District 71 one-school plan on ballot

Besides the library expansion referendum, another referendum on the Nov. 7 ballot will seek voter support for a proposed \$6.9 million bond issue to consolidate two Niles Schools and renovate and enlarge the remaining school.

According to the proposal, Niles Elementary School South, 6935 Touhy, which serves kindergarten through grade 5, would be eliminated, while the Culver Middle School would get a 50,000 square foot addition, undergo renovation bringing the school into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and would serve students in kindergarten through eighth grade.

The \$6.9 million bond issue would be paid off over the next 20 years by homeowners whose tax bills will be increased by approximately \$65 annually for a home valued at \$140,000.

District 71 Superintendent Dr. Eugene Zalewski pointed out that the consolidation is educationally sound. The building design will allow younger students to be in a separate section of the building.

"It will allow us greater flexibility in use of staff," Zalewski said. "We're a small district, and now we have a lot of staff members who have to go between the two schools. For example, physical education is taught in the afternoon at Culver and in the morning at South."

Zalewski said that in addition to art and P.E. teachers, the school psychologist, social worker and special ed teacher current-

School board elections, referendum vote on Tuesday

Voters will go to the polls on Tuesday Nov. 7 to elect candidates for local school boards. Polls in the local school districts will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Candidates in the local school districts are as follows:

District 71

In District 71 there are three four-year vacancies and one two-year vacancy on the school board. However, only two candidates have filed to run. They are incumbent Vincent Bugarin and newcomer John Zuckerman, both running for four-year terms.

"We're hoping for some write-in candidates," said Barb Miller, secretary to Superintendent Gene Zalewski.

District 63

The largest number of challengers is probably in District 63 where seven candidates are running for three seats. Joel Block is the lone incumbent, with newcomers Kerry Karth, Richard E. Mally, Anne E. Marzullo, Daniel Patlak, Arthur Ryden and Mark

D. Weisman entering the race. Kris Benoit, administrative secretary to Director of Personnel and Pupil Services and board of education secretary Michael Johann said she had no idea why there were so many candidates. The only even remotely controversial issue is teacher negotiations, Benoit said, and those should be settled before the election.

Nilesites to vote on library expansion

Niles voters will decide Nov. 7 on a proposed bond issue that would raise \$8.875 million for renovation and expansion of the Niles Library.

According to Library administrator Cary Czarnecki, if the proposal is approved, \$7 million will be used to add 26,000 square feet of new space in a two-story wrap-around addition that will be built over the existing children's library and administrative and technical services wing. The remaining \$1.875 million will be spent on new books and equipment.

The issue needs a simple majority vote, Czarnecki said, and will result in a slight increase in the library tax rate.

For a home with a market value of \$100,000, the library tax increase would amount to 92 cents a month or \$11 a year, Czarnecki said. "About the cost of a new book," he said. "At the library you can get all the new books you want all year long," he added.

According to the proposal, Niles Elementary School South, 6935 Touhy, which serves kindergarten through grade 5, would be eliminated, while the Culver Middle School would get a 50,000 square foot addition, undergo renovation bringing the school into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and would serve students in kindergarten through eighth grade.

The \$6.9 million bond issue would be paid off over the next 20 years by homeowners whose tax bills will be increased by approximately \$65 annually for a home valued at \$140,000.

Senior Citizens offered low-cost wills in Skokie

Eligible citizens are offered low-cost will preparation services through the Senior Citizens Will Program, Wednesday, Nov. 8, at the Skokie Office of Human Services. Advance appointments are required and will be scheduled from 9:30 a.m. to 12 p.m.

An attorney from The Chicago Bar Association Lawyer Referral Service will provide free consultations about wills to seniors who register for the service. At a client's request, the attorney will also prepare a simple will for a reduced fee. The cost for drawing up a will is not more than \$50 for an individual (\$75 for a couple).

