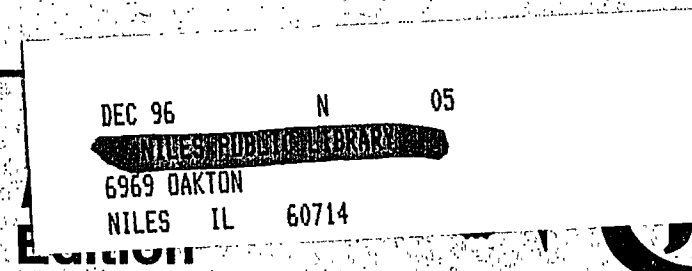

## Suspects nabbed in gas station cigarette theft

Niles police arrested three suspects April 24 after receiving a hold-up alarm from the Niles Cigo station, 7662 N. Milwaukee Ave., according to a press release issued by the Niles police department April 26.

The first investigating officer to arrive at the scene was informed by a witness that three suspects were in the mini-mart stealing cartons of cigarettes.

The witness identified a male subject who was exiting the store as one of the suspects. The suspect brushed aside the officer and entered the passenger side of a ve-

hicle parked by the gas pumps and driven by a female suspect.

When the officer attempted to remove the suspect from the vehicle, the driver sped off throwing the officer to the ground.

A second police unit arrived at the scene as the offending vehicle left the lot and drove southbound on Milwaukee Avenue. Police gave chase southbound on Milwaukee to Howard Street, then east on Howard Street.

At Lehigh Avenue the vehicle stopped, and the male subject in the passenger seat fled the vehicle

## Non-teaching staff seek '5 + 5' in Dist. 63

While teachers throughout the state, including the East Maine Elementary School District 63, were offered the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund "Five Plus Five" early retirement program two years ago, other school employees were excluded from the plan.

The program for teachers was mandated by the state, but offering the same program to classified employees, such as secretarial/clerical and custodial workers and teacher assistants was a voluntary matter to be decided by each district.

The District 63 School Board has considered the matter, but a public vote was never taken. Now five classified employees, including Toni Joseph, secretary to District 63 Superintendent Robert Selman,

## Chemist finds it's not that smart to invest in art

A 58-year-old Niles chemist who loaned \$6,000 to the business agent of a Russian dance troupe may be the second area victim of the group's schemes, according to Niles Police Public Information Officer Sgt. Roger Wilson.

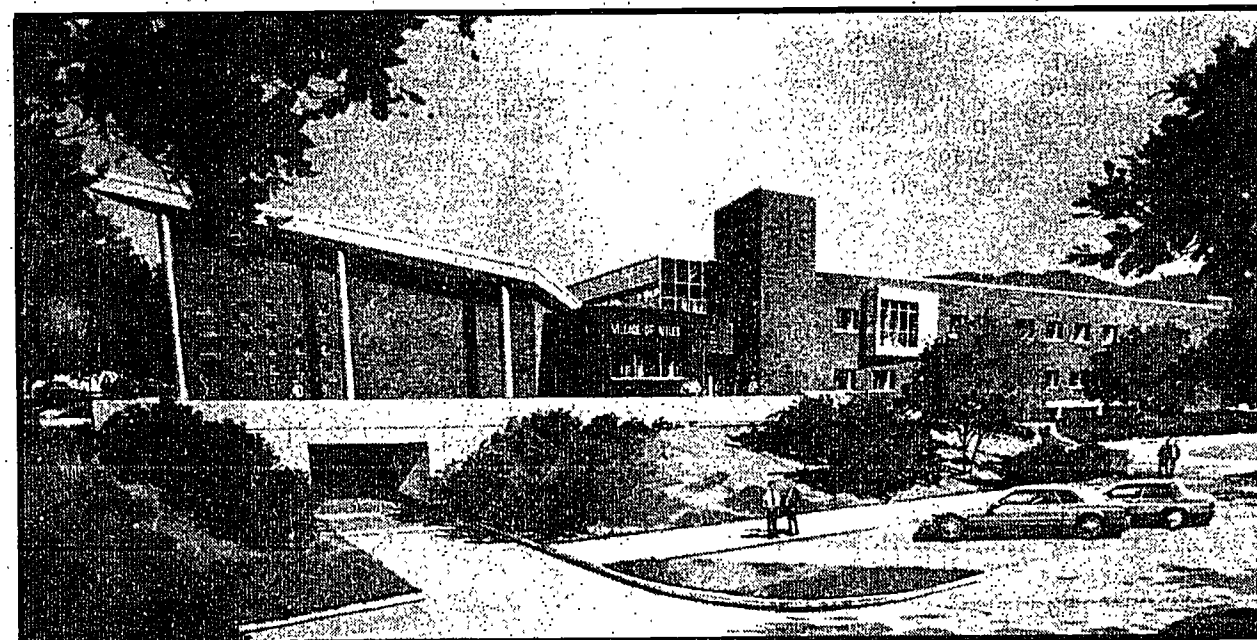
An area motel was bilked out of several thousands of dollars by the group who left without paying a hefty bill they ran up last year.

