Zoners deny petition for 4-story condo

The Niles Zoning Board denied a request for the construction of a condominium building at its meeting August 1 and Trustees said they had no other choice.

Josef Matuschka, of 7139 Days Terrace, Niles, petitioned the Board for a change in zoning in order to construct a 5-unit condominium building, four stories

or 40 feet high, at 6454 Gross Point Road in Niles.

The first floor would be an enclosed parking garage; the second and third floors would include two apartments apiece and the fourth level would have one apartment. Each level would measure 3,600 square feet apiece and the total building would

equal 12,000 square feet.

The petitioner and his architect, Brian Reno, originally submitted a petition to construct nine units, but had to lower the number to five after the Zoning Board informed them that they couldn't authorize that size.

The petitioners were also unauthorized to build a four-story building.

Class action suit sought against Sprint/Centel

Niles to fight phone rate hike

Following a surprise rate increase in telephone bills, the Village of Niles is seeking permission to file a suit against Sprint/Centel on behalf of all affected Niles residents.

Sprint/Centel reportedly approved a \$6.3 million increase in telephone rates on May 4 that customers became aware of only after receiving their June bills.

While residential and business customers had a set rate for all calls within a designated area prior to the increase, Sprint/Centel customers are now

charged according to the frequency of calls, duration of conversations, distance of a call made and the time of day it is placed.

Customers -- in Niles, Park Ridge and Des Plaines -- are experiencing telephone bill rate increases charted between 20 and 120 percent.

According to attorney Peter Troy, who sat in for the absent Richard Troy at the Niles Village Board meeting July 26, the Village, or the Village attorney, should have been notified of the increase prior to its going into effect.

"Neither was notified," Troy said. "We feel the best course of action is to file a lawsuit against Centel to void the increase."

Troy said one-third of the Village, north of Oakton and west of Milwaukee, are Sprint/Centel customers. Rather than each resident file a separate lawsuit, the Village is seeking the opportunity to file a class action suit.

"All the people that are similarly affected would be called a class," he said. "A class action suit saves court time, but you have to seek permission from the court to do it."

Troy said the Village is hoping Judge Aaron Jaffe will grant permission for the suit around August 8 and predicts that the first contested hearing will occur before Thanksgiving.

Meanwhile, the attorney is seeking a preliminary injunction prohibiting the rate from being applied to its customers.

Further, Troy is requesting the funds raised from the increase be put in an escrow account and allowed to at least gain interest until a ruling has been made.

"I don't know if we're going to get that," Troy said. "But the case looks good."

"We wouldn't file if we didn't think it was appropriate."

Oak Park plans adjusted for seniors

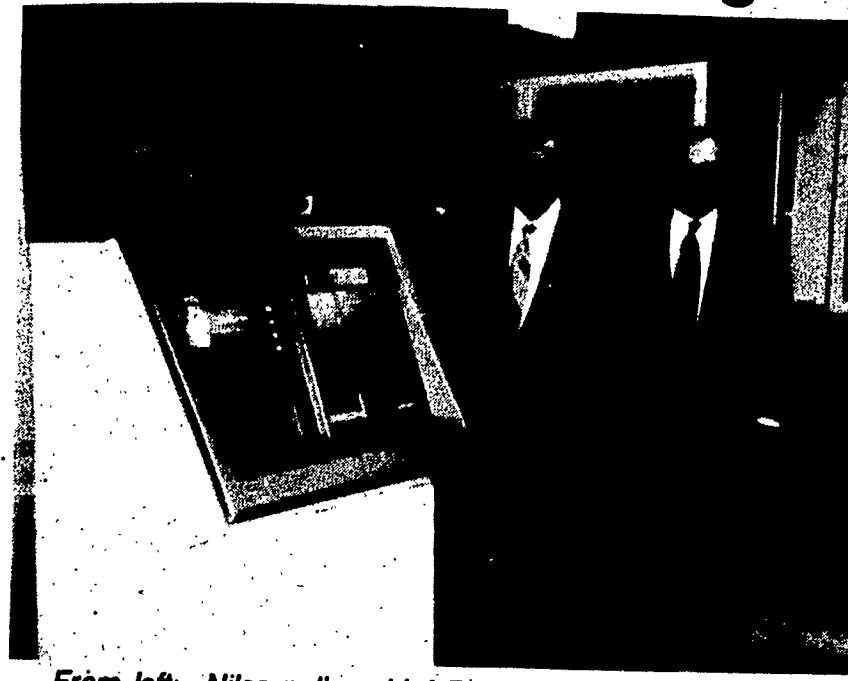

ATM in police station offers safe banking

The First National Bank of Niles' automatic teller machine located in the Niles Police Department is officially open for business.

