

## Niles Library ponders move during construction

The Niles Library Board is currently studying the feasibility of staying in their current building during the upcoming expansion construction or moving to temporary headquarters for a 12 to 16 month period.

Library Business Manager Joe Vlach noted that while the move could cost more than \$320,000, the library would save about \$225,000 in construction time by being out of the building and about \$51,000 in current building maintenance and repairs.

Temporary space being considered by the library is a two-story office building at 7400 N. Caldwell and also an empty bank building on Waukegan Road in Morton Grove. Both sites would provide approximately 30,000 square feet of space.

Library Board President Ted Przybylo stated that the speed-up of the expansion and renovation construction without the library staff and contents in the building came up recently and not all the facts and figures are available yet. Another problem will be the

decrease in parking spaces due to the equipment which will be on the premises during the construction.

The current construction schedule is divided into four phases as the library collection and operations are moved around to accommodate the work crews. Scheduled completion for the expansion and renovation is set for February, 1999.

In addition to the inconvenience to the library and its patrons, it still remains to be seen what the cost of moving the operations and collection around during the construction will be. Also being considered are the costs for moving the library and its collection to a temporary site and moving it back upon completion of the renovation.

The renovation and expansion of the library was approved by voters in a referendum last November through the sale of \$8.9 million in bonds. The expansions will add 26,000 square feet in space and increase the parking spaces from 96 to 134.

## New state law gives township a police officer

Maine Township will have the right to hire its own police officer after Jan. 1, 1997 because of a new law signed by Illinois Governor Jim Edgar. The law also has the uniqueness of being called the "Maine Township law" since it was written by Maine Township Supervisor Mark Thompson two years ago. Legislators in Springfield gave the law its name which died in the Senate last year but Sen. Marty Butler re-introduced it this year and it passed the Senate this time around.

The bill allows a township police officer to issue citations for ordinance violations, mainly those involving garbage disposal and other health problems, unkempt lawns and abandoned cars.

Previous to the passage of the "Maine Township law," townships could not enforce their own laws and had to depend on the help of the Cook County Sheriff's Department.

Property owners in unincorporated Maine Township which has a population of more than 25,000 are required to hire a scavenger service for their garbage disposal. Many residents are not doing this and are either dumping their garbage on neighbor's property, in business dumpsters or in local al-

leys. This new law has been eagerly received by many local townships who are facing some of the same problems as Maine Township.

## Dist. 63 adopts 'Tort Reform'

East Maine Township Elementary School District 63 Finance Director Walter Korpan has come up with his own version of tort reform that may allow the district to spend more of the education fund on education rather than on salaries.

Korpan proposed using \$649,449 earmarked for paying attorney fees and lawsuit damages the district may incur to part of the salaries of 300 district employees. Another \$316,583 from the operations and maintenance fund could also be tapped for salaries, according to Korpan.

So far, the proposal seems to be going down well with other members of the district Finance Committee.

An attorney for the district approved the procedure of charging certain percentages of the em-

Police say Chicago man intentionally caused Milwaukee Ave. crash killing 2

## Murder charges filed after fatal car crash

Two people died in Niles on Sunday when a Chicago man intentionally struck their car while traveling 50 miles per hour, as reported by the Niles Police.

The Chicago driver has since been charged with 2 counts of first degree murder, according to The Cook County State's Attorney's office.

Killed in the accident on Sunday was Malas Moutaz, 27, of Rosemont. His passenger, Nancy E. Minnich, 33, of Addison, died Monday at Lutheran General Hospital.

According to Niles Police, Moutaz and Minnich had stopped their vehicle, a 1988 Pontiac Grand Prix, for a red light in the northbound lanes of 9500 Milwaukee Avenue at 2:20 p.m. This stop light is located at the northern most entrance to Golf Mill Shopping Center and Four Flags Shopping Center.

Police report a 1991 Cadillac Eldorado, driven by John A. Ma-

glio, 42, of Chicago, struck the rear of Moutaz's sitting auto while traveling at 50 miles per hour.

Niles Police additionally noted

that Maglio said he had intentionally run into the sitting car so he could determine whether his life would be saved by his God.