The chemist and his wife were introduced to the business manager by a third party. The loan, which was supposed to finance the troupe's travel for performances, was paid back with a \$6,500 check, including \$500 interest, given to the chemist by the agent Oct. 21 of last year.

The agent asked the victim to wait a while before depositing the check, and talked him into investing another \$10,000 to

## Niles resident wins Sheriff's Medal of Honor



Long-time Niles resident Mike Provenzano was among the 91 Chicago-area volunteers who were awarded the Cook County Sheriff's Senior Medal of Honor on Tuesday. Provenzano had been nominated by Maine Township Supervisor Mark Thompson.

Provenzano, 85, has been active in almost every area of the community: church, civic organizations, politics, charitable organizations and senior programs. He is a familiar face at Maine Township Senior events and has played a leading role in many of the group's activities. For the past several years, he has co-starred in the Seniors' annual musical productions. ## Maine Township budget down 8%

The Maine Township Board on Tuesday approved the 1996-97 budget for the township.

The budget for the General Town Fund totals \$2,825,631 down 8 percent from \$3,066,209 this year. Spending in the General

Assistance Fund decreased by 10 percent, to \$644,175 from \$718,375 in the current budget year.

The largest change in the General Town Fund comes from a \$325,000 reduction in building addition costs. Expenses will drop in the coming budget year as the addition to the Town Hall is completed. Construction is scheduled to be finished in May.

The General Assistance Fund budget will see a \$75,000 drop in building addition costs in 1996-97.

Although its 1996-97 fiscal year begins March 1, the township had until May 31 to adopt the new budgets.

All procedures concerning notifications and application of turf management chemicals will strictly adhere to the guidelines






### Estrogen gets a boost from calcium

"To reap the osteoporosis-fighting benefits of estrogen therapy, women need to continue taking estrogen long after sixty-five. It's better to use the standard dose, but for women who want to take the smallest dose possible, add supplemental calcium," said bone specialist Dr.

Bruce Ettinger, of University of California Medical Center, San Francisco and Kaiser Permanente Medical Center, Oakland, CA, at the 1995 Annual Session of the Texas Medical Association.

The standard dose of Premarin (the #1 prescribed estrogen product) for post-menopausal women is 0.625 mg. daily. According to Dr. Ettinger, this dose can be cut in half - to 0.300 mg. - without significant loss in benefits if a calcium supplement of 1,000 mg. is taken in conjunction with the lower dose of Premarin. The smaller dose of estrogen may result in fewer disturbing side effects often associated with the hormone, such as uterine bleeding. Taking a lower dose of estrogen can also be reassuring to patients concerned with long-term safety issues. Dr. Ettinger first documented calcium's estrogen boosting effects in a January 1987 Annals of Internal Medicine article.

### Walking epidural takes the labor out of childbirth

Childbirth does not have to be a painful experience says anesthesiologist Dr. Michael Newman. Using a combined spinal epidural, or "walking epidural," obstetric anesthesiologists at Rush have helped almost 5,000 women go through regular labor comfortably.

"There's absolutely no good reason for a woman to have to suffer through childbirth," he says. When using a combined spinal epidural, an anesthesiologist injects a small amount of potent opiate into the cerebro spinal fluid, which is located in an area below the spinal cord. He then puts a catheter in the epidural space and gives the patient a diluted solution of opiate and local anesthetic. The medication may be given to a patient when she first comes to the hospital in pain and is given continuously through delivery.

