## Sentence of youth who killed Skokie eye doctor delayed

Sentencing of the 15-year-old Waukegan youth who was convicted of murdering a Skokie eye doctor in his Zion office has been delayed pending results of a psychiatric examination.

Silvester Donoe was convicted Feb. 20 of the first-degree murder of Sigmund Zagoren, 77, last June 18.

Donoe and a 13-year-old accomplice went to Zagoren's business pretending to shop for contact lenses. Later, they attacked Zagoren with a pipe wrench in the parking lot of the office building. Zagoren reportedly sustained at

## Chicago man, 25, arrested in Wilmette; police say burglar worked in Niles, Skokie, Lincolnwood

## Suspect charged in a dozen area home burglaries

Burglary victims from Niles, Glenview, Skokie and Lincolnwood were among the homeowners sorting through more than \$50,000 in recovered property allegedly stolen by a 25-year-old Chicago man charged with a dozen residential burglaries in Niles and seven other nearby communities.

Oscar Luna Robledo was arrested March 27 in Wilmette after an alert off-duty community service officer spotted him two days earlier near homes on Ridge Road and noticed that he matched the description of the burglar being sought in connection with a string of house and townhouse burglaries that occurred between January and March.

During follow-up surveillance, Robledo's car, a red 1993 Geo, was spotted by another Wilmette officer on Old Glenview Road.

When Robledo returned to the car, he was arrested with articles taken in an Evanston burglary in his possession. A search of Robledo's apartment in the 4300

block of South Francisco Avenue in Chicago by detectives from Wilmette, Evanston, Skokie, Glenview and Northfield revealed a large amount of stolen property and firearms, much of which has been returned to the rightful owners.

Two of the burglaries Robledo is accused of committing occurred in Niles townhouses, one on Feb. 10 in the 8700 block of Shermer Road, the other on

## MG firefighter injured in house fire

Firefighter Peter Tropp, 32, was treated for possible smoke inhalation during a fire that started in the attached garage of a vacant house in the 8800 block of Central Avenue around 12:55 p.m. March 27.

According to a report issued by District Chief Ruedanz, the fire was upgraded to a full still alarm due to high winds and the large amount of fire encountered upon arrival of the Morton Grove Fire Department personnel.

Four engines, two trucks, three ambulances, and 32 firefighters responded to the alarm, which

came in at 12:51 p.m. The fire was brought under control by 1:12 p.m.

Mutual aid was received from nearby suburbs, including Niles, Glenview, North Main and Skokie.

The house was recently sold and the new owners had not yet moved in, officials said. The cause of the blaze is still under investigation. Damage was estimated at \$70,000.

Tropp was released from Lutheran General Hospital where he was treated and was still recuperating as of April 6.

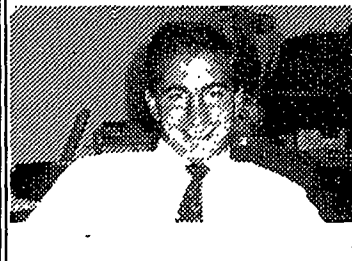

## Residents get to know NPD at Police Academy II

Members of Citizens Police Academy II gathered March 3 at the Niles Police Department to begin the second 10-week program designed to give residents a working knowledge of the department.

The group meets weekly from 6:30 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. to hear speakers as well as have hands-on experience in various aspects of police work.

The program, which is coordinated by Sgt. John Fryksdale, includes such topics as Police Officer Training, Traffic Enforcement, Juvenile Law, Initiating Traffic Stops, and presentations by various police and village agencies, such as the Animal Control/Canine Unit, the Niles Human Services Department and the officers who implement various programs, such as P.R.I.D.E., D.A.R.E. and G.A.T.E.

Among the "hands-on" activities, this semester's CPA members have already donned the special eyeglasses that replicate the feeling of a person with a blood alcohol level of .8 and "dusted for prints" under the guidance of evidence technician Detective O'Sullivan.

Two of their remaining seven sessions will also be "hands-on," when they experience a ride-along and also take a turn learning to shoot on the police pistol range.

