Strong evidence in '95 Niles abduction case

The 12-year-old victim of a Feb. 28, 1995, abduction will have a second chance to view Robert Russell Koppa in a police lineup.

This time, however, the convicted murderer and rapist will be without the scraggly beard he had when she viewed him in the first lineup conducted by Niles Police July 20.

Koppa was linked to the Niles crime because of what police termed striking similarities between it and Koppa's July 10 abduction of a 17-year-old Bloomingdale girl from the Woodfield Shopping Center.

Koppa, 47, of Palatine, was indicted July 30 in Cook County Circuit Court in Rolling Meadows. The judge ordered Koppa to shave his beard in preparation for four lineups scheduled for the week of Aug. 19, according to a Chicago *Tribune* article.

The paroled child killer is a suspect in four other unsolved cases, including two attacks in Chicago's Grand Central area, one in Deerfield and the Niles abduction.

Employed by a beverage company in Round Lake at the time of the Schaumburg incident, Koppa has served two prison terms for the murder of 15-year-old Julie Angel, raping two women and abducting another woman. He was

paroled from the Dixon Correctional Center just three weeks before the 1995 Niles abduction.

Niles Deputy Police Chief Jerry Sheehan told the *Tribune* that the Niles girl was kidnapped as she was walking to a bus stop in the 9000 block of Cumberland Avenue around 4 p.m. Feb. 28 of last year on her way to a music lesson in Northbrook. The victim was grabbed by a man who drove her away from the area and sexually assaulted her.

The girl returned to her home at 9 p.m. and told her parents she had been sexually assaulted, police said.

Although the victim was unable to positively identify Koppa in the July 20 lineup, police said the description she gave of her attacker and the car he was driving along with physical evidence taken at the scene build a strong case against Koppa.

Sheehan said that prosecutors have filed for a court order that will allow investigators to obtain hair and blood samples from Koppa. They will also test his DNA against evidence from the Niles crime, Sheehan said.

It will take an additional two to four weeks after the court order is obtained for the Northern Illinois Police Crime Laboratory to process the test results, Sheehan said.

Niles proceeds with new Public Works facility

A new public services facility is being proposed for a seven-and-a-half acre location at Harlem and Touhy Avenues. A two-story office building and garage will be erected to house all of the 73 vehicles and pieces of equipment, including buses.

"It's very comprehensive," Trustee James Mahoney told the Board, "because it takes in all the public works facilities that are now scattered in a couple of different sites."

Another key point was the inclusion of a fueling station that will also be contained at the facility. Mahoney stated that this would "centralize and eliminate two other fueling areas" which Niles currently has.

The Village Board unanimously passed measures to pursue the concept of the new public works building and entered into a contract with Rust Environmental,

Oakbrook, IL, an engineering consulting and architectural company.

Drawings for the proposed project are being developed by Tom Jacobs, of Rust Environmental.

Hospice of the North Shore enhances the quality of life for chronic and terminally ill patients who wish to enjoy their remaining days in the comfort of home - surrounded by loved ones. At times, though, the friends and family that care for the ailing patient need assistance too. Most often, they need time away from home, to run errands, to pick up groceries, or to take a break away from their caregiving responsibilities.

From October 10 to November 11, Hospice of the North Shore will offer volunteer training sessions for people who would like to become hospice volunteers. Classes will be held on Mondays and Thursdays from 9 a.m. to noon at Alden Estates of Evanston, Inc., 2520 Gross Point Rd. in Evanston. No classes on Halloween.

Rabies information

Rabies is a deadly disease caused by a virus that attacks the central nervous system. The virus is present primarily in the saliva, brain tissue and spinal fluid of a rabid animal.

Rabies can affect all mammals. From 1990 to 1994 in the United States, an average of 7,000 animals per year - most of them wild - were diagnosed as having the disease. The disease is found in all states except Hawaii, as well as in Canada, Mexico and most other countries around the world.

