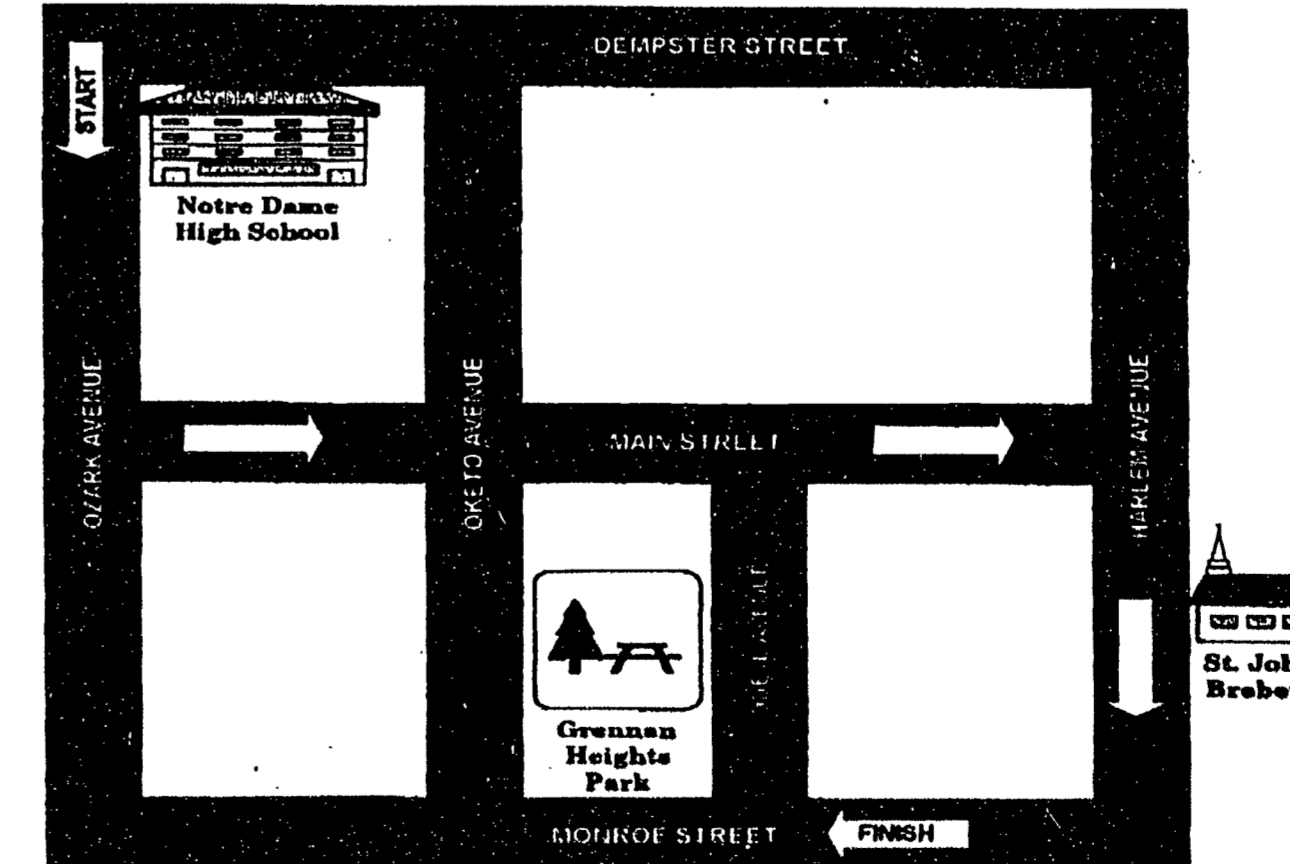

### World famous Budweiser Clydesdales in Niles 4th of July Parade

The world famous Budweiser Clydesdales, the symbol of quality and tradition for Anheuser-Busch since 1933, are scheduled to make an appearance at the Village of Niles annual 4th of July parade.

