

Chicago's first freezes have ranged from September 22, 1995 to November 24, 1931. This year's first freeze at O'Hare Airport occurred October 28. Dist. 63 seeks funding for Gemini addition

With enrollment projections topping 900 during the next four school years, current overcrowding at Gemini Junior High School is forcing district officials to plan a third building expansion.

Expansion of Gemini, which was enlarged twice before in 1962 and 1965, will be part of the redistricting plan approved by the Dist. 63 board of education, which also includes the reopening of the Stevenson School at the start of the next school year.

City Council members of both Des Plaines and Park Ridge have agreed to present a united front in opposing expansion at O'Hare Airport, including the planned addition of several new runways.

Officials representing both communities have agreed that neither will join the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission, despite indications from Des Plaines officials and the late Mayor Paul Jung endorsing membership in the commission, which is funded by Chicago. The

Found guilty, jailed in Alabama for molesting teen;
Coached Maine South to 1979 Illinois championship

Former Maine basketball coach jailed in sex case

Quitman Sullins, 64, a physical education teacher and coach at Maine South High School from 1968 to June 1990, who coached the 1979 state champion basketball team, has been imprisoned in Red Bay, Ala., after being convicted of sexual misconduct charges.

Sullins pleaded guilty Oct. 20 to charges of assault and distribution of obscene material to a mi-

nor lodged against him last July 5 after a 16-year-old student at the alternative school where Sullins has taught for the past six years reported that Sullins sexually assaulted him in an office of the school.

Sullins was sentenced to 12 months on each charge, but his sentences were split so that he will serve two consecutive 30-day prison sentences and two years probation.

Sullins will also be required to submit to a psychiatric examination by an expert in sex offenders, complete all recommended treatment, resign from his teaching position and agree not to teach children in any capacity, according to Franklin County officials.

No similar incidents occurred while Sullins was coaching at the Park Ridge high school, according to Park Ridge Police Chief Robert Colangelo.

The words integrity, character, and intelligence were mentioned again and again as various attendees stepped forward to participate in a "roast" recalling humorous incidents, but always ending on affectionate notes of admiration. Chief Ray Giovannelli emceed the event. Other distinguished guests included Village Manager Abe Selman, who said, "The village is a much better place because you've come through here." Police and Fire Commissioner Sam Bruno presented Reid with a resolution from the City Council praising his long service to Niles. Mayor Nicholas B. Blase also praised Reid's career quipping, "You've been a policeman here longer than I've been Mayor!"

Former classmates participated in reburial of Indian war cavalry trooper

The date of Nov. 11, took on an additional patriotic meaning for two former classmates of St. Thecla School in Norwood Park. Current Berwyn resident Tom Day and Norwood Park resident and author Stan "Tex" Banash played major roles in the military reburial service of Pvt. Michael Keegan, a Civil War veteran and later member of Lt. Col. George Armstrong Custer's 7th Cavalry, at 11 a.m., on Nov. 11, at the Fort Sheridan Cemetery, near Highland Park. The public was invited to attend.


Day, who commands the Mariners Black Sheep Squadron Color Guard and serves as Sgt. Major of the Volunteer 7th Cavalry, coordinated the event from the armory to the burial site which included a funeral march led by the Emerald Society Color Guard and Pipes and Drums, the Color Guard of the 7th Cavalry of Fort Hood Texas, the Color Guard of VFW Post 2202, and Col. Joe Day Ventura Scout Crew 777 carrying Civil War and Cavalry unit flags. At the site, a speech was delivered by Maj. Gen. George H. Thomas (re-enactor), Commander of the

Army of the Cumberland, a poem read by President Abraham Lincoln (re-enactor), viewing of the casket by participating units, last rites administered by Bishop James Wilkowski, folding and presentation of the flag to the Consulate General of Ireland, presentation of a certificate from President Bill Clinton, and delivery of a check for \$55 to Sheldon Funeral Home as payment of the bill the U.S. Government would not pay 99 years ago. The ceremony concluded with firing of a cannon salute, playing of taps with echo and placing of Veteran's Day wreaths.