Bank officials presented the ATM to the Village of Niles in a presentation involving Mayor Nicholas Blase, Village Manager Abe Selman and Police Chief Raymond Giovannelli around 11 a.m. August 1.

Selman was the machine's very first customer and withdrew \$100 to break it in.

First National's senior vice president Charles Barbaglia said the decision to place the machine at the Niles Police Department, 7200 Milwaukee Avenue, Niles, came following discussions with the Village, police and the bank.

"We wanted to make it safe for customers to use the ATM," Barbaglia said. "A police station should be a safe place."

In addition, it will be useful for the police department as people can make cash bonds and pay fines when they are here.

While the bank, located at 7100 West Oakton, offers two 24-hour ATMs on site, one in the lobby and one through a drive-thru, the Niles Police Department is the first location for an off-premise automatic teller machine.

In fact, according to bank president Alan Emerick, the only other police department that offers an ATM is located in Chicago.

The new machine will be available for use 24-hours a day. The ATM is fully automatic and instructions are available in Spanish and English.

Bank officials said, depending on the success of this new ATM, the First National Bank of Niles might consider expanding its machines' locations.

"Additional places are being considered," Barbaglia said, "but there are no definite plans."

Niles progressing in solving flood problems

Village officials held a special meeting July 26 to determine whether what progress has been made to solve flooding problems around Niles.

The meeting came in response to a major rain on June 23 and 24 that dropped 3.65 inches of rainfall on the south end of town and 4.9 inches on the north. The Village received 28 basement, 12 street and five overland flooding complaints.

"Overall, the number of complaints was much less than experienced for a 1989 storm when 132 basement flooding complaints were received after a 3-inch rainfall," said Jun Noriega,

director of public services. "We believe the reduction is directly attributed to steps homeowners have taken to floodproof their homes, combined with work we have done to the sewer system."

According to Noriega, that work included insituform lining south of Oakton and east of Milwaukee; a new storm sewer line to the north branch of the Chicago River from Dempster and Sherman; an in-line detention on Dempster and Ozark; and the addition of restrictors and flood deflector berms on Dempster Street. These berms, also placed on Milwaukee, south of Dempster, were described as "dams" and helped reduce the rate of drainage into the sewer system.

Of the complaints received after the storm, 16 were due to the Village's sewer lines being blocked and 12 occurred in response to blockage on each homeowner's sewer line.

Noriega said that while the street flooding was inconvenient, none of it posed a serious problem.

"Administrators were so pleased to see the efforts that were taken as the projects worked during this rainfall," said Village Manager Abe Selman.

New rule to put an end to alcohol possession

The District 225 School Board voted 5-2 in favor of a proposal July 25 that calls for the expulsion of any student found with alcohol on school property.

Under the proposal, high school students at Glenbrook South in Glenview and Glenbrook North in Northbrook will be expelled from school if caught with alcohol on school grounds, on a school bus or during school events.

Students who come to school or an event under the influence of alcohol, but not in possession, will face a 10-day suspension under the plan.

Administrators are calling the proposals one of the strictest alcohol policies in the Chicago area and a couple of board members question the district's ability to enforce the severe new rules.

Township extends support for senior travelers

The Maine Township Town Board this week responded to the increasing demand for transportation for the elderly and disabled by allocating up to \$4,000 a month in additional funding for the next three months to PRC Paratransit Services Inc.

PRC is a consortium of six area townships - including Maine - that provides taxi transportation at nominal rates to people who have difficulty using public transportation.

Niles Senior Center to offer low-cost wills

Eligible senior citizens are offered low-cost will preparation services through the Senior Center Will Program Friday, August 19, at Niles Senior Center. Advance appointments are required and will be scheduled for 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. that day.

An attorney from The Chicago Bar Association will provide free consultations about wills to seniors who register for the service. At a client's request, the attorney will also prepare a simple will for a reduced fee. The cost for drawing up a will is not more than \$50 for an individual (\$75 for a couple).

Durable Power of Attorney and Living Will forms are available free of charge. A Durable Power of Attorney allows a senior to designate another person to make property or health care decisions in the event the senior becomes physically or mentally unable to do so. A Living Will allows an individual to express his or her desire to have death-

not provide services for them and would be able to offer transportation to its current clients for only another month to six weeks.