## Help for seniors

Illinois senior citizens will get help to cut through government red tape, learn more about what to do in emergency weather situations and benefit from homestead exemptions under three new laws signed this week, said State Sen. Walter Dudydz (R-7th).

Dudydz said the laws signed by Gov. Jim Edgar help ensure that senior citizens can take full advantage of existing programs.

The new program, which helps senior citizens overcome bureaucratic obstacles to participating in public benefits programs, would be developed by the Illinois Department on Aging through the 13 Area Agencies on Aging. Assistance could include transportation services; representation of persons in benefits procedures; senior advocacy in benefit programs; education of seniors about benefits programs; public education on benefits of interest to seniors; and involvement in the systemic problems of benefits programs. This new law takes effect Jan. 1, 1997.



## Local ordinances and how they affect you

### Planning to improve your palace?

If you are planning to move, reconstruct, add, or alter your home in any way, chances are you will need a permit. Residents must obtain a permit prior to commencing any work—whether you do the work yourself or contract the work.

Typical improvements include (re)constructing a deck, a second/third story, a garage, installation of central air conditioning, a fence, new wiring, and a host of other projects.

To find out whether you need a permit, contact the Code Enforcement Department at 967-6100 (telecommunication device

for the deaf, TDD, 967-8840). Obtaining a permit is in the residents' best interest. Permits are necessary to protect homeowners from poor workmanship, as well as to assure a Village-wide standard of quality.

**Don't throw away good merchandise—have a garage sale!**

Garage sale permits must be obtained from the Code Enforcement Department. The permits are free of charge, and are valid for one weekend: Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. No more than one permit per residence can be issued within a 12-month period.