The eight-horse Hitch will be harnessed and hitched to the famous red beer wagon for participation in the Village of Niles 4th of July parade which takes place on July 4th from 9:30 a.m. to approximately 10:45 a.m.

The Clydesdales' appearance in Niles is one of 300 made annually by the five traveling hitches. Canadians of Scottish descent brought the first Clydesdales to America in the mid-1800s. Today, the giant draft horses are used primarily for breeding and show.


The Clydesdales became part of Anheuser-Busch in 1933, shortly after the repeal of Prohibition. August A. Busch, Jr. decided to present a hitch of the mighty horses to his father to commemorate the first bottle of post-Prohibition beer brewed in St. Louis.

Mr. Busch told his father that he had bought a new car and asked him to stop outside and take a look at the new vehicle. But instead of a Model 'T', Mr. Busch's father gazed upon a Clydesdale hitch pulling a red, white and gold beer wagon.

That was only the beginning. Realizing the advertising and promotional potential of a horse-drawn beer wagon, Mr. Busch had the team sent by rail to New York City, where it picked up two cases of Budweiser beer at New Jersey's Newark Airport. The beer was later presented to Al Smith, former governor of New York and an instrumental force in the repeal of Prohibition.

From there, the Clydesdales continued on a tour of New England and the Middle Atlantic States. The hitch even delivered a case of beer to President Franklin Delano Roosevelt at

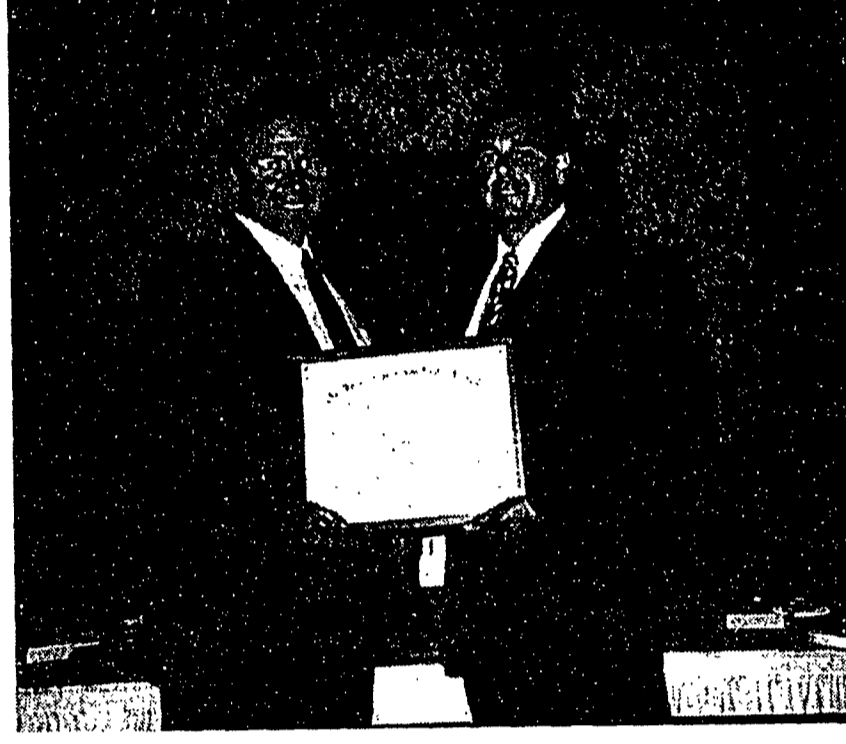

### Morton Grove's pools open successfully

The Morton Grove Park District started its summer season with the opening of the newly renovated Oriole Pool June 3, and Harter Pool on June 10.

Although it was cool, Oriole Pool's opening had 50 people for the ribbon-cutting event, and about 140 people enjoyed the heated water in the pool. The pool did not open in the evening due to the cool weather. The staff received favorable comments on the renovations.

