Morton Grove OK's mini-mart

The Morton Grove Village Board of Trustees heard the details of a request for a special use permit regarding the auto service station at 6600 Oakton. The owner of the station plans to change the station to an auto mini-mart station.

Seven Blonz, the Chairman of the Morton Grove Plan Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals presented the case. The case had been continued several times due to failure by the applicant to provide adequate engineering drawings for detention, proper movement diagrams showing that a semi-trailer truck could easily maneuver to the new diesel pump location, and adequate floor plans. Chairman Blonz indicated that, after four hearings, the applicant had complied with the Commissions requirements for information on the change.

With the proper documents to review, the Commission discovered that there was not sufficient space for a semi-trailer truck to

Glenview seeks to end redevelopment rumors

In an effort to curb rumors that the Village of Glenview plans to replace the commercial property in the Lehigh Triangle with residential housing, the Board of Trustees passed a resolution last Tuesday declaring that it has no intention of condemning or rezoning the area.

The declaration comes on the heels of protests by angry property owners who showed up at a plan commission meeting last month with architectural drawings by the Glenview firm of Skidmore Owings & Merrill. The plans show multi-family housing and Meira parking in place of the businesses currently located in the 24-acre area between Lehigh Avenue and the former Glenview Naval Air Station.

According to the plan commission, the drawings merely

Elderly driver crashes into Niles bar

A 73-year-old man was the only one injured when he crashed his 1975 Cadillac into the Go To Blues bar in Niles.

Police say that Robert Jorgensen was driving southeast on the inside lane on Milwaukee Avenue yesterday, and struck the tail end of the car next to him when he attempted to change lanes.

The second car was spun into a 360 degree turn, but its 23-year-old driver was unharmed. Jorgensen's vehicle continued across Milwaukee until it crashed into the bar.

Police charged Jorgensen with improper lane change and failure to reduce speed in order to avoid an accident. He was taken to Lutheran General Hospital for his injuries.

Latest attack occurs in Chicago's Rogers Park; Police on highest alert to nab suspect

Rapist attacks eighth area woman

Police believe that the man responsible for the home attacks on women living in the northern suburbs and north Chicago, struck again yesterday afternoon in West Rogers Park.

This is the eighth instance where the suspect has identified himself as a public official to gain entry into homes in unincorporated Maine Township, Morton Grove, Mt. Prospect, Niles, and Skokie, and the north-side of Chicago.

Unfortunately, it is the first case where the man assaulted a juvenile.

According to police, the man produced a badge and entered a home on the 2500 block of Pratt Blvd, brandishing a gun. The girl told police that the man

wore a dark navy jacket, black or navy pants, and shiny shoes. The suspect has been described as approximately 6 ft. tall, medium-to-slender build, clothes like those described in the other cases.

Service is Square Deal Shoe's secret of success

Question: How does a family-owned business thrive for almost 80 years without being de-owned a national chain?

Answer: By giving the people what they want. Plaines resident Louigi Capozzoli, owner of Square Deal Shoes in Des Plaines, "People go where they are treated right."

Started by Capozzoli's father, who immigrated to the United States in 1920, the independently owned and operated shoe store on 1516 Miner Street has been a downtown Des Plaines fixture since its grand opening in 1921.

"We came to Des Plaines when this was a little hick town of about 5,000 people," said Capozzoli. "Des Plaines grew more slowly than most communities and we were able to grow right along with it."

The store has survived depression and recessions by offering patrons more than just an attractive shoe off the rack. Square Deal Shoes not only provides brand-name family footwear ranging in widths from narrow to extra-wide, it also specializes in orthopedic and prosthetic shoes.

"If people have problems with their feet, they go where they can get a quality shoe. We do a lot of orthopedic work," said Capozzoli. "And we still measure and fit people for the proper size shoe."

That's something that most shoe stores don't really do anymore.

"A sign with a name is not the proper way to honor someone who has contributed to the value of life," said the charming businessman in a recent interview. "When you see a street sign, you don't know if the name is a tree, a mountain or what. When you include the pictures, you can teach the child, you can show everyone exactly who you honor."

After a visit to the local historical society, Arvanitis discovered that Hammond was one of the first mayors of Indiana.

"He won the election by flipping a coin!" Arvanitis laughed. "Now, don't you think that people in the neighborhood should know who their streets are named for?" These signs will put a face with the name.