Durable Power of Attorney and Living Will forms are available free of charge. A Durable Power of Attorney allows a senior to designate another person to make property or health care decisions in the event the senior becomes physically or mentally unable to do so. A Living Will allows an individual with a terminal health condition to express his or her desire to have death-delaying procedures withheld or withdrawn.

Seniors may complete the Durable Power of Attorney and Living Will forms themselves, or they may hire the attorney to help fill them out and explain the various options available on the forms. The fee for the attorney to provide legal advice about a Durable Power of Attorney is \$75 maximum for an individual (\$125 for a couple). The charge

for a Living Will is no more than \$50 for an individual (\$75 for a couple).

To be eligible for the Senior Citizens Will Program, a client must be age 60 or over. Annual income must not exceed \$15,000 (\$20,000 for a couple); and assets, excluding a home and personal car, should be worth no more than \$30,000.

The Senior Citizens Will Program is sponsored by The Chicago Bar Association, the Suburban Area Agency on Aging, the Chicago Department on Aging, and the Cook County Legal Assistance Foundation.

Appointments for the Senior Citizens Will Program must be scheduled in advance. To register and be screened for eligibility, call the Skokie Office of Human Services at (708) 933-8208 (voice) or (708) 933-8455 (TDD). The program is usually held the second Wednesday of each month.

What you don't know about diabetes can hurt you

StableLives Diabetes Program at Holy Family Medical Center in Des Plaines, will participate in the American Diabetes Association's Diabetes Detection Week. Free and easy diabetes screening tests that could save a person's life will be offered to the public during the week of November 5-11.

Diabetes is a dangerous disease in which the body does not produce or respond to insulin, a hormone needed for daily life. The accumulating high blood sugar can severely damage the heart, blood vessels, kidneys, eyes and nerves. If left untreated, diabetes can lead to premature

death. Early detection of diabetes will help prevent these health risks. The symptoms of diabetes are:

- Type I, Insulin-Dependent Diabetes: frequent urination, accompanied by excessive thirst; extreme hunger; unexplained weight loss; extreme fatigue; and irritability. These symptoms often occur suddenly.

- Type II - Non-Insulin Dependent Diabetes: blurred vision or any unusual changes in sight; tingling or numbness in the hands or feet; frequent skin infections; slow healing of cuts and bruises, and any of the previously mentioned symptoms for type I. The symptoms of Type II diabetes often appear gradually and many individuals may not have any symptoms.

It is extremely important that people who are at high risk for diabetes be tested. Individuals at high risk for diabetes include: anyone who has a blood relative with diabetes; anyone of African American, Hispanic, or Native American descent; and anyone over 40 and overweight. These populations have a high inci-

dence of diabetes. The American Diabetes Association and Holy Family Medical Center, StableLives Diabetes Program, encourage the public to take advantage of the free diabetes screening available from November 5-11. Several times early-morning drivers have driven an end-run around the one-gate crossings which resulted in fatalities. At the Lehigh crossing on Dempster Street there's a stop light west of the train tracks and another east of the tracks, which are synchronized with one another. Had the Fox River Grove crossing had a similar two stop light configuration, the accident would not likely have occurred.

In addition to the federal transportation department's inspections we're hopeful local officials will also re-study all railroad crossings to make sure the Fox River Grove tragedy never happens here.

tion.

District 67
In District 67 the situation is almost the same, except that three incumbents and two newcomers will be running for three seats.

The incumbents are Joan Dechert, Susan Pellicano and Edward Reynolds. Joe Brunner and Janet Ladd are newcomers to the board race.

District 64
Peace will reign in Niles District 64 where three candidates will run for three seats. Incumbent Irene Jinks will run along with John Farrell and H. Stephen Lieber.

District 70
In Morton Grove District 70, five candidates will vie for three seats on the seven-member school board. The incumbents are Mary Malooly and Donald Hols. Also running are Carl Savaro, Lawrence Gomborg and Karen Rosenski. The terms are for four years.

"A lot of people are interested in running for the school board this year," said Marianne Bielinski, administrative assistant to the superintendent.

