Mayor inducts SJB student council members

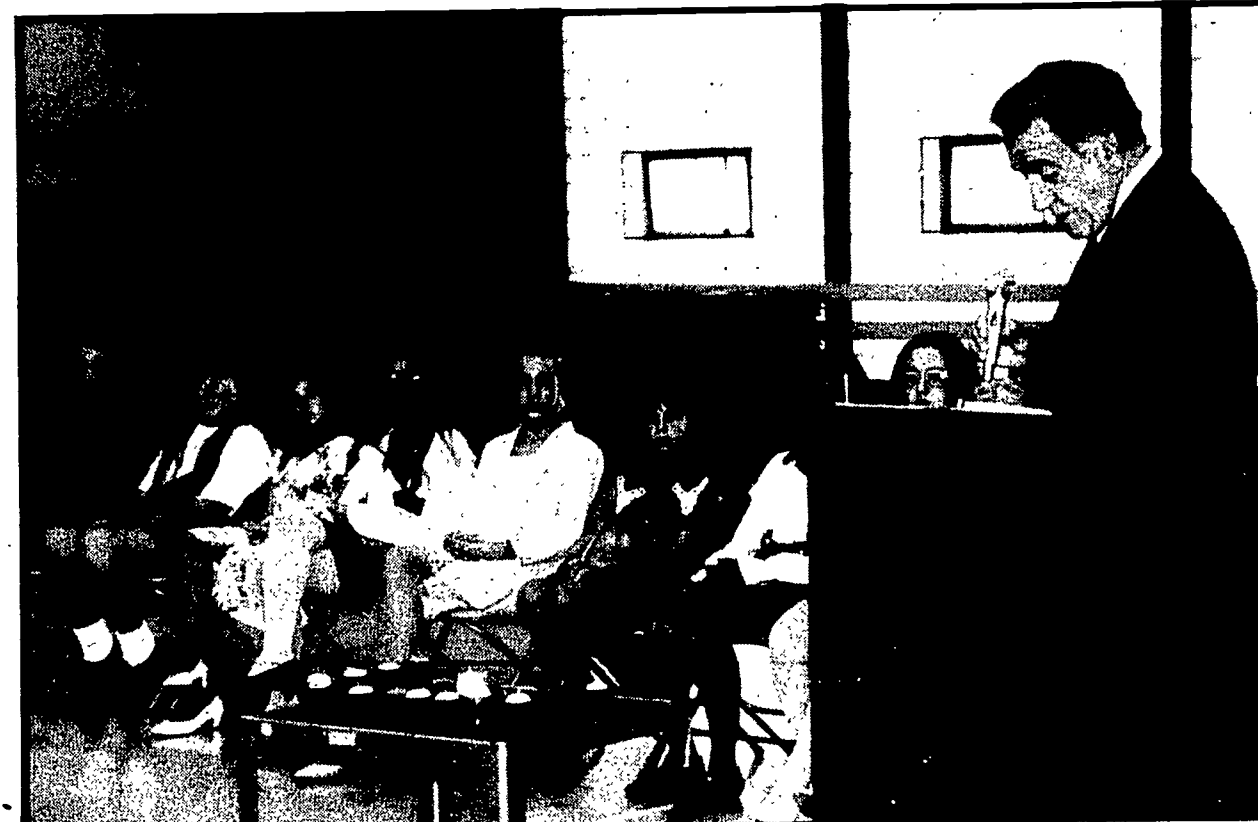

Village concerned over gangs and civil rights suits

Future of Niles Fest pondered

It was standing room only at the Niles Village Board meeting Tuesday night.

The topic of interest was the future of Niles Fest, a Niles event that has brought both community spirit and individual violence to the Village of Niles.

Each year at least 100 people are being turned away from the event for fear of gang activity, according to Police Chief Raymond Giovannelli. The potential for civil suits against the Village by people who were denied admittance or forced to adjust or remove certain items of street gang

type clothing will increase if the Niles Event is not discontinued or changed in its present form.

It all began with a letter dated August 18 from Giovannelli stating that cost of police service at the Niles Fest exceeded \$11,000 this year as a result of gang problems the event has attracted in the past.

Giovannelli addressed the Board Tuesday night with three concerns regarding Niles Days: public safety, officer safety and the possibility of civil rights suits.

"The third is the one that is most ignored and most bothersome," Giovannelli said. "How firm can the ground be when we deny people access to a public event? The Village will end up paying the tab for civil liberty suits."

"The Chief is not recommending eliminating the event," said Village Board President and Mayor Nicholas Blase. "But we are sitting on a time bomb. You can't chase away 100 people each year and not expect an explosion."

"Let's change the event to something that is safer for the community."

One possible solution would be the elimination of the carnival portion of the event. This part of the fest is what attracts the younger crowd, the ones who are more prone to gang activity.

"Refusing of the carnival would ultimately have the same effect (as discontinuing the event)," said Lee Elsinger, a Niles patrolman and President of the Niles Events Committee. "Fourteen organizations depend on the proceeds obtained by the carnival. Continuing the fest would be an unsound venture if the carnival was eliminated."

