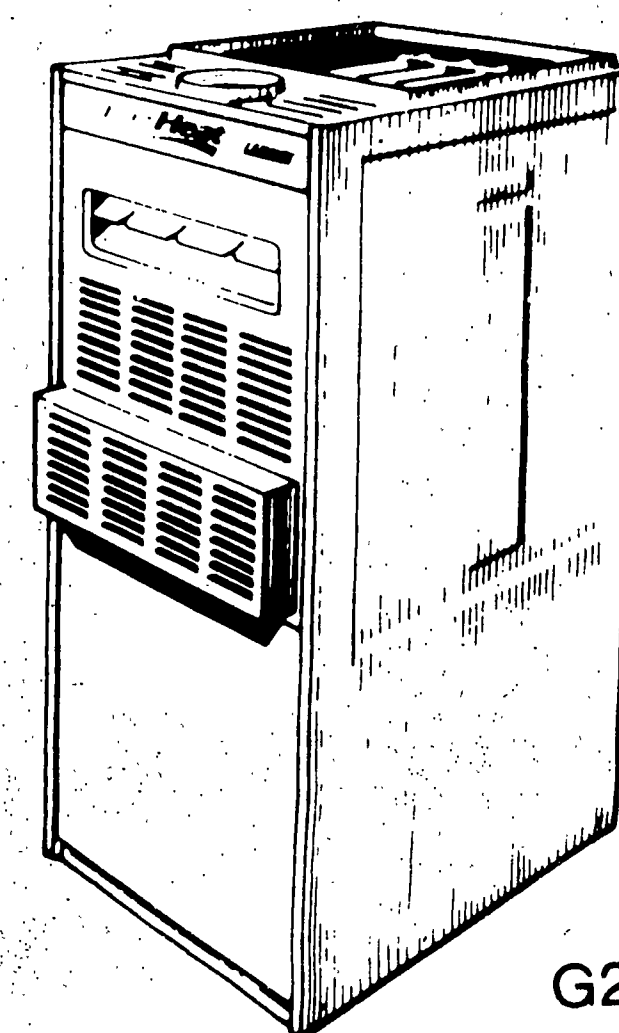

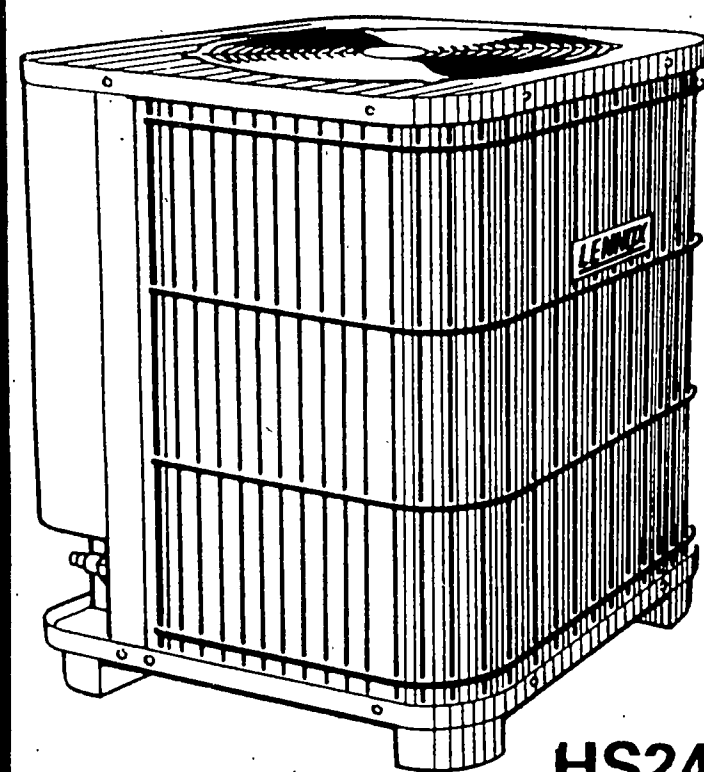