Aquatics classes also began at Oriole Pool with morning and evening classes offered. The new heater in the pool has only been able to keep the water temperature at 77° Fahrenheit because of the 40° nights in the last part of the month. With more summer-like weather, the heater will be able to keep the pool at a toasty 82°.

There are already four rentals for Oriole Pool this year. This is an increase of 100% over last year, when there were two rentals.

All this began in spite of the presence of a leak in the pool, and the need to do some minor finishing work on the remodel. Director Jeff Fougereusse expects the leak to be repaired in the fall, and that it will not affect normal pool operation for the season.

Harter Pool's opening was better attended due to nicer weather. KISSFM-92.7 Radio Station was there from 11:30 to 1:30 handing out prizes. The opening also saw a duck race, where contestants released rubber ducks down the water slide. The first duck down won a prize for its owner. The ducks, which are owned by the Park District, were purchased with a donation from Halogen Supply Company.

Harter Pool also opened in spite of some last minute repairs. The two spray features were not functioning. Director Fougereusse anticipates that the Park District will have them working soon.

### Niles library approves long-range plan

The Niles Public Library District Board approved its long-range plan for programs and services from July through June of 2005.

Library Administrator Cary Czarnecki said that the library tried to develop programs that are appealing and best serve the public.

"One of the things we've done is to use a questionnaire to see what the people want, and that's been very successful."

Based on patron input, the library will continue offering seminars on subjects ranging from financial planning to travel and cooking. Czarnecki said that a recent "nostalgia program" on the Chicago's old Riverview amusement park was a big hit.

In other news, the board submitted its annual application for an Illinois State per capita grant, which factors a municipality's population size, as well as current legislation to determine how much of a grant is given.

Czarnecki said that the Niles Public Library usually receives "in excess of \$67,000" and that he doesn't expect that amount to change.

The funds will be used to purchase library supplies, as well as furniture and updated equipment.

**Half of all U.S. women suffer from anxiety and worry**  
(DM)-Do you experience unrealistic, excessive worry for a period of more than six months? If so, you're not alone.  
Each year, over 10 million Americans battle General Anxiety Disorder (GAD), a common disorder that is much more than everyday worries. GAD is defined as six months or more of overwhelming, unfounded worry accompanied by three or more physical and psychological symptoms. GAD can make it difficult for people to concentrate at work, function at home, and generally get on with their lives. Individuals suffering from GAD often have other medical illnesses, such as irritable bowel syndrome and depression.  
GAD is more common in women than men, and although it's widespread, few people realize that they suffer from a common and treatable disorder.  
In a recent random survey of 1,044 women polled by Braskin Audits and Surveys Worldwide 50 percent reported that they have experienced anxiety symptoms and worry for a period of more than six months. In addition, one out of ten women describes herself as having "unrealistic" or "excessive worry." Furthermore, the majority of the women (70 percent) were not aware that these continuing anxiety symptoms and worry may be caused by GAD.

**More women face embarrassment from conspicuous effects of rosacea**

While in today's world women are increasingly recognized as equals to men, when it comes to rosacea many differences between the sexes appear to exist.  
Of fundamental significance, clinical studies have suggested that rosacea may occur three or four times more often in women than in their male counterparts. This higher susceptibility to rosacea may be due to a number of factors, according to Dr. Jerome Z. Litt, assistant clinical professor of dermatology, Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine, in a recent article in the medical journal *The Female Patient*.  
Not only does rosacea seem to strike women disproportionately to men, but it tends to affect men and women in somewhat different ways. According to a National Rosacea Society survey of 2,157 patients on the pattern of rosacea symptoms, women are more likely to experience symptoms on the cheeks (87 percent of women vs. 68 percent of men) and chin (49 percent vs. 20 percent). On the other hand, men are more often affected by severe symptoms on the nose (21 percent of men vs. 8 percent of women).  
"Although rosacea seems to be more common in women, dermatologists have observed that rosacea tends to be more severe in men," Dr. Litt said. "This may be due in part to a tendency for men to delay seeking medical help until the condition has reached more advanced stages."  
For most sufferers, the onset of rosacea occurs between the ages of 30 and 60 as a facial redness that may come and go. Over time, the redness becomes more persistent, and visible blood vessels may appear. Without treatment, bumps and pimples often develop, and in advanced cases -- especially in men -- the nose may become enlarged from excess tissue.  
In a woman who is at risk for rosacea -- someone who has a tendency to flush a lot, a family history of the condition or a strong stinging reaction to topical skin products -- hot flashes during menopause may actually bring on rosacea's first appearance.