The concept has been very well received. Arvanitis has shown his signs at expos in New York and Chicago.

"Mrs. Clinton saw them in New York and she was very impressed," he points to one of his signs. "I said that she should have a George Washington. A first president for the first lady!"

Arvanitis hopes to see the day when his signs are the standard for streets throughout the world.

He said he'd like to see them started in Chicago, or even Niles, and has met with mayors Richard Daley and Nicholas Blase to discuss the matter.

"In time, people, especially the children, will forget who these names belong to," he said. "You think now that it is impossible to forget the face of Martin Luther King but in fifty or a hundred years, people can forget. And that is no way to honor a great person."

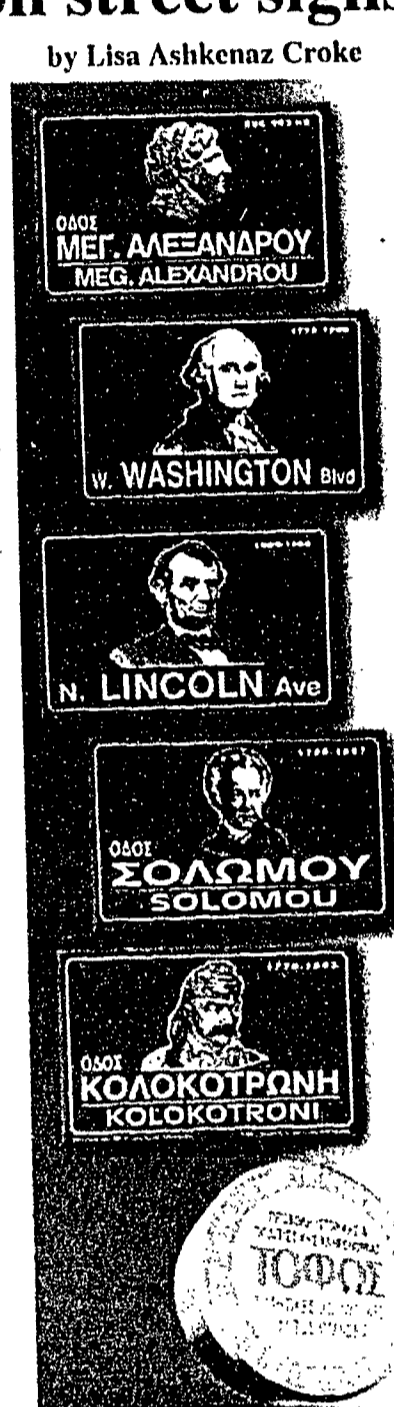

Traffic safety phase 3 completed

The Niles Police Department just completed phase 3 of a 5 part traffic safety campaign to promote traffic safety, specifically concentrating in the area of occupant restraint. The campaign known as "Click-it or Ticket" and mobilization ABC (America Buckles up Children) has been greatly publicized statewide. Here in Niles notices and flyers were distributed to various local businesses and shopping malls in an attempt to educate and remind the public of the importance of traffic safety. Additionally, Officer Ron Brandt gave several presentations to the junior and senior classes at Notre Dame High School.

The summary of activity during this last enforcement period by Niles police officers included 119 seat belts and child restraint citations, 88 citations for speeding as well as 377 additional citations for various traffic related offenses. In addition, 5 motorists were arrested for driving with a suspended license, 6 arrests were affected for Driving Under the Influence (DUI), 2 people were arrested for drug related charges, and one person was arrested on an outstanding warrant.

The next phase of the traffic safety campaign will concentrate on DUI enforcement and is scheduled to begin June 25th and continue through July 8th, 2000. The Niles Police Department encourages motorists to practice traffic safety especially during the upcoming holiday. The following materials will not be accepted at the collection: agricultural wastes, propane tanks, business/commercial sector wastes, smoke detectors, explosives, farm machinery oil, fire extinguishers, lead acid batteries and institutional wastes. Morton Grove reports crime drop in 1999

The Morton Grove Police Department's 1999 annual report shows that most crime is down across the board. According to the report, 489 people were arrested for criminal activity in 1999. That's a reduction of 233 arrests from 1998. The number of assault and battery cases remained at 18 for both years, and there was one murder in 1999 compared to none in 1998. There were four rape cases in 1999, down one from the five reported the year before. While violent crime took a slight dip, the most impressive drops were in thefts and robberies. There were 420 thefts in 1998 and 295 in 1999, while robberies were reduced from 13 in 1998 to seven in 1999. Burglaries of businesses and homes dropped from 126 in 1998 to 114 last year, and vehicle burglaries declined from 118 in 1998 to 98 in 1999.