"These are not individuals who could take regular transportation," Bailey said. "We are meeting needs that would not otherwise be met."

PRC allows seniors and the disabled to travel to their employment, doctor's appointments, medical treatment and other professional services, as well as on personal visits for shopping or recreation Bailey said. Such service allows many users to continue living independently and working in the community despite their disabilities, she said.

"Maine Township has a very large senior population, and that population is growing," said Supervisor Mark Thompson. "This is a service that allows a lot of people to stay in their own homes."

Maine Township allocated \$15,000 to PRC earlier this year. However, Thompson pointed out, Maine has been using a disproportionate share of PRC's services because of the large number of seniors who live in the township.

"We receive a sizeable return on a very small investment," Thompson said.

Trustee Jim Reilly proposed the \$4,000-per-month allocation to help keep PRC operating while the township explores ways to ensure that funding shortfalls don't continue in the future.

Seniors need to be aware of driving limitations

Senior citizens age 65 and older comprise more than 13 percent of all Illinois drivers. While few requirements exist for seniors to maintain driving privileges, they need to pay special attention to natural physical changes, such as changing vision and slower reflexes, that limit driving ability.

Q. At what age should older citizens stop driving?
A. There is no set age as long as they are physically and mentally capable of driving safely. Most elderly people stop driving and even voluntarily surrender their licenses when they feel they should not be driving.

Q. What are the guidelines for driver's license renewal?
A. Seniors ages 69-80 must renew their licenses every four years for a \$5 fee. Persons 81-86 must renew every two years for a \$2 fee, and those 87 and older must renew annually at no fee.

Q. What tests are required?
A. Everyone must pass the vision test, and all persons age 75

and older must pass the driving test. In addition, everyone must take a written test every eight years except those having no traffic convictions.

All senior citizens are encouraged to participate in a driver safety program called "Seniors on the Go." The program provides hands-on driving practice for seniors in a comfortable, risk-free environment.

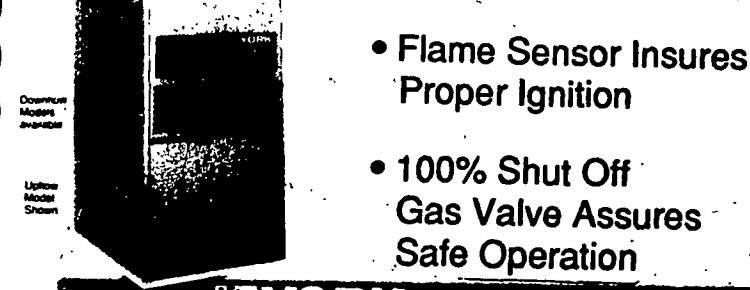

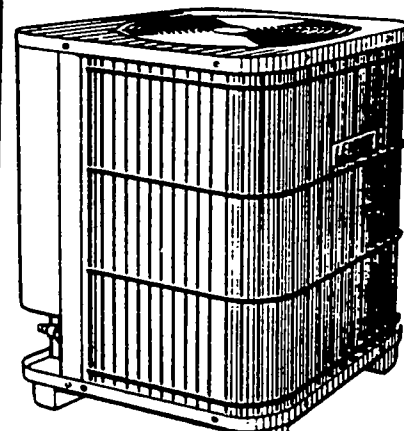

Employee charged with theft

Q. I recently purchased my first automobile. Because it is a used car and no longer under warranty, I need some advice on what I can do to maintain the car. Also, how should I go about finding a trustworthy auto mechanic?

A. Congratulations. Buying an automobile is one of the most important and expensive purchases the average person makes. Proper maintenance will help to ensure that your car runs well and will cut down on repair costs. Maintaining your vehicle requires some basic knowledge of general automobile maintenance (a good place to start is to thoroughly read the manual) and finding a reliable auto mechanic.

If you will write to my Consumer Protection Division at 500 S. Second St., Springfield, Illinois, 62706, we will send you a free booklet called "Taking the Scare Out of Automobile Repair." The booklet provides many tips on how to identify and prevent automobile problems before they occur and offers advice on how to find a qualified mechanic when repairs do become necessary.

'Highway hypnosis' can be dangerous

Driving long distances, whether 100 or 1,000 miles, can be tiring and stressful. "Highway hypnosis," or driver fatigue, is caused by dull scenery and the monotonous sounds of wind, tires on the pavement and steady hum of the engine. Once "highway hypnosis" sets in, driving becomes particularly hazardous.