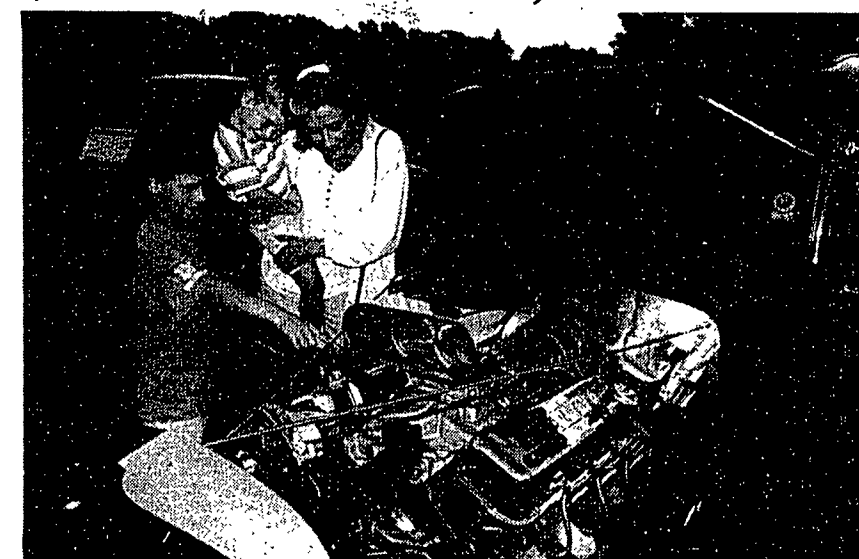

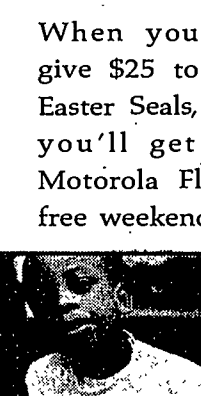

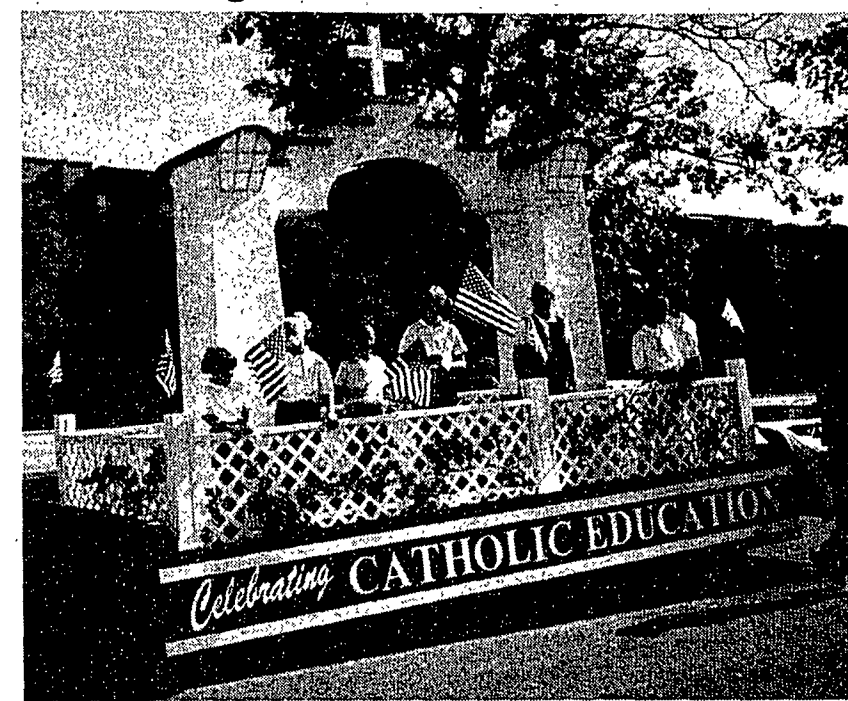

### Plan to identify drivers who black out passed

The Illinois House today approved Secretary of State George H. Ryan's proposal requiring police to alert his office about drivers who cause crashes after passing out.

The plan also requires motorists to alert Ryan's office within 10 days if they develop a medical condition that could impair their driving abilities. Drivers who fail to follow the law could have their drivers licenses canceled.

The measure - House Bill 3629 - passed 106-0 and now moves to the Senate for further consideration.

"This legislation will give my office the information we need to make more informed decisions about whether certain drivers should be on the road," Ryan said.

"Requiring police to provide these reports to my office could head off many tragedies," Ryan began developing the measure last December after a 31-year-old Palatine man crashed into a post office building during a seizure, injuring more than a dozen people.

The driver also had four previous collisions caused by seizures, but none of the incidents were reported to Ryan's office.

Sponsoring the legislation were state Reps. Dan Rutherford, R-Pontiac, and James B. Durkin, R-Westchester.

Under current law, physicians, state's attorneys and police officers can ask the secretary of state's office to cancel a motorist's driving privileges because of a medical condition.

Ryan's plan would require police agencies to notify his office of any driver who crashes after blacking out behind the wheel.

Currently, about 150,000 Illinois drivers have their medical conditions reviewed on a regular basis by the Secretary of State Medical Advisory Board. Most are required to provide a physician's report indicating they are safe to drive each time they renew their drivers license.

Ryan's office cancels about 800 drivers licenses a year due to medical conditions.

### Barring felons from school bus jobs

In its first month, a law requiring the fingerprinting of new school bus drivers blocked the hiring of 26 felons convicted of offenses ranging from rape and prostitution to drug and weapons violations. Secretary of State George H. Ryan announced today.

Criminal background checks run during July on 584 would-be drivers statewide showed more than 4 percent had committed offenses that, under current law, automatically bar them from being hired to drive children to school.

"In the past, our system for criminal background checks let too many people convicted of these serious crimes slip through the cracks," Ryan said in a news conference today. "Now that we're taking fingerprints, we've got a way to screen out these felons."

"The message we intend to send, starting now, is this: When there is a job opening for a school bus driver, people with a history of dangerous criminal behavior need not apply."

Mandatory fingerprinting of all new school bus driver applicants was a key provision of legislation Ryan proposed in spring 1994 to overhaul the regulation of Illinois' 25,000 school bus drivers.

The measure, which took effect July 1, also consolidated oversight of bus drivers into the secretary of state's office, which is now responsible for licensing and approving school bus drivers under Ryan's "Safe Ride" program.

"The enforcement of this law has been a real eye opener," Ryan said. "Our expectation was that many people with criminal histories wouldn't even bother to apply for a job driving a school bus now that the law requires them to be fingerprinted."

"We found out that wasn't the case."

While the law's main focus was to screen out felons convicted of serious crimes, Ryan said the background checks also showed a sizable number of applicants had been charged or convicted of lesser criminal offenses.

