Alert victims aid in robber's capture

Dennis Ray Johnson, 42, a Texas native now residing in Chicago, probably thought he was committing a perfect crime, just like in the movies, when he walked into the Blockbuster Video store at Oakton and Milwaukee Avenues around noon Oct. 23.

Johnson had something wrapped in a towel, and by some pretty fine acting and body language, he was able to convince the clerk and another customer who was in the store at the time that it was a gun.

He was so convincing, in fact, that when he told the clerk to "Give me all the money out of the register," the clerk complied giving Johnson the cash contents of both registers in the store.

When Johnson motioned for the clerk and the witness to lie down on the floor, they did so. He cautioned them to stay there for three minutes.

Johnson then made his first miscue: he tried to exit through the entrance, but was stopped in his tracks and had to go back, walk around the front of the counter and finally go out through the exit.

Once out of the store, Johnson went straight for his van. Meanwhile, the clerk and witness took the spotlight. Ignoring the three-

Blase takes stand on November referendums

Mayor Nicholas Blase of Niles issued a position letter recently involving the two referendums which Niles voters will have to decide on in the upcoming November 7 election.

In his statement Blase said, "I would like to provide a brief explanation and explain my position on each of these referendums."

Blase noted, "The first referendum is for Grammar School District 71 which involves the question of whether the school on Oakton Street, just east of Waukegan, should be expanded eliminating the need for a second school on Touhy Avenue. The logic regarding this question is overwhelming because one school can operate more economically than two. Therefore, I strongly recommend this referendum."

Niles to accept profit-sharing if Rosemont gets riverboat gambling

Residents express concern over proposed bank exits

Niles Village Hall was again the gathering spot for many concerned homeowners who came to hear and complain about the rezoning petition of Parkway Bank & Trust, sole bidder for the property soon to be vacated by the Village of Niles at 7601 N. Milwaukee.

The new Village Hall is being constructed at Oakton and Waukegan and is expected to be ready sometime next year.

Parkway had been granted their zoning request to construct a banking facility with drive-thru windows, by the Plan Commission and Zoning Board at its meeting on Oct. 2, with several restrictions. One of these was that a right-turn entrance only on Dobson St. from Harlem would be part of the plans. But it was this the residents were complaining about at the Village Board meeting.

Although the homeowners conceded they had been pacified in early October by the Zoning Board's recommendations, John Meier, 7635 Oconto, told the Trustees that they (the residents) had reconsidered the situation

and were now asking that the Dobson Avenue entrance be eliminated.

Paul Kolpak, 6767 N. Milwaukee, Niles, attorney for the bank, provided other ingress and egress options that he said had been agreed upon by the bank since the Zoning Board's meeting.

Kolpak's suggestions were met with opposition from Trustees Bart Murphy and James Mahoney who questioned the logic of one of the alternatives, which would move traffic back onto Howard at one of the busiest spots.

Niles cop nabs murder suspect

Luck and good police work came together for Niles police officer Lisa Nallen Oct. 21.

After leaving roll call to begin her 11 p.m. to 7 a.m. shift, Nallen was about to drive out of the Niles Police Department parking lot when a white 1993 Mazda with Georgia license plates whizzed past her.

Something clicked for Nallen, as she remembered a police bulletin about a murder warrant out of DeKalb County, Georgia, that had just been read at roll call. Nallen remembered the description of the car and the suspect who had stolen it after murdering its owner and thought this might just be the man.

With assistance from other officers, Nallen made a traffic stop, placed the suspect, Scott Lee Loughman, 24, under arrest and transported him to the Niles Police Department where he was mirandized and processed.

Loughman is accused of murdering short-time acquaintance

Halloween safety tips

Halloween falls on Tuesday, Oct. 31, this year. With dusk falling one hour earlier because of central standard time, young ghosts and goblins will be haunting neighborhoods in pursuit of treats very early. Motorists and parents must take proper safety precautions to protect excited trick-or-treaters.

Q. How can motorists contribute to the safety of children?

A. Turn on your headlights at the first sign of dusk, and reduce your speed in residential areas. Look for trick-or-treaters before turning at intersections and before turning into or backing out of driveways. It also is important to watch for trick-or-treaters who may dart out from between parked vehicles.

Q. What can parents do to ensure a safe Halloween for children?

A. Make sure they wear

brightly colored costumes or reflective tape, which can be purchased at most auto or hardware stores. Encourage them to walk on sidewalks, whenever possible, or to keep to the far left-hand side of the road, facing traffic. Remind children to knock only at homes lit by porch lights, and make sure candy is properly sealed. Parents, guardians or older siblings should accompany children age 10 and under.

Q. How can children contribute to their own safety?

A. Wear warm, comfortable clothing that is easy to walk, see and be seen in. Carry a flashlight and trick-or-treat on well-lit streets. Always look left, right and left again before crossing streets. Trick-or-treat with an adult or with a group, and only go to neighborhoods in which you are familiar.