Q. When does "highway hypnosis" typically set in?
A. Usually after driving two to four hours.

Q. What can I do to combat driver fatigue?
A. If possible, change drivers frequently. Otherwise, keep your body and mind active:

- Shut off the cruise control and vary your speed.
- Change the radio station often and turn up the volume.
- Sing along with the radio or talk with other passengers.
- Adjust the air conditioner or open a window.
- What if fighting fatigue becomes too difficult?
- A. Stop at a rest area or gas station and stretch, exercise or wash your face. Try taking a short nap; 15 to 20 minutes of sleep may refresh you enough to keep going safely, and little time will be lost.
- Q. Is it safe to drive long distance at night?
- A. No. Driving during hours that you usually are sleeping is not recommended. Your biological time clock will have difficulty adjusting to the change, and fatigue could set in earlier than usual.

Reporting a fire or any emergency

All too frequently we hear of tragic stories regarding people who call to report their house is on fire. In their fright, they forget to tell the fire dispatcher their address or give an incomplete address. Others claim they called the fire department and the dispatcher kept them on the telephone asking questions. At the time, it may seem as if dispatchers are asking you needless questions. In reality, these questions will aid the fire department in getting assistance to your home quickly.

1. In the event you are in a residence or building that catches fire, evacuate the building and call the fire department from a phone outside the building. The North Maine Fire Department Emergency Phone Number is 297-2121.

2. When the dispatcher answers, inform them that you are reporting a fire emergency. Tell them your name. The dispatcher may ask you to spell your name.

3. The dispatcher will request the telephone number you are calling from, in case of accidental disconnection or if additional information is needed.

4. Next, provide the dispatcher with the address of the fire and the nearest cross street if you know it. If you are in an unfamiliar area when you discover a fire and are unsure of the address, try to give the dispatcher specific

the medical emergency. Many dispatchers have special medical training and may be able to provide you with lifesaving techniques to use until emergency help arrives.

Emergency calls made the right way help save lives. False emergency calls made as a joke are crimes that cost lives. False alarms tie up emergency lines and endanger emergency personnel driving to the scene. Many dispatchers tape and trace incoming calls, this can help apprehend those calling in false alarms.

The North Maine Fire Department wants to remind you that the unincorporated area of Maine Township is not served by 9-1-1. If you have an emergency, call 297-2121, and follow the procedures outlined.

If you need any phone stickers with the emergency number, call 297-5020 during business hours and we will make arrangements for you to receive them.

5. Stay on the telephone until the dispatcher completes the questioning and disconnects the call.

6. In the event of a medical emergency, stay calm and give the dispatcher as much information as possible as to the nature of

Safety tips for motorists

With summer upon us, motorists need to prepare for increasingly crowded highways as many will be driving to their favorite vacation spots. Motorists are encouraged to obey the speed limit and take extra safety precautions when traveling on busy expressways.

Q. How do I merge onto an expressway safely?

A. Apply your turn signal and use the merge lane to gain enough speed to match that of the expressway traffic. Motorists driving in the right lane of an expressway should move to the faster left lane or adjust their speed to allow other drivers to merge.

Q. What is a safe following distance on expressways?

A. When driving 55 miles per hour, you need about 250 feet to stop, and about 350 feet to stop when traveling at 65 mph. Therefore, the 4- to 5-second following rule is recommended. To determine your distance, pick an object on the road ahead and begin counting, "one-thousand one, one-thousand two..." as the vehicle ahead of yours passes the object. You should reach a 4- or 5-second count before you pass the object. When following big trucks or motor homes, increase your distance even more.

Q. What is the best way to exit an expressway?

A. Exits can be located on either the right or left side of an expressway. Make sure you are on the correct side to avoid quick,

Sharing the road with trucks

Sharing the road with big trucks can be intimidating, even for the most experienced driver. Because of a truck's size and weight, the driver has special needs that demand attention by other motorists.

Q. What are the guidelines for following a big truck?
A. Don't tailgate. Rear-ending a truck can result in a car sliding into and under the trailer. Allow a 4 to 6 second following distance behind a truck to maintain a clear view of the road ahead.

Stay out of the truck's blind spot by positioning your vehicle so the truck driver can see it in his side mirrors. You should be able to see the driver's reflection in his large side mirrors.

Dim your headlights when following a truck at night. High beams can reflect off the truck's mirrors and blind the driver.

Q. What procedures should I follow when passing a truck?

A. Drop back to get a clear view of the road ahead and to gain enough speed to pass. Apply your turn signal (blink your headlights at night) and pass quickly. Do not pull back into the truck's lane until you can see the entire front of the truck in your rearview mirror. Do not slow down after passing.