The advantages of having a combined spinal epidural are that it not only provides pain relief, but also enables the patient to move her legs. The patient can move around in bed, walk around, sit in a chair or go to the bathroom rather than having to use a bed pan.

Walking epidurals do not adversely affect either the mother or the baby. Patients may experience itching and a few patients, 1 in 100, may get a spinal headache - both of which are temporary and easily treated. The pain most women have during labor is easily managed with a walking epidural. Only the small group of women who have back labor, which is caused by the position of the baby's head, does not benefit as much from the combined spinal epidural as their counterparts.

Here is a sampling of the money-saving tips according to the bride and groom's splurge-or-save preferences:

**Food**  
Usually the largest expense, catering can be more economical when you:  
• Choose foods carefully (chicken costs less than beef, broccoli less than asparagus), and select items that are in season.

• Eliminate the appetizer course if hors d'oeuvres will be served.

• Consider a wedding brunch (serving pastries, muffins, Mimosas) or an English tea reception (with teas, finger sandwiches, scones) instead of a seated dinner.

• Order a white-nonwedding-sheet cake to complement a smaller, decorated wedding cake.

**Photography**  
Capturing a once-in-a-lifetime event on film is essential. Invest in the best photographer you can afford and:

• Compare hourly fees versus package prices.  
• Consider having the formal wedding portrait shot at the reception.

• Hire the photographer for formal portraits and ceremony only, encouraging guests to take candid shots with single-use cameras on the table.

• Find out how long the photographer will keep negatives. (You may prefer to buy additional prints in the future, after other wedding bills are paid.)

**Flowers**  
A symbol of bounty and fertility, their intoxicating aroma once was thought to protect the couple from evil spirits. Fabulous flowers can be worked into the tightest budget with these tips:

• Carry in-season and locally grown flowers—less pricey than out-of-season exotics.  
• Group multiple blooms of inexpensive flowers (i.e., baby's breath), tying them together to give the effect of one huge, lavish flower.

• Have bridesmaids and/or mothers carry bouquets with larger but fewer flowers (French tulips, sunflowers).

• Plan a wedding during a holiday season; the site may already be adorned with greenery and

lights.

#### Bridal Attire

A bride's gown is often her foremost priority—and sets the tone and formality of the wedding.

• Shop early (at least nine months before the wedding) to find the widest range of styles and prices.

• Avoid costly alterations (changing the neckline or waist, cutting down a too-large gown), and get a quote for alterations before buying—if it's too high, ask for an itemization.

• Ask the store's bridal consultant about discontinued styles and samples—they may offer extra savings. (Fabrics such as silk shantung, satin, organza and taffeta are multiseasonal.)

• Be creative with bridal accessories; garters, ring pillows and purses can be embellished at home by you and your bridesmaids.

**Honeymoon**  
A luxurious vacation can be within reach with careful planning and research.

• Book an all-inclusive package tour; you'll know up front what expenses will be.

• Travel off-season for lower airfare and hotel rates/packages (the Caribbean from May to mid-December, Bermuda in April, the Greek Isles in May and October).

• Plan in advance to take advantage of promotional airfares, frequent flier seats and lower rates for rental cars, rooms and cruise berths.

### Social Security and brides

The list of "things to do" is usually pretty long for brides-to-be before their wedding. The Social Security Administration (SSA) wants to add one more important, but very easy item to that list. If you're going to change your name when you marry, remember to tell Social Security.

For women who work, reporting this name change assures that you will receive proper credit for your earnings and, one day, all the Social Security benefits you are due. For women who don't work outside the home, reporting the change will ensure that your Social Security record shows the correct name when it's time to apply for benefits.

Another important reason to report your change of name is that Internal Revenue Service and SSA records should show the same name and Social Security number. If they don't, your tax refund may be delayed.

Of course, if you continue to

use your maiden name after marriage, as many women do today, you don't need to report your marriage. Just be sure to use your maiden name consistently throughout your working years. If you change your mind later, let Social Security know.

