Arft tells village's side of Suburban Motel controversy

Morton Grove Village Manager Larry Arft defended the actions of the village in serving eviction notices on the last remaining permanent tenants of the soon-to-be demolished Suburban Motel.

The tenants need not have waited until they received actual eviction notices to make other living arrangements, Arft said. They could also have obtained relocation assistance from the village before being evicted.

The reform law applies to property acquired by a municipality after Nov. 1, 1999. Morton Grove acquired the Suburban Motel through condemnation proceedings Jan. 20, 2000, and in that respect seems to fit under the law's provisions.

Only Mr. Miller and one other tenant refused and rejected the assistance, Arft said. The village also offered help through the Department of Family and Senior Services, Arft said.

"The village didn't just give notice and then abandon them [the tenants]," Arft said.

Gail Schechter of the Interfaith Housing Center of the Northern Suburbs, a not-for-profit agency which investigates housing discrimination, attended the Village Board meeting Feb. 28 to challenge the TIF displacement of the Suburban Motel permanent tenants.

Schechter invoked a new TIF reform law signed just last summer by Governor George Ryan. The new law requires compliance with the federal Uniform Relocation Act, which in turn requires

several months' notice and the finding of replacement housing in close proximity to the TIF district as well as funds for rent.

Arft countered Schechter's claim under the new law, however, by saying that the Suburban Motel is business or commercial property, not residential property, and therefore does not come under the new law.

The battle will rage on for a while yet, Arft said, and the village board will meet with Interfaith Housing again Friday to "sit down and come to a reasonable agreement."

Until then, the eviction deadline has been extended until after the March 3 deadline. Arft concedes there may be a few more days or even a week or two, but the tenants will not have the extension of months they are seeking to remain in the condemned motel.

The judge ordered vacation of the premises by March 15, and that's the date that all parties concerned will probably have to abide by.

Morton Grove may make legal history, however, as this will be the first case to be decided after the new TIF reform law was enacted, Schechter said.

"It's ironic that the village [of Morton Grove] was able to get away with displacing over 200 units in the Admiral Oasis and the Fireside," Schechter said. "Now that there are just nine permanent tenants [in the Suburban Motel], they may have to do something about it."

Arft emphasized that no matter what is decided, no tenants will be or ever have been put out into their cars.

American Lung Assn Nursing Assembly scholarships

The American Lung Association of Metropolitan Chicago (ALAMC)'s Nursing Assembly is offering six pulmonary and public health nursing scholarships for the 2000-2001 academic year, including a new financial award worth up to \$10,000. The scholarships are available in four categories, and are open to nursing students who are either enrolled in a nursing school in Cook County or reside in Cook County. The application deadline for all scholarships is March 31, 2000.

The 2000-2001 academic year scholarships include the Zienko-Kietrys Nursing Scholarship, the Allan Shaw Scholarship, the Doctoral Studies Award, and the New Investigator Award. ALAMC's nursing scholarships are offered at the undergraduate, graduate and doctorate level.

Three undergraduate Zienko-Kietrys Nursing Scholarships are available to full-time undergraduate nursing students (of junior or senior standing) who plan to eventually work in the area of lung or public health. 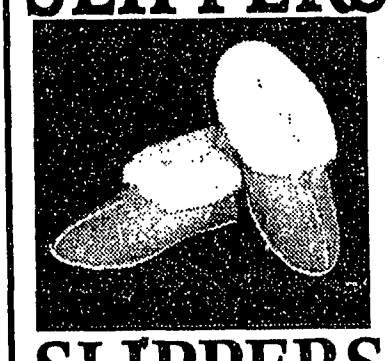

Women Pilots of the Ninety-Nines to meet

Approximately 40 women pilots are expected to attend when the Chicago Area Chapter of the Ninety-Nines, International Organization of Women Pilots, holds a chapter meeting this spring at Lewis University.

Founded in 1929, the Ninety-Nines organization is named for the original 99 charter members. Amelia Earhart served as the first president in 1931. When founded, the Ninety-Nines adopted a mission to unite female pilots for mutual support and to advance aviation. Today, their mission is threefold: to promote world fellowship through flight; to provide networking and scholarship opportunities for women and aviation education in the community; and to preserve the unique history of women in aviation.

Ninety-Nine membership in the United States requires Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) pilot certification, and recently the organization has accepted student pilots, designated as Future Women Pilots, who must have a current FAA medical certificate. Students can use their membership as Future Women Pilots to meet the two-year membership requirement needed to apply for an Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarship. Through this program, 13 scholarships are awarded annually to Ninety-Nines worldwide.