Q. What about a truck passing my vehicle?
A. Pull as far to the right of your lane as possible. Slow down so the truck driver can pass quickly.

Q. What special needs do trucks have when turning?
A. Big trucks need to swing to the left to allow enough room to make a right turn. You may need to yield the right of way or back up to allow for a truck's wider turns.

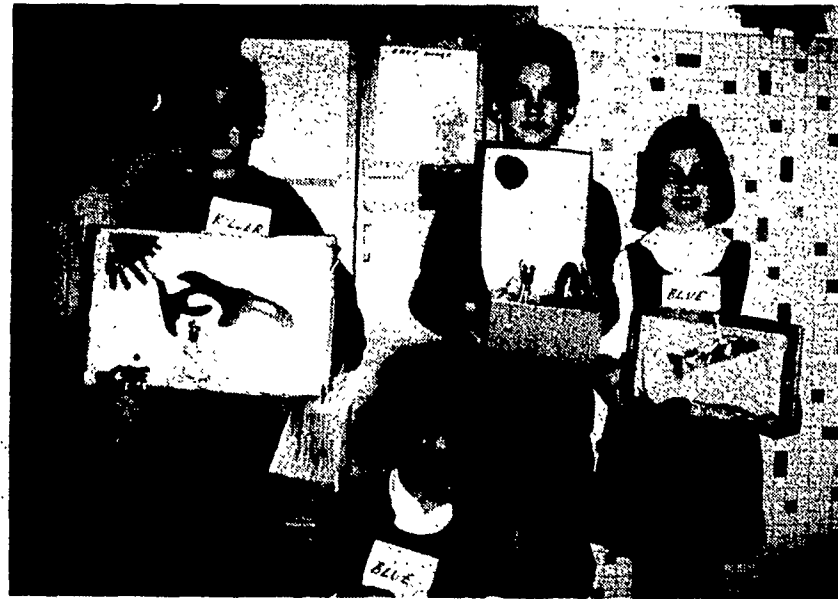

Oakton receives grant

Oakton Community College has been awarded a \$122,971 grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to partially fund a project to assist nursing students from academically and culturally disadvantaged backgrounds, especially those for whom English is a second language.

Area schools to get \$33 million

Schools in Arlington Heights, Prospect Heights, Mount Prospect, Des Plaines, Park Ridge and Wheeling will get a total of about \$33 million from the state, including \$2.2 million in new money for the 1994-95 school year, according to state Sen. Marty Butler (R-Park Ridge).

Butler said he has received estimates from the state Board of Education of the amounts that individual school districts will receive from the state under the new budget.

"These are estimates, however," Butler said. "Districts shouldn't count on these amounts or base their budgets on them, because what they actually receive could be quite different, depending on enrollment and other factors."

Butler said the increased state support is due to the additional \$185 million allocated to elementary and secondary schools in the new state budget. He pointed out that colleges and universities will receive \$92 million more than last year.

Estimated funding for schools in the 28th Senate District for FY 1995 are as follows:

Des Plaines 62 - total, \$2,145,446; new money \$144,075; East Maine 63 - total \$2,090,542; new money \$107,241; Park Ridge 64 - total \$1,515,641; new money \$117,464; Maine Township High School 207 - total \$4,544,702; new money \$292,245; Maine Township Special Ed. - total \$70,241; new money \$2,046.

Niles West addition gets award

The Niles West Science Addition has received a Distinguished Building Award from the Chicago Chapter of the American Institute of Architects (AIA Chicago). The addition, which was completed in August of 1993 at a construction cost of approximately \$4.16 million, was designed by the architectural firm of O'Donnell, Wicklund, Pigozzi and Peterson (OWP&P) and offers a futuristic 21st century appearance.

"Early on we set and negotiated a relatively tight budget," states John Nix, Niles Township High School District 219 Director of Building and Grounds. "We expected to work within a tight budget to get a building that represented something other than a typical school warehouse. It's a good functional facility that will serve the district for many years."

"This is a significant acknowledgment of the quality of design and execution of this major project," adds Andrew Mendelson, Associate Principal of OWP&P. He notes that the award recognizes "the vision and foresight of

Niles Township High School District 219 in providing its student and community the finest in educational facilities."

Along with its futuristic design, the wing adds fourteen new classrooms to the building. The addition also represents an innovative use of space, as preparation areas for the science classrooms are centrally located rather than attached to each classroom. With a central location, each prep area can now serve up to eight to nine classrooms. The construction of the facility also allowed for the conversion of the twelve science rooms in the original Niles West building to standard classrooms, thus increasing total available teaching space.