Some group members will take their turn on the pistol range while other group members will actually be riding along with police patrol officers as they keep the peace in the village.

Criminal Law, Domestic Violence, Drug Investigations, Use of Force and SWAT Team demonstrations will also be discussed before the May 5 graduation, which will be held at the Village Hall.

Fryksdale, who coordinates the program, said, "There are 18 people out there now who know what we do. They're like an extension of us."

Fryksdale said that many of the participating officers spend much of their off-duty time doing re-

search, making lesson plans and preparing handouts for the CPA sessions they conduct.

Sgt. Sam Fucarino who presented a session on criminal law investigation to the group March 30, said he was glad to be able to "dispel some of the myths about doughnuts," that are sometimes attributed to police departments.

Susan Panico, director of development with the Niles Park District is one of the course participants. She said she joined the program "to be more informed regarding what the police department does so I can try to apply it to what I do in my job and as a citizen."

Jack Fisher, another course member, was a designer of communication systems for Motorola. He designed the communication system currently used by the Chicago Police.

"My goal was to learn how I as a citizen could help the Niles Police Department and to learn various aspects of their activities," Fisher said. He added that he is most impressed with the knowledge and enthusiasm displayed by the officers involved in the program. "They are like kids at Show and Tell, standing up and showing us what they do."

Darlene Barszcz joined the group because she is a parent and also serves as co-president of the PTA at Niles South School and Culver Middle School. She said another parent, Marge Melfi, who participated in the first Academy highly recommended it to her.

"I'm hoping to bring some of the information back to other parents in the PTA," Barszcz said. She was particularly interested in the presentations about the D.A.R.E. and P.R.I.D.E. drug abuse prevention programs, which are presented in the schools.

"It's extremely interesting," Barszcz said. "I can't get over the information they're giving us."

### Are Your Feet Killing You?

Most people accept sore tired feet as a fact of life. People think that if they spend a lot of time on their feet they are going to hurt and leave it at that. This is most certainly faulty reasoning. Unfortunately the vast majority of patients who go to the podiatrist's office do so only after the pain has become so unbearable they can't stand it any more.

A more prudent and painless approach would be to have problems such as heel pain, ingrown nails, hammertoes, bunions, and foot injuries evaluated and treated before they become major problems. We all know from watching the multitude of T.V. advertisements that pain is caused by inflammation. All of the above conditions are associated with inflammatory processes. The longer these inflammatory conditions go untreated, the worse they get and the longer they take to resolve. Most foot problems can be treated with minimal time, suffering and expense if they are caught early.

The concept of early diagnosis and treatment takes on even greater significance in the diabetic population, those with poor circulation and patients with decreased feeling or lack of sensation in their feet. We require adequate circulation and sensation to function normally. Common foot problems such as ingrown nails, corns and calluses can quickly become major foot infections which can lead to ulceration and in some instances, amputation. Fortunately most patients with diabetes and other conditions that predispose to serious foot problems are well educated on the potential problems associated with these conditions and seek regular advice from their primary care physician or podiatrist.

So when your feet hurt, listen to them. Don't just accept foot pain as a fact of life. In patients with diabetes, poor circulation, abnormal sensation or a compromised immune system this message takes on even greater significance. Are your feet killing you? Then do something about it!