Fr. Chuck Beierwaltes, CSSR is a dynamic preacher who comes from Chicago. After high school he served for three years with the United States Army band followed by three years of employment with the Illinois Bell Telephone Company. He became a Redemptorist in 1962 and ordained a priest in 1967. His various ministries include being Assistant Pastor and then Pastor for nine years in both a suburban parish and inner city African-American parish in St. Louis. He was elected to the Redemptorist Provincial Staff for six years after which he was vocation director. In 1963 he was asked to go as a missionary to Thailand as Director of a large International School and then as associate pastor ministering to the refugees in prison and the American women incarcerated in Bangkok. He returned to the States in 1997 and is now Co-Director of the Redemptorist Theology Residence and Director of the Overseas Mission located in the Chicago area. Father Chuck has many experiences to share.

Rev. William Bueche, CSSR was born in Grand Rapids, Michigan in 1952. Raised in a Redemptorist parish and with an uncle already a Redemptorist priest, he felt God's call to the priesthood at a young age (10 years old), and entered the Redemptorist seminary in 9th grade. Ordained a priest in the Redemptorist Order in 1978, he spent one year in a Redemptorist parish in Omaha, Nebraska. In 1980, he went to Rome for higher studies in Moral Theology at the Academia Alphonsiana. Invited to remain on the faculty there, he taught Moral Theology in Rome for 10 years, specializing in the area of bioethics. In 1966, after 16 years in Rome, he returned to the United States to become the pastor of Blessed Sacrament Parish in the North Lawndale area of Chicago's westside. He is currently a pastor in this "inner-city" neighborhood, and ministers in a multicultural setting, with African-American, Mexican-American, and Caucasian parishioners. Father Bill is an inspiration to all.



IAMB opposes proposed Predatory Home Loan Practices Act

The Illinois Association of Mortgage Bankers (IAMB) has announced its opposition to House Bill 3007, the proposed Predatory Home Loan Practices Act, due to the effects the legislation would have on both Illinois consumers and the mortgage

lending industry. The Illinois Association of Mortgage Bankers is joined in opposition to House Bill 3007 by the following organizations: Illinois Bankers Association, Illinois Financial Services Association, Illinois Mortgage Bankers

Association, Illinois Association of Realtors, Illinois League of Financial Institutions, Illinois Land Title Association, Community Bankers Association of Illinois, Illinois Credit Unions League, Professional Independent Insurance Agents of Illinois, The

Home Builders Association of Illinois and the Illinois Life Insurance Council. The following is a review of IAMB's primary concerns about HB3007, according to IAMB President David Cesar:

• The Bill was designed to target sub-prime lenders offering home loans to borrowers with less than perfect credit, but in reality it applies to all Illinois home loans. VA, FHA and conventional "A" paper borrowers would also be negatively impacted by the legislation.

• Section Ten-4 caps fees at 3% of any total loan amount. This provision discriminates against lower income families because lenders could not afford to originate small loans where little or no profit can be earned. If the mortgage industry is expected to cap all fees at 3%, they will pull out of the small loan market and those with lower economic status will not realize the American dream of homeownership.

• The IAMB believes that the State should not be in the business of price fixing or setting fees for any industry. This is a market economy and market forces should be allowed to work without state interference.

• The Bill (Section Ten-1) mandates that borrower's ability to repay must be considered and that debts do not exceed 45% of income. Many factors are used to evaluate borrower risk, not just income and expenses, when considering loan approval. The sole use of a debt ratio will limit consumer options and will lock many senior citizens, retirees, farmers, veterans, self-employed individuals and those with a fixed income out of the home loan market.

• Section Ten-e infringes on consumers' rights to determine whether it is appropriate to refinance their mortgage and severely limits the choices consumers normally have. The decision to refinance may be acceptable for one consumer and not for another based on individual needs and desires. These are highly subjective decisions to be handled on a case-by-case basis, not impeded by legislation.

• It may restrict consumer ability to refinance to pay for a child's education, consolidate debts, and invest in home improvements or many other scenarios where the borrower can improve their situation.

• This Bill creates an unfair competitive atmosphere because it exempts federally chartered institutions from all provisions. Small business in Illinois will be affected by government interference in the free market system, making it difficult, if not impossible, for Illinois-based companies to compete and profitably continue business. Also, enforcement would be sporadic at best with ex-

emptied companies free to act in any manner without repercussions from this proposed legislation.

"The cost to enforce this legislation would be staggering. Agencies would potentially have the enormous burden to monitor ALL transactions within the State for compliance (the Office of Banks and Real Estate currently has less than 10 employees to oversee the industry)."