Figures brought by the Niles Fest Treasurer stated that the net profit from the carnival portion of the event equalled \$20,000, while the total profit came to \$15,000.

New rail project to alleviate suburban traffic

U. S. Rep. Henry J. Hyde (R-Bensenville) praised the House of Representatives for passing a bill yesterday that includes \$10 million in federal funds for a commuter rail service that is expected to ease traffic congestion in the northwestern suburbs of Chicago.

The funds are included in the Fiscal Year 1994 Transportation Appropriation.

The \$10 million will be used to upgrade the freight-only Wisconsin Central Railroad to passenger

train standards to provide commuter service between the north-west suburbs and downtown Chicago.

The service, which is scheduled to open in early 1996, will extend from Antioch into Chicago with stations in Des Plaines, O'Hare Airport and 10 other sites.

"This project will provide much needed traffic relief for the residents of Des Plaines, Park Ridge and other northwestern suburban communities," said Hyde.

The Dempster Street construction project is behind schedule.

The estimated finishing date on the project, which extends along Dempster Street from Ozark Avenue to Waukegan Avenue in Niles and Morton Grove, is October 30; almost one month later than the Village of Niles anticipated.

There are also several repaving projects occurring around the Village that will be finished in a couple of weeks, but, according to Selman, the Dempster Street project is the only project of substance.

Mark Rhee, an eighth grader, acted as her primary belyer. The belyer takes up slack on the body harness around the climber. On her trip back down, Meredon hung in mid air as Rhee supported her weight from the ground and his back ups helped out.

Students shouted encouragement while their fellow students climbed and spotted her before her feet touched the ground.

Kimura also said the activity was about setting realistic goals for how high students believed they could climb and why they may not have made it.

When asked if who was climbing factored into how she spotted, eighth grader Sandy Schertzing said it did not matter "what grade you're in, boy or girl, you're spotting them to make sure they're going to be O.K."

Trust falls, among the last activities in the six week program, were also demonstrated at the meeting. Sixth grader Jason Henriksen fell backwards into the waiting arms of fellow students, their arms interlocked to disburse the weight of the fall.

Kimura said that the club activities include first aid, using a map and compass, cooking over a fire or camping stove, nature studies and community service.

Community service is where some of the ecological lessons are learned. The Outdoor Adventure group cleans up litter around the Oakton and Caldwell area and by the north branch of the Chicago River, Kimura said.

By cleaning up the community, "they think twice before they throw it out," Kimura said. The clean-up portion of the service projects are so successful, Kimura added, the group is running out of places to collect trash. To serve the community, the club also visits senior homes and helps to stock the Niles Township Food Pantry, Kimura said.

That would mean a \$5,000 loss without the carnival.

There are many things that have been obtained for the Village, including chair lifts, a Cadillac ambulance, the information marquee at Howard and Milwaukee Avenue, the Historical Society showcases and air conditioning, food certificates and a chair lift and aide to an 11-year-old blind child, that would not have been possible without the Niles Fest.

"Are we surrendering to the gangs?" said Niles resident Don Steinko. "In the 80s we dealt with the carnival problem. We ran the affair without the carnival and it was a disaster. The whole intent of the event is to get young people involved. This is affecting our community spirit."

A few suggestions were tossed around the room at the Village Board meeting Tuesday night including: holding the event at a church, charging admission and having a controlled area in which the patrons enter. It is unsure whether the event will be discontinued or changed for the future. Mayor Blase said the situation will be evaluated and a solution will be presented at the next Village Board meeting.

"This problem is nothing new," said resident Robert Berles who has worked at the carnival since 1958, the last 10 years with the Niles Historical Society. "Niles has been growing. More people, more gangs. You have to expect that. In the past, the police force has been able to take care of the gangs and I think they can do it in the future."

"This is a family oriented Village. It's where people come. If the carnival is taken away, you might as well take down the sign 'Where People Count.'"

give away candy and accept donations to help blind, visually impaired, deaf and hearing impaired people.

Also during the meeting, the Board voted in favor of annexing a triangle corner, which is not in corporate Niles, including Milwaukee Avenue on the east corner, Greenwood Avenue on the west and Golf Road on the south.

A 36-unit condominium building was approved by the Board to be built at 7436-50 Waukegan Road. The building will stretch across 1.4 acres of land and each luxurious unit will equal about 1600 square feet.

In other business: it was decided at the meeting that groups wishing to place charitable solicitation canisters in public places must first get a certificate of approval from the Village Board. The Board stated that many charities are not licensed by the Attorney General and that some are even shams. In some only five percent of the proceeds are given to the charity while the rest of the donations are kept. The Board would like to regulate that.

The Board also approved the installation of a four way stop sign at the intersection of Octavia and Keeney Street. This is the result of Police Chief Raymond Giovannelli monitoring the now two way yield intersection and noticing the many accident experiences at the corner over the past five years.

Finally, the United States Congress passed a Cable Television Consumer Protection on Competition Act of 1992, otherwise known as the "1992 Cable Act", which authorizes municipalities to regulate subscriber rates. Therefore, the Board determined that it is in the best interest of the Village and its residents to regulate basic cable subscriber rates.