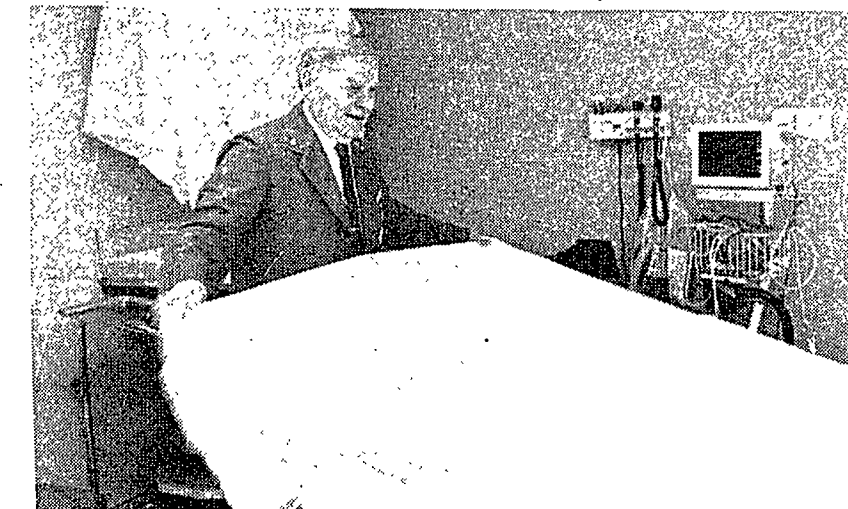

### Low interest rates spark north suburban real estate boom

Although local realtors hesitate to term it a boom, the upswing in sales in Niles and Morton Grove this spring is about 20 percent ahead of 1997 sales, and market conditions look like they can only get better.

Bill Alston of ERA Callero & Catino Realty, Inc., at 7800 Milwaukee Avenue in Niles said that the only thing preventing a really big boom market is the shortage of homes going up for sale. "People move here and they stay," he said, citing the location, transportation, shopping and police and fire protection as the major drawing cards of the Niles/Morton Grove area. The Trident Center and the Niles Free Bus are especially attractive to seniors, Alston said.

First time home buyers will be attracted to Niles when they learn that the village has resumed its participation in the Mortgage

Credit Program after a three-year gap.

Along with about 30 other suburbs, Niles will provide \$4 million at low interest rates to first time residential property buyers, Niles Finance Director George Van Geem said at a recent Village Board meeting.

Callero & Catino Realty is the busiest real estate firm in Niles, doing a whopping \$33 million in sales last year, according to Alston. He estimates his personal record over his 27-year career in real estate at around \$75 million in sales.

Alston credits the low interest rates, currently around 7 to 7.25 percent, and a good economy with spurring the increase in spring sales.

The interest rates last year were closer to 8 percent, according to Nick Marino of Century 21 Marino realtors, located at 5800

Dempster St. in Morton Grove for the past 26 years.

"We've always enjoyed a good market in the north suburban area, there's always been a good demand for this area," Marino said.

Marino said the low taxes and high quality municipal services offered in the Niles/Morton Grove area combine for "the best housing for your dollar."

"The Niles/Morton Grove area probably have the best services and the most reasonable tax rate of all towns in the area," Marino said. "You can't ask for better services [than those provided in Morton Grove]. The snow is plowed before you get out of bed in the morning," he added.

Marino also cited the "exceptional" availability of mortgage money with enhancing this year's market. There are also a great va-

## Home Style

### Don't forget that this year's leaves become next year's plant food

The more leaves your amaryllis plant grew last year, the more colorful blossoms it had or has this year. The time to start concentrating on growing those leaves is just as soon as the large, trumpet blooms begin to fade.

As long as the weather remains cold outdoors, keep your plant at a sunny window to nourish those leaves. Once warm weather settles in, move your plant to a slightly shaded location outdoors. Throughout summer, keep

the plant's soil moist and fertilize regularly.

Each year, your plant has to rest before it can flower again. In September, stop watering and fertilizing, and move your plant indoors to the basement or any other place that is cool and dry. Ignore the plant for two months.

A couple of months before you want flowers, bring the potted bulbs into a warm room. Light is unnecessary until the leaves appear, and they might appear before, after, or along with the flower stalks. Water to get growth started, then increase the amount as growth progresses.

If your plant needs to be repotted, do it right after blossoms fade - in late winter or early spring. Be careful not to damage the roots, though. True amaryllis bulbs often are sold rootless. These plants bloom beautifully their first season because the flower buds were preformed within the bulbs the previous season. But following

repot your amaryllis by teasing some of the old soil from among the roots, then set the bulb into a slightly larger pot. Because the bulb is prone to rotting, set only the bottom half in the soil, and use a potting soil that drains well. Bulbs can go for three or four years without repotting, just as

long as there is an inch or so of space between the bulb and the rim of the pot.