The first-month figures showed that 110 bus driver applicants - or about 20 percent of the total - either had arrests or convictions on offenses that, under current law, would not bar them from driving kids to school.

The offenses ranged from relatively minor violations, such as traffic offenses or disorderly conduct, to more serious crimes, including battery, burglary and theft.

"Because we're fingerprinting, we are now able to give bus companies and school districts information they need to make good decisions about hiring people who are trusted with the lives and safety of children," Ryan said.

### Sheriff's 'Swap Crews' in Des Plaines

Labor crews from the Sheriff's Work Alternative Program (SWAP) will be working in Des Plaines on Aug. 8 and 9, as a public service to the taxpayers of Cook County, according to the Office of Sheriff Michael F. Sheahan.

The SWAP Program is made up of non-violent offenders charged with DUI and other misdemeanor crimes who "swap" jail time for a community service sentence. Under the supervision

of specially trained sheriff's deputies, the crews work throughout the county on a variety of public works projects such as cleaning parks, viaducts and streets.

"The SWAP Program serves our county well because it saves taxpayers millions of dollars," said Sheriff Sheahan.

"SWAP provides our communities with a free labor source and it helps to combat jail crowding and the costs associated with that problem. It also provides tough

yet meaningful rehabilitation to the offenders by allowing them to pay their debt to society in a pro-

ductive fashion."

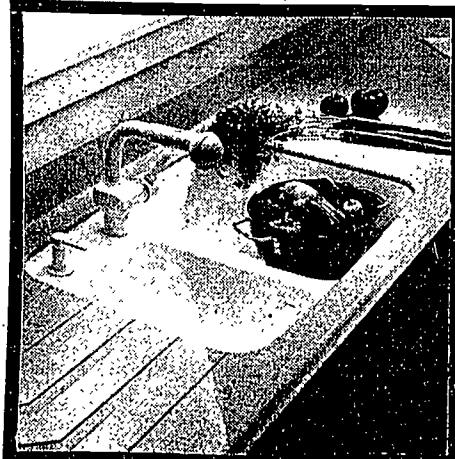

### Enhance health care for women

Gov. Jim Edgar signed legislation to enhance health care for women.

Gaining Edgar's approval were measures to:

• "Combat" drive-through deliveries by requiring those in the insurance business to provide coverage for a minimum of 48 hours of inpatient care after a normal birth and 96 hours after a Cesarean section.

• Require insurance providers or managed health care plans to allow women to have direct access to an obstetrician or gynecologist without having to get prior approval or a referral.

"The health of new mothers and their babies should not be jeopardized merely to save some money," the Governor said.

"I also believe that all women should have ready access to health care that responds to their unique needs."

House Bill 2557, which is effective immediately, responds to the concerns of new mothers and physicians that women and their newborns were being hurried out of hospitals under pressure from of hospitals under pressure from insurance companies. It allows for women to leave the hospital in less than 48 hours if the attending physician authorizes it and there are assurances that the condition of the baby will be checked in the first 48 hours after the discharge. The legislation does not cover private sector self-insurance plans, which are governed by federal law.

Chief sponsors of the legislation were Reps. Kathleen Wojcik (R-Schaumburg), Mike Bost (R-Murphyboro), Carolyn Krause (R-Mt. Prospect), Judy Biggart (R-Hinsdale) and Judy Erwin (D-Chicago); and Sens. Robert Madigan (R-Lincoln), James DeLeo (D-Chicago), David Luechtefeld (R-Okawville), Larry Bomke (R-Springfield) and Aldo DeAngelis (R-Olympia Fields).

Senate Bill 1246 addresses the concerns of women and many physicians that managed health care plans may delay unduly a woman's access to care by a gynecologist or obstetrician. Health care organizations now have 120 days in which to implement the provisions.

Some chief sponsors of Senate Bill 1246 are Reps. Rosemary Mulligan (R-Park Ridge), Raymond Poe (R-Springfield), Gwenn Klinger (R-Springfield), Angelo "Skip" Saviano (R-Elmhurst Park) and Gerald Mitchell (R-Sterling).