Fun in the Sun Can Take Its Toll on Your Skin

Want to look old before your time? It's easy, just make sure you spend plenty of unprotected time in the sun.

Painful sunburn doesn't just ruin vacations; it can ruin your skin. Worse yet, it will increase your risk of skin cancer (melanoma), the most common cancer in the United States. Despite the attention paid to anti-aging agents such as Retinol and Vitamin C,

sun protection still is the single most important thing you can do to keep your skin looking younger and healthier - and reduce your risk of developing melanoma.

Most people know they need sun protection - but don't realize it needs to be applied every time they go outside. Intense, short-term exposure can cause sunburns, but cumulative, long-term exposure leads to equally serious

risks.

Here are some important sun care tips:

- Even an overcast, cloudy, or foggy day poses risk to your skin since nearly 80 percent of the sun's burning rays penetrate through clouds.
- Use extra protection when the sun is brightest - between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Wear sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher that protects against both UVA and UVB rays; anything less provides little real protection.
- Don't overlook protection for lips, neck, hands, arms, feet, and legs - all areas of high sun exposure.
- The best protective clothing is a tightly woven, dark fabric.
- Wear a hat with at least a 4-inch brim.
- Drinking plenty of water will keep your skin hydrated and help heal sunburned skin.

Not everyone's skin reacts the same way to sun exposure. My doctor said that my medication would make my skin more sensitive to sunlight. What does this mean, and what should I do?

Over-the-counter and prescription medications, supplements, herbs, cosmetics, and even scents can increase your "photosensitivity" (sensitivity to sunlight). Symptoms include redness, warmth, blisters, swelling, and sometimes rash.

Prescription medicines most often responsible for photosensitivity reactions include the antibiotics tetracycline (brand name Sumycin), cotrimoxazole (Bactrim or Septra), and ciprofloxacin (Cipro).

Anti-inflammatory drugs such as indomethacin (Indocin), nabumetone (Trelafen), treatments for acne or for wrinkles such as tretinoin (Retin-A, Renova) or Retinol, and diuretics (water pills) such as hydrochlorothiazide (HydroDiuril) can also cause this reaction.

Your doctor or pharmacist can advise you about specific prescription medications. The packaging and instructions also detail side effects. However, the labeling on many over-the-counter products doesn't list photosensitivity reactions, so be sure to ask.

Soaps and perfumes containing mint or citrus fragrances also can cause problems. Coal tar, a common ingredient in dandruff and eczema products, is another culprit, as well as pain relievers such as ibuprofen (Motrin, Advil) and naproxen (Aleve); itching-stopping creams containing diphenhydramine (Benadryl cream); and acne medications containing benzoyl peroxide (Oxy 10, Clearasil).

Herbal products that may cause photosensitivity include St. John's wort, anise, dong quai, and

Tribulus terrestris (Tribestan).

I try to be good about wearing sunscreen but I still manage to burn at least once during the summer. What are the best remedies for sunburn.

Try to avoid getting a sunburn in the first place. Always wear sunscreen with an SPF of at least 15 whenever you're outside, and reapply it frequently. Cover yourself in protective, tightly-woven fabrics and a hat with at least a 4-inch brim and avoid the sun between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. However, if you burn despite precautions, here are steps you can take to relieve pain and itching.

If your sunburn is relatively mild:

- Antihistamine products such as diphenhydramine (brand name Benadryl) can provide relief.
- Hydrocortisone ointments such as Cortair or Dermest also relieve itching and inflammation.
- Topical anesthetics such as benzocaine (Americaine), lidocaine (Lidocaine), and pramoxine (Itch-X) ease pain temporarily, usually 15 to 45 minutes.
- Oral over-the-counter drugs such as aspirin, ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin), naproxen (Aleve) or ke-

trofen (Orudis) may help combat pain and inflammation (however, acetaminophen products like Tylenol do not reduce inflammation).