Increasing enrollment and the need for updated science labs were the major factors in the decision to build the addition. Enrollment has increased by more than 280 students at West since 1990, and is expected to rise by an additional 725 by 2001. This represents an anticipated increase in student population of 59 percent between 1990 and 2001.

Local schools receive waste reduction grants

As part of its School Waste Reduction Grant Program, the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) has allocated funds to Edison School in the Village of Morton Grove and Madison and Jane Stenson Schools in the Village of Skokie. Each school received approximately \$200 in funds for purchase of reusable practice slates for classroom use that enable the schools to significantly reduce the amount of paper used for printing practice and repetitive exercises.

School District 69 PTA Ecology Chairman Ann Alor coordinated the funding applications from Edison and Madison Schools. Each school planned a number of educational initiatives to supplement the students' use of the slates, including tracking the amount of paper saved by using the slates throughout the year. At School District 68's Jane Stenson School, teacher Barbara Tullsen organized the funding application. First grade students using the reusable slates wrote about their waste reduction accomplishments during Earth Week in April, 1994.

SWANCC is an intergovernmental agency responsible for providing a long-term solid waste management plan for the northern Cook County region. Twenty-three communities, including the Villages of Morton Grove and Skokie, are SWANCC members. The grants to the District 68 and 69 schools were among a total of approximately \$4,000 SWANCC distributed as part of its 1993-94 School Waste Reduction grant Program offered to elementary schools in the SWANCC region.

N.N first in state in biology

The science students of Niles North High School placed first in the state and third in the nation in biology, third in the nation in chemistry, fourth in the state and seventeenth in the nation in physics, and fourth in the state in earth science and one hundred fifth in the nation. The total composite score for Niles North ranks it fourth in the United States among those schools who choose to compete in all four areas.

Niles West team competed in three different areas. In biology the Niles West team placed second in the state and fifth in the nation; the chemistry team placed first in the state and tied for third in the nation and the physics team placed third in the state.

Smoking banned in schools under new law

Under a new federal law, school administrators must rid their buildings of smoking, suspend students who carry guns, and grant parents veto power over some materials. Under the Goals 2000: Educate America Act, P.L. 103-227, schools must ban indoor smoking; suspend or expel students who carry guns to school; allow parents to review materials seeking information about students' personal beliefs; and involve parents "to the extent practical" in federally funded birth control programs for students.

The only impact the new legislation is expected to have in District 207 involves smoking since

the District 207 Discipline Code already calls for the suspension or expulsion of students who carry weapons, procedures are in place for parents to review materials seeking information about students' personal beliefs, and District 207 does not participate in any programs to provide birth control to students.

Under the new law, designated smoking areas for faculty and staff will have to go. Failure to comply could cost Maine Township high schools from \$1,000 a day in fines to reform grants or all federal funding. District 207 currently receives about \$1 1/2 million in federal funding.

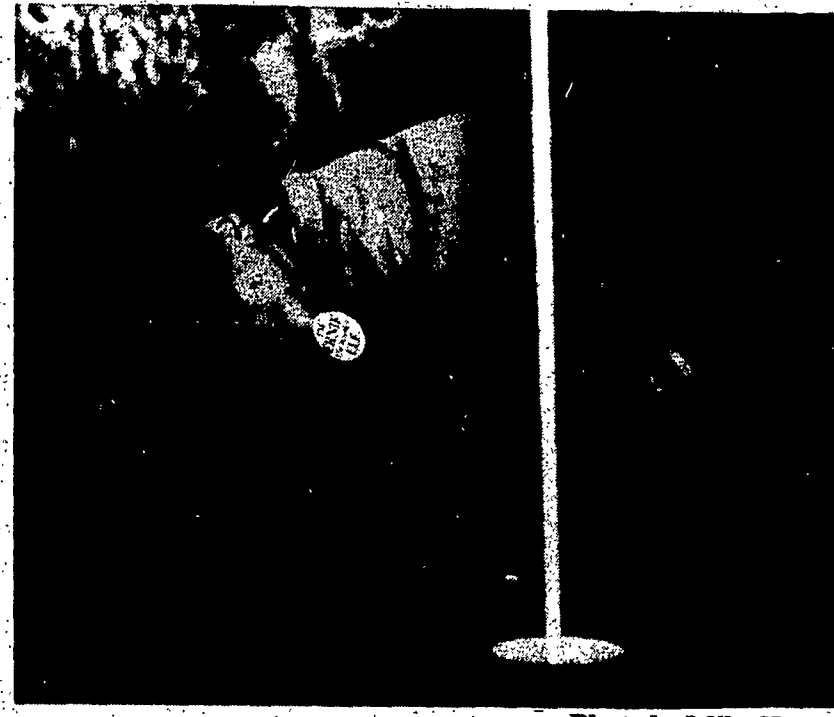

Buyers leave room in budget to personalize homes

How much does the typical luxury home buyer invest to add a few extra personal touches, even though the home is loaded with custom features?