reason for this phenomenon. "Female rosacea sufferers face a distinct set of issues relating to the disease," Dr. Litt said. "Unlike most disorders, rosacea is one that tends to affect men and women differently."  
Nonetheless, clinical studies have found that both men and women benefit equally from medical therapy to help eradicate a broad range of symptoms. Avoiding environmental and lifestyle factors that may aggravate individual conditions also may help to keep rosacea symptoms under control.

### Medical care & prescription drugs available for free

Financial Assistance Network in Washington, DC has just published a new booklet, "Free & Low Cost Medical Care." The booklet includes information on a how and where to get free and low cost medical care under the Federal Hill-Burton program.

The Hill-Burton program has been in effect for over 50 years providing more than 35 billion dollars in free and low cost care to qualified participants. The program was established in 1946 to assist in the construction and modernization of hospitals and medical care facilities. Nearly 6 billion dollars in grants and loans were given to 7,000 facilities in over 4,000 communities. In exchange, the facilities agreed to provide a reasonable amount of services to persons residing in the local community who are unable to pay.

There are currently 687 facilities that provide free or low cost medical care. Over 1100 prescription drugs are also available for free or very low cost to qualified individuals. Unfortunately, many qualified people do not take advantage of these programs because there is rarely any publicity to inform the public, says Paul Nevezal,

### False 'sunburn' may signal onset of facial disorder

What may appear to be a sunburn or prolonged redness of the face this spring or summer could be a warning sign of rosacea, a little-known but increasingly common skin disorder now estimated to affect more than 13 million Americans.

Rosacea is a chronic and progressive disorder that usually begins after age 30 as a transient redness on the cheeks, nose, chin or forehead, and its incidence is now rapidly expanding as the populous baby boom generation enters the most susceptible age. Over time, the redness becomes more persistent and noticeable, and tiny visible blood vessels may appear on the surface of the skin.

Without treatment, bumps and pimples often develop and, in advanced cases, the nose may become swollen from excess tissue. This is the condition that gave comedian W. C. Fields his trademark bulbous nose. In some cases, the eyes also may be affected, appearing watery or bloodshot.

Dermatologists usually prescribe initial treatment with fast-acting oral and topical antibiotics to bring rosacea under rapid control, followed by long-term therapy with the topical medication alone to maintain remission. Rosacea sufferers are also advised to identify and avoid lifestyle and environmental factors that seem to aggravate their individual conditions.

### Holy Family offers tips for a safe Fourth of July

Firework-related injuries are growing. Recently, the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission reported 8,300 injuries related to fireworks, eye injuries accounted for 25 percent. These figures do not include those treated in non-emergency room settings or those left untreated.

As a community service, Holy Family Medical Center's Emergency Department offers these Prevent Blindness America® fireworks safety tips:

- Do not delay medical attention even for mild injuries. "Mildly" damaged areas can worsen and end in serious vision loss, even blindness, that might not have happened if treatment had occurred immediately.
- Stay calm, do not panic.
- Do not rub the eye. If any eye tissue is torn, rubbing might cause more damage. Trying to rub the eye is an automatic response to pain, but pressure will only do more harm.
- Do not attempt to rinse out the eye. This can be even more damaging than rubbing.
- Shield the eye from pressure. Tape or secure the bottom of a foam cup, milk carton or similar shield against the bones surrounding the eye: brow, cheek and bridge of the nose.
- Avoid giving aspirin or ibuprofen (or other non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs, called "N-SAIDS") to try to reduce the pain. They thin the blood and might increase bleeding. Acetaminophen is the over-the-counter drug of choice, although non-prescription painkillers will not be of much help. It is better to by-pass the drugstore or medicine cabinet and get to the emergency room right way.