Numerous natural and herbal remedies for burns have not been found clinically effective, nor have they been approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. Nonetheless, some people swear by them.

One such remedy, aloe, has been used for centuries to treat and soothe burns. For best results, look for one that is at least 95 percent pure aloe gel, like Roberts Aloe Care Gel. Calendula, another herbal sunburn remedy, is especially popular in Europe. Some laboratory tests suggest that calendula may reduce inflammation, but the herb hasn't been tested in clinical studies.

From caries to cancer, a "silent epidemic" of oral disease affects the minority and low-income populations in the United States, wrote David Satcher, the US Surgeon General, in a first-ever report on oral health. The Executive Summary of the report was released May 25, 2000.

While, fluoridated drinking water and better dental care mean that middle age or young citizens can expect to remain their lifetime for life, dental disease continues to threaten the health of those who live on a low income.

"The two major themes of the report, oral health means more than healthy teeth and oral health is integral to general health, cannot be stressed enough," said Alfred T. Bean, DDS, a general dentist in Chicago who serves as President of the Chicago Dental Society. "Finding treatment options has long been a priority for the Chicago Dental Society," said Dr. Bean. "An Access to Care Committee meets regularly to identify and address issues relating to the treatment of uninsured children and adults."

comparing with 17% of children who live above the poverty line. According to the government report, the disparity increased for older children. More than 43% of poor children have tooth decay by the time they reach age 17 compared to 23% of children who live in better economic conditions. In Illinois, a survey found that 38% of 6- to 8-year-olds statewide had cavities that needed filling, and in Chicago, 54% of children have cavities that need filling.

Oral disease remains untreated because children lack insurance coverage and because dental care is a low priority for poor families. Those who are uninsured are two and one-half times less likely to have a dental examination, according to the report. Experts indicate that 26 million children in the United States have no insurance coverage for dental care. "Finding treatment options has long been a priority for the Chicago Dental Society," said Dr. Bean. "An Access to Care Committee meets regularly to identify and address issues relating to the treatment of uninsured children and adults."

Mary Ann Andrews retiring after 36-year career at Resurrection

Mary Ann Andrews, Director of the Laboratory at Resurrection Medical Center, 7435 West Talcott Avenue, has retired after 36 years with the hospital.

Andrews, a Norwood Park resident, began her career at Resurrection in 1964 as a medical technologist in the chemistry department, when Resurrection was a 250-bed hospital (today it has 439 beds).

Reminiscing, Andrews said, "At that time, all lab tests were done manually. When a patient came in for a test - and usually it was just for one test - the lab people handled the entire procedure. We registered the patient, drew blood for the test and even collected money from the patient for the test."

"Of course the volume of business was much lower then. We'd see about 30 outpatients in a day, compared to multiple tests for 100 to 120 outpatients that we handle today. We now do 600 blood draws daily. We also perform tests on an average of an additional 100 specimens a day that are delivered to our Reference Laboratory by doctors' offices."

The present-day lab that Andrews has directed for the last 17 years was built in 1972. She was involved in helping select new equipment for the new lab.

Resurrection has kept pace with emerging laboratory tech-

nology. We've made changes and updates to meet the medical needs of the community," Andrews noted.

In 1984, the lab converted from mostly manual operations to a modern, computerized operation. The laboratory has many computerized trouble-shooting tools designed to solve problems in minutes that used to take hours or days.

Retirement for Andrews won't mean her life will be any less busy. "I have family in Arizona and Hawaii, as well as closer to home

LGH first to use minimally invasive breast biopsy device

Physicians at Lutheran General Hospital are the first in the Chicago area to use a new minimally invasive, ultrasound-guided procedure to detect breast cancer. The Mammotome Breast Biopsy is an alternative to an open surgical breast biopsy, and provides an accurate diagnosis of early stage breast cancer.

Unlike traditional open surgical biopsy, which requires a large incision and core needle biopsy requiring multiple insertions of the device, Mammotome requires only one insertion and minimizes the removal of surrounding healthy tissue. The procedure only requires a local anesthetic and can be performed on an outpatient basis.