Under the Real Estate Settlement Procedures Act (RESPA) and Truth In Lending Act (TILA), mortgage professionals must notify consumers of all disclosures, fees and costs prior to loan closing. We recommend that consumers educate themselves about the lending process and their rights under these acts.

The Illinois Association of Mortgage Brokers was chartered in 1987 to unite the interests of its members to meet the challenge of regulatory, technological and competitive change in the evolving mortgage broker industry.

Section Twenty allows for borrower claims of liability to be brought against any subsequent holder of the mortgage; thus holding secondary lenders responsible for errors made by the original origination company. This will present most Illinois loans from being purchased in the secondary market because prospective purchasers will not want to assume the additional risk connected with the purchase of an "Illinois" loan. This in turn will decrease the number of loan programs available to consumers.

Section Twenty-Five of the Bill provides that a claim may be brought anytime within the life of a loan and within 2 years of the date a loan was repaid. For example, if a 3-year mortgage is fully paid by a consumer, such consumer could bring an action 2 years after the loan was repaid. The liability for a loan made in the year 2000 would only be extinguished in the year 2032. No Illinois law has ever gone that far in the realm of consumer protection.

Job Corps launches recruitment campaign

Young people have a chance to join Job Corps, learn a trade and start a career when the 35-year-old U.S. Department of Labor program kicks off its recruitment campaign for the year 2000.

The campaign will recruit young adults for newly opened Job Corps centers in Chicago and the centers in Joliet and Graceland. Job Corps trains more than 68,000 people per year and is the country's most successful job training program.

The recruitment campaign targets motivated young women and men from 16 through 24 years of age who wish to take advantage of the free education and trade opportunities offered through Job Corps. The program offers eligible students the chance to learn at their own pace from trade-certified instructors while living on campus or commuting.

"Job Corps has a long history of training young women and men in a variety of fields, and helping them get started in the career of their choice," said Richard Trigg, regional director. "A Job Corps education gives graduates a new outlook and a new start."

Students spend six months to two years completing vocational training in one of the many fields offered and studying for a high school diploma or GED if needed.

Successful Job Corps students can also enter the Advanced Career Training program, which builds on their specialized training. ACT students enroll at a vocational school or community college in courses that will add to their skills and further increase their job earning potential.

Job Corps Region V administers 13 training centers and oversees outreach and placement activities for students in Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio and Wisconsin. Each center trains students for work available in that state with a goal of keeping skilled workers in-state to strengthen its workforce.

Job Corps offers training in vocations including accounting, building and apartment maintenance, business and computer skills, culinary arts, carpentry, clerical occupations, customer service and health occupations. Job Corps provides all residential students with room, board, medical and dental services and some spending money while they learn.

Some centers offer non-residential programs and provide day care for students' children.

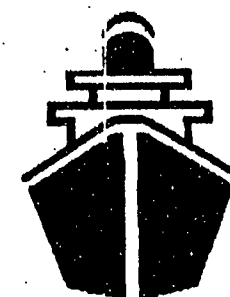

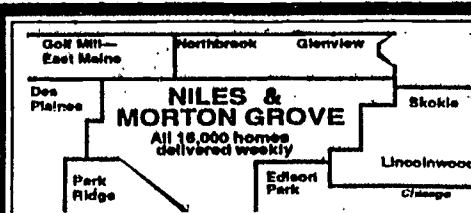

told a Sun-Times reporter that in every case, the victims had left their unattended cars unlocked while they were visiting graves, enabling the thief or thieves to park along side the targeted vehicles, enter them and remove the victims' purses, which in each case contained cash and credit cards.

Facarino sympathized with the victims who likely came to the cemetery to mourn the loss of loved ones while the unknown offenders were stealing their purses.

Descriptions of the thieves in the Niles cemeteries and their vehicles have varied widely thus far.

Two purse thefts occurred at Queen of Heavy Cemetery in the

last three weeks. In those incidents, a man drove up to unlocked cars and removed the purses left inside, according to Bill Cunningham, a spokesperson for the Cook County Sheriff's Police.

In the latest case at Queen of Heaven Cemetery, two sisters visiting their parents' graves, noticed a man driving a white car pull up along their car and then suddenly drive away. When they returned to their car, their purses were gone.

to be informed of such tax financed projects through a registry maintained by the Niles Village Clerk's office. According to registry rules, "interested parties shall be entitled to receive all notices and documents required, with respect to the applicable Redevelopment Project Area."

While a community may have more access to information, authority concerning TIF projects and spending will remain with municipalities.

