

Park Board to hold hearing on Jozwiak Park move

Park Board President Elaine Heinen announced that a public hearing regarding the disposition of the Niles College property and proposals made regarding Jozwiak Park will be held Feb. 21 at 7 p.m. at 7877 Milwaukee Ave.

At the request of Tim Posedel, Commissioner of the Niles Baseball League, President Heinen agreed to meet with the League Board of Directors prior to the public hearing. Posedel said he hoped to make Heinen aware of the league's concerns regarding Jozwiak Park so that she would be better prepared to express the concerns of the citizens at the public hearing.

Commissioner Bernard "Bud" Skaja, III said he hoped that the village motto, "Niles, where people count," would not be changed to "Niles, where condos count." He urged fellow Park District members to "remember

the people who elected us" and not just "special interests."

Mark Donash, a coach of the Niles Hockey Rangers, complained that the group had been stunted on ice time and that preparation for the large number of new members had not been properly taken care of. Jerry Krewer, Superintendent of Recreation, said that communication and personnel problems made scheduling ice time particularly difficult but that efforts are being made to keep the program going.

In other business, Gary Koenig, executive director of the Maine-Niles Association of Special Recreation gave the annual report detailing the state and national recognition the Association has received for its excellent programs for disabled youngsters and adults. He also

Blase to hold meeting on Pontarelli development

Immediately before beginning its first meeting of 1996, Mayor Nicholas Blase informed the capacity crowd that had gathered at the Village Hall on Jan. 23 that the Board would not be taking up the rezoning issue involving Pontarelli Development Co.'s plans to develop the former Niles College site.

Blase stated that under law, zoning matters required more time for resolution between the Zoning Board's meeting and the Village Board's meeting.

Noting the tension of the crowd, Blase announced that a separate meeting will be held to

discuss the proposed 420-unit condominium development and public park.

He further stated that the proposal would be included at the Board's Feb. 27 meeting, and that the Niles Park District was planning to take up the matter at its Feb. 21 meeting.

In another matter, the Niles Village Board, in conjunction with its plan to adopt a redevelopment plan for the area surrounding the intersections of Milwaukee and Touhy Aves. announced that a special public hearing would be held on March 1. The hearing would be held at 7 p.m. at the Village Hall.

Police say 37 year old suspect has long criminal record

Chicago man charged in area church break-ins

Working together on an active Des Plaines Police Department burglary warrant, investigation personnel from the Niles and Morton Grove Police Departments arrested the suspected perpetrator of at least 14 burglaries to Catholic churches and schools in the northshore area.

Taken into custody Jan. 19 at about 4:30 p.m. in the vicinity of Thorndale and Winthrop Avenues in Chicago was Larry Ellis, 37, of 5860 N. Kenmore Ave., Chicago.

Ellis was questioned at the Niles Police Department regarding three recent burglaries, at St. Martha's School, 8523 Georgian, Morton Grove, on Dec. 12, at St. John Brebeuf School, 8301 N. Harlem, Niles, Dec. 19, and St. Isaac Jogues School, 8149 W. Golf Rd., Niles, on Jan. 14.

Ellis was charged with the three burglaries, and investigation continues on similar burglaries that have occurred in Highland Park, Wilmette (2), Highwood, Glenview (4), Winnetka, Northfield (2) and Evanston. All the burglaries occurred

in facilities of the Chicago Archdiocese and were either churches or schools.

Bond was set at \$500,000 by Judge McCourt, and Ellis is currently being held in the Cook County Jail pending his Feb. 16 court date at District 2 Headquarters in Skokie.

"Ellis has an extensive criminal history, which includes arrests and convictions for several of these types of burglaries," said Sgt. Roger Wilson, Public Information Officer of the Niles Police Department.

Around 4:07 p.m., the man returned to the store and returned the merchandise to the suspected clerk. Without checking the returned merchandise, the employee issued a cash refund for \$3,538.71 to the Chicago man and brought the boxes back to

Sprint/Centel reminds customers of new area code

Sprint/Centel-Illinois reminds its customers to begin using the new 847 area code in the Chicago area.

The new 847 area code has been assigned to all Sprint/Centel north and northwest suburban customers who had the 708 area code. Chicago residents and businesses, including those served by Sprint/Centel, will continue to use the 312 area code.

This results from a decision made last year by the Illinois Commerce Commission to split the 708 suburban area code when it became obvious the supply of 708 numbers was on the verge of being exhausted. The popularity of fax machines, cellular phones, pagers, modems and second lines in homes had rapidly depleted the number of available phone numbers, according to Joe Davis, Sprint/Centel network services, traffic and support manager.

From Jan. 20 until April 20, phone calls will still go through if a customer forgets to use the new area code. However, as of April 20, the new code must be used. At that time, if callers dial the old area code, they will hear a

recorded message reminding them to use the new code.

Another area code, 630, will be introduced in the Chicago west suburbs this summer. The permissive period for that area code split will begin Aug. 3 with mandatory use of the code effective on Nov. 30, Davis said. Still another area code, 773, will be introduced in the city on Oct. 12 (permissive period) with mandatory use of the code required Jan. 11, 1997.

Business customers, many of whom may have a telephone system which needed to be re-programmed to accommodate the new area codes, are encouraged to test their systems by calling a number in the new area code any time.

If they experience problems, they may need to consult their communications vendor.

Sprint/Centel offers its business customers a toll-free number, 1-800-539-7229, to call for information on how to update their phone systems or for other questions regarding the new area codes.
