I also heard other horror stories from around the nation at a congressional hearing earlier this year. One woman testified her 82-year-old father-in-law purchased 32 subscriptions to the same magazine extending until 2018 because he believed he was nearing the grand prize. Other family members told us of loved ones who were so convinced they had won a sweepstakes they refused to leave their home for fear they would miss

the Prize Patrol. Sadly, our elderly are particularly vulnerable to sweepstakes fraud. A survey commissioned by the American Association of Retired People (AARP) showed that 40 percent of seniors asked believe there is a connection between purchasing and winning. These experiences - which have depleted the life savings of the unsuspecting and created rifts among loving family members - are why it is so important to strengthen the laws to help us move toward that goal. · Consumers who think they have been victim of a deceptive
