## Law regulates home swimming pools in Niles

Even though Labor Day was fast approaching which traditionally marks the end of summer and the outdoor swimming season, the Niles Village Board determined that private swimming pools located in the Village needed to be better protected.

Consequently, at its August 27 meeting, the Board unanimously voted that all private swimming pools, above ground or in-ground, installed or altered after August 27, 1996 must now be completely surrounded by a fence.

Fences around the pools must be 5 feet above grade and must have locked gates to be in compliance with the BOCA Code, re-

## Clausen to leave Grand National October 1

## Niles board studies 'Reverse 911'

As early as October, the Niles Village Board may decide to install the "reverse 911" emergency notification system already in use in Vernon Hills and Oak Brook.

Jacqueline Bianchi, a representative of the Indianapolis-based Sigma Company that provides the service, made a presentation to board members before their Aug. 27 meeting.

A database of names and phone numbers would be set up. In the event of an emergency, those numbers would be called, alerting residents in the area via a recorded message of suspicious persons, gas leaks or other emergency situations.

The cost of the system would be about \$30,000 with an annual service charge of about \$3,600.

Morton Grove couple run over while crossing Dempster St.;  
Des Plaines man, 40, previously convicted of drunk driving in April

# Drunk driver hits MG couple, kills 1

A Des Plaines man whose license was suspended April 26 on a previous drunk driving charge struck a Morton Grove couple crossing Dempster Street Aug. 27 killing the wife and injuring her husband.

Miriam Green, 61, was pronounced dead on arrival at Lutheran General Hospital in Park Ridge. Her husband Melvyn, also 61, was treated for a fractured wrist and other injuries. He was released Aug. 29 according to Cindee Castronovo, Lutheran General spokeswoman.

The couple were standing on the raised median at the intersection of Harlem Avenue and Dempster Street waiting to cross to the north side of Dempster. The 1988 Lincoln Town Car driven by Tadeusz Kitlas, 40, of Des Plaines, traveling west on Dempster, entered the left turn lane but then proceeded straight ahead instead of turning. After crossing

the intersection at Harlem, the vehicle drove up and onto the raised median, striking both victims, propelling them up and to the west, according to Morton Grove Police Commander Garry Marta.

The vehicle then continued far-

## Prom night death caused by seizure

The prom night death of 18-year-old Morton Grove honor student Tanila Sassounes was the result of a seizure disorder, according to the Cook County Medical Examiner's Aug. 13 report. Sassounes was found by friends early on the morning of May 18 following the Niles West High School prom. Several students, along with Sassounes, had rented a room at the Comfort Inn, 601 Diversey Parkway, Chicago.

Sassounes was found in the bathtub where she apparently suffered an undiagnosed seizure disorder while showering that caused her to collapse and drown, according to Mary Powers, a medical examiner's spokesperson.

Chicago police ruled out drugs or alcohol as possible causes of death early in the investigation. Sassounes emigrated with her family from Tehran, Iran, in 1982.

## Edward Jones: Evaluating Fund Management Can Be A Challenge

You wouldn't choose an attorney, CPA or broker without carefully investigating his or her experience and background. You should do the same with mutual funds.

When you invest in a mutual fund, you're entrusting some one else to make decisions about your money; therefore, you should carefully evaluate the manager of any fund you're considering. In fact, most published evaluations of mutual funds weigh heavily on the reputations of the managers.

For example, in its annual fund ratings, Forbes magazine once disqualified an entire mutual fund management group because its funds were headed by teams rather than an individual for each

fund. That meant that regardless of how outstanding or consistent the performance of any fund, if the spotlight was shared by more than one manager, that fund could not win a trophy. The editors of Forbes admitted that they had excluded an entire group of excellent funds because each fund was not managed by a single star. They also admitted that their highest-rated fund probably would lose its luster if the manager left—and he did.

While this may be extreme, it illustrates how important the connection is between a fund's manager and its performance. Unfortunately, major management changes happen regularly at mutual fund companies. This makes

it difficult when you're reviewing a fund's past performance. Did the fund have different managers during good times and bad times? Was the person who manages the fund today responsible for its outstanding performance in the past?