A study of that question at one such development, The Fairways at Rivershire, a Baxter Homes community in north suburban Lincolnshire, indicates that it is a fairly pricey sum.

According to Andy Warner, director of sales and marketing for Baxter Homes, Fairways buyers are spending approximately 10 percent of their purchase price to personalize their homes.

Many homes feature views of the Marriott fairways, while others look out over lake or woods.

Shedding new light on basement remodeling

"Many homeowners have unfairly written off their basements as too damp or dark for anything other than storage space or a workshop," said Rick Hides, Sales Manager, Pella Windows & Doors, Inc., a Morton Grove distributor of Pella Wood Windows and Doors. "However, in many cases, basements can add valuable living area to the home."

Hides said homeowners can evaluate their basement's remodeling potential by examining a few key points. Minimum floor to ceiling height allowed by building code is 7 and a half feet. Heating and cooling systems should be expandable into the basement area to reduce musty odors.

Space should be available to add primary access through wide steps, preferably with landing at the top. Also, safety demands a second basement exit, preferably a large and easily opened window.

"Not only are windows vital to basement safety, comfort is a major factor," said Hides. "The key to the livability of basements is bringing in natural light to help the loss the basement feel."

Hides said window options depend on the landscape and drainage needs around the basement level. In most cases, larger windows can be installed after digging deeper window wells. On sloped lots, a sunroom bump-out can spread natural light with a series of connected wall and ceiling units.

"If basements pass a homeowner's initial assessment, a professional contractor should be brought in to look for possible trouble spots," said Hides. "Together with the contractor, explore all options for bringing in natural light through added or larger windows."

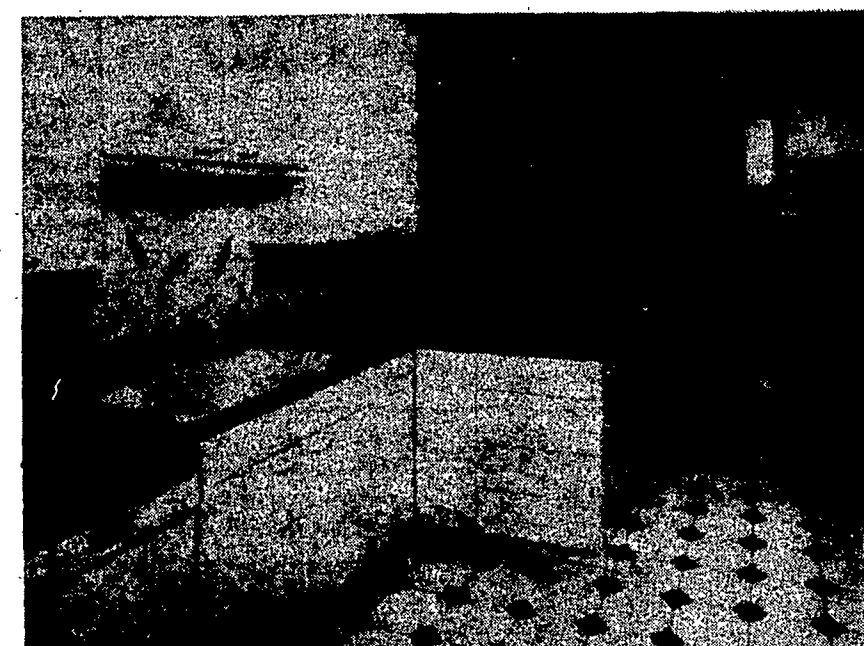

Lyme disease precautions

Lyme disease is a potentially
serious bacterial infection that
has afflicted over 50,000 Ameri-
cans since 1982.

The source of this widespread
public health problem is the tiny
deer tick, also known as the
"black-legged" tick. This pest re-
sides in home lawns, shrubs,
woodpiles and over-grown,
wooded areas. Although it has
been reported in 43 states, Lyme
disease most commonly occurs in
the Northeastern states, North
Central states, and parts of Cali-
fornia.

