

## District 63 teachers set to strike next week

A teachers strike in the East Maine Elementary District 63 may be less than 10 days away.

Teachers filed papers Monday that will pave the way for an early October strike, according to Tom Dailey, head of the East Maine Education Association. The teachers group is required to give 10 days' notice before striking.

Despite some progress made Sept. 23 when school board and union representatives met with a federal mediator, the two groups were not able to come to a formal compromise.

At the Wednesday, Sept. 23, evening meeting, the district offered a less than 1 percent increase in first-year salaries, while the union agreed to a shorter contract. However, the offers of both sides were only informal and in any event leave the warring factions still far apart in the negotiations, according to Robert Riley, an attorney and spokesperson for District 63.

Despite numerous phone calls, neither Riley nor Supt. Robert

Varga was available at press time Tuesday morning for comment on any developments at the meeting held Monday evening, Sept.

28. Another meeting is scheduled for Thursday, Oct. 1.

The 235-member teachers union is set to strike on Thursday, Oct. 1.

### Republican Herb Sohn says 'Enough is Enough': calls for an end to the Starr investigation

Dr. Herb Sohn, the Republican candidate for Illinois' 9th Congressional District, lashed out at the continuing investigation into President Clinton, calling "an end to the insanity."

Sohn continued to condemn the President's own conduct as "deplorable, outrageous, and disrespectful to the American people and to women everywhere." But he went on to argue that Independent Counsel Kenneth Starr's 4-year, \$40 million investigation is only doing further harm to the nation as a whole.

"Now that we've seen the President's videotaped testimony, it's

time for all of us to take a collective deep breath and look at exactly where this entire episode has gotten us," Sohn said. "Instead of focusing on real problems like improving health care and saving Social Security, Washington is wasting taxpayer time and money dragging us all through the mud. Enough is enough."

Sohn, a prominent Chicago physician, noted that instead of spending \$40 million on the Starr investigation, the nation would have been far better served spending the money on medical research to find a cure for cancer. And he likened the on-going in-

vestigation to the excesses many physicians must endure when faced with unsubstantiated malpractice lawsuits.

"Such endless investigations, with their 'scorched earth' tactics, do little to serve the larger cause of Justice," Sohn says. "Instead, they rack up legal bills, ruin lives and force the cost of medical insurance to skyrocket for all Americans."

Sohn is facing Democrat State Representative Jan Schakowsky of Evanston in the race to succeed retiring Congressman Sidney Yates. Sohn is a former Republican nominee for Congress in the 9th Congressional District and is a former Republican candidate for Mayor of Chicago.

### Murphy challenges Butler to debates

Laura Murphy, candidate for State Senate in the 28th District, has challenged her opponent, State Senator Martin Butler, to a series of three debates in the remaining weeks before the November 3rd election.

"This is a valuable forum for the voters to see and hear the candidates and their views on the issues," Murphy said.

"I hope Senator Butler will re-

spond positively to my challenge," she added. "I am sure that it would also be possible to turn one of our already planned forums into a televised debate, if the Senator will agree."

Murphy said she would be open to televised debates on the local cable stations with a town meeting format where citizens would be able to ask questions about key concerns and issues.

### McCormack challenges incumbent to four debates

Michael McCormack, Democratic candidate for State Senator in the 7th District, challenged incumbent Senator Walter Dudydz to four televised debates on cable television in the months of September and October. The debates would be in a town meeting format with residents able to ask questions of candidates about their key concerns.

A debate would require Dudydz to answer questions such as why he and Senate President "Pete" Philip helped block HMO reform, property tax relief, and legislation to reduce youth smoking. As a member of Senate leadership and the Rules Committee, Dudydz played a key role in blocking reform in all of these areas.

If Dudydz fails to agree to the debate challenge, McCormack said he would instead make these events town meetings where residents get a chance to voice their concerns on the most pressing local issues.

McCormack, a Chicago firefighter who lives in North Edgebrook, wrote a letter to Dudydz asking him to respond by the end of August to the debate challenge. He said in the letter that he will work with local cable television suppliers to make sure the debates are broadcast in the district. Also, McCormack said residents would be invited to attend to ask questions in a Town Meeting format.

### Court victory protects traffic safety system

Secretary of State George H. Ryan applauded a court decision that forces five Chicago suburbs to stop undermining state highway traffic safety efforts by issuing municipal traffic tickets that are not recorded on an offender's state driving record.