Cellular phone tips

Cellular phones are convenient and provide an extra measure of safety when used to call for road service, report accidents, check traffic or weather conditions or to report suspected drunk drivers.

Unfortunately, some drivers abuse cellular phones and create safety hazards.

Q. What can I do to make car phoning safe?

A. Drive defensively while speaking on the phone. Check mirrors frequently, every four to five seconds is appropriate.

The best way to keep both hands on the wheel is to use a hands-free speaker phone.

Keep conversations short. Intense negotiations or arguments should be held only while your car is parked.

Q. What are some safe dialing tips?

A. Whenever possible, dial when your car is not moving, or have a passenger dial the phone for you.

Store frequently used numbers in your phone's memory to eliminate unnecessary dialing. Keep a list of important and emergency numbers in your vehicle, such as police, weather, traffic or any others that may be helpful.

If you must dial while driving, dial the first three numbers, assess traffic, then finish making the call.

MG resident/architect brings European influence to design



Like many Europeans, Darek Zarnowski longed to have an opportunity in the United States. He was raised under Communism in Poland but, along with a majority of young people, he had a rebellious and resentful nature. This ultimately led him to express his views by drawing political cartoons.

He had been drawing politically sensitive cartoons for two years while attending college in Warsaw. Although his cartoons criticized Communist leadership and the government in general, he still obtained a Master's Degree in Architecture from the Warsaw Polytechnic of Engineering and Technology Faculty of Architecture. Afterward, he held architectural positions with two companies in Warsaw from 1983 to 1988. Zarnowski's cartooning continued until he traveled to the United States on a tourist visa later that year. It was at this time that his home in Poland was visited by

the government. It seems they had tolerated enough of this political sarcasm. One of his friends called and warned him to remain in the United States rather than return. He stayed and then made application to begin the process of naturalization.

Following one year at a Chicago architectural firm, he accepted a position in 1990 with Bernheim & Kahn Ltd. Architects. The firm, located then in downtown Chicago, relocated to suburban Northbrook, and Zarnowski soon became involved in all phases of architectural and interior design, working on commercial and residential buildings. Fluent in Polish, some Russian and steadily improving on his English, Zarnowski expects to become a naturalized citizen in 1996.

Among the many projects on which Zarnowski has worked include Chicago Vocational High School, Lane, Technical High

School, Scanlan Elementary School, and Hedges Elementary School, all Chicago schools. In the private sector, he is involved in creating a total new exterior design image for Wickes Furniture, which will be adapted to its stores in Wheeling, Itasca, Harvey, Wilmette, North Riverside, and Merrillville, Indiana. Other design work has involved Midwest Bank locations in Chicago and Hinsdale, as well as a unique proposed casino concept at Navy Pier, phases I and II of Stone Jewish Community Center in Flossmoor, and railroad stations in Buffalo Grove and Wheeling for the new Metra Wisconsin Central Line.

Having worked on a variety of

projects, Zarnowski, who is now head of design at Bernheim & Kahn Ltd., Architects, is able to comment on some of the differences and similarities between architecture in the United States and Poland.

"Projects in both countries are based on money and a budget," he said. "During Communism, budgets didn't have to be established because limitations were placed on materials and access to and delivery of materials. There was no selection of materials to speak of. The availability of materials always dictated the design and texture of a building."

"On the other hand," he continued, "budget limitations in the United States are determined by

the client, and architectural design seems to be more traditional. In Europe, the philosophy is to preserve old buildings and make them look better. In the United States, the commitment to preserve buildings is not as strong.

"I'm amazed there is such an abundance and variety of materials in this country, and access to information, shapes, colors, and custom work seems to never end. There is no limit on the design of a project other than the client's budget," he said.

Zarnowski lives with his wife, Violetta, in suburban Morton Grove. He is looking forward to designing his home and having it reflect the lifestyle of his family and their interests.

ABOUT YOUR PAIN....

Q: I've been suffering from what's called "sciatica." Can you explain this condition to me? L. Malik, Niles.

A. Sciatica is an abnormal and usually painful condition of the sciatic nerve, which supplies the muscles and joints of the hips, buttocks, posterior thigh, calf and foot. The sciatic nerve is the largest nerve in the body, extending from the lower spine down the back of the thigh.

Symptoms of sciatica include pain, numbness, and often muscle weakness in the affected areas. The pain may be a result of inflammation of the sciatic nerve or an impingement of the sensory nerve fibers that end at the sciatic nerve. Often compared to the "worst toothache" imaginable, sciatic pain may become less pronounced as it progresses but it could affect the function of the hip and the lower leg areas.