Rabies is common in bats, skunks, raccoons and foxes, but the disease also has been found in deer and in large rodents, such as woodchucks. Cats, dogs and livestock can get rabies, too, if they are not vaccinated. Some animals, including chipmunks, gerbils, guinea pigs, hamsters, mice, rabbits, rats and squirrels, rarely get rabies. Birds, fish, insects, lizards, snakes and turtles never get rabies.

The first sign of rabies is usually a change in the animal's behavior. An animal need not be "foaming at the mouth" to have rabies. Other signs include difficulty walking, a general appearance of sickness or a change in the animal's normal behavior. For example, if an animal that is normally wild and avoids contact with humans approaches a picnic area, campsite or home and appears tame or friendly, consider it rabid. Conversely, if a normally tame and friendly animal becomes hostile or aggressive without provocation, it too should be considered rabid. A rabid animal usually dies within one week after showing signs of the disease.

People usually are exposed to the rabies virus when an infected animal bites them. Exposure also may occur if a person is scratched by an infected animal or if the animal's saliva enters an open cut or mucous membrane (nose, mouth, eyes). The presence of a bat in a home, or any contact with a bat, represents a possible hazard for rabies and should be reported to the local health department so that the circumstances can be evaluated.

Wash the wound thoroughly with soap and water and seek medical attention immediately. The local health department or the county animal control office also should be notified immediately. The animal should be captured without damaging its head and only if direct contact with the animal can be avoided.

If an apparently healthy domestic dog or cat bites a human, it must be captured, confined and professionally observed daily for 10 days following the bite. If the animal remains healthy during this period, it would not have transmitted rabies at the time of the bite. There is no reliable observation period established for non-domestic animals. If a person is bitten by a non-domestic animal and it is available for test-

ing, testing should be done immediately. All animal bites should be reported to the local health department.

If an animal suspected of having rabies cannot be observed or tested, or if it tests positive for rabies, treatment of the individual with rabies immune globulin and the vaccine series must begin immediately. Vaccine injections are given in the arm.

People in high-risk occupations - for example, veterinarians, wildlife biologists, wildlife rehabilitators, animal control officers and taxidermists - should consider getting the rabies vaccine to protect themselves from exposures that could occur in their work. This type of vaccination (pre-exposure vaccination) consists of three rabies vaccine injections. Periodic single boosters are generally required every two years if the risk of contact continues. A person already vaccinated and later exposed to rabies must receive two booster injections three days apart immediately after exposure.

If your pet has been in a fight with another animal, wear gloves to handle your pet. Call your veterinarian, and isolate the pet from other animals and people for several hours. A vaccinated pet may need a booster dose of rabies vaccine as soon as possible. Unvaccinated animals exposed to a known rabid animal must be confined and professionally observed for six months or euthanized.

To protect yourselves and your pets from rabies:

- Do not feed, touch or adopt wild animals or stray dogs or cats.
- Vaccinated pets serve as a buffer between rabid wildlife and humans, so be sure dogs and cats are up-to-date on their rabies vaccinations. Consult with your veterinarian about when your pet needs to be vaccinated.
- Do not allow pets to roam free.
- Do not attract wild animals to your home or yard. Store bird seed or other animal feed in containers with tight-fitting lids. Feed pets indoors. Make sure garbage cans are tightly capped. Board up any openings to your attic, basement, porch or garage. Cap chimneys with screens.
- Encourage children to immediately tell an adult if they are bitten or scratched by an animal. Teach children not to approach or to touch any animal they do not know.
- Report all animal bites to the local health department.
- If a wild animal comes on your property, let it wander away. Bring children and pets indoors and alert neighbors. You may contact a nuisance wildlife control officer who will remove the animal for a fee.

New model aids understanding of digestion

A live rat model developed by Rush neonatologists Dr. Robert E. Kimura and Dr. Michael Uhing is helping scientists who study malfunctions of the small intestine get closer than ever to seeing exactly how humans absorb what they eat. Because it mirrors how humans absorb nutrients, the live rat model is physiologically more accurate than previous research methods that used tissue slices and intestines exposed to surgical condition.