In the ruling, Cook County Circuit Court Judge Thomas P. Durkin found that the five communities - Schaumburg, Northfield, Kenilworth, Hanover Park and McCook - were illegally operating alternative-traffic enforcement programs created by local ordinance and illegally issuing their own traffic tickets, which are commonly referred to as "compliance tickets," "administrative tickets," or "P-Tickets."

As ordinance violations, these offenses were not reported to Ryan's office, allowing offenders to bypass a state record system that requires mandatory fines and drivers license suspensions for serious or habitual offenders.

"I am very pleased with this ruling. This means motorists who break traffic laws in certain communities will not escape our attention simply because they pay a fine to the municipality," Ryan said. "If we're going to make the roads safer, we have to have an accurate record of who is breaking the law and who is not, and those drivers who are breaking the law should pay the consequences."

Ryan said the use of P-tickets was letting untold numbers of habitual offenders stay on the road because no record of a P-ticket offense was forwarded to the secretary of state's office. Those violations included moving violations and serious offenses, like school

bus drivers who ignored railroad crossing gates.

Ryan said he has been particularly concerned by the ticketing practices in Schaumburg and Northfield. The ordinances in both communities allowed tickets for nearly 80 offenses covered by the state's vehicle code, including the illegal transportation of alcohol, attempting to beat an oncoming train and failure to bring a school bus to a full stop at a railroad crossing.

Under state law, the illegal transportation of alcohol could carry a drivers license suspension. For less serious traffic offenses, P-tickets may have helped some drivers escape the automatic loss of their drivers licenses, a punishment triggered when a motorist over age 21 receives three moving violations in one 12-month period.

The Kenilworth ordinance allows local tickets for 31 violations found in the state vehicle code, including speeding more than 25 miles-per-hour above the posted limit. McCook allows P-tickets for only six state violations - lesser speeding and equipment violations - while Hanover Park allows P-tickets for lesser offenses, such as speeding up to 12 miles-per-hour over the posted limit.

Ryan said he sympathizes with the reluctance of municipalities to eliminate P-tickets, which can be a key revenue source. However, by failing to write traffic offenses under the Illinois Vehicle Code, the communities were draining revenue away from state and local governments that collect a portion of those fines. Ryan's office does not receive revenue from traffic tickets.

### Weatherizing and insulating the home can go a long way to save energy and money

The coming of fall signals the start-up of heat pumps, furnaces and space heaters. While it's important to do a checkup to make sure everything is in working order, it also is a good time to take a look around to make sure energy isn't being wasted in your home.

Weatherizing and insulating your house has many benefits and can be a big money saver. Studies show that heating and cooling costs account for more than half of the total energy bill, including those in homes with average insulation.

A well-insulated home is easier on the pocketbook. At the same time it is gentler on the environment because it saves energy and therefore cuts down on pollution and the depletion of natural resources. In an average home in a cold climate, it is estimated reducing energy usage by only 15 percent can save the equivalent of 500 pounds of coal each year.

Also, a tightly sealed, well-insulated house can eliminate

cold spots and drafts and make for a more comfortable home.

#### Do It Yourself

In making your own energy audit, first check for drafts around windows and doors by holding a lit match up to gaps in the door or window on a windy day, recommends Debbie Rambo, of The Home Depot. The flame will move or blow out, then hold the smoldering match to the area and see how the draft affects the smoke. If it flutters, the weather stripping is inadequate and should be replaced or upgraded.

Next, measure the temperature in different parts of the room. If it fluctuates more than one or two degrees, that room is poorly sealed or air movement inside the house is restricted. Correct this by updating the weatherstripping around doors and windows, and measure the temperatures again. If the variations still exist, you may have an air flow problem with your heating system. Check

with your public utility company to see if they can provide you with information about air flow problems and how to correct them.

Take a look at your weatherstripping and insulation. Is it beginning to deteriorate? Is it crumbling? Has it hardened or is it torn? Most weatherstripping products will last only a few years so expect this to be a seasonal job. Caulking even the tiniest of spaces between the home's siding and exterior elements will go a long way to keep warm inside. Seal around vents, wood framing, cables, faucets and electrical outlets -- anything that could create a possible air leak.

Look for condensation, frost or ice buildup on storm windows or the outside surface of interior windows. Condensation indicates that moist, warm air is escaping, and that the seal between the interior window and the storm window needs to be caulked.

You may also want to conduct an energy audit on your home with the help of your local utility company. Most power companies will provide either an energy audit kit, or conduct the audit for you -- sometimes free of charge. The audit will help you identify any energy loss areas, and recommend solutions.