Local anesthesia is administered and then a small incision is made in the breast for insertion of the probe device. The probe is guided into the breast via computerized ultrasound guidance. Once the probe is in position in the breast, a vacuum system gently draws tissue into a sample chamber. Then a rotating device cuts the small tissue samples and sends them to a tissue collection chamber. Tissue samples are then sent to a pathology lab to be examined.

The new technology allows the physician and patient to observe the tissue removal as it occurs. The Caldwell Breast Center at Lutheran General Hospital is the first in the Chicago area to offer the hand-held ultrasound guided Mammotome biopsy system. The outpatient procedure is performed in less than an hour, requires no stitches, and allows women to return to their normal routine immediately afterwards with only a small adhesive strip to cover a quarter inch incision about the size of a match head.

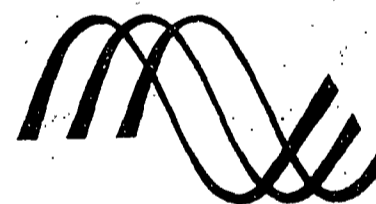

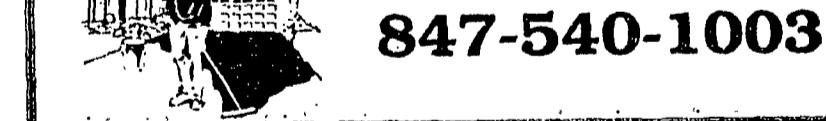

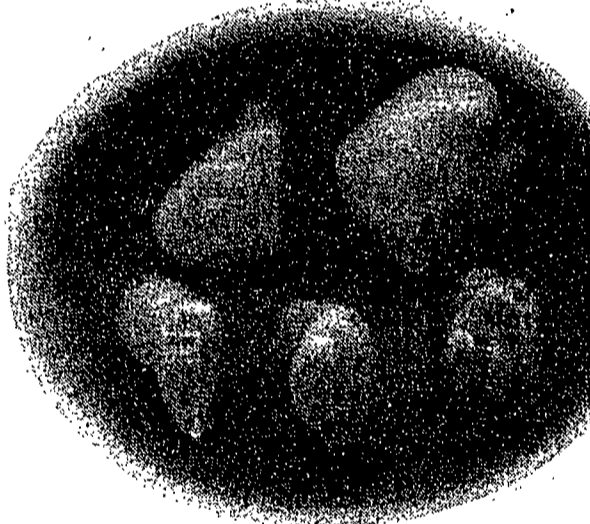

Home shoppers' confidence still perking

Economists call it the "wealth effect," the sense of financial security triggered by a prosperous economy and, in particular, a stock market boom.

Home builders note that steadily rising property values are contributing significantly to the strong and durable housing market.

Whatever the cause, the result is that shoppers are stretching their budgets and buying with extreme confidence.

Indications that this is so show up in sales tracked by sales and marketing consultant Equity Marketing Services for Lincoln Ridge, a master-planned community of condominiums and carriage homes in north suburban Skokie.

Shoppers are asked to indicate the price range in which they are shopping. In every category, buyers are actually buying toward the higher end of the indicated ranges.

For example, the group who said they were shopping for a home priced from \$125,000 to \$150,000 are actually spending an average of \$184,432 for their homes. That comes to \$46,363, or 34 percent, higher than the average price of \$136,500 in that price range. And it doesn't include additional spending for upgrades, which in many cases is significant.

The fact that people are spending at the upper end of the scale or beyond it certainly suggests that they are underestimating their purchasing power," said Robin.

In fact, shoppers in every price bracket are actually spending more than they intended.

For example: Those declaring interest in slightly more expensive homes, priced from \$150,000 to \$175,000, averaged \$188,760 in purchase price, more than \$26,260 or 16 percent over the \$162,500 average for that bracket. Home seekers in the \$175,000 to \$200,000 range are spending an average of \$200,947 for their homes, which is \$13,447 or 7.2 percent over the average in that grouping. In the \$200,000 to \$225,000 groupings, the average tag was \$232,409, eclipsing the average price in that range by some \$19,909 or more than 9 percent. And in the next highest sector, \$225,000 to \$250,000, the average purchase price of \$253,585 was \$16,085 or 6.7 percent above the average price of \$237,500. Those who said they are prepared to spend upwards of \$250,000 have an average price tag of \$258,075, a shade above those who said their top price was \$250,000.

