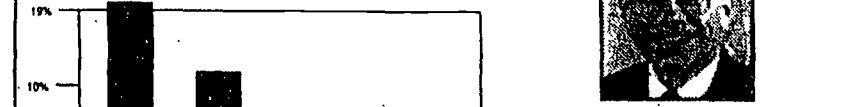

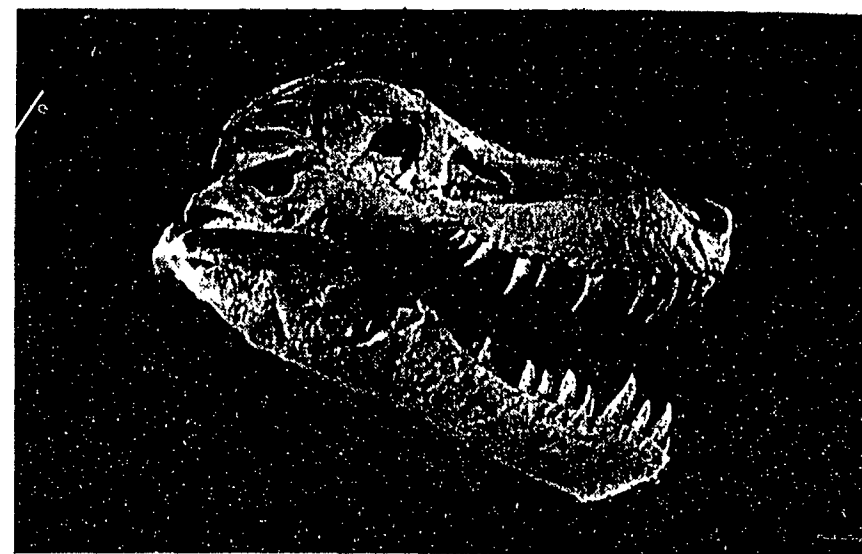

Sue's open jaw



The open jaw of Sue, the world's most famous dinosaur, presents a realistic view of the T. rex's skull and razor-sharp teeth. Sue's sixty teeth, which range in length from 7.5 to 12 inches, were continually shed and re-grown during the dinosaur's lifetime. Sue's complete mounted skeleton will be unveiled in May of 2000. Sue's vital statistics

Age: 67 million years - and rather well preserved for her age, wouldn't you say? Discovered: August 12, 1990, on the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation near Faith, South Dakota, by fossil hunter Sue Hendrickson. Length: 41 to 45 feet (12.5 to 13.7 meters). Height at hips: 13 feet (4 meters). Estimated live weight: 7 tons (6.4 metric tons). Weight of skull, as found: Nearly 1 ton. Length of Skull: 5.2 feet. Size of brain cavity: Just big enough to hold a quart of milk. Number of teeth: 60. Length of teeth: 7.5 to 12 inches. Sex: Undetermined. Price: Acquired by The Field Museum (with assistance from McDonald's Corporation and Walt Disney World Resort) for \$8.36 million. To scientists and dinosaur fans: Priceless.

Is This a Fact? Fact: It took six fossil hunters 17 days to get Sue out of the ground; it took ten preparators two years to clean and repair her bones. Fact: A T. rex skeleton is made up of more than 250 bones. Sue was found with most of those bones. She's missing only a foot, one arm, and a few ribs and vertebrae. Fact: Only two complete T. rex forelimbs have ever been found -- and Sue's one of them! Fact: Sue's legs are enormous, but her arms are the size of a human's -- so short they couldn't even reach her mouth. No one knows how T. rex used those tiny forelimbs. Fact: Sue's razor-sharp teeth were continually shed and re-grown during her lifetime.

Did You Know... T. rex lived closer in time to the first humans (60 million years apart) than it did to the first dinosaurs (160 million years apart). The first T. rex was unearthed in Wyoming by Barnum Brown in 1900. Some tyrannosaurs -- dinosaurs in the same family as Sue -- weighed as little as 200 pounds, full grown. Dinosaurs evolved from a group of crocodile-like reptiles called thecodonts. The word fossil comes from the Latin word fossilis, which means "dug up."