To report a name change, call Social Security's toll-free number, 1-800-772-1213, any business day between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., or call or visit your local Social Security office. You'll need to complete an Application. For a Social Security Card and provide either your marriage certificate to verify your old and new names or two documents—one with your maiden name and one with your married name. All documents must be originals or certified copies. The application form lists acceptable documents.

## The Bridal Guide

### Forty steps to a perfect wedding

Of course, you will do a million things in the process of planning your wedding ceremony and reception. But the basic guideline for creating your wedding can be broken down into forty basic tasks.

1. Announce your engagement, first to your family and then to your friends.

2. Select a tentative date or several possible dates for the wedding.

3. Enjoy your engagement party, and immediately send thank-you notes for any gifts that you received.

4. Hire a wedding consultant.

5. Decide upon the style and formality of your wedding.

6. Determine, with your consultant's help, a realistic wedding budget.

7. Attend any bridal shows in your area.

8. If you will need to compose a prenuptial agreement, do so early in your plans.

9. Reserve the ceremony site and officiant.

10. Issue engagement announcements to your local newspaper.

11. Decide how many guests you will invite to the ceremony and reception.

12. Divide the number of invitations three ways; part for the groom's family, part for your family, and part for you and the groom.

13. Select the bridal party and the groom's attendants.

14. Choose and reserve the reception site.

15. Register at one or more gift registries.

16. Hire a caterer, if one is not included with the reception site.

17. Examine bridal magazines and visit bridal shops to determine which style of bride's and bridesmaids' dresses appeal to you.

18. Select and reserve your photographer.

19. Reserve a band or disc jockey for the reception, as well as the ceremony musicians.

20. Choose and hire a videographer.

21. Select and reserve your florist.

22. Order all of your bridal attire.

23. Order the bridesmaids' dresses.

24. Order invitations, announcements, and personal stationery.

25. Order formalwear for groom and male attendants.

26. Select and order wedding rings.

27. Visit a travel agent and begin to plan the honeymoon.

28. Arrange for limousines or other transportation.

29. Begin ballroom dancing lessons to prepare for your wedding day.

30. Start writing thank-you notes for shower gifts.

31. Finalize a menu plan with the caterer.

32. Choose and order a wedding cake.

33. Coordinate the selection of the mothers' gowns.

34. Finalize a time schedule of the day with your wedding consultant.

35. Engage a calligrapher to address invitations and write place cards.

36. Reserve accommodations for out-of-town guests.

37. Make arrangements for the ceremony rehearsal.

38. Assist groom's mother in arranging rehearsal celebration.

39. Contact guests who have not responded to invitations.

40. Draw seating chart.

There is the flower girl who looked back down the aisle, saw the "mess" she had made, and turned around to pick up the petals she had just tossed; the ring bearer who simply got tired and plopped himself down in the middle of the aisle; and the flower girl who froze in terror. They run down the aisle, they start to cry, they trip, they hum loudly throughout the exchange of vows—kids are unpredictable, and introducing yet another unpredictable element into the wedding plans is not a wise move for the control-oriented bride.

But there is no doubt that children look adorable walking down the aisle, tossing petals or carefully balancing a pillow, and many brides continue to look for ways to incorporate children

into their wedding plans. Not all children of an appropriate age are up to such a task, developmentally or emotionally, so choose the children carefully. If you suspect that stage fright might be an issue, arrange for two children to walk down the aisle together. Practice the child's routine at the ceremony site several times, and keep the whole process very simple. The ring bearer should not, obviously, carry a real wedding ring on his pillow, but a "fake" that has been sewn on. And it is advisable to just have the flower girl walk down the aisle carrying flowers and not tossing anything.

on foot. The pursuing officer and a second officer gave chase. While attempting to stop the offender, the officers engaged in a struggle with him, during which one officer was thrown to the ground injuring his shoulder.

Varga, asked the Board at its April 9 meeting to consider offering the "Five Plus Five" early retirement program to them.

According to the program, employees who are at least 50 years old and have at least 20 years' experience are allowed to purchase five additional years of their pension plan, which permits them to retire five years early.