Lincoln Ridge is situated on a nine-acre site approximately two blocks north of Touhy Avenue and just east of the intersection of Skokie Boulevard and Lincoln Avenue.

The \$40 million complex will have a total of 188 residences, including 60 one-, two- and three-bedroom residences in each of two six-story masonry condominium buildings and 68 carriage homes. The carriage homes are being built in clusters of 17 buildings, designed in the style of single-family homes, each of which has four two- and three-bedroom, single-level residences.

Prices run from approximately \$194,500 to \$279,500 for remaining condominiums and from \$269,900 to \$309,900 for carriage homes. Prices and availability are subject to change without notice.

Here is a brief description of the two types of residence:

The new lineup of condominium homes still available in the North midrise' condominium buildings have from approximately 1,169 square feet in the two-bedroom, one-bath units to approximately 1,794 square feet of the larger three-bedroom, two-bath designs. One-bedroom plus den, 1.5-bath plans have 1,222 square feet with a balcony, while two-bedroom homes have one, 1.5 or two baths and range from approximately 1,169 to 1,456 square feet.

Each residence has a balcony with sliding doors and screens. Kitchens include a cozy breakfast area, a full-size pantry and a full suite of designer cabinetry and no-wax vinyl flooring. White-on-white General Electric appliances include frost-free refrigerators with icemakers, built-in dishwashers, continuous-clean gas ranges and waste disposers. Corner units have a window above the sink for natural light.

Each condominium residence has a spacious laundry. Standards also include plush carpeting in living areas, individually controlled heating and air conditioning, lever handle door hardware and a large walk-in closet. Ceiling heights in all living areas of the condominiums are approximately 8.5 feet, adding wall space and heightening the experience for volume.

Each residence is sprinklered, as are all public areas, and each building has an intercom system with a TV camera in the lobby.

As part of the purchase price every owner will have one heated indoor parking space and an individual storage locker adjacent to the parking space.

The final condominium building, now 50 percent sold, is scheduled for occupancy in late summer. The remaining carriage

homes are available for spring occupancy. Carriage homes feature four units in each building; two on the first floor and two on the second floor. They have similar interior appointments, notably spacious kitchens with large breakfast areas opening to a deck or patio through glass sliding doors that flood the area with natural daylight. Elegant bathrooms feature European-style vanity cabinets, cultured marble vanity tops with two integral bowls, full-width vanity mirrors, theatrical lighting and ceramic tile floors.

The Lincoln Ridge sales center at 7400 N. Lincoln Ave. and display models of both condominium residences and carriage homes are open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays through Friday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and from noon to 5 p.m. on Sunday.

Dept. of Public Health offers hot weather tips

Heat-related illnesses such as heat exhaustion and heat stroke happen when air temperature and humidity are high. Certain people are more at risk for becoming sick due to the heat, particularly the elderly, babies, and children.

The Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH) recommends following these rules when hot weather arrives: • Drink plenty of fluids to keep the body hydrated. Avoid alcohol and caffeine because they dehydrate the body.

• Eat light foods; heavy foods tend to add heat to the body. • Avoid salt tablets and highly-salted foods. • Wear light colored, lightweight clothing. If you must go out of doors during the hottest part of the day, wear a hat.

• Use a sun screen with a sun protection factor (SPF) greater than 15 to protect yourself from sunburn.

• Stop or reduce strenuous physical activities during extremely hot weather. Avoid prolonged outdoor activities.

• Take a cool bath or shower to cool off your body. Cold, wet wash cloths can be used to cool the body.

• Try to avoid cooking and baking, especially during the hottest times of the day. • Check frequently on the elderly, ill family members and neighbors.

CCDPH recommends that people who do not have air conditioning find relief in public facilities such as libraries, shopping centers, senior centers, movie theaters and restaurants. Additionally, people using the following medication should consult with their doctors, as they may be increased risk during high temperatures:

• neuroleptics (examples: haloperidol or chlorpromazine) because they impair thermoregulatory function; • medicines with anticholinergic effects (example: medication for Parkinson's disease) because they tend to inhibit perspiration; and • major tranquilizers (examples: phenothiazine, butyrophenone and thiozanthene).

