by Lisa Ashkenaz Croke In an effort to reduce utility costs, the Village of Niles and Niles Park District have discussed joining a consortium comprised of the City of Chicago and other suburbs which will allow the municipalies to receive a better price for electricity.

Niles currently has a franchise agreement with Commonwealth Niles Police Department is host- Edison that provides free electricity for all municipal buildings. At Lehigh and Devon/Caldwell, when the railroad

gates go down (and after a few seconds) the lights for Lehigh Avenue turn green. This allows traffic to proceed parallel with the railroad tracks or to turn away from the railroad tracks, while the gates are down. That's

At Lehigh and Touhy, and at Lehigh and Howard, all lights stay red when the railroad gates are down. Why? That's not logical.

According to records kept at the Illinois Department of Transportation, all the Lehigh Avenue traffic signals at Touhy, Howard and Oakton were revised in 1986 to have them turn red at the entire intersection whenever trains pass. There is no additional written information on the matter since files are routinely purged at the department after seven years.

Dave Ziesemer, traffic signal engineer for District 1, which includes Cook County and the surrounding counties, remembers the change. He says that the change took place for safety reasons:

"If I remember correctly, there was a meeting between the Village of Niles and the State of Illinois after one or more accidents at those intersections," he explained. The accidents apparently revolved around southbound traffic on Lehigh Avenue that would turn onto the left, ungated portion of the roadway. The resulting confusion on the part of drivers caused at least one accident involving a train and a car, according to Ziesemer.

"After that, they decided to change the signal sequence to prevent further accidents," Ziesemer said.

The Lehigh and Devon/Caldwell intersection, on the other hand, is controlled by the City of Chicago. "Unless they see a pattern of accidents there, they would have no reason to change those signals," Ziesemer said. He noted, however, that trains are apt to be slower moving since there is an upcoming station in that area.

• Use protective equipment. Using the appropriate equipment is one of the best ways to avoid injury. Bike helmets, knee and elbow pads, and protective eyewear can prevent serious harm

If you or a child is faced with a possible bone fracture, seek trauma assistance immediately and follow up with an orthopedic physician. It used to be that osteoporosis was considered a disease that affected only the elderly. Osteoporosis was associated with older womer whose backs were hunched and who could no longer stand up straight. The truth is that an estimated 20 million American women suffer from osteoporosis, and 80 percent of them don't even know it.

Osteoporosis is a chronic, progressive condition that steals bone from the body, leading to fractures of the hip, spine and wrist. One in two women and one in eight men will suffer from an osteoporosis-related fracture in his or her lifetime.

Many people confuse osteoporosis with arthritis, and wait for swollen joints and discomfort before being tested. Even though osteoporosis is painless until a bone fracture occurs, it is important to find out how healthy your bones are now and if need be, adjust your lifestyle to avoid this brittle bone disease. Follow these tips to maintain healthy bones:

 Start a regular exercise program. Exercising for 20 minutes, three times a week, reduces the risk of osteoporosis. • Those with severe osteoporosis and who have suffered from fractures may find Tai Chi, a form of martial arts, to be a beneficial

strength training exercise system. • Be careful when bending and lifting heavy objects, including grandchildren. Bend from the knees, not the waist.

 Be sure to include calcium in your daily diet. Use a calcium supplement that's highly absorbable, such as microcrystalline hydroxyapatite concentrate (MCHC). But don't
overdo it. Taking more than the recommended amount of calcium may cause kidney stones.

• Eat a healthy, balanced diet, including fresh vegetables, fruit, nuts and seeds. • Drink 8 eight-ounce glasses of water a day. Avoid caffeine, carbonated sodas, alcohol, baked goods and junk food.

 Watch your animal protein intake. • Watch your animal protein intake.

According to the memo, home sales in Niles have increased by 13.4 percent and condo sales have increased by 13.3 percent throughout the village. Yet the memo fails to note whether high traffic areas near new condominium developments.
