Niles Park District files suit for Tam condo land

Hoping to thwart a proposed condominium development which would sit a 66-unit condominium complex smack against the park's southern boundary, the Park District has filed a condemnation suit in order to take possession of two acres of property at 7800 Caldwell Avenue, current home of the Moscow Nights restaurant and bar.

The park district was not pleased with development plans to build the complex five feet from the golf course's fifth tee box. The park's concerns, coupled with several questions pertaining to flood planes and water retention, prompted the Niles Plan Commission to delay recommending the development while the issue was addressed at an April meeting. Glenview approves 50% sales tax rebate for ABT

In order to sell the deal on, Abt Electronics Inc.'s move from Skokie to the Village of Glenview, the Board of Trustees unanimously approved an economic agreement at this month's meeting to give the business a 50 percent sales tax rebate once sales reach \$100 million.

According to the agreement, the Village, which receives one percent of all sales taxes, would

World famous Budweiser Clydesdales in Niles 4th of July Parade

The world famous Budweiser Clydesdales, the symbol of quality and tradition for Anheuser-Busch since 1933, are scheduled to make an appearance at the Village of Niles annual 4th of July Parade.

The eight-horse Hitch will be harnessed and hitched to the famous red beer wagon and take to the streets of Niles for the Niles 4th of July parade which takes place on July 4th from 9:30 a.m. to approximately 10:45 a.m.

The Clydesdale appearance in Niles is one of 300 made annually by the five traveling

hitches. Canadians of Scottish descent brought the first Clydesdales to America in the mid-1800's. Today, the draft horses are used primarily for breeding.

The Clydesdales became part

of Anheuser-Busch in 1933, shortly after the death of Mr. Busch's son, William A. Busch, Jr. decided to present a hitch of the mighty horses to his father to commemorate the first bottle of post-prohibition beer brewed in 1933.

Mr. Busch told his father that he had bought a new car and asked him to step outside and take a look at the new vehicle. Instead of a Model "T", Mr. Busch's father gazed upon a Clydesdale hitch pulling a red, white and gold wagon.

Each hitch travels with a

Budweiser dog. In the early days of brewing, Dalhousie were bred and trained to protect the horses and guard the wagon when the driver went inside to make deliveries.

Budweiser Clydesdale travel-

ing hitches are based in St. Louis, MO; Menifee, CA; Merriam, NH; San Antonio, TX; & San Diego, CA. The Budweiser Clydesdales can be seen at the following Anheuser-Busch breweries: St. Louis, MO; Merriam, NH; and Ft. Collins, CO. All the horses in the Clydesdale team can be viewed at Grant's Farm in St. Louis, MO; Tampa, FL; Busch Gardens Williamsburg, VA; Sea World, San Diego, CA; Sea World Orlando, FL; and Sea World, San Antonio, TX.

land and the Midwest.

The hitch even delivered

a case of beer to President

Franklin Delano Roosevelt at

the White House.

Horses chosen for the Bud-

weiser Clydesdale Hitch must be

at least three years of age, stand

approximately 16 -- or six

feet at the shoulder -- and

weigh an average of 2000 pounds,

must be bay in color, have four white

stockings, and a black mane and

tail. A gentle temperament is

very important, as hitch horses

often feed millions of people

each year.

A single Clydesdale hitch

will consume as much as

20-25 quarts of feed, 40-60

pounds of hay and 30 gallons of

water per day.

Each hitch travels with a

Dalmatian dog. In the early days of brewing, Dalmatians were bred and trained to protect the horses and guard the wagon when the driver went inside to make deliveries.



False 'sunburn' may signal onset of facial disorder

What may appear to be a sunburn or prolonged redness of the face this spring may in fact be a well-known but increasingly common skin disorder now estimated to affect more than 13 million Americans.

This disorder, which is chronic and progressive disorder that usually begins after age 30 as a transient redness on the cheeks, nose, chin or forehead, is called rosacea.

It is rapidly expanding as the popular baby boom generation enters the most susceptible age. Over time, the redness becomes permanent, the skin thickened, and tiny visible blood vessels may appear on the surface of the skin.

Without treatment, bumps and pustules often develop and, in advanced cases, the nose may become swollen from excess tissue.

This is the condition Dr. C. Field has termed bulbous nose. In some cases, the eyes also may be affected, appearing watery or bloodshot.

Doctors suggest using medications initially treated with fast-

acting oral and topical antibiotics to bring rosacea under rapid control, followed by long-term therapy.

basements from water that they say came up through the sewers.

In April, The Bugle reported the claims of Niles resident, Cecilia Teppart, who said she had 12 hours of pumping raw sewage out of her basement at the 8200 block of Oketo after the area was hit by severe thunderstorms.

Teppart said she said that Teppart's troubles were not due to damaged Niles sewers, even though Public Services had just requested \$35,000 from Villa Park to help with emergency repairs to damaged sewers on Oricle, just blocks away from Teppart's home.

"Basements flood all the time," he said in April.

Teppart says that she's had two other incidents of flooding since then, most recently this past weekend.

"Once I've got pictures," she said. "There's 3 ft x 3 ft of this black muck that goes right into the sewer drain."

Teppart said that the neighbor directly behind her has an estimate that a \$10,000 worth of damage due to sewer flooding.

Noriega said that when such flooding occurs, residents should contact Public Services so that a sewer crew can be sent out to investigate.

"So far, we only had three complaints and cash the resident was at fault. Either a subpump wasn't connected correctly or there were roots in the line," he said. "People need to take care of what's on top."