**Winterize Your Home**

- Make sure the attic and basement are properly insulated and use rubber compression strips to seal the channels of patio door jams.
- Caulk around dryer and exhaust vents and seal between baseboards and floorboards.

### TimeSmart Ask Carolyn

Q. Does it matter how old ice is? Does it lose its freshness? Notice an odd taste sometimes.

A. Cold surfaces, such as ice, absorb odor compounds faster than warm surfaces. However, there are some things you can watch for to lessen the incidence of odor in your ice cubes. Empty the bin once a week and wash the bin with soap and water. Remember, air circulates between the refrigerator and freezer, so wrap foods like garlicky pizza to prevent food odors from settling into ice cubes. Be sure that the ice is made with good quality water...you might need an in-line water filter to give you better tasting ice.

### Diversity works at Lincoln Ridge in Skokie

Diversity is working at Lincoln Ridge, Robin Construction Corp.'s master-planned residential community in north suburban Skokie.

The carefully planned decision to combine two distinct housing types -- traditional condominiums and carriage homes -- is meeting marketing expectations with amazing accuracy.

"The one common denominator of the two housing types is a maintenance-free lifestyle," explains President Richard Robin.

"What we wanted to achieve at Lincoln Ridge was a unique look that enhances the neighborhood and attracts buyers, something that would require us to find the right balance of aesthetics and economics."

The unique development plan was engineered with the assistance of marketing consultant Tracy Cross & Associates, which advised Robin that such a combination would be feasible. Translating a promising "game plan" into a specific design format was another matter.

Robin and his staff consulted Doug Buster, a principal of the architectural and land planning firm, Bloodgood Sharp & Buster, to find a formula to produce the two different but compatible housing types. The architectural firm of Andrian-Zemendes designed the two six-story mid-rise condominium buildings.

Buster and his staff devised 15 land plans before the final design was settled for the \$40 million, nine-acre complex at 7447 N. Skokie Blvd., just south of the intersection at Lincoln Avenue.

"From a sales perspective, the combination is working out terrifically," says Cynthia Lee, sales director.

"We have sold 75 percent of

the first phase with the same ratio of condos to carriage homes there as is planned for the entire development. That's a pretty remarkable balance and certainly speaks well of the game plan in terms of market acceptance of the two housing styles," added Lee.

When completed, Lincoln Ridge will have 60 one-, two- and three-bedroom residences in each of two six-story masonry condominium buildings and 68 carriage homes built in clusters of 17 buildings. The carriage homes are designed in the style of single-family homes, with four two- and three-bedroom, single-level residences in each carriage home building.

Condominium homes, priced from \$152,400 to \$229,900, will contain from approximately 976 square feet in the one-bedroom, one-bath units to approximately 1,724 square feet for the larger three-bedroom, two-bath designs. One-bedroom-plus-den, 1-1/2-bath plans have 1,228 square feet with balcony while two-bedroom homes will have one, 1-1/2 or two baths and range from approximately 1,171 to 1,455 square feet. (Prices and availability are subject to change without notice.)

Each residence will have a balcony with sliding doors and

screens.

Kitchens include a cozy breakfast area, a full-size pantry in most residences, designer European-style cabinetry and no-wax vinyl flooring. White General Electric appliances include frost-free refrigerators with icemakers, built-in dishwashers, continuous-clean gas ranges and waste disposers. Corner units have a window above the sink for natural light.

Each condominium residence has a spacious laundry. Standards include plush carpeting in living areas, individually controlled heating and air conditioning, lever-handle door hardware and a large walk-in closet. Ceiling heights in all living areas of the condominiums are 8 feet 4 inches high, adding wall space and heightening the experience for volume.

Each residence is sprinklered, as are all public areas, and each building has an intercom security system with a TV camera in the lobby.

Every condominium owner will have one heated indoor parking space and an individual storage locker adjacent to the parking space.

Carriage homes, priced from \$246,900 to \$289,900, have similar interior appointments, including bathrooms with European-style vanity cabinets, cultured marble vanity tops with two integral bowls, full-width vanity mirrors, theatrical lighting and ceramic tile floors.

Two-bedroom, two-bath carriage homes have approximately 1,647 square feet, including the patio, while the three-bedroom, two-bath plans have 1,885 square feet, including a deck.

Lincoln Ridge is situated just two blocks from the Touhy Avenue entry to the Edens Expressway (U.S. Highway 94).

Condominium and carriage home owners will have separate homeowner associations in addition to a master association that will be responsible for exterior maintenance such as landscaping and lawn care and snow removal, as well as the upkeep of common areas.