Instead of repotting your bulb, you could multiply it. Do this by first slicing right through the center of the bulb, from top to bottom, with a knife. Then cut each piece once again through the center, from top to bottom, so now you have four equal pieces. Pot up these pieces, keep them warm and moist, and each will grow into a whole new bulb, all bearing the exact same flower.

Seed is another way to multiply amaryllis. Pollinate the flowers with a small brush, alternately dabbing the ends of the dusty, yellow anthers and the three curled ends of the central stamens. The base of the flower will soon swell into a seed capsule. When the capsule is dry, remove the seeds and sow them. Seedlings bloom within a couple of years. ### Keep wooden decks looking like new by sealing them now

With the onslaught of powerful summer storms and scorching days upon us, don't neglect the one thing that's always hanging around out back - your deck!

"Now is the perfect time to seal your deck because of the summer's harshest weather conditions," said Niles Home Depot Paint Department Supervisor Ken Williams. "But it's also a great time to prepare your deck for fall and winter, which unbelievably, are right around the corner."

Easy Deck Maintenance  
The first step in sealing your deck is to make sure your deck is

in the best possible shape. Year-round extreme weather conditions in the Chicago region can wreak havoc on decks, drying out the wood and making it susceptible to water retention and rot.

"While a weathered deck can be restored to its original wood color with a deck brightening solution, you should replace loose nails with corrosion-resistant deck screws," said Williams. "You'll also want to smooth splintered boards before you apply a

preservative."

For a sturdier deck, drive the new screws into the joints to secure any loose decking. Use an orbital sander to smooth out any rough areas before applying finish to decking boards, railing or stairs. Make sure to vacuum the deck to get rid of any loose sawdust.

**Sealing the Deck**  
After the preparation work is complete, you are ready to begin sealing your deck. Apply a stain-

ing sealer to all wood, preferably using a pressure sprayer, followed by a paint brush to smooth out drip runs. Porous wood may require another coat or staining for even coverage.

Mix the deck-brightening solution as directed by the manufacturer. Apply the solution with a pressure sprayer and let set for 10 minutes. Scrub the deck thoroughly with a stiff scrub brush. Rinse deck, and if necessary, ap-

ply a second coat of brightener to extremely dirty or stained areas. Rinse and let dry. Apply a fresh coat sealer or stain. Avoid staining in direct sunlight, or if rain is forecast for the day.

"While repairing and sealing a deck might sound like a huge project, it can be done," said Williams. "Just take it one step at a time, and before you know it, your deck will look just like new." The Niles Home Depot is located at 901 Civic Center Plaza.

### Herbs can add history, romance to your home landscapes

About 13 years ago, the quaint, newly built, red-and-white country home was missing only one thing - its landscaping.

But its owners, Edward and Joanne Weaver, didn't want a manicured lawn, squared-off shrubs and neatly placed flowers. As a history buff, Joanne Weaver thought it only appropriate she landscape the entire yard with herbs.

Using about 150 to 200 varieties of herbs, the Weavers created Bend of the Bosque Herb Farm.

Their passion for the plants is apparent upon walking into their yard.

Bees buzz around a huge rosemary bush she used in place of a hedge beside the front porch. The large bush with its purple flowers serves as the focal point of the front yard. A nearby tree provides shade for several varieties of herbs, including soap wort.

A hodgepodge of roses, sages and mints adorn the yard's cedar-post fence line, while a bay tree serves as a conversation piece at

the other end of the house.

Some of Weaver's most interesting collections of herbs are found in several theme gardens. Weaver has a Biblical garden, featuring herbs mentioned in the Bible like wormwood, mint, garlic, chervil, onions and leeks. Her medicinal garden features motherwort, horehound, mullein, dill and pansies.

Her culinary garden includes sage, which she uses to season meat and vegetables.

Weaver triangled off another

section of her yard and deemed it her fairy garden.

Since there isn't much top soil where she lives, Weaver plants many of the herbs in raised beds, which are built up and filled with soil. Raised beds allow for good drainage, which herbs need. Mulch between the beds helps level the ground and insulate the plants.