RESOLUTION ADOPTING PREVAILING WAGES

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, codified as amended, 82CS 1301 et seq. (1993), formerly Ill. Rev. Stat., Ch. 48, par. 39-1 et seq.;

AND WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Niles Elementary Schools District #71 of Cook County investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of Cook County employed in performing construction of public works, for said Niles Elementary Schools District #71.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF NILES ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS DISTRICT #71:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, county, city or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Niles Elementary Schools District #71 is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the Cook County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 1996, a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the Niles Elementary Schools District #71. The definition of any terms appearing in this Resolution which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Niles Elementary Schools District #71 to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Niles Elementary Schools District #71 Board Secretary shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Niles Elementary Schools District #71 this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of the prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The Niles Elementary Schools District #71 Board Secretary shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Niles Elementary Schools District #71 Board Secretary shall promptly file a certified copy of this Resolution with both the Secretary of State Index Division and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The Niles Elementary Schools District #71 Board Secretary shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Resolution, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

black with a medium complexion, wearing dark clothing similar to what a police officer would wear.

Four of the six women attacked have been sexually assaulted. The majority (six) of the women are of Asian descent.

The majority of attacks (five) have occurred in the suburbs, and a man fitting the suspect's description attempted to enter two separate residences in unincorporated Des Plaines last week.

Over the weekend, Asian and Pakistani men living in the area solemnly patrolled their neighborhoods, dogs in tow, after the suspect attempted to gain entry into the apartments of an Asian woman and a Pakistani woman last Tuesday. The suspect identified himself as a telephone repairman to the Pakistani woman, and told the Asian woman that he was a police officer sent by her family.

In both cases, the women refused to open the door and called the police, which is exactly what officials have been urging women to do since the attacks began last April. Police say that anyone identifying themselves as an officer should be in possession of three forms of identification: a badge, a state star, and a photo ID card. If residents have any suspicions at all, they can dial 911 to check on an officer's identity before answering the door.

Since the incidents on Tuesday, a Cook County Command Vehicle has been posted on Kennedy Drive in unincorporated Des Plaines. Penny Matek,

Continued from Page 1 represent a possible redevelopment scenario for the area in 25 to 50 years.

Village President Nancy Firer responded to the Triangle property owners in a letter stating that "unscrupulous" real estate brokers trying to solicit listings were responsible for "spreading false rumors."

Despite such assurances and explanations, area landowners have banded together and hired a lawyer to make sure that nothing happens to their property.

spokesperson for the Sheriff's Department, said that the Command Vehicle is part of the department's task force, which is comprised of police from the surrounding areas who have all joined together in the search for the suspect.

"It serves as a mobile police station where the officers can meet, get flyers distributed, and where people who may not feel comfortable going to a station can speak with police," she said.

Officer Jim Zimmerman from the Niles Police Department said that police have been stopping and questioning men fitting the attacker's description.

"We're talking to everyone we can and we're always checking leads," he said referring to a man who was pulled over on Golf Road last week after police received a call from a resident that someone with a similar build and clothing as the suspect was seen trying to gain entry into an apartment of the 9400 block of Washington.

"Turns out he was a working security guard who had an appointment to see an apartment in the area," said Zimmerman. "But we're glad that residents are on the alert."

Zimmerman also said that the man police pulled over was in possession of a firearm, but that he was "not the guy."

When asked if police had fingerprints or DNA samples to identify suspects or link the attacker to each of the cases, Matek said that she could not comment on evidence.

A \$10,000 reward is offered for information leading to the attacker's arrest.

Other requirements imposed by the Commission included proper fire and burglar alarms, that the owner refrain from using mirrored or tinted glass, and that the hours of operation be restricted to 4 a.m. to midnight. The Village Board passed the ordinance.

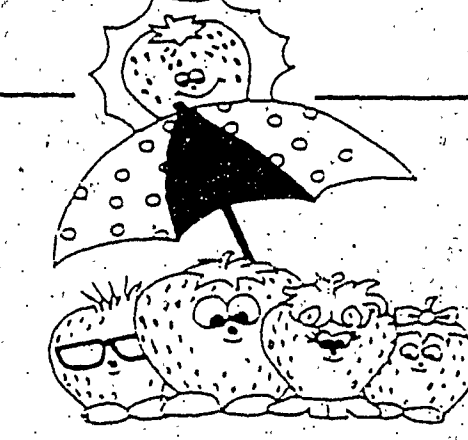