The model is revolutionizing research into diseases that affect digestion, such as the painful intestinal problems suffered by many cystic fibrosis patients. It also can help scientists understand the intestine's interaction with the liver, which helps to digest and store nutrients.

"Uhing and Kimura have now succeeded, by ingenuity and technical virtuosity, in treating...new methods for studying small-intestinal transport and metabolism," wrote the University of California Medical School's Jared Diamond in the journal Nature.

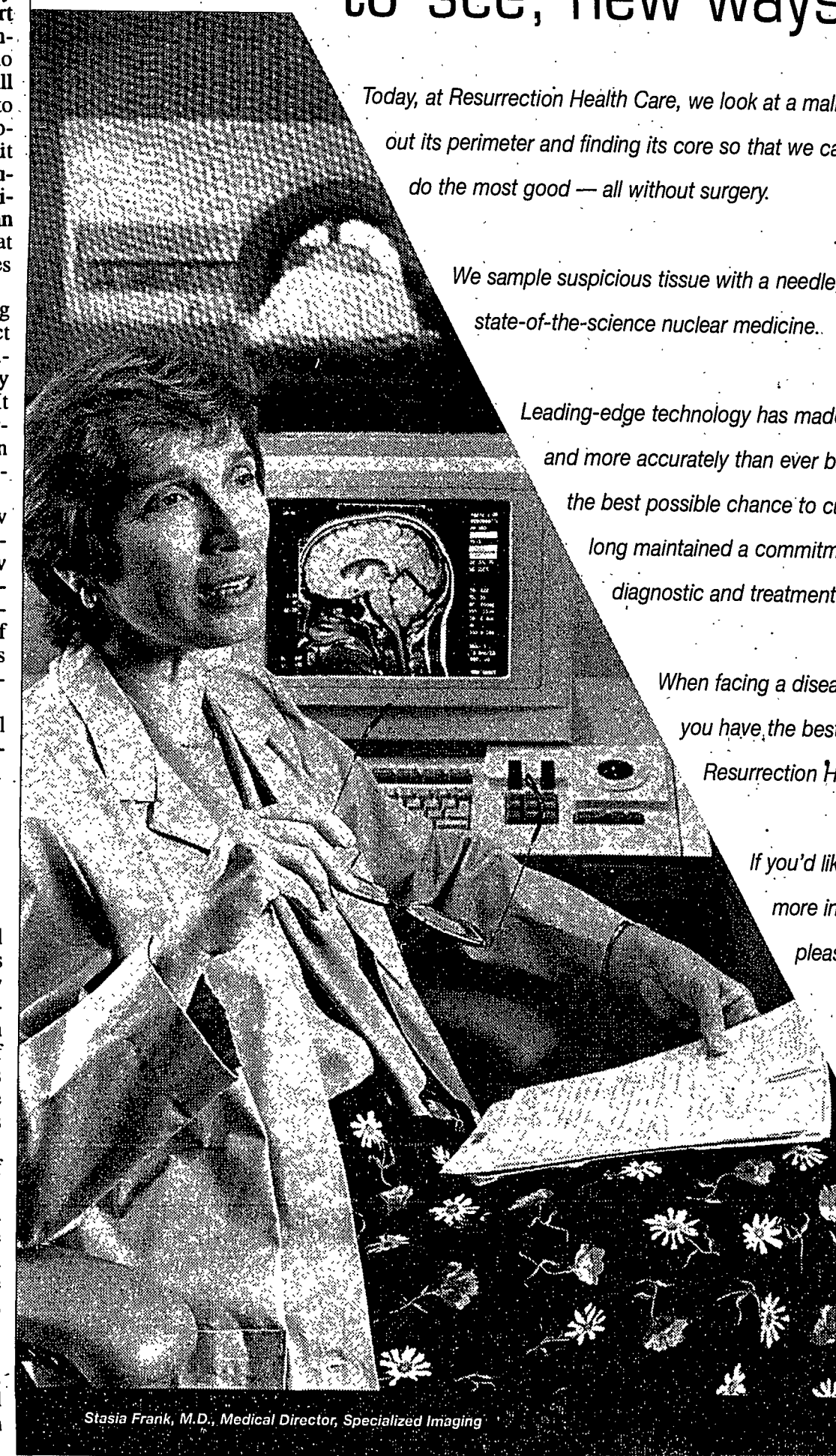

Repel the invasion of the bitesized beasts

With the rain of spring comes the insects of summer. Strategic measures can be taken to battle these battalions of bugs, according to a Loyola physician.