The faulty spinal-pelvic alignment may result from a single fall, accident, unusual exercise, or such structural deficits may develop gradually as part of an overall distortion pattern. Three conditions which most frequently injure the sciatic nerve include:

1. When the nerve openings between the vertebrae in the lower back are blocked, the sciatic nerve is compressed and irritated.
2. A sacroiliac subluxation or distortion puts direct pressure on the sciatic nerve.
3. The deep muscles of the buttocks may squeeze and irritate the sciatic nerve as it passes between them.



Keep Halloween safe, free bookmark for kids

Costumes, parties, trick-or-treating and lots of candy create great excitement for children at Halloween. To keep this fun and avoid hazardous situations, drivers and parents need to take special precautions, says AAA-Chicago Motor Club.

Visibility is frequently a problem both for motorists and children. It's hard for drivers to see children after dark, and many children wear costumes which can make them even more difficult to see. To make matters worse, the masks frequently worn by these trick-or-treaters can obstruct their vision so that they miss seeing oncoming cars.

Drivers should practice these precautions:
• Turn on headlights at first sign of dusk.
• Be extra alert for children darting from between parked cars.
• If making a right turn on red, keep a special lookout for children.
• Drive at least 5 mph under the posted speed limit in residential areas.

Parents should be sure their children can see clearly by encouraging them to wear makeup instead of a mask, or enlarging mask eye holes and emphasizing removal of masks before crossing the street. Younger trick-or-treaters should be accompanied by a parent or an older brother or sister. Otherwise, they should go out with a group and tell parents the streets they plan to visit.

Children should trick-or-treat while it's still light. If that isn't possible, they should go only on well-lighted streets and be sure to carry flashlights or glowsticks. Their costumes should be trimmed with retroreflective tape which shines brightly in head-lights. It can be



I had given away what might have been my fortune. (I also have a 1920's baseball signed by Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig and Jimmy Foxx, but the names are hardly visible because I played catch with my son one time with that ball and rubbed off most of the names).

What's troubling about box-packing is half the stuff I packed is lost. Many of the boxes went out to Michigan. We have a house near New Buffalo and a couple of hundred boxes...or thousand...or so, are there in closets and in the basement.

My books also went out of state. I had several hundred books which were always part of the decor in the family room. Today, I have 11 books on my new shelves in The Matchbox...three of them library books.

I had a former bedroom set-up as an office with a file cabinet, computer and printer. In The Matchbox the file cabinet is in the rear of the clogged-up closet and there's no room for a computer or printer.

The Matchbox is up 16 floors and we forever brag about the vistas we see from up high. On a clear night we can't see forever but we can see a silhouette of downtown with the Hancock and Sears

buildings acting as bookends of the silhouette. To the west we can see the lights at O'Hare Airport. Night-time, the sparkling lights give a breathtaking view. But how many times can I have my breath taken away? It's like watching a giant television screen which has only one picture. After awhile you'd like to change stations.

I had lunch with a friend who told me the only time his 45 year marriage was ever troubling was the year he moved. He's a very laid-back guy, and for him to be irritated requires a major upset which only moving could do.

I've concluded "moving" is a woman's thing. A guy doesn't want to move. What for? I recall telling one young fellow I was going to miss the good shower faucet I had when I moved. He probably thought I was nuts. But the little things in a house are what make a house a house.

I could move around the old house instinctively. I knew where to reach, where to pull, what to push and I never lost anything...except one half of a pair of socks with regularity.

If you come visit us at The Matchbox call first. If someone else is visiting we might have to meet in the outer hallway. Otherwise, you might have to enter The Matchbox sideways. And if you don't have your right side facing forward, you'll never be able to see the beautiful view.

minute warning, they were up and rewinding a surveillance tape in about 10 seconds and phoning police in about 30 seconds more with vivid descriptions of the offender and his vehicle.

At 12:32 p.m. Niles police made their entrance and immediately observed the fleeing Johnson in the 8600 block of Harlem Avenue. They followed him to 7113 Dempster Street where they stopped the offender, ordered him out of the vehicle and placed him in custody.

Once again, Johnson had to go into his act as he had to convince police that he had no gun. This time, however, police were able to verify the story, and it turned out to be the truth—Johnson was unarmed.

Police recovered \$219 from Johnson's van and he was charged with aggravated robbery, a class one felony, and placed under \$25,000 bond.

"Once again, good police work was done by good policemen who got a lucky break," said Public Information Officer Sgt. Roger Wilson.

However, that may not be the end of the story. According to Wilson, Judge Rohrer ruled that Johnson will be placed on electronic monitoring after he posts bond.

- For Children:
• Make sure all costumes are sewn properly and hemmed to avoid tripping;

• Make sure all costumes are flame retardant;
• Give children flashlights. Change the bulb color to orange or yellow to add to the festivities;

• If using toy guns or other toy weapons, they should be made of foam, rubber or plastic;
• Accompany young children "trick or treating" to reduce the risk of them eating unexamined treats or being the victims of older kid's tricks;