Edison suit settlement bring refunds and rate reductions

Electricity customers in northern Illinois will have their charges reduced by more than 25 percent over the next year as the result of a \$1.34 billion refund and a \$339 million annual rate reduction announced Monday by Commonwealth Edison and about a dozen consumer groups and governmental agencies.

The landmark settlement was reached after the company, consumer representatives and government agencies agreed to settle six rate cases pending before the Illinois courts and the Illinois Commerce Commission.

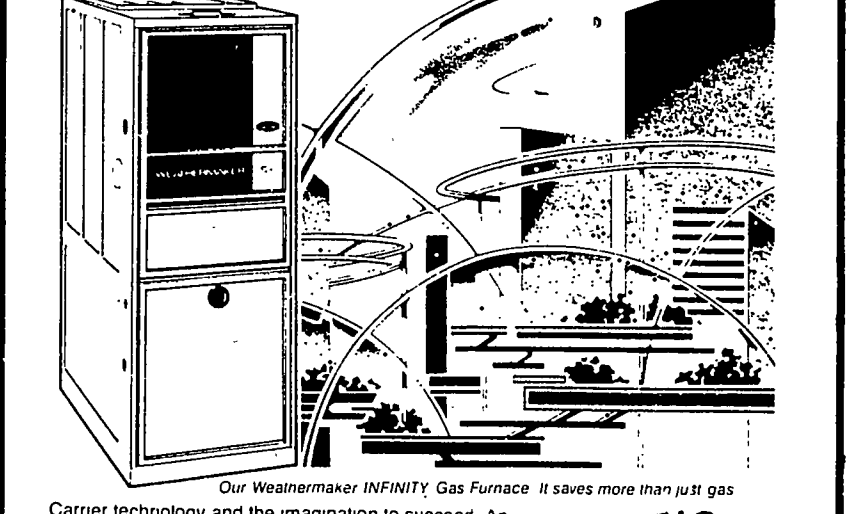

struction is impacting our businesses. I would much prefer it have gotten done sooner, but I think they are doing a reasonably good job."

Morton Grove's Village Manager, Larry Arft, does not share the same attitude. Arft said he is unsatisfied with the progress of the Dempster Street project in Morton Grove and is unsure when the project will be completed.

"The project is scheduled to be finished at the end of October, but I have very little confidence in that," Arft said. "The progress has been very disappointing. There are (steps to the project) that should have been done months ago."

Arft said the Village has voiced its concerns to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the contractor responsible for the project.

"It seems as if there have been

other construction projects that carried higher priority than this one," Arft said. "The level of staffing has been minimal and the project has dragged on. There have also been weather related days which have exacerbated the situation."

The Deep Tunnel project is another construction project that is creating traffic problems in Morton Grove. Construction crews are building a dropshaft on Austin and Church Streets, which has limited traffic from a two-way to a one-way street going northbound.

According to Arft, this phase of the Deep Tunnel project is moving smoothly and should be finished some time in October. This Village Manager would like to be as confident about the inconvenient Dempster Street project.

"Right now I have no kind of prediction when the project will be completed," Arft said. "We have been told to anticipate that the paving will be done at the end of October. But progress should have been much further along by

foot Victor Yackman Pavilion east of the main hospital. The four-story building, will bring together all outpatient and ancillary pediatric services and will be connected to the inpatient units of Lutheran General Children's Hospital via a connector link at the second level. The Yackman Pavilion will offer, for the first time, a separate entrance for all children's services, which, in turn, will also streamline the flow of traffic around the entrance of Lutheran General Hospital.

A three-story, 1,100 space parking garage will be built on a section of the north campus at Dempster and Luther Lanes, currently the site of surface parking. The garage would be landscaped on each level of its terraced facade, as well as the area around it, to enhance the aesthetic appearance of the north campus and the overall appearance of the parking structure itself.

Another key component of the plan includes consolidation of all outpatient cancer services under one roof in a multidisciplinary setting in the West Pavilion. It also includes construction of vaults to house two linear accelerators (machines which provide radiation treatment) adjacent to the West Pavilion to serve the

Cancer Center.

An enclosed sky bridge will connect the new parking garage on the north campus with the existing parking garage, Parkside Center Professional Building, Lutheran General Hospital and the Victor Yackman Pavilion. The sky bridge will also connect the West Pavilion (formerly Parkside Lutheran Hospital) with the rest of the campus. The climate-controlled sky bridge will accommodate motorized carts used by persons with disabilities.

Zoning applications have been filed with the City of Park Ridge and the first public hearing was September 27. Certificates of Need will be filed within the next 60 days with the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Board.

Once the necessary approvals are secured, groundbreaking for Phase One construction will begin in Spring, 1994 and be completed over a three-to-four year period. A future component of the Campus Plan is a Medical Office Building/Ambulatory Care Center on the north campus. It would house additional physician offices and outpatient ancillary diagnostic and treatment services. However, construction is at least three years away, pending further review of the plan.