Limiting outdoor time, however, is challenging that may be, wearing neutral-colored clothing, avoiding perfume and aftershave lotion, and applying repellent can all help prevent insect bites, said Dr. Thomas DeStefani, assistant professor and director of general pediatrics.

If bites or stings do happen, here are a few tips on how to treat them:

- Leave the bite area alone. Try not to scratch the area.

- Take an antihistamine to reduce the itching of a mosquito bite rather than apply a topical agent. Oral medication is much more effective than any topical agent. This includes treatment for children.

- Apply a cold compress or ice to a bee sting.

- Mix a meat tenderizer with water to form a paste and place on the sting area. The protein from the meat tenderizer decreases the amount of bee venom.

If swelling away from the bee sting area occurs, or breathing or swallowing are difficult, get immediate care. These symptoms may indicate an allergic reaction.

Fruits and vegetables better than pills

Can supplemental vitamins, fiber, and natural fruit and vegetable compounds called "phytochemicals" in pill form work as well as foods to fight off cancer? At a recent symposium presented by the American Institute for Cancer Research, leading diet and cancer researchers said supplements are not a substitute for eating plenty of plant-based foods.

When our bodies absorb phytochemicals, vitamins and fiber from plant-based foods, they work in different ways to protect our health, by shielding cell membranes from damage to affecting rates of the cell division that is key to the cancer process. According to Dr. Gary G. Meadows, Professor of Pharmacognosy, Washington State University, "Researchers still have not discovered answers to questions about dosage and combined effects of these plant food elements."

That's one reason why taking large doses of vitamin and phytochemical supplement pills is not advisable, the researchers pointed out. "Many people believe that if a little is good, more must be better," Meadows commented. "In fact, overdoing any one thing often has negative effects. When people rely too much on supplement pills, they tend to forget about eating a balanced diet."

Real Estate tax bills coming

Cook County Treasurer Edward J. Rosewell announced that the due date for the second installment real estate taxes has been set for Sept. 11, 1996.

Rosewell said that by law payments received after the Sept. 11 due date will be subject to a 1.5 percent penalty on the amount due per month or unpaid portion thereof.

Rosewell urged property owners to make their payments by mail to avoid long lines. He said that taxpayers who do not receive a bill should contact his office at 443-5100, or make a personal visit to any one of the six offices and a duplicate bill will be issued.

Illinois insurance questions

Q. Our homeowners insurance company won't renew our policy because we've had lots of claims. Our company said we can get coverage from the FAIR Plan but my friend said the FAIR Plan coverage isn't as good. What is the FAIR Plan and is my friend correct?

A. The FAIR Plan is an association which functions like an insurance company in making homeowners and other property insurance available to people who aren't able to buy it from private insurance companies. The FAIR Plan, which stands for "Fair Access to Insurance Requirements," is basically the insurer of last resort. All insurance companies selling homeowner insurance in Illinois help to fund the Plan. The Plan is not government funded.

Your friend is incorrect. You can buy coverage from the FAIR Plan that is the same as policies offered by private insurance companies. However, you'll need to try to buy insurance from at least three different companies before turning to the Plan. An agent licensed to sell property insurance can help. To find an agent in your area, call the Plan at (312) 861-0385, (618) 875-6261, or 1 (800) 972-4480.

Q. My mom died. I can't find her life insurance records. She said her policy was paid up many years ago. I heard there is a service available to search for missing policy records. How can I use that service, or better yet, can you tell me what company she is insured with?

A. There was a missing policy service provided by the American Council of Life Insurance. However, the service was discontinued January 1, 1996, because the success rate was less than 1 percent.