The incentive for the district is the savings that are realized when employees with less experience are hired at lower salaries to replace the better paid retiring employees. However, according to district business manager Walter Korpan, the district would lose about \$9,200 over a five-year period if the five decide to retire.

Because teachers generally earn more than classified employees, there is a far greater salary difference between retirees' pay and that of new employees. For example, a retiring teacher may well have been earning \$54,000, while a first-year teacher would be hired at \$24,000. The difference in salary between retiring and newly hired classified personnel would be much less.

The School Board will consider extending the early retirement to classified personnel at a future meeting.

finance the troupe's Mexican tour. The agent promised a profit of \$6,000 to \$7,000 on the second loan.

The chemist waited several months to deposit the check. On April 8, it was returned by his bank marked NSF. The victim has not seen or heard from the agent since February.

However, the news is not all bad. The second check for \$10,000 has not yet been cashed or deposited by the agent.

The matter is under investigation, according to Wilson. "People who are investing [with the Russian troupe] are from the same area in the former Soviet Union, and they trust them. They are being taken advantage of by people from their own area," Wilson concluded.

## State offers insurance tips for tornado victims

The Illinois Department of Insurance is offering some advice to Illinois residents faced with insurance claims from tornado and other types of storm damage.

"The first several days after a disaster can be very stressful even when property damage is covered by insurance," noted Insurance Director Mark Boozell. "Concerns about temporary shelter, emergency repairs and the costs of restoring or rebuilding sometimes make it difficult to think clearly about filing an insurance claim."

To assist propertyowners facing that process, the Insurance Department offers the following suggestions:

•Notify your agent or company right away. Be sure to report your temporary address and phone number if you've vacated your home.

•Make necessary temporary repairs and move your personal property to a protected area to prevent additional damage. Clean and dry items damaged by water, but do not dispose of anything until the insurance adjuster has examined them.

•Keep records and receipts of all additional living expenses, and temporary repair costs.

•List all damaged items you plan to report. Include as much detail as possible: e.g., purchase dates and prices, brands, and model and serial numbers.

•Ask about advance or partial

payments, especially if you need money to make your house livable. Advance payments will be subtracted from your total settlement.

•Be cautious about contractors you hire to repair or rebuild your damaged property. Do not let anyone rush you into repair work, and do not sign contracts for major repairs until the insurance company has determined how much it will pay.

•Be suspicious of anyone who promises you more than your insurance covers or leads you to believe that you should profit from a disaster. If you have any questions about the handling of your claim, contact your insurance company.

The Forestry Locations for Free Mulch are as follows: Northwest Forestry, 640 Cosman Rd., Elk Grove Village; Skokie Forestry, 1140 Harm's Rd., Glenview; Salt Creek Nursery, 500 Ogden Ave., Western Springs; Palos Forestry, 1030 Willow Springs Rd., Willow Springs; Tinley Creek Forestry, 6797 W. 147th St., Oak Forest; and Thorn Creek Forestry, 18725 Stony Island, Chicago Heights.

People must bring their own containers and shovels for the mulch, which is available for residential use only. Residents are responsible for loading the mulch into their containers and vehicles.

Mulch is wood chips of various sizes. Richard Newhard, Chief Forester, suggests that "the mulch should be spread around trees and shrubs to prevent moisture evaporation." "Consequently, gardeners will not need to water as often."

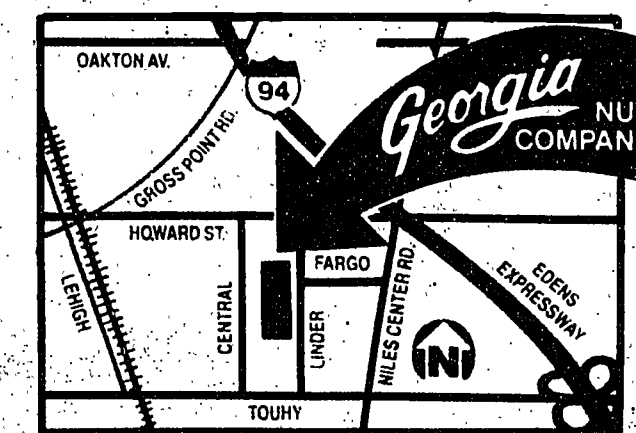