To help with drainage, Waco resident Cindy McGregor uses sand and rocks around some of the herbs in her landscaping.

McGregor began growing herbs about 10 years ago after developing an allergic reaction to onion.

Herbs are one of the easiest plants to grow in Central Texas soil, which is very alkaline. Most herbs also are hardy plants that endure the area's winter weather.

Unlike Weaver who landscapes strictly with herbs, McGregor uses herbs to complement her landscaped yard.

Gardeners can use herbs in a landscape design in several ways, including mixing and matching with other plants and flowers and placing them in containers.

Most herbs need at least six full hours of sun, but in the summer heat, morning sun is better than a blazing afternoon sun, she said.

When landscaping with herbs, many people plant in squares, circles or lines. It's better to use odd numbers of plants for balance, McGregor said. If planting a longer bed, plant the larger plants in the back and graduate down to smaller ones in the front.

When mixing and matching herbs with other plants or flowers, like roses, McGregor advises using organic methods to avoid spraying pesticides, especially near herbs you plan to eat.

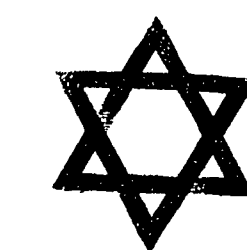

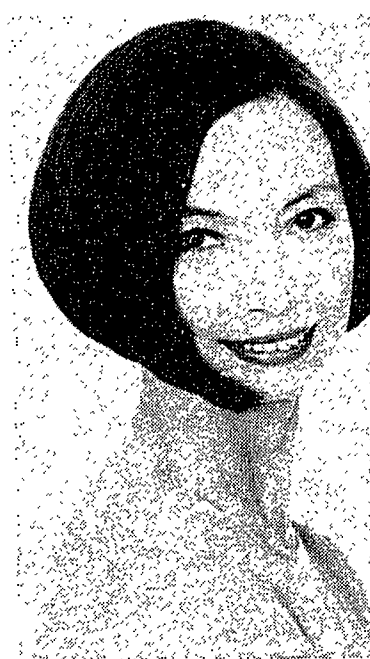

### A stalled car can lead to 'Road Rage'

Proposed Flood Elevation Determinations for the Villages of Morton Grove and Niles, Cook County, Illinois

AGENCY: Federal Emergency Management Agency  
ACTION: Proposed rule.

## SUMMARY:

Technical information or comments are solicited on the proposed modified base (1% annual chance) flood elevations shown in the preliminary Flood Insurance Studies and Flood Insurance Rate Maps for the communities listed in the table below. The base flood elevations are the basis for the floodplain management measures that each community is required to either adopt or show evidence of being already in effect in order to qualify or remain qualified for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

## DATES:

The period for comment will be ninety (90) days following the second publication of these proposed rules in a newspaper of local circulation.

## SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

The Federal Emergency Management Agency gives notice of the proposed determinations of base flood elevations, in accordance with Section 110 of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (Pub. L. 93-234), 37 Stat. 980, which added Section 1363 to the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 (Title XIII of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 (Pub. L. 90-448)), 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 44 CFR 67.4(a).

These elevations, together with the floodplain management measures required by Section 60.3 of the program regulations, are the minimum that are required. They should not be construed to mean the community must change any existing ordinances that are more stringent in their floodplain management requirements. The community may at any time enact stricter requirements on its own, or pursuant to policies established by other Federal, State, or regional entities. These proposed modified elevations will also be used to calculate the appropriate flood insurance premium rates for the new buildings and their contents and for the second year of insurance on existing buildings and their contents.

Pursuant to the provisions of 5 USC 605(b), the Administrator, to whom authority has been delegated by the Director, Federal

Emergency Management Agency, hereby certifies that the proposed modified flood elevation determinations, if promulgated, will not have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of small entities. A flood elevation determination under Section 1363 forms the basis for new local ordinances, which, if adopted by a local community, will govern future construction within the floodplain area. The elevation determinations, however, impose no restriction unless and until the local community voluntarily adopts floodplain ordinances in accordance with these elevations. Even if ordinances are adopted in compliance with Federal standards, the elevations prescribe how high to build in the floodplain and do not prohibit development. Thus, this action only forms the basis for future local actions. It imposes no new requirement; of itself it has no economic impact.