The Hotline cannot tell you who your mother is insured with. There is no central clearinghouse that maintains records of the company with which a person is insured - for any type of insurance. Although in some states the Secretary of State may have a record of where residents of that state have auto insurance, no such records are maintained in Illinois.

It is important that people plan ahead by maintaining their own financial and insurance records. It is advisable to also keep a copy of such records at a location other than your home (like a bank safety deposit box) in case of a home fire.

Your best bet is to do a thorough search of your mother's personal and financial records (for example, old cancelled checks). Perhaps your mother's bank could help. If you find any company name, that may give you something to work with. Call the Hotline at 1 (800) 444-3338 for more information.

Consumers warned about unlicensed professionals

After a recent series of cases involving unlicensed professionals of all kinds, Cook County State's Attorney Jack O'Malley warned consumers to check credentials before hiring a professional - lawyer, roofer, real estate broker - to make sure they are getting what they pay for.

"We have seen a variety of consumer complaints involving alleged shoddy service provided by professionals, many of whom

Skokian charged with unlicensed practice

A Skokie man was named in a complaint filed by the Consumer Fraud Division for unlicensed practice of optometry. Frank Farber operated European Optical Company, located at 3288 N. Milwaukee Ave., Chicago.

According to investigators, Farber was a licensed optometrist in his native Russia, but has never been licensed to practice optometry in the U.S.

Farber has 30 days to answer the complaint. The case was referred to the State's Attorney's Office by the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation.

BBB advises consumers

The Better Business Bureau of Chicago & Northern Illinois, is advising consumers that World-wide Wallcoverings & Blinds, Inc., 333 Skokie Boulevard, Northbrook, IL 60062, has been the subject of 1195 complaints since their file was opened in January, 1994. As of July 25, 1996, 579 complaints have been closed as unanswered because the company failed to respond, 27 have been closed as unsettled, and 380 have been closed as settled. Also, there are 201 pending complaints that were received in the past 40 days. The complaints come from 49 states.

The majority of complaints allege delay in shipment and/or posting of charges on credit cards before shipment has been received and/or delay in issuance of credit to bank credit cards on canceled orders.

The company has been advertising wallcoverings and blinds in national magazines, purporting that consumers can save "up to 80% off retail on blinds" and "up to 78% off retail on wallcoverings." On April 25, 1996, BBB/Chicago sent a memorandum to the advertising media, including those magazines that were known to be running ads for this company, recommending that further advertisements should be considered "Not In The Public Interest" (NIP) because of these complaints.

look like the normal activities of people going in to rent a video," Giovannielli said.

After the officer called for support, the two officers detained the suspects and discovered a large number of video tapes stacked up near the door of the store, "ready to be taken," Giovannielli said.

"They [the officers] prevented a pretty good theft from taking place," said Deputy Commander Bill Reid.

The four offenders were handcuffed and placed in the rear seat "cage" areas of the two squads, two suspects in each car. The Plexiglass "cages" cannot be opened from the inside of the car, Giovannielli explained, and the only opening in the acrylic is a 12" x 14" window to permit communication with front seat occupants.

While the two officers went into the video store to obtain information from the female clerk, the only one on duty at the time of the attempted theft, the unthinkable happened: Handcuffed suspect Willie Garcia, a.k.a. Jimmy Garza, a career criminal with a record of 29 arrests on 37 charges, managed to squeeze himself through the opening in the Plexiglass into the front seat where he opened the door and fled northbound through the alley.

When the officers realized the suspect had escaped, they immediately alerted their supervisors and initiated a search of the area. The escapee was believed to be contained in the area between Main, Monroe, Milwaukee and Oseloa, and numerous squad cars converged on the area.

Air One, the State Police Helicopter, happened to be aloft nearby. The pilot, overhearing the ground radio communications between the officers and their watch commander, radioed his offer to aid in the search.

Giovannielli explained that Air One is always on call for any po-

lice department in the area that needs its assistance, but he emphasized that Niles police did not call for the helicopter. When helicopter assistance was offered, they merely accepted it, and with good and sufficient reason, according to Giovannielli.