Even if you find a fund that has had continuous management, there are no guarantees about its future. According to USA Today, one fund company fired a manager of an asset allocation fund after he achieved a three-year return of 34 percent. The \$11.2 billion he managed failed to meet the 36.8 percent average gain of similar funds. The fund company replaced him with a team of managers, one of them a top performer

whose previous fund more than doubled the average stock fund over the past 10 years.

Asset allocation funds move money among stocks, bonds and the money market in response to economic and market trends. People who invest in these funds are typically conservative, preferring reasonable returns and not too much risk. Their objective is not only to grow, but also to protect. How do you think the shareholders of this fund reacted to the assignment of a new stock picker who could be a high roller?

There's not much you can do about management changes at mutual funds. However, keep in mind that when you examine mu-

tual fund ratings, you may be looking through a rear-view mirror.

The two fundamental tests in selecting a fund are consistency of results and continuity of the people managing the fund. Simply put, the same managers must be consistent in making money. Blindly buying a mutual fund without knowing about its management history could be an invitation to big surprises. Before you invest, learn the fund's stated objectives, its risk parameters and as much as you can about its management history.

## Water quality complaints

Between August 12 and 26, the Health Department received 88 complaints about the quality of Skokie's drinking water. The Water and Sewer Division also received numerous complaints. The Health Department has been in contact with the Evanston Water Department who too have heard from concerned citizens.

Most complainants state that their water tastes and smells moldy or "earthy." In addition to their dislike for the flavor of the water, they are afraid that it may be dangerous to drink.

Employees of the Evanston Water laboratory have assured the Village that there is no risk in drinking the water. The problem is related to an overgrowth of algae in Lake Michigan caused by increasingly clear water over the past few years. The water is apparently being filtered by millions of zebra mussels. This filtration process allows sunlight to reach greater depths and increases the growth of algae which produces foul tasting chemicals. Evanston has been adding additional activated charcoal as part of the treatment process but this is only somewhat effective.

The Skokie Health Department will continue to collect at least 70 water samples each month to be tested for bacterial levels. If a health problem should be noted you will be informed at once.

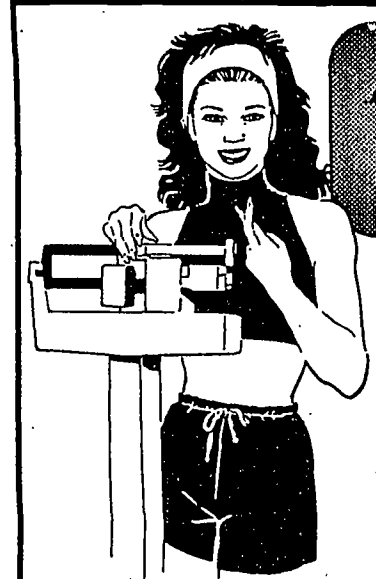

### Caffeine and medications could effect driving ability

Avoid excessive caffeine and sugars; pay attention to body fatigue; read medicine labels carefully for warnings about drowsiness. The precautions may be obvious, but people continually fail to consider them before getting behind the wheel, says Citizens Against Drug Impaired Drivers (C.A.N.D.I.D.).

"People need to know that there are a number of factors - not just alcohol and illicit drugs - that can impair one's ability to drive," said Karen Tarney, co-founder of C.A.N.D.I.D. and victim of a drug-related car crash in 1989. "Even everyday medications, such as cholesterol-lowering drugs, antidepressants, and sedating cold and allergy remedies can diminish driving skill by causing drowsiness, and by compromising coordination and reaction time."

C.A.N.D.I.D. is offering consumers a free "Drive Smart, Drive Safe" brochure. This new brochure highlights basic automobile safety tips, provides a checklist of some commonly used medications that can impair driving ability, and includes state-by-state information about penalties for driving under the influence of drugs. The brochure can be obtained by calling the toll-free hotline, 1 (800) OK-2-DRIVE.