Lessees and owners of real property in the following communities, are encouraged to review the preliminary Flood Insurance Studies and Flood Insurance Rate Maps and to submit comments to the appropriate community representatives as listed below. Proposed base flood elevations along flood sources studied in detail are shown on the flood profiles in the study. The proposed modified base flood elevations are as follows:

Customer Choice and Rate Relief Act of 1997. This new law will reduce electric rates for consumers across the state and finally bring competition to Illinois' electric industry.

Under the law, rates for residential customers of Commonwealth Edison and Illinois Power, the state's largest and most expensive utilities, will be reduced by a total of 20 percent, 15 percent this August and an additional 5 percent cut in May 2002 -- the largest rate reduction anywhere in the nation. Residential customers of other utilities will see total savings of at least 5 percent off today's rates.

But that's not all. Along with ordering the largest rate cut in the nation, the legislation will open up Illinois' electric industry to competition, a change that should lower rates even further in years to come. And the bill includes tough consumer protections to safeguard ratepayers from the kinds of scams and hassles they've seen with the break up of the phone industry.

The new law provides real benefits for real people right away -- not just the vague promise of lower rates in the future. In fact, total savings for residential customers will approach \$6 billion by 2006. That's something all legislators who supported the bill can be proud of.

### March gas costs continue to be lower than last year

### Taxpayer Bill of Rights

In 1996, a second Taxpayer Bill of Rights increased the protection of taxpayer rights in complying with the tax laws and in dealing with the IRS. It also established the Office of the Taxpayer Advocate, which has broader authority to take any action permitted by law to help taxpayers who would otherwise suffer a significant hardship due to the way the IRS is administering the tax laws.

In any dealing with the IRS, people are entitled to fair treatment by IRS employees, privacy, representation and the right to appeal an IRS examiner's findings. If their problems are not solved through normal IRS channels, people can get special help through the Problem Resolution Program. Want more information? Call 1 (800) 829-3676 for Publication 1, Your Rights as a Taxpayer (or Spanish-language Publication 1SP, Derechos del Contribuyente).

Another taxpayer right has been strengthened as a result of the Taxpayer Browsing Protection Act. People have the right to confidentiality of their tax information. It is now a misdemeanor for employees and contractors of federal and state governments to willfully inspect another person's tax records without authorization. The IRS will notify any taxpayer whose records were illegally inspected when a person is criminally charged for the browsing.

other room and asked me if I'd tape a nine o'clock program on NPR's radio station, WBEZ. I opened a package of new audio tapes and after 15 minutes of negotiating with our well-worn audio recorder, I zeroed in on the radio program. I wasn't back to the Bulls' game for five minutes when I was asked to check for messages from our west coast kids. The telephone recorder had a red zero on its message box and I yelled back there were no phone calls. She then asked me to check the E-Mail. So, off with the Bulls and on with the computer. Switch On, computer button On, Arrow to ONline and push down on the key bar, type in my code to the message center, a welcome voice welcomes me and then it tells me "You have mail", and I key in on the mail box picture, down again on the bar but there's no new mail, only old mail.

So here I am, forty-five minutes later, clicking and clacking my way through a VCR, an audio tape recorder and a computer. I haven't seen Michael or Scottie and I haven't really seen much of anything except lit screens, digital numbers and momentarily, I thought I was part of Generation X. Well, I'm not from X and I don't pretend to be.

I'm as computer illiterate as most people of my generation. Until last week I'd never got involved with E-Mail. And getting on a Website was not even considered.

I watch my son maneuver

his way in and around a computer and I'm amazed at how easily he travels the byways of websites. He E-Mailed me how to get on the White House site and I sent Hillary a letter asking her to invite her former Maine East teacher, Paul Carlson, to the White House. A New York friend E-Mailed me the road which leads to newspapers and press services and magazines from all over the world. If I take advantage of it I'd become a news junkie chained to this computer.