Banash, who serves as sheriff of the Westerners - Chicago Corral, represented the Old West, and was positioned at the head of the casket to guide pallbearers. He described his participation in this event as being akin to attending the 100th anniversary of the Massacre at Wounded Knee (last Indian War battle), in South Dakota, on Dec. 29, 1890 where he also represented the celebrated author, Dee Brown.

Sheriff's Police add video cameras to squad cars

Cook County Sheriff Michael F. Sheahan announced that his department has begun outfitting squad cars with state-of-the-art video equipment that will enable officers to record traffic stops and other police activities.

The cameras are being utilized as part of a pilot program that will test their effectiveness during street operations. If the program is successful, Sheahan plans to expand the use of cameras in street patrol vehicles over the next two years. If the program is expanded, Sheriff's Officials will work to secure grant funding to purchase 50 to 75 additional cameras.

Sheahan noted that videotape shot during a traffic stop can serve as important evidence during court proceedings, particularly in cases involving D.U.I. arrests when the camera can record field sobriety tests that are administered to drunk driving suspects. Additionally, the video camera can provide visual evidence for internal affairs investigations in cases of alleged police brutality and can be used to disprove false claims of police misconduct by motorists.

The video camera program is

one of several high-tech initiatives recently employed to improve and enhance operations within the Sheriff's Police Department. This month, Sheriff's Police acquired a state-of-the-art mobile command bus that can be used as an emergency communications center during natural disasters, hostage situations, roadside safety checks and other special police operations.

The new command bus is a multipurpose vehicle equipped with state-of-the-art electronics and communications equipment that will enable authorities to coordinate multi-agency responses directly at the site of emergencies and disasters.

The 35-foot vehicle has 22 radio frequencies, 12 telephone and cellular phone lines, two mobile data terminals used for obtaining relevant police information, three laptop computers, a portable breathalyzer, camcorder, fax machine, copier and printer. The vehicle, which cost \$286,500, was purchased at no cost to taxpayers using asset forfeiture funds obtained by police during narcotics arrests and investigations.

Other new technical improve-

ments and equipment currently being used by the Sheriff's Police include:

Smart Trailer -- a traffic control device that is deployed to traffic "hot spots" and accident-prone intersections to inform passing drivers of their speed and compile data on traffic patterns and average rates of speed. The Smart Trailer, which cost \$13,600, has been used extensively along LaGrange Road in the southwest suburbs, a highly traveled county highway that has had numerous accidents in recent years. Sheriff's Police officers have written more than 19,000 tickets on LaGrange Road since December of 1995. The Smart Trailer is often used near schools to remind motorists to watch their speed. Sheriff's officials, who plan to acquire a second Smart Trailer by year's end, also make the trailer available for use to other suburban police departments.

Front and Rear Radar -- This technology is improved over regular radar devices because it allows officers to clock travel times of other cars in front or behind the squad car in a 360-degree radius. In addition, the radar can be used while the officer is parked or while driving, unlike traditional hand-held radar devices. Two unmarked Sheriff's patrol cars are currently equipped with Front and Rear Radar and two additional units have been ordered and will be in use this Fall. The radar is being used in areas where police are seeing increased incidents of speeding, accidents or cases of road rage.



What parents can do to help their early reader

As the L.D. teacher and educational specialist at St. John Brebeuf School, I am often asked by parents of young children what they can do to help insure reading success. Parents are familiar with the suggestion to read to their child but there are more specific things they can do.

In early childhood preschool through grade 1, phonemic and

phonological awareness is very important. Simply put - it has to do with sounds in language not letter names. When a child knows CAT and HAT sound alike or rhyme - that is phonological awareness. This awareness can happen long before letter names are learned. Children used to learn and memorize nursery rhymes and Mother Goose Rhymes. When they learned Jack and Jill went up a hill and realized Jill and Hill sound the same, that is phonological awareness.