District 219
A storm is brewing in High School District 219 where four three-year vacancies attracted eight candidates, four of them incumbents. However, two citizens filed objections to seven of the candidates, which would have left a single candidate had not the electoral board overruled all the objections.

However, then one of the objectors appealed the overruling, and the appeal was upheld on four of the candidates, so that only four of the original eight candidates are still on the ballot. Jeff Berkwitz, District 219 public relations co-ordinator, said the objections were fairly technical rather than issue-oriented. One example Berkwitz cited was an objection to one candidate because he had failed to number the pages of his signature petitions.

ly travel between the two schools and receive a travel reimbursement that would be saved if the consolidation referendum is approved.

Another saving will be the cost of renovating only one school to comply with the ADA. "We have to provide a way for people to get from one floor to another," Zalewski said. "We have no elevator in either school now."

The four candidates who were removed from the ballot because of objections learned Tuesday that their appeal to a higher court that would have restored them to the ballot was denied. They are Sanford Alper, current board president, Saul Weiner, current board vice president, and challengers Paul Smith and Jerome Glass.

District 207
In the Maine High School District 207, four candidates will vie for three four-year terms. Running are John Roger Crawford, Ben H. Herman, Donna B. Pellar and David L. Slayton. Oscar Marquis is running for the two-year unexpired term left vacant by Mary Ann Moller-Gunderson when she moved out of the district.

Oakton Community College
Ten candidates are in the running for three six-year terms on the Board of Trustees at Oakton Community College in Des Plaines.

Three incumbents are among the candidates. Ray Harstein, who was a founding board member and has served on every board since, is one of them. Ellen Schrodt, who has just completed her first term is another. Larry Golberg completed the unfinished term of a board member forced to resign by an illness.

The other candidates are Peter Dudko, Ralph Goren, Vernon James Grubisch, Bill Handzel, Gerri Sue Hesselberg, Maxine T. Hill and Adair Waldenberg.

The Oakton race was described as "hotly contested" by Ray Rolff, public relations manager for the college. "I would say there's a lot of interest. The ten candidates seem to be very interested in serving [and] in running for these three seats," Rolff said.

the Niles/Culver PTA Referendum Committee, said the consolidation will eliminate overcrowding and save taxpayers money in the long run. She said it would cost the district \$4,000,000 to renovate each of the schools to meet current standards, for a total cost of \$8,000,000. The consolidation/addition proposal will cost \$6.9 million, for a saving of \$1.1 million.

Mayor Nicholas Blase has come out in favor of the consolidation. "The logic regarding this question is overwhelming because one school can operate more economically than two," Blase said.

"People are using the library more," Czarnecki said. "People recognize that and the response we've been getting is positive. People see the need for it" [library expansion].

A circulation increase of 185 percent in the last 10 years and more than 28,000 cardholders have underscored the need for more storage and operating space, Czarnecki said. "The library is too small now for the collection we have. We've outgrown the space we have for the books and material collection," Czarnecki said. If the referendum is approved, the library will increase the size of the collection by 57,000 items, he said.

Czarnecki estimated that groundbreaking would occur in the fall of 1996, followed by 18 months of construction during which the library would remain open.

The whole project should be finished in late winter or early spring of 1998, Czarnecki said. The project will also increase parking space by 40 percent, as architects will reconfigure the parking lot, making the alley on the east side of the property one-way thereby adding parking spaces.

Czarnecki said the referendum has received the endorsements of many civic leaders and organizations, starting with Mayor Nicholas Blase who wrote in a recent position letter: "This necessary expansion will provide the future needs of our young people and everyone else that uses the library facility."