• Do not apply ointment or any medication to the eyes. It is probably not sterile. Also, ointments make the eye area slippery. This could slow the doctor's examination at a time when every second counts.

• Above all, do not let your child play with fireworks. Do not use them yourself and keep family members away from those who do. Even sparklers are dangerous. They burn up to 1800 degrees Fahrenheit - hot enough to melt gold.

If an emergency situation arises, please seek medical attention immediately. Physicians and nurses specially trained in emergency medicine at Holy Family Medical Center are available to care for any problem you feel needs urgent attention. Holy Family's Emergency Department, 100 N. River Rd., Des Plaines, is a state-designated Level II Trauma Center ready to handle emergencies 24 hours a day.

#### Morton Grove Community Church commissions youth for ASP

Morton Grove Community Church is sending ten commissioned members to participate in the Appalachia Service Project (ASP), this August. ASP is a ministry to make homes warmer, safer and drier in the Central Appalachia region of the United States. The participants from Morton Grove Community Church are members of the High School Youth Group, AWIP - A Work in Progress.

Appalachia Service Project is a Christian ministry which began in 1969. Its mission is to build relationships, faith, and neighborhood while building or repairing houses for low-income families in Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia. Each year more than 10,000 high school youth with their adult advisers from approximately 500 churches across the country travel to work in Central Appalachia with ASP. AWIP, the youth from Morton Grove Community Church will be serving with ASP for the first time this year.

The pastor of Morton Grove Community Church, Rev. Michael Winters states, "We have two mission teams preparing for a week of service in West Virginia. The members of these

teams are studying the culture and history of Central Appalachia. They are also learning building techniques. I am pleased to announce that two members of the congregation have invited our ASP teams to their homes for on-the-job training. With expert supervision, the two teams will replace a kitchen floor and repair plaster walls. No doubt, ASP is a good and helpful thing our young people are doing. I am certain that the experience of ASP will develop a deeper Christian faith and more active desire for servant-hood in the youth of our church."

"Of course, funding activities are on-going," explains Pastor Winters. "Our ASP budget is nearly \$5,000 which covers, in the main, participation fees, room and board, and travel expenses. Members of the congregation have been buying shares in the mission teams at \$5 each. Other fund-raisers have been a congregational breakfast on Easter morning and a Family Games Night. There is a special and on-going effort called Rent-A-Teen in which ASP volunteers earn money for the mission by doing odd jobs. Two car-

