





TV viewing linked to obesity

American children spend more time watching television and videotapes and playing video games than on any other activity except for sleeping. Recently the Journal of the AMA published a study that evaluated the potential association between television viewing

Nearly 200 third and fourth grade students in two schools participated in the study. Students from one school received an 18 lesson, six month classroom curriculum to reduce television, videotape and video game use. The curriculum consisted of teaching the children to budget their entertainment time and did not include any lifestyle modifications, such as diet or exercise. The children from the second school received no special instruction and were used as the con-