Currently, laws providing people from driving under the influence of any drug that impairs driving performance have been enacted in 35 states plus the District of Columbia. In these states,

people can be fined up to \$5,000, receive a jail sentence of up to 2 years, and endure license suspension or revocation.

Enforcing the legal ramifications of drug-impaired driving, the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) manages a certification program for Drug Recognition Experts (DREs) throughout the country. Via the DRE program, highway safety officials are trained to recognize broad categories of drugs, both legal and illegal, in impaired drivers. To date, DRE programs have been instituted in 30 states and the District of Columbia. C.A.N.D.I.D. advocates implementing the program in every state.

C.A.N.D.I.D. is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to educating the public about the dangers of drug-impaired driving. C.A.N.D.I.D. is supported through a grant from Schering Corporation, a sponsor since 1994.

### Guidelines for following trucks

Q. What are the guidelines for following a big truck?

A. Do not tailgate. Allow a 4- to 6-second following distance behind a truck to maintain a clear view of the road ahead. Rear-ending a truck can result in a car sliding into and under the trailer.

• Stay out of the truck's blind spots by positioning your vehicle so the truck driver can see it in his side mirrors.

• Dim your headlights when following a truck at night. High beams can reflect off the truck's mirrors and blind the driver.

Q. What procedures should I follow when passing a truck?

A. Make sure you have a clear view of the road ahead and gain enough speed to pass. Apply your turn signal (blink your headlights at night) and pass quickly. Do not pull back into the truck's lane until you can see the entire front of the truck in your rear view mirror. Do not slow down after passing.

Q. What about a truck passing my vehicle?

A. Pull to the right of your lane, and slow down to let the truck pass quickly.

### Banishing the mid-afternoon slump

It's that time of day. The morning went well, but the middle of the afternoon comes and your concentration and energy levels have plummeted. The only thing you can think about is where to find the nearest candy bar. Where does the afternoon slump come from, and how can you avoid it?

If you rely on sugar and caffeine to jump start your energy early in the day, you may feel a slump later when the effects wear off and your blood sugar drops. Although small amounts of sugar or caffeine usually don't cause a problem, larger amounts can cause an eventual major fall-off in energy, especially if they are used as quick-fix replacements for balanced meals.

If you're trying to save time or calories, a lunch that is too light will not provide enough fuel to last through an afternoon. Some nutrition experts recommend eating at least a quarter of your day's calorie needs at lunch time. Therefore, relying on a bowl of soup with a few crackers, a slice of pizza, or a diet frozen meal to provide lasting energy will probably not suffice. Supplement these foods with other foods to create a meal that satisfies hunger for more than a couple of hours.

For some people, a meal made solely from the carbohydrates found in grains, fruits, vegetables and sweets will not supply enough long-lasting energy - even though they may contain a significant number of calories.

To avoid an afternoon slump, you may find relief by adding some low-fat protein to your carbohydrate-based meal. Some grilled chicken with fruit, tofu

with steamed veggies, or beans in a salad might make a real difference between a quick fix and lasting energy.

When you do experience a slump in energy, don't try to fix it with a jolt of caffeine or sugar. If you need a snack, try a longer-lasting one like pretzels, crackers, fruit or milk. You may just need a mental break after concentrating too long on a difficult or tedious task. Some people find it helpful

to do a few neck and shoulder stretches, or to get up and move around for a few minutes.

Plan ahead and you may be able to avoid an afternoon slump. Make time for a 15 to 20-minute walk at lunch time to help prevent its onset. Avoid excess fat and calories at lunch, but don't sacrifice the lasting energy that comes from combining a modest amount of lean protein with plenty of grains, fruits and vegetables.

This kind of lunch, based on the American Institute for Cancer Research dietary guidelines, not only gives you lasting energy, but also helps lower your risk of cancer and promotes long-term good health.

up to school was equally fast. Carrying her brown box luggage into the new dorm was done amidst much huffing and puffing. And while the huffing and puffing was natural for me, when I came upon the hordes of young people who seemed to be coming from all directions, I vowed I'd begin getting into condition at the "Y" beginning Monday.