Census data helps channel funds into community

Maine Township Supervisor Mark Thompson is telling uninformed residents that there's no reason not to cooperate with the upcoming census in 2000. In fact, Thompson joins other community leaders encouraging cooperative reporting of the changing population so that federal funds are fairly distributed according to an accurate count.

Residents that reflect realistic demographics. Concerned that apathy or unfounded fears may cause some residents to be less than cooperative, Thompson maintains there is no basis for suspicion. Participating in the census is in the individual's own self interest, said Thompson. "People who answer the census assist their

community's efforts to obtain federal and state funding and provide valuable information needed to plan for schools, hospitals, roads, and more. Census information helps decision makers understand which neighborhoods need what level of services. But they won't be able to tell what your neighborhood needs if you don't fill out your census form."

"We were recently able to pave the alley behind Sumac Avenue through a Community Development Block Grant that was obtained using census data concerning population," Thompson added as a local example. "On the other hand we were denied a grant in another area where census data was not accurate -- a good example of how lack of cooperation with the census last time may have contributed to losing funds."

Thompson hopes residents concerned about privacy will consider the fact that census data is, by federal law, protected and for the most part, anonymous. "The numbers published by the census bureau are combined with thousands of answers from po-

ple in your neighborhood and all over the United States," said Thompson. "No one, except sworn Census Bureau employees, can see individual questionnaires or link your name with your responses."

According to information provided on the Census Bureau's own web site, at <http://www.census.gov>, the Census Bureau by law cannot share respondent's answers with others, including welfare agencies, the Immigration and Naturalization Service, the Internal Revenue Service, courts, police and the military. In fact, the Census Bureau points out that the law provides severe penalties for any census employee that makes your answers known. Anyone who breaks this law can receive up to five years in prison and \$5,000 in fines.

"We're hoping people will answer accurately and completely with this important count that gives legislators a realistic look at who their constituents really are," said Thompson. "It's the best way to help your community get its fair share."

2000 off to fast start for RE/MAX of Northern Illinois

The RE/MAX of Northern Illinois network reports that despite rising mortgage interest rates, its sales for the first two months of 2000 were up 5.3 percent when compared to the same period a year ago. The network's sales for January and February totaled \$1,068,678,481; versus \$1,014,900,092 in 1999.

Transaction volume was up slightly on the same basis, with 6,057 sales completed during the first two months of this year, one more than in January and February last year. New listing volume was up 10.77 percent to

\$1.38 billion from \$1.25 billion a year ago.

Hegner noted that with RE/MAX listing volume up nearly 11 percent for the two-month period, the supply of homes may be expanding at last. "Homes were in short supply last year, but new construction has remained strong, and many new home buyers have a home to sell," she said. "A larger inventory of homes for sale would bring the market into better balance."

The average price of a home sold by RE/MAX during the

first two months of this year was \$176,436; a 5.3 percent increase over the \$167,583 average price for the same period in 1999.

RE/MAX offices in the Northern Illinois Region have led the Chicago metropolitan area residential real estate market each year since 1989 in closed sales volume. In 1999, that closed sales volume totaled more than \$10.2 billion. Since 1995, one out of four homes sold in Chicagoland was listed by RE/MAX.

Home Style

How to succeed at house painting

Painting the interior or exterior of a home is a no-brainer - providing you've done the really important work of preparing the old surfaces for their new topcoat.


Paint needs proper adhesion to last through years of weathering, washing, rubbing, rough-housing and all of the other abuse the world can throw at it. It doesn't matter which paint you buy. If you don't put it onto a clean, solid surface, it won't last.

Watch professional painters work, and you'll see that they often spend more time getting ready to paint than actually brushing, rolling or spraying the stuff on. They know what it takes to do a good job. The most important preparation steps include:

- Wash down all surfaces to be painted. For interior walls and ceilings, use a strong TSP (trisodium phosphate) solution, rinse with clean water and allow the surface to dry well before you repaint. Plaster can be scrubbed, but drywall needs a gentler touch with a damp, not wet, sponge. Exterior may be power-washed - use an appropriate cleaning solution that sprays on with the water, and be careful not to damage surfaces with the high-pressure stream.
- Scrape or sand away old paint that's not well-adhered. Blistering, peeling and flaking paint can be removed by and or with portable sanding machines. 