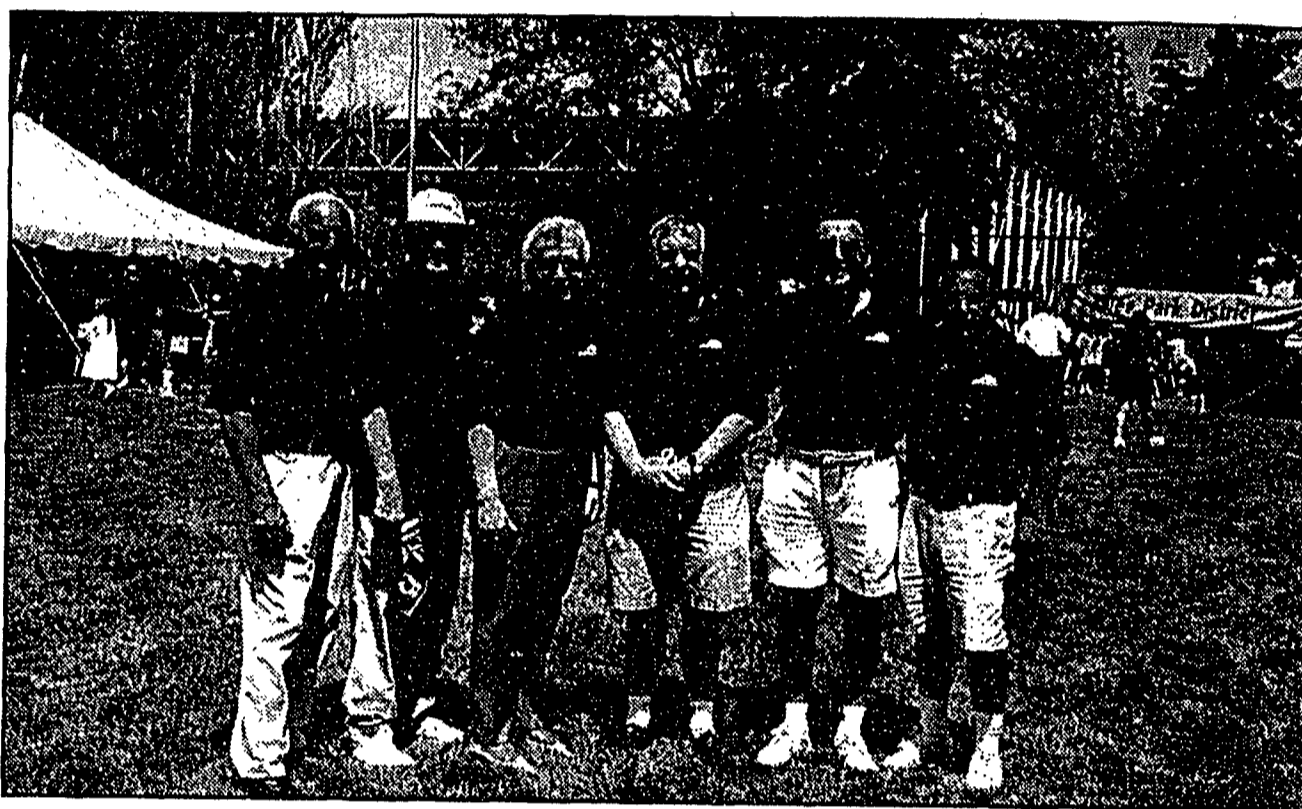

The tower design was chosen by the original owner Robert Liggett to honor the famous scientist Vincenzo Galileo or Galilei, 1564-1642. Galileo was an astronomer and developer of telescopes, and a professor at the University of Pisa in 1589.

basements from water that they say came up through the sewers. In April, the Bugle reported the claims of Niles resident, Cecilia Teppart, who spent 12 hours pumping raw sewage out of her basement at the 8200 block of Oketo after the area was hit by severe thunderstorms. At the time, Noriega said that Teppart's troubles were not due to damaged Niles sewers, even though Public Services had just requested \$35,000 from the Village for emergency repairs to damaged sewers on Oketo, just blocks away from Teppart's home. "Basements flood all the time," he said in April. Teppart says that she's had two other incidents of flooding since then, most recently this past weekend. "This time I've got pictures," she said. "There's 3ft x 3ft of this black muck that goes right to the sewer drain."

Teppart said that the neighbor directly behind her has an estimated \$10,000 worth of damage due to sewer flooding. Noriega said that when such flooding occurs, residents need to contact Public Services so that a sewer crew can be sent out to investigate. "So far I've only had three complaints and each time the resident was at fault. Either a subpump wasn't connected correctly or there were roots in the line," he said. "People need to

realize that they are responsible for some of the maintenance themselves."

Noriega said that Progress is also to blame for Niles' beleaguered sewer system. "Once a house in Niles covered 25 percent of the property. Now with expanding garages and driveways and decks, 75 percent of the property is covered," he said. "When all of that ground is replaced with concrete, the water can't get absorbed and it flows faster into the sewers."