Eleven floors up is her bedroom, a 10 by 16 foot room which seemed too small for all her brown boxes. When I saw her roommate had an equal amount of the same kind of luggage it seemed impossible two teen girls would be able to live in that cubicle.

The hordes of young people who were downstairs were figuratively matched by the throngs who were on floor 11.

Amidst the brown boxes, the two teens and the little Mother and Father, an endless stream of Betty Coeds began squeezing into the room, laughing, gripping about the food, shaking hands, squealing and just being friendly. They were from Edwardsville and Bensenville and "she worked at Lyttons" and "I remember you from orientation" and "Boy, was the food bad...I was sick for three days with the flu...and I'm sure it was from the food." It was an endless stream of young people, all full of talk.

It was supertime and the number one daughter had very little for lunch so Little Mother said we'd take her out for a bite...but naturally, she wasn't hungry, and I gave Little Mother the, "Let's get out of here and leave her alone" look.

She kissed us goodbye and Mother remembered she

needed a few dollars cash. She kissed us again and I even counted a third time which was some sort of a record. It must have been that good clean corn-bearing De Kalb air.

As we left, I borrowed an old standard bromide from a friend by telling the girls, "Have a good time and be good girls...but not necessarily in that order." They all laughed and then they all told me what their old Dads had said and I realized all old Dads are much the same...pretty corny.

As we started the drive home we mulled over whether the school was too large. "Maybe we should have considered a smaller school," Little Mother worried because "She" missed supper and "She" wouldn't have anything to eat. "The least I could have done was leave her some fruit," she worried, but soon Mother was dozing as we headed for the tollway.

Exiting at Dempster Street, I told Little Mother, "Look at it this way...you didn't lose a daughter, you gained a car." I thought it was kind of funny but she ignored the little morale booster.

When we arrived home the younger brigade peremptorily asked us two or three questions about "her school" and then reviewed the sprinkling fight they had, and lapsed into a finger-pointing battle over who did what to whom.

There's now one less finger-pointer at home...and we're going to miss her. But as we sat down to dinner, I realized it's only a matter of minutes before someone spills something. And I was right...and suddenly I had a lump in my throat.

ther west, still driving on the median and blowing out both left side tires. All the rubber on the left tires was lost, according to Marta, but Kitlas continued driving west on Dempster for approximately three miles to his residence in the 9700 block of Bianco Terrace in Des Plaines.

Morton Grove and Niles police followed the gouges left in the street by the vehicle's wheel rims all the way to Kitlas' home, police said.

After a brief struggle, Kitlas was taken into custody and transported to the Morton Grove police station where he was charged with reckless homicide, aggravated driving under the influence of alcohol, leaving the scene of a personal injury accident, driving with a suspended license, improper lane usage, battery to a police officer and resisting a police officer.

Marta estimated the maximum sentence Kitlas would receive if convicted at 13 years.

At the time of the collision, Kitlas was on supervision and driving on a judicial driving permit, the result of an April 26 court decision for a Feb. 11 arrest by Morton Grove police for a DUI charge. A judicial permit allows a driver who has been convicted on a DUI charge to travel to and from his/her place of employment, usually on a particular route and at particular times of day, Marta said.

No bail or bond was set at the initial bond hearing Aug. 29 due to Kitlas' citizenship status, according to Marta. Kitlas, from Poland, is in the U.S. on a visa, which increases his flight risk, Marta said. A bond review hearing to reconsider Kitlas' eligibility for bond was scheduled for Sept. 4.

The incident was the second fatality involving a hit-and-run driver under the influence of alcohol this year, Marta said. A truck accident at Golf Road and Harlem Avenue resulted in a fatality several months ago, Marta said.

cently added to the Village of Niles' own Building Code.

Substantial protective covers are also required to be provided under BOCA and placed over all private residential swimming pools during the period from September 16 to observance of Memorial Day.