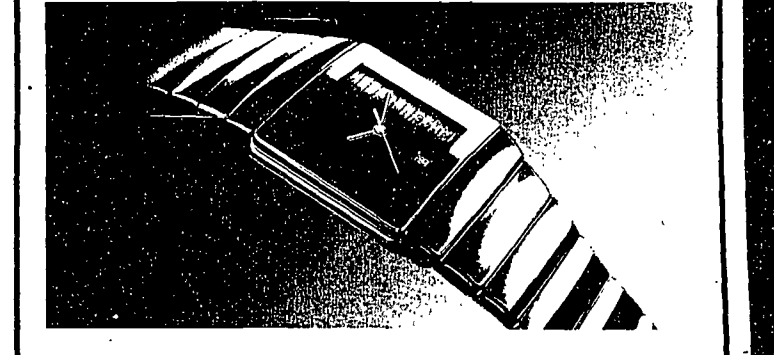

## Strengthening Medicare: the critical next steps

Medicare has protected the lives and health of more than 30 million older Americans for more than 30 years. For many of our parents, Medicare has been their only protection from the soaring costs of health care, and their only hope of affording the care they need.

But, even with Medicare's help, older Americans are spending more and more of their income to buy overpriced drugs and foot the bill for long term care.

**The High Price of Medicines**  
Look at what's happening to two older Americans. Mary Johnston and Celia Mahoney.

Mary Johnston's husband died eight years ago. Today, at 73, she's struggling to get along on \$726 a month from Social Security. Mrs. Johnston began working six decades ago, when she was twelve years old. After a lifetime of hard work, Mrs. Johnston still isn't on Easy Street. It would be tough enough making ends meet if all she had to worry about were rent and groceries. It's all her medications that makes it near impossible to get by on \$726 a month.

Mrs. Johnston doesn't complain about her health, but she lives with diabetes, a heart condition, and arthritis, so her medicines are expensive. Each month she has to come up with \$128 for prescription drugs she needs to survive. That's a big chunk of

her income. Sometimes she skips meals. Sometimes she skips pills. So, what happens? Well, one time, she wound up in the hospital for skipping pills.

**The Crushing Burden of Long Term Care**

If Medicare fails Mary Johnston on the cost of drugs, it fails Celia Mahoney on the cost of long term care. She's been in a nursing home for seven years, at the staggering cost of \$36,000 a year. That's twice what she gets in pension and Social Security, so she's going through her savings. Even though she saved and saved throughout a life of hard work, there's not much left. Some days, she stares out the window, weeping that everything she worked for is disappearing; her savings and her dignity.

Rather than being able to help her children, she may soon have to turn to her children for help.

Her daughter, Dorothy, has two children in college. Dorothy worries about her mom, but she's

also worrying about what the cost of long term care is going to do to the family budget, already straining to cover tuition for two kids in college.

**It's Time to Strengthen Medicare**

Unfortunately, the stories of Mary Johnston and Celia Mahoney are not even unusual these days. For all the good that Medicare has done for older Americans, more needs to be done. It's time for America to take the next step.

Medicare should be strengthened, and it should cover prescription drugs and long-term care. That's a priority for American families, and it should come ahead of new tax loopholes for the wealthy.

America has Social Security and Medicare only because our parents created them for their parents. It's our turn to do what needs to be done for our parents, our children and ourselves.

Lunch is included during the trip. On the menu will be boneless breast of chicken topped with apricot sauce, steamed vegetables, steamed rice, dessert and a beverage.

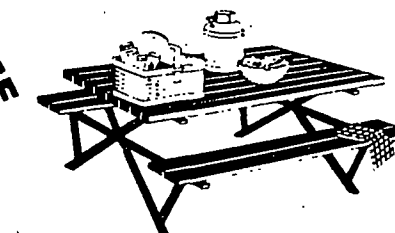
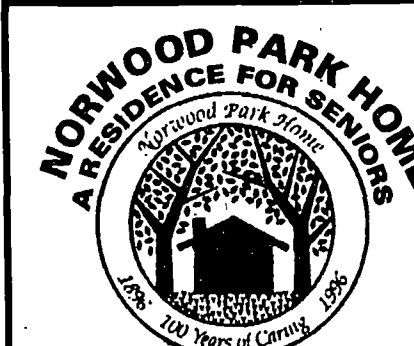

### Driving hints for seniors

Senior citizens age 65 and older comprise about 13 percent of all Illinois drivers. While few requirements exist for seniors to maintain driving privileges, they need to be aware of natural physical changes, such as changing vision and slower reflexes, that may limit their driving ability.