Humans generally contract
Lyme disease after being bitten
by an infected deer tick. Initially,
victims may notice a red, expand-
ing rash and experience flu-like
symptoms. If not treated early
with antibiotics, Lyme disease

can sometimes result in heart
problems, arthritis, and serious
neurological disorders.

Most Lyme disease infections
occur during June, July and Au-
gust. To reduce your risks while
outdoors this summer, apply in-
sect repellents to clothing and
footwear. Follow packaging in-
structions, especially if applying to
children.

If hiking in heavily wooded areas,
wear long pants tucked into
socks. After returning indoors,
shower and thoroughly inspect
yourself for ticks.

To protect your landscape and
perimeter areas, apply SEVIN®

Avoid use of 'Cow's Head' pills

The Illinois Department of Public Health recently warned consumers to avoid the use of "Cow's Head" Tung Shueh pills, which are a Taiwanese herbal remedy that contains a controlled substance, other drugs and trace amounts of lead.

An Illinois laboratory has reported some individuals, who said they do not take any legally prescribed controlled substance, have failed employer-mandated drug screening after their urine tested positive for drugs associated with Cow's Head.

An analysis by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) confirmed Cow's Head contains the drug diazepam, a controlled substance found in some anti-anxiety medication. The pills also contain hydrochlorothiazide, a diuretic, and combination of several anti-inflammatory drugs, including diclofenac, indomethacin and mefenamic acid.

These drugs can have serious side effects and adverse reactions, especially in persons taking other medications, and could cause serious blood disorders. The FDA has warned consumers and postal officials to watch for the pills, which are not legally imported into the United States. Small quantities have been smuggled into the country and eventually offered for retail sale without a prescription, usually in Asian food and general merchandise stores.

Cow's Head comes in packs containing 80 black-colored pearl-shaped pills, approximately 3/8 inch in diameter. The manufacturer, Ta Ang Pharmaceutical Co. of Taiwan, claims the pills are for treatment of blood disorders, circulation and liver problems, and strengthening bone and muscles.

Anyone in the possession of the pills should discontinue use and contact their physician. The sale of these pills is a violation of the Illinois Controlled Substances Act and the Illinois Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act.

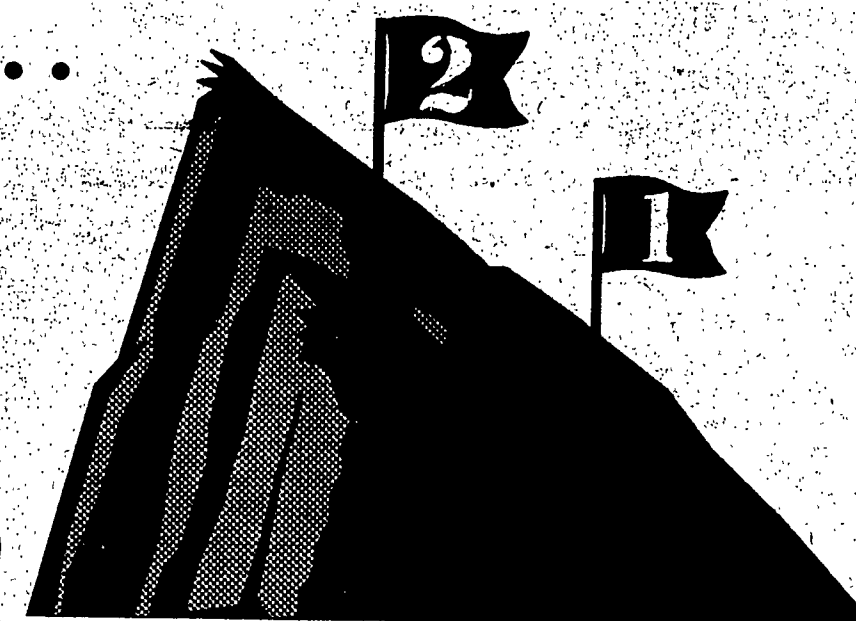

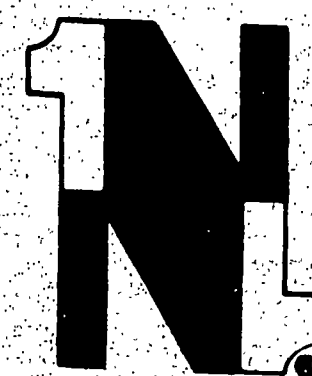