### Tips to help plants make it through winter

Winter's on the way and it's wise to know what actions you should take to ensure plant survival. Keep your winter worries to a minimum with this handy clip-and-save list from the American Nursery & Landscape Association (ANLA).

**Outdoor Plants**  
Make sure plants are healthy going into winter. Some varieties benefit from one last feeding. Consult a nursery professional to determine which plants in your landscape need this type of attention.

Check for pests. Many insects like aphids and lacewings feed until the first hard freeze. Pest infestations can force plants into an early dormancy that decreases winter survival.

Mulching protects roots and conserves moisture. One to two inches of bark, or three inches of pine straw or leaves under the canopy of a plant protect it from sudden changes in temperature and soil moisture.

Continue watering if necessary. Outdoor plants need water, even when they aren't actively growing. Periods of extended drought make plants more susceptible to cold injury. Watering up to one inch per week is recommended during dry months (before the ground freezes) with no

snowfall. Avoid pruning within six weeks of the average first frost date. Late fall pruning can result in new growth that does not have time to harden off before winter.

Provide extra protection during hard freezes. Cover your most cold-sensitive shrubs with old blankets. If you use plastic, don't let it touch leaves -- it conducts cold that can harm extremities. Take a wait-and-see approach with plants that seem to have died from a freeze. They may return to life in spring. If so, prune any dead tips or branches back to just above the new growth.

**Container Plants**  
Again, make sure plants are healthy going into winter. Check for pests and treat if necessary.

Reduce the frequency and strength of fertilization during winter for plants that are not actively growing. Water-soluble or slow-release fertilizers are preferable.

The heating systems in most homes tend to decrease humidity levels. Supplemental mistings or changing the location of plants can improve health. Most plants tolerate a few months of lower light levels while over-wintering. But do check plants occasionally -- look for symptoms of light deprivation. These include yellowing

or pale foliage, drooping or drooping leaves, and leggy growths. If necessary, move to an area with higher light levels or supplement with grow lights.

Take it easy when reintroducing plants to the great outdoors. Sunburn of foliage commonly occurs when plants are brought into intense light too quickly. After all danger of frost has passed, acclimate overwintered plants gradually. Give them a few days in an intermediate zone, like a covered porch or under a tree canopy, before moving into full sun.

Spring is a good time to see if plants are potbound. Are plants wilting, do they have poor color, are leaves dropping? Lay the pot on its side and gently tap it out of its pot. Are the roots crowded, or even growing through drainage holes? If so, it's time to repot. Your garden center is a great source of colorful and practical containers, as well as potting soil mixes and fertilizers. Those items, and these overwintering suggestions, are about all your plant needs to look great going into spring.

Dist. 219 Board okays  
budget but fears for future

Despite the specter of a budget deficit looming in the near future, the Niles Township High School District 219 has approved the proposed \$72 million budget.

That figure reflects a reduction in spending achieved after much effort by district officials to trim expenses for the school year just begun last month.

Approval came after three public hearings were held beginning last August. No residents attended any of the meetings, officials said.

The 1998-99 budget was approved 4-1 with one abstention by member Leon Finkel who was attending his first meeting. The lone opposing vote came from board member Joe Weiss who has perennially taken issue with the teacher and administrative salaries paid by the district.

Board President Robert Silverman termed the budget responsible and in sync with the freeze on per-pupil spending. Salaries are based on the teacher contract, which the district has an obligation to fulfill, Silverman said.

Silverman said that approval for the budget came only after the board had carefully scrutinized each dollar. The budget will provide district students with what Silverman termed the best education possible.

The budget includes an increase of 11.3 percent over the previous year's budget. The deficit between the new budget and projected revenue is expected to be just under \$5 million, officials said.

The deficit in the education fund alone doubled since last year. Expenses have increased by ten percent or about \$6 million to a projected \$50.6 million. Revenue, however, is expected to be in the neighborhood of just \$46 million, an increase of only \$4 million over last year's revenues.

Officials attribute the education fund increases mainly to salaries and other benefits.

Areas where cuts were made

include about \$100,000 from legal expenses, which have been reduced to \$285,000 in the new budget. Supt. Griff Powell said he is hopeful legal fees may be reduced even further in the near future.

The transportation fund was reduced by \$400,000, while the faculty travel expense budget was lowered by \$75,000.

A very serious problem facing the district is the anticipation of increasing enrollment, which will make it imperative for the district to build more facilities to accommodate the larger number of students.