Q. Is there an age at which older citizens should stop driving?

A. No, as long as they are physically and mentally capable of driving safely. Many elderly people voluntarily stop driving and surrender their licenses when they feel they should not be driving.

Q. What are the requirements for seniors when renewing a driver's license?

A. Seniors age 69-80 must renew their licenses every four years for a \$5 fee. Persons 81-86

must renew every two years for a \$2 fee, and those 87 and older must renew yearly at no fee.

Q. What tests are required when renewing a driver's license?

A. All drivers must pass a vision test, and those age 75 and older must pass a behind-the-wheel driving test. Additionally, all drivers must take a written test every eight years, except those having no traffic violations.

Seniors are encouraged to attend a Rules of the Road Review Course before renewing a driver's license. ### Health records required to start school year

The Niles Township High Schools are urging all parents and students to complete or update student health and immunization records so that they can attend classes when school begins on Tuesday, Aug. 27.

State law requires that students

new to District 219, including freshmen and transfer students, have a complete physical done by a doctor licensed in Illinois. The law also requires evidence of immunization against measles (two doses of live vaccine), mumps,

### Governor signs Dudycz bill for boot camp

A new law gives the green light to a boot camp program for certain Cook County prisoners, according to Assistant Senate Majority Leader Walter Dudycz (R-7th, Chicago), the sponsor of the legislation.

Senate Bill 1357, signed by Gov. Jim Edgar, authorizes a county-operated boot camp and specifies that only people convicted of nonviolent felony crimes will be allowed to participate in the Cook County boot camp program as an alternative to jail. Inmates must be between the ages of 17 and 35 and can not have participated in a boot camp program or have more than one prior felony conviction resulting

in imprisonment. Those prisoners convicted of the following crimes are not eligible: Class X felony, first or second degree murder, armed violence, aggravated kidnapping, criminal sexual assault, aggravated criminal sexual abuse or a second conviction for criminal sexual abuse, forcible detention or arson.

"One way to combat the problem of overcrowded prisons is to try to prevent our young prisoners from making a return visit to jail. A boot camp will give them a sense of accomplishment, so they will be looking forward to a clean life outside of prison," Dudycz said.

### Tax Help programs seek volunteers

Over 80,000 Americans gave something to the IRS this year, and they can't wait until next year to do it again.

According to the Internal Revenue Service, what they gave wasn't money; it was time. They did it through IRS-sponsored volunteer programs which provide free tax assistance to people who can't afford professional tax help. VITA - Volunteer Income Tax Assistance - primarily helps low-income people, senior citizens, people with disabilities, and those who have difficulty with English. TCE - Tax Counseling for the Elderly - is a companion program cosponsored by organizations such as the American Association of Retired Persons.

The IRS is now recruiting vol-

unteers for next year's programs. The most important qualification is a desire to help others by answering tax questions and filling out basic income tax returns. Though some volunteers are accountants, many more come from other walks of life, such as students, business people, teachers, and retired people.

Free training is provided to all volunteers. Then volunteers offer help at schools, libraries, senior citizen centers, and other convenient neighborhood locations.

The IRS is also looking for groups interested in sponsoring new tax help sites. If you'd like to volunteer, or have questions about these programs, call the IRS toll-free at 1-800-829-1040 and ask for the Taxpayer Education office.

employees' salaries to the tort fund if  
their job duties relate to loss pre-  
vention and reduction. For exam-  
ple, 02 percent of a secretary's  
salary might come from the tort  
fund, while 100 percent of a  
crossing guard's salary could be  
funded with tort money.

According to the proposed  
plan, between 30 percent and 70  
percent of the salaries of 24 em-  
ployees will come from the opera-  
tions and maintenance fund, but  
35 percent to 50 percent of a cus-  
todian's salary could come from  
tort funds because a custodian's  
job deals with both safety and  
sanitation.

Further discussion of the use of  
tort and operations and mainte-  
nance funds is slated for the Aug.  
13 School Board meeting. The  
tentative budget is scheduled to  
go on display Aug. 13 in district  
buildings and the Niles Public Li-  
brary.