BOCA is the National Building Code which the Village of Niles has incorporated into its Code of Ordinances. The Niles Code has been amended by the Village Board to now require that every existing private residential swimming pool and every pool that is modified or altered, such as being moved or expanded, be subject to these procedures.

Although no particular reason was cited by Village Trustee Andrew Przybylo for the amendments, "There was not a drowning or an accident," he believed that this law "helps people." Przybylo was instrumental in proposing the passage of these amended statutes.

Grandfathering exemptions will apply for existing pools. Pools that were currently installed in the Village prior to August 27, 1996 will not be required to have fences or coverings.

However, new owners buying a house after August 27, that has an in ground or above ground pool will have to erect a fence that is up to Code, the Trustees mandated.

Smaller pools, those that are less than three feet high, are not subject to this ordinance.

Another provision applies to diving boards. Under the law, no diving boards that are attached to pools may be higher than 3 feet.

Additional provisions of the law require that no portion of a pool may be located closer than 6 feet from the property line, and above ground pools shall not exceed a height of 4 feet above grade.

Bianchi said. Mayor Nicholas Blase brought the system to the board's attention after reading about it earlier this summer.

Niles Police Chief Raymond Giovannelli said he thought the system would be beneficial for public information and safety.

"I think it [Reverse 911] probably has merit," said Village Manager Abe Selman. "But we need to see it installed someplace. We're going to do more research."

Whether the "reverse 911" would have helped calm residents during a recent police helicopter chase of an escaped arrestee is debatable.

"I'm not sure we would have used it in that situation," Selman said. "There have to be guidelines worked out so we won't unnecessarily alarm residents."

## Ecology Club works to save Wetlands

Thousands of years ago, before Columbus, before Lief Ericson, and probably before many of you were even born, what is now known as the Upper Midwest was totally covered in an ecosystem known as wetlands. Preserving this type of environment, which has now been mostly pushed to the northeastern most shores of Lake Michigan, has become one of the main goals of the Maine East Ecology Club. This "ecologically priceless" system provides a home for literally thousands of species of plants and animals, some of which are endangered species and more of which cannot survive anywhere else.

In cooperation with other Maine Township High School ecology clubs, Maine East's Ecology Club has adopted the closest section of the Indian Creek wetlands, located in Long Grove. The clubs make several trips a year to the site where members engage in activities stretching from simple litter removal to the pulling of dangerous plants such as purple loose stripe, a weed which can grow and overtake acres of thriving wetlands in less than a year.

The united ecology clubs have also worked to protect the wetlands from Illinois Department of Transportation plans to build a multi-lane highway through the endangered environment. Ecological organizations from all over the state have been actively concerned with the destruction of these wetlands, with the only alternatives being rerouting the highway or rebuilding the lost wetlands in another suitable place.

Even though man-made wetlands are a reality, artificial wetlands are never as productive as the original. The disturbance would affect the path of the streams formed by heavy rainfall, a disturbance that would lead to widespread plant and tree deaths, which would, in turn, shake the food chain until larger carnivorous animals started to die off.

Such relocation can also affect the lives of the animals who suddenly become forced to live in a place that, even though it is similar to their old home, is decidedly different. Moreover, the price of rebuilding the lost wetlands

would be much more than the cost of the highway itself.

In addition to being a homeland for animals, the wetlands serve as a natural water filtering system. The water that passes through a wetland is often used to supply neighboring cities miles away. Groundwater that flows through these areas is filtered and cleaned by natural limestone deposits and microscopic decomposers, the basis of all wetland life. As such things as acid rain and air pollution invade, the decomposers start to die. With these organisms gone, the effectiveness of the wetlands as a water-purifier is severely lowered and more expensive techniques must be relied upon.

Through continued work days of weeding, tending to wetland animals, litter removal days, and campaigning their cause through local newspapers and the Chicago Tribune, Maine East's Ecology Club hopes to not only help save this and other dying lands, but to also spread their message of action and the urgency with which this action must take place.