"The decision made by the watch commander was based on the fact you had a career criminal running around the area who was somewhat desperate," Giovannielli said.

"In our opinion, at that time it was necessary, but with a caveat," Giovannielli said. "I know the watch commander would not have gone to the trouble of requesting a helicopter had it not been in the area already. I think it's safe to say, the State Police officer offered up services, we accepted," Giovannielli added.

"You want to use all the resources available to you to try to apprehend him [Garcia]," Giovannielli said, citing the fact that Garcia was handcuffed, desperate and had a very long police record.

Area residents, however, were taken aback by the incident. "It was something else, coming through the trees with that beam," said Nancy Redig of the 7200 block of Conrad. "It kept coming back. It seemed to start at Notre Dame [High School, 7655 W. Dempster] and kept coming back to Grennan, Milwaukee and Oakton," Redig said. "You didn't know what in God's name it was," she said. "It was interesting, though," she added.

"It's alarming," Giovannielli admitted, adding, "Police operations many times will alarm citizens. Just the sound of sirens and the lights. We had officers on foot checking backyards," Giovannielli said.

"It was scary," said Josephine Cassola of the 8100 block of Oketo Avenue. "They were hovering so low to the buildings, you

mental Co. No budget has yet been determined.

A short public hearing was also held at the Board meeting on the issuance of \$3.2 million in industrial development revenue bonds to Lewis Spring & Stamping Co. by the Village of Niles.

Joanne Malinowski, Vice President of Kane, McKenna & Assoc., Inc., financial advisor to the Village and Mark Andreasik, President of Lewis Spring presented the proposal to the Board.

The bonds will enable Lewis Spring to borrow funds for an industrial development project at tax-exempt rates, Malinowski said. Although the bonds will carry the Village's name, Niles is not responsible for payment.

Mark Andreasik, president of Lewis Spring, 2652 W. North Ave., Chicago, told the Board that the money will be used by the industrial company to acquire a building at 7500 N. Natchez, Niles. The company plans to move its entire operation, which

has been in Chicago for 50 years, to Niles.

Approximately \$500,000 will be used for rehabilitation on the building, Andreasik said. Balance of the proceeds will be used for the purchase of future equipment to keep the business competitive in its industry.

Ninety people currently work for Lewis Spring and Andreasik stated that he anticipates bringing in additional employees in the future.

Authorization for the issuance was unanimously approved by the Board.

In another matter, Trustee Tom Bondi noted that the Niles July 4th Parade was "the biggest and the best to date." Eighty-eight units took part in the parade.

Bondi gave special thanks to Mayor Blase, the Niles Public Works Department, the Niles Park District, the Niles Police Department and the Niles Village staff for their efforts.

couldn't help noticing."

Christine Maciuszonek, also of the 8100 block of Oketo Avenue, said she tried to alert her elderly neighbors and kept in touch with the police department throughout the three-hour manhunt. "I didn't go to bed until 2 a.m.," she said. "I was afraid to leave the house, but it was pretty exciting."

Taxpayers need not be alarmed, however. The cost of the helicopter sweep is a "moot issue," Giovannielli said. "He [the helicopter pilot] was up there already. It didn't cost any more or any less."

Despite all the commotion, however, police failed in their mission to apprehend Garcia. Somehow he got away.

Not for long, though, because the 32-year-old fugitive was arrested at 3:41 p.m. at the home of a friend in the 1800 block of North Shakespere Avenue in Chicago.

Garcia was charged with felony obstruction of justice and misdemeanor charges of attempted retail theft, theft and escaping from police, according to Reid.

His adult accomplices, both Chicago residents, who did not get away were charged with attempted theft. One of them was also charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

Charges against the juvenile arrestee are pending. He was released to the custody of his parent.

By the time of the arrest, the slippery Garcia had managed to slip out of his handcuffs, a piece of cake for the latter-day Houdini. Garcia also has a history of slipping out of many of the charges against him, Reid said.

Of his 37 previous charges, 23 for theft, two for assault, one for burglary, one for obstructing government and five for drug possession, Garcia has only two convictions, Reid said.