Lack of funding makes sewer repairs slow work. Noriega estimates that it will cost upwards of \$15 million dollars to repair the sewers beneath Oketo. But he is determined to find a solution, though he said that it will take some time. "We (Public Services) do all of the work ourselves," he said. "We put the video camera into the sewer and televise the line. If we see a problem, we go in and clean it."

This summer's sewer project will involve lining 19,866 feet of sewer at a cost of \$850,000. In addition, Niles is spending \$3,432,500 on watermain construction and another \$1,910,000 for street resurfacing throughout the Village.

"The most important thing is preventive maintenance of the sewers," said Noriega. "We want what's under the street to be just as nice as what's on top."

Eppley was a 1942 graduate of Ohio State University, where he was president of the Kappa Sigma fraternity, a member of the Rempho's Bucket and Dipper, and Sphinx honorary societies, as well as a national collegiate singer. He sang the National Anthem at a 1982 Cubs game.

lect a total of \$11 million within a 15-year period.

In order to assure that Abt stays in Glenview that long, the rebate will be reduced if the business leaves the Village within 15 years. If Abt chooses to relocate within five years, it will not receive any rebate.

Abt Electronics Inc. President Robert Abt said that his company needed the rebate to help finance moving and expansion costs for the business, which plans to construct a 50,000 square-foot show room and 270,000 square-foot warehouse on Milwaukee Ave., just north of the former Zenith building, now Aon Corp.

Some Glenview residents expressed concern that so much tax revenue will be diverted from the Village to a single business. But estimates show that Glenview should receive substantial income from Abt sales taxes - up to \$900,000 annually.

In addition, property taxes are estimated to bring Glenview School High School District 225 over \$400,000, and Glenbrook High School District 225 may see as much as \$700,000 in revenue from the development.

Abt plans to start construction in September and hopes to open by August 2001.

to meeting standards."

LoVerde said that Niles currently falls below the standard set by the Department of Parks and Recreation, which holds that there should be a certain amount of recreational area available per 1,000 residents.

According to the suit filed with the Cook County Circuit Court, the park district would pay landowners "just compensation" for the land to be used as "open space and/or recreational facilities."

While how much the park district will pay for the land is not yet known, LoVerde said that acquisition of property to expand the park's growing basketball and gymnastics programs is a top priority.

The park district expects the Circuit Court to set a hearing date on the matter within the next 12 to 18 months.

### How a Compost Bin can help your garden

Homeowners plant and tend gardens to beautify their homes, and for the spiritual satisfaction it gives them. And experienced gardeners know that compost added to a garden makes flowers fuller and vegetables bigger. But what is compost, and how do you make it?

Compost is a substance resulting from the decomposition of organic matter such as leaves, shredded wood, old roots, grass clippings, fruit peels, coffee grounds and other materials that are vegetable in origin. Composting creates humus,

which adds essential nutrients to the soil, you can buy it by the bag at a garden-supply center or make your own. Gardens thrive with the help of a compost pile. Compost supplies plants with food and improves soil structure. It also helps retain rainfall and plant foods. Building a compost pile is not an exact process. It can be started at any time of the year, but fall is usually the best time. There are various ways to make a compost bin, and the cost is minimal. Most homeowners

have odds and ends of lumber or cement blocks around the house that would be suitable for a compost bin. Be sure the bin is not airtight - composting requires oxygen for decomposition to take place. And don't put a bottom on it; that way, the nutrients will enter the soil directly. As you pile refuse into the bin, add a layer of 10-10-10 fertilizer evenly over the top of the rotting matter. Cover the refuse with two inches of soil, and then sprinkle two cups of hydrated lime on top of that. Continue to build successive layers of refuse about 12 inches high, repeating the fertilizer, soil and lime process. The fertilizer hastens the process of decay. When the pile is four to five feet high, let it decay for three or four months. When it is soft and crumbly, the compost material is ready for use. Besides the joy it provides gardeners who see their plants bloom and grow to their fullest with composted material. ### Safety tips for being handy in the home

For those who are handy, safety is no accident when doing repairs and making improvements in the home. More accidents occur in the home than in the workplace. To help you practice safety first, here are some suggestions from the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP). "Wear appropriate safety equipment and observe safety advice and proper use of equipment. Establish a routine that makes safety automatic, and never use a tool you are unfamiliar with or perform a task you are unqualified to do."