Newly appointed District Superintendent Dr. Griff E. Powell, 52, was undismayed by the financial condition of the district following the audit review read at the Sept. 14 meeting of the board of education. Powell quoted the auditor who, he said, pronounced the district "in sound financial condition."

Nonetheless, Powell said he is anxious to "involve the board more intensively and extensively in building and developing the district budget."

Powell said he thought the board did not feel that the budget was "as much their budget as they would have wanted it to be." He said it was his intention to have the board feel more comfortable with the budget and to feel that it is actually their budget. The previous superintendent, Dr. Vickie Markavich and the former business manager were more responsible for this year's budget than the board of education, Powell said.

However, new personnel, including a new accountant and a new purchasing agent, should bring a big change to the business office of the district, Powell said.

"We've brought in new people to help make a smooth transition in the business office," he added.

As far as Powell's own transition into his new position, he said he is "settling in slowly but surely." In addition to meeting many

new people, Powell said he is renewing many acquaintances with people he knew and worked with when taught math at Niles North High School beginning in 1969 and later served as dean of students at Niles West High School for four years and assistant principal at Niles North for another four years. He left the district in 219 to serve as principal and superintendent in several other districts, including the Ramapo Central School District in New York, his latest assignment from 1992 to 1997.

Powell said he was glad to be able to attend the retirement party of Harriet Richmond who had been his secretary from 1974 to 1978 "when I was Director of Instruction in social studies, art, music and the Learning Materials Center," Powell said. He credited Richmond with being an excellent secretary.

Murphy backs  
HMO reform

Patients would be given the right to sue their health maintenance organization under a proposal announced by Laura Murphy, Illinois State Senate candidate in the 28th District.

"The system needs equal accountability. Why should Health Maintenance Organization (HMOs) be exempt from responsibility for patient care when their decisions are dictating the care or treatment a patient receives?" said Illinois State Senate Candidate Laura Murphy (D-28).

Murphy, who is a health care practice administrator, said until reforms which promote accountability take place in the HMO system, "patients should be given the right to sue" Murphy's proposal would also set up a panel to weed out frivolous lawsuits.

"With the move toward managed care in the past 10 years, we have seen health care decisions made by insurance companies that have boggled the mind. New

mothers and babies sent home from the hospital within 24 hours after birth, women who have had mastectomy surgery sent home within 24 hours after surgery," Murphy said.

"We now have laws protecting patients in those procedures and leaving the decision to the doctor...but in both of these situations, the HMO could not have been held accountable. If a patient had suffered permanent injury as a result of being sent home too soon, the doctor would have been held accountable, the hospital would have been held accountable, but not the HMO," Murphy said.

Murphy's proposal would give patients the right to sue their HMOs, and it would also establish a panel consisting of health care professionals, consumers, representatives of the Illinois Department of Insurance and the Insurance Industry to weed out frivolous suits.



ion is scheduled to meet Oct. 6, a few days before a strike could legally begin.

The teachers are seeking a 5-year contract that includes a 7.6 percent pay increase the first year and a 6 percent contribution to the Illinois Teachers' Retirement System.

The board proposed a contract providing 3.8 percent, 3.75 percent and 3.7 percent pay increases over the next three years.

District 63 teacher salaries range from \$29,000 to \$62,000, according to Dailey. Average pay is \$46,000 according to the district, but only \$40,000 according to the union.

The last teachers strike in the district lasted 10 days in 1991. In the present dispute, union officials contend that the district has surplus funds that should be used to increase teachers' salaries, while district officials counter that the funds are account balances that must be maintained.

the Cook County Commission on Human Rights against the Village of Morton Grove and the owners and managers of the motel. The John Marshall Law School Fair Housing Clinic, directed by F. Willis Caruso and Kit Mahlman, is providing legal representation to the tenants and IHCNS.

The August action was a race against time. Morton Grove gave tenants notice to move by August 31. The Village plans to replace the Admiral with a Walgreens as part of its Waukegan Road Redevelopment Plan, funded through a Tax Increment Financing (TIF) district.

The complaints allege that Morton Grove discriminated in targeting the Admiral Oasis and that such action has a disparate, and therefore unfair, effect on the minority population of Morton Grove. The complaint also cites discrimination against other protected classes: older persons, disability, national origin, and parental status. IHCNS also alleges that the Village's actions are contrary to its assurance to the County, as a recipient of Community Development Block grant funds through the County, to affirmatively further fair housing.

The tenants are retirees, veterans, children, and working people; they are members of all races; they need the affordable housing the motel provided. Some lived there for several weeks, others for up to 30 years. The motel had over 160 rooms.