Phonemic and phonological awareness are terms used by researchers who study early literacy development and reading disability. These studies have shown the acquisition of phonemic and phonological awareness is highly predictive of success in learning to read. Awareness of speech sounds is not always an easy task for young children. Parents can help young children by providing an environment that encourages play with and enjoyment of language. Specifics include, nursery rhymes, riddles, songs, poems and read aloud books which emphasize the sounds of language. Specific titles are:

These books usually become favorites of children and should be read not just once but many times. By doing this you will help your young child build the necessary basic skills for beginning reading.





LIHEAP can help families pay heating bills

In many Illinois households, families are under severe and continuing stress as they try to stretch limited budgets to meet their needs. Cold weather can add to the burden as heating bills increase.

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is designed to help eligible low-income households pay for energy services. The amount of the assistance is determined by income, household size, fuel type and geographic location.

LIHEAP is administered by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs

(DCCA). Nicor Gas is working with DCCA to spread the word that help is available for households experiencing difficulties paying energy bills.

LIHEAP assistance is provided to households with incomes that do not exceed 125 percent of the federal poverty guidelines. Do You Need a New Roof? How to Make that Decision...

If your home is nearly 20 years old, or it's been a good two decades since it was last shingled, chances are you may need a new roof.

Autumn is a good time to inspect closely and evaluate the condition of your roof. If the roof has deteriorated significantly, you'll have enough time to get your home re-roofed before winter weather arrives.

The Asphalt Roofing Manufacturers Association (ARMA) suggests that consumers look for the following aging/deterioration signs in trying to determine if they need a new roof.

Using binoculars, walk around the outside of the house and look for cracked severely curled or broken shingles. Never walk on a roof; it can be dangerous and may damage the shingles.

Check gutters and downspouts for excessive accumulation of the mineral granules that coat the shingles. (It is normal for shingles to lose some of their granules, as an excess amount is applied during shingle manufacture.) These granules provide important weather resistance to your roof. Noticeable loss of granules usually signifies roof aging or deterioration.

Using a flashlight, inspect your attic space, looking carefully at the underside of the roof deck and rafters for stains or wet spots; both can be signs of leakage.

If you decide it's probably time to re-roof, you'll quickly discover there's a wide variety of products and options available in today's asphalt shingles. According to ARMA, four out of five homes in the United States have asphalt shingles.

For the most part, asphalt shingles remain the number one choice of homeowners because they offer the broadest array of colors, shapes and textures to match most architectural styles at the most affordable price. In addition, asphalt shingles offer a long

life expectancy and low maintenance requirements.

For roofing professionals, asphalt shingles are often preferred because they offer good performance in all types of temperatures and are considered the easiest to apply of the standard roofing materials.

In addition, asphalt shingles are available in a variety of classifications that meet specific fire, wind and hail resistance testing standards. For example, all shingles carry a Class A, B or C fire rating, with Class A providing the highest fire resistance. These fire ratings are defined by nationally recognized standards and tested by independent testing agencies. In addition, many asphalt shingles carry a "wind resistant" label indicating that they've been tested to meet specific high-wind criteria.

Once you decide on the type of roof you're interested in, then color and style questions loom large. ARMA experts recommend that you consider the following basics when trying to decide on a roofing style and color.

The color of your roof should harmonize with the color of your home's exterior walls. For example, if you have light gray siding and white trim, choose a roof color in the gray family and avoid brown shades.

Stay in keeping with the neighborhood. You'll be happier with a roof that blends into the background rather than one that differs noticeably from the surrounding homes.

If you want your home to blend in with the natural environment, pick a roof color that blends together varying shades of browns, grays or greens.

A small home may be given added dimension with a light-colored roof to direct the eye upward and create a sense of airiness.

Dark roof colors on tall homes or steeply-sloped roofs will help to recede the roofline visually and seemingly reduce

the structure's scale.

Airoom exec says media room trend is here to stay

You and your family are all set to watch a great new flick. You've got your popcorn, the lights go down and you settle back for some real entertainment. Question: where are you, the local movie palace or your own home media room? More and more often, the answer is at home.