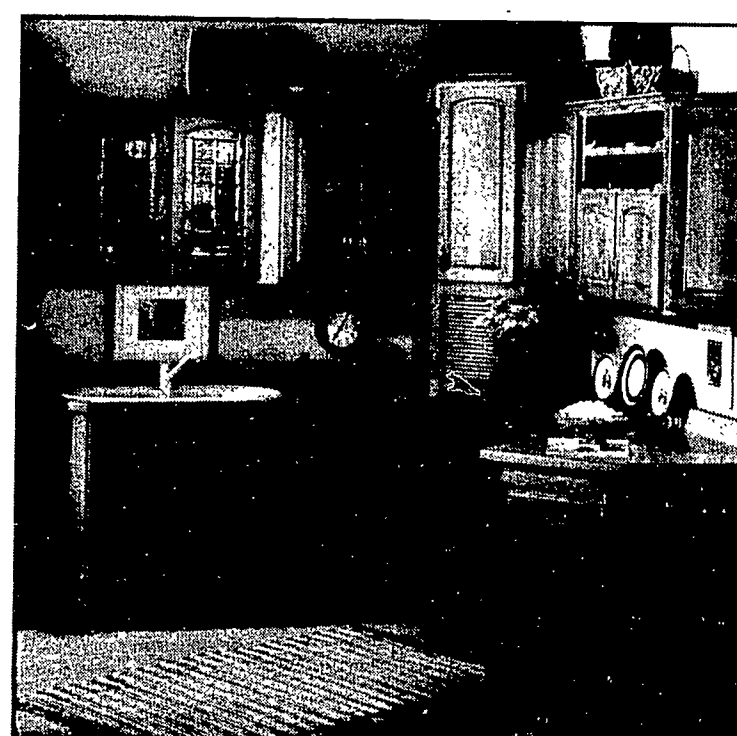

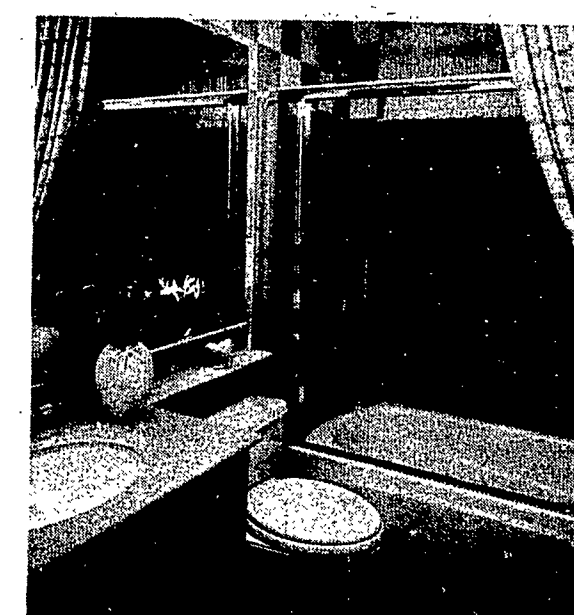

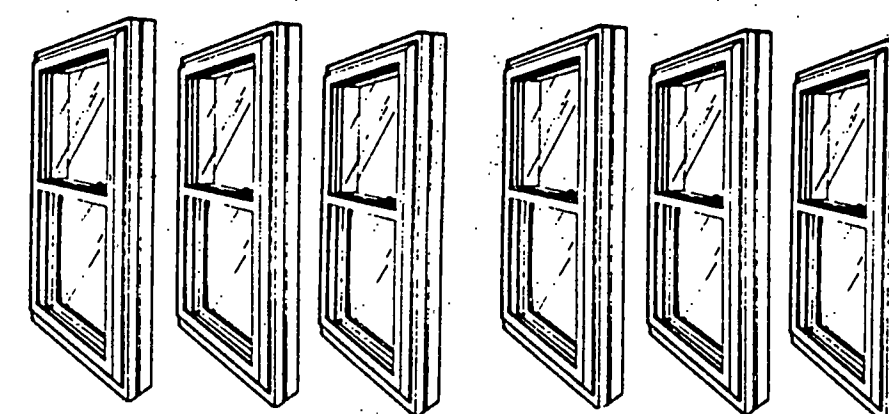