"Can we trust municipalities to make TIF decisions and can we make them accountable for these decisions?" asked Trustee Bart Murphy, who provided an example of changes made in a TIF project after a public hearing.

In such cases, municipalities will be required by state law to inform registrants of any TIF changes.

Those wishing to register should contact the Niles Village Clerk. Individuals must provide proof of residency, such as a driver's license, lease, or utility bill. Organizations will be required to submit a one-page statement describing the function of its operation.

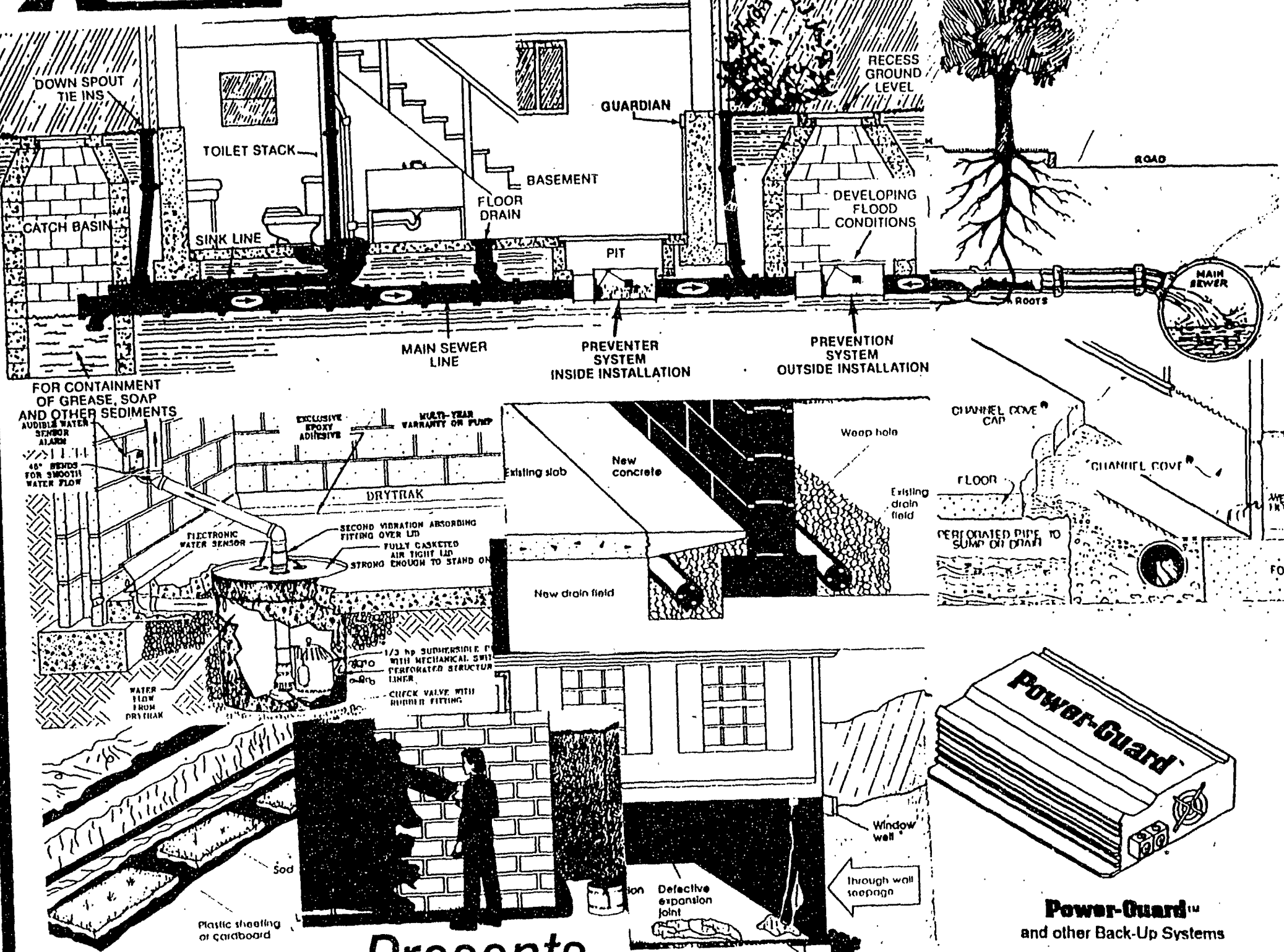

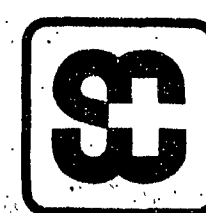