"The media room trend has been building since the beginning of the '90s," said Seymour Turner, general manager of Airoom Architects and Builders, the leading home addition and design/build firm in the Chicago area. "We attribute it to several things. The two-income family, where Mom and Dad both work, played a big part. When parents come home in the evening, they want to stay there and enjoy time with their children. Second, the explosion of cable TV and other electronic technology like satellite dishes, advancements in audio and visual components, projection TVs, surround sound and more affordable speaker components. This meant a huge variety of things to watch and hear and better equipment to enjoy it on," he said. "So, why not a special place where all this equipment can be enjoyed by the whole family? In many instances," Turner said, "the family

room has become the media room."

In the last two years, Airoom has built 30 media rooms a year, either as new additions or remodeled spaces within a home. The average cost to remodel a space into a media room is about \$20,000 to \$30,000, excluding the electronic equipment.

Airoom's designers and craftsmen have become very skilled at designing these spaces, not only for the present technology, but for the future as well. "We can design and install any kind of cabinetry the customer wants," said Turner, "but I think our greatest contribution is making a house ready to accept tomorrow's technology. While we're there remodeling a room, we can also pre-wire a house for tomorrow's needs by using conduits or raceways that allow new equipment to be added," he said.

"More and more data will be driven through cable lines coming into the house," Turner said. "Cable television, of course, but also telephone service, Internet access, home security systems and home automation. That's the so called 'smart house,' where your home computer turns the lights on in the evening, turns the oven on to start dinner and sets the thermostat so the house

is the right temperature when you arrive home. It sounds futuristic, but it's really right on the doorstep," Turner added.

One of the largest most complex media room projects the company has done was in a vintage 1880s home in Winnetka. Airoom gutted the basement and created a very sophisticated me-

dia room with custom cabinetry to house the latest electronic equipment.

At the same time they pre-wired the house for the next generation of technology, while retaining all the home's beautiful,

original woodwork. "It was a challenge," Turner said, "but the homeowners now have a state-of-the-art media room and a house that's wired for tomorrow."

- Keep important documents or items that would be difficult or impossible to replace in a fire safe, or bank safe deposit box.
- Make photocopies of important documents and store in a place separate from the originals.
- Place photographs, negatives, and other irreplaceable documents in a fireproof box.
- Make back-up disks of important computer files and keep them in an off-site, protected area such as a bank deposit box.

and storage devices to keep documents for long periods of time.

- Check with local government or health agencies for other year 2000 advice. You may want to prepay early January bills, have extra cash on hand for any "glitches" that may occur in electric banking/transfers, etc.

Hot water safety

There is no doubt about it -- hot water heaters provide lots of comfort and convenience through warm baths and clean clothes. Remember, however, that hot water can also cause serious burns. Hot water burns are 100% preventable if you follow these tips:

1. Keep hot liquids out of the reach of children. When hot coffee or tea (usually over 160°) is spilled, it can cause severe injury. Be sure to watch babies and toddlers carefully while you are cooking or enjoying a hot drink.
2. Supervise children and older people in tub baths. Always test their bath water; it should be about 100°. Kids often cannot tell the hot from cold water faucets and may not be able to get out of hot water quickly. Elderly and handicapped people are more fragile and prone to falling.
3. Set your water heater thermostat at a safe level. Many are set at 140° or above. Set your thermostat on low (approx. 120°) to be safe and to save 18% of the energy used at 140°.
4. Test your water temperature. Run the hot water for 3 to 5 minutes and test with a candy, meat, or water thermometer. Reset the temperature on your water heater. Wait a day and then retest and adjust, if necessary. And, to conserve water, be sure to repair leaky faucets promptly. One drop a second can waste as much as 60 gallons of hot or cold water in a week.





Home security's "Top 10" list




In addition, Howard Dane, Sharon Deemar, Leon Finkel, and Jeffrey Greenspan were sworn in as members of the District 219 board.





of getting it by drinking three or four cups of green tea a day. The average time of a World Series baseball game in 1998 was 3 hours and 18 minutes. In 1971 when the first World Series night game was played the average game was played in two hours and 30 minutes. In 1903 the average time was 1 hour and 48 minutes.

