

A 25-year-old woman was found with a gunshot wound in her head Jan. 16 in her apartment in the 3600 block of Salem Walk in unincorporated Northfield Township near Glenview.
Cook County Sheriff's Police said Jan. 17 they were questioning an unidentified man in connection with the death of Beth Gozzola, who died at Lutheran General Hospital early Monday morning, Jan. 18.
Police were responding to a 911 call placed around 7:20 p.m. Sunday evening when they found Gozzola, a CCSP spokesperson said.
An autopsy was scheduled for Jan. 18 by the medical examiner's office.

A recent study published in *Injury: International Journal of the* chronic "whiplash" injuries.