**Power Tools** Use a tool only for its intended purpose, applying the force it was built to withstand. When working with machinery, tie back long hair, wear close-fitting clothing and remove jewelry. Never drink alcohol when operating equipment or using power tools. "Maintain tools in proper working condition, and perform proper routine maintenance. Regularly inspect tools, cords, and accessories, and immediately repair or replace broken equipment and tools. "Only use attachments authorized by the manufacturer. "Never alter a tool in a manner that reduces its safety. "Keep tools, equipment, and supplies neatly stored in locked cabinets or drawers between uses. "Avoid distractions when using power equipment. "When using a cutting tool, always aim the edge away from your body. "Ladders When using a ladder, remember to think "safety" first. Inspect it to make sure it's in good working condition, and always use the right type of ladder. Place it on firm, even ground. Face a ladder when climbing up or down, and hold the side rails with both hands. Never stand on the top rung. Keep aluminum ladders away from power lines, and never use them to do electric work, because they conduct electricity. "Make work areas as safe as possible," said Dr. Harris. "Never leave garden tools or extension cords lying around, and return tools after each use. Establish and maintain proper lighting levels, and replace electric cords that are frayed or the insulation is breaking." 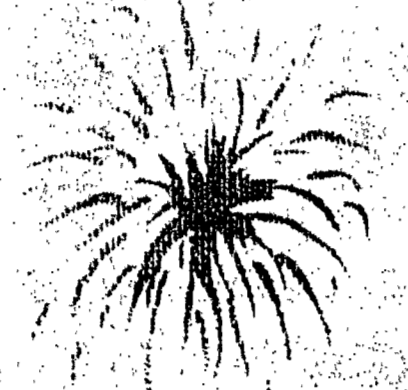

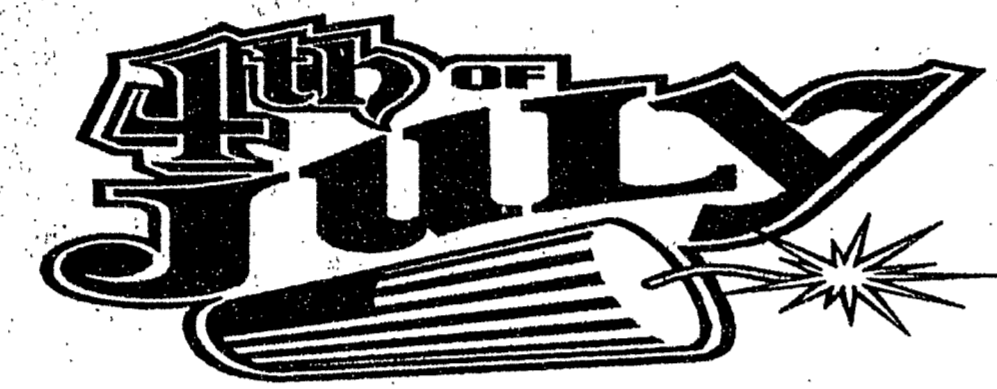

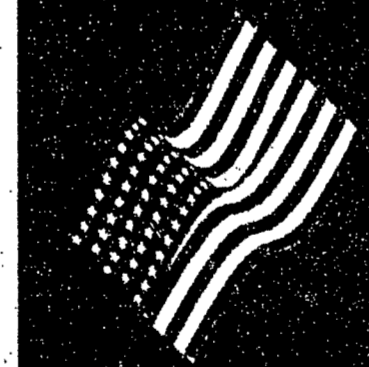