The accumulation of wealth gives you the opportunity to do what you really want to do with your life, and to spend time in ways of your choosing. Books on becoming a millionaire suggest you acquire a sufficient income over a long period of time, live well below your means to have the discretionary income to invest, resist the temptation to spend the invested gains. Three easy ways to become a millionaire are to take advantage of your company's 401(k) plan and any other company-sponsored benefits, buy a home and live in it to retirement and as your income increases, rather than buy a larger home with a large mortgage, using the extra discretionary funds for your investments, buy a pre-owned car and drive it for no less than 12 years; 20 to 25 is optimal. According to a professor at the University of California, "If your average family income is \$40,000 you have within your reach the ability to create \$1 million in net worth if you have discipline and determination and not by throwing away money on high mortgages and car payments."

December is the cloudiest month of the year and the cold months from November through March have an average of 18 days per month of being the cloudiest days. . . . An international study showed if Americans paid \$1 for a prescription drug, that same drug costs 71 cents in Germany, 68 cents in Sweden,

65 cents in England, 64 cents in Canada, 57 cents in France and 51 cents in Italy. In a 1997 survey the American Survey For The United States by the Census Bureau and the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Midwesterners were found to be the happiest with their homes. Using a 1 to 10 scale 70.3% Midwesterners rated 8 or higher, compared to 70% in the Northeast and 69.9% in the South. Westerners seemed the least satisfied with a 65.8% percent rating of 8 or better.

Turning to neighborhoods, Midwesterners were happiest with a 69.3% rating of 8 or more. The level of satisfaction was expressed by 68.4% for Southerners, 65.7% by Northeasterners and 62.7% for Westerners. Other findings of the report included there are 99.5 million occupied housing units in the United States with owners living in 65.5 million homes and renters in 34 million.

The median home size was 5.4 rooms which means half had more than that and half had fewer. Homes were biggest in the Midwest, 5.6 rooms, and smallest in the West, 5.2. In the Northeast the median was 5.5 and it was 5.4 in the South.

The largest share of homes, 44 million, had one complete bathroom while 39 million had two or more.

The vast majority, 88 million homes, were connected to a central water supply and 11 million had wells.

make finalist status in his category.

Entries were judged by a panel of professional writers including novelists, short-story and essay writers, playwrights, editors, actors, magazine contributors, television producers and freelance journalists. The awards were announced at a ceremony at Columbia College on May 22.

When the plan has been finalized, the district will be comprised of seven schools, five for grades 1 through 6, a junior high, and one school, Melzer, for kindergarten only.

The cost of the proposed addition to Gemini will be between \$2 million and \$8 million, according to Superintendent Dr. Robert Varga.

Funding for the expansion project may come from a \$7.4 million working cash fund that Varga alluded to. However, it is also possible that the district may have to ask voters to pass a bond issue to pay for the addition, Varga said.

The district will also seek grant money to defray costs of the addition as well as pay for renovation costs at Stevenson in Des Plaines, according to Jim Reynolds, director of operations and maintenance for Dist. 63.

Varga said a lot of ideas for how to finance the expansion projects in the district are being discussed. Overcrowding is plaguing other schools within the district besides Gemini, he said.

The district has a 10-year history of operating in the red and currently has a deficit of \$27 million.

Karganis said that if Chicago builds the four planned east-west runways at O'Hare, more planes, more noise and more pollution will plague the two suburbs. The number of yearly take-offs and landings will soar from 900,000 to 1.5 million, Karganis said.

Karganis warned officials that Chicago will be offering suburban leaders many economic perks if they will support airport expansion.

Karganis advised local leaders to address state representatives such as Sen. David Sullivan (R-28th) of Park Ridge and Rep. Rosemary Mulligan (R-55th) of Des Plaines to gain Gov. Ryan's support for opposition to O'Hare expansion.