My grandkids on the west coast and those here in Chicagoland are more computer literate than I ever will be. My two year old Oregon grandson can push the right buttons which leads him to children's programs and he's a baby boomer's baby.

There's no doubt we've moved into a new period in communications which is as revolutionary as the era when Edison, Marconi, the Wright Brothers and Henry Ford moved this country to new dimensions. My little Sunday night entrance into this new world was little more than a momentary blip in what's happening out there. My generation can get involved just as much as the boomers and their little boomers. We're a few switches away, a button or two behind the mid-life boomers. But it's not hard to catch up. The new millennium is just about 625 (or 991) days away and this may well be the entrance ticket into the 21st century.

least 24 blows to his head during the attack.

The struggle took place in Zagoren's 1997 Buick Park Avenue, which Donoe drove to Pleasant Prairie, Wis., striking Zagoren several times during the journey, according to testimony.

The accomplice, Rolando Zavala, followed in a car owned by Donoe's mother, authorities said.

Donoe finally left the still-breathing Zagoren in a pumpkin field drainage ditch, first robbing him of \$365.

Zavala has already pleaded guilty as a juvenile to being a par-

ty to first-degree intentional homicide and will serve at least a year in a Wisconsin juvenile facility.

Donoe, who was tried and convicted as an adult, could receive a life sentence for the dual charges of homicide and carjacking-leading-to-death. The minimum time he would have to serve in Wisconsin would be 13 years, according to authorities.

A Wisconsin state law, which has been in effect for four years, mandates that even if the accused is under 17, he or she must be tried as an adult when the charge is murder.

## Removing criminals from public office approved

The Illinois Senate has approved legislation sponsored by Assistant Senate Majority Leader Walter Dudyzy (R-7th, Chicago) to immediately remove public officials from office once they are convicted of a crime.

Senate Bill 1225 sets the time upon which the office becomes vacant at the date of the return of a guilty verdict, or, in the case of a trial by the court, the entry of a finding of guilt. The law currently requires the office to be vacated when the official is sentenced.

"City of Chicago officials asked for this legislation to address cases like the alderman who was convicted of a crime in 1997 but would not immediately vacate his seat. The city could not force him to leave because the law does not require the office to be vacated until the official is sentenced," Dudyzy said. "Because court appeals can drag on and delay sentencing, it could be that these convicted criminals, in their role as public officials, will be making important decisions and receiving taxpayer dollars through the public payroll."

Dudyzy says Senate Bill 1225 will affect all elected officeholders in the judicial, legislative and executive branches of city, county and state government.

Senate Bill 1225 now moves to the House of Representatives for further consideration.

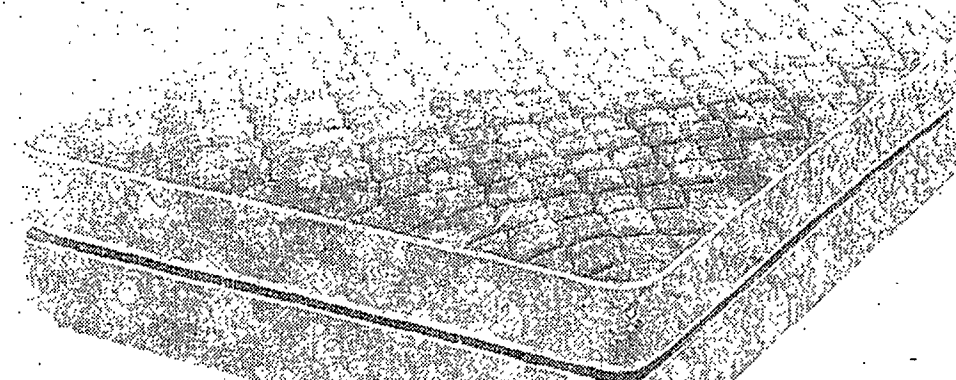
