



Local realtor recalls 30 years of change

Born in Edison Park in 1949 and raised in Niles, local Re/ Max agent, Ken Welter, of Re/ Max Properties Northwest in Park Ridge, has seen the business change dramatically since he first became licensed back in 1970. "When I first started working in my father's small real estate office at the corner of Milwaukee and Harlem Avenues, there were no real estate franchises," Welter says. "In those days, your reputation either made you or broke you," he

"We live in a brand name society today, where brand names like Re/Max, Century 21, Coldwell Banker, and Prudential stick in the minds of the consumer and not necessarily the agent's reputation, and I'm not so sure that's good," says Welter.

"A few years ago, all the mul-tiple listings in 6 Chicago area counties joined forces and formed a huge regional multiple listing service, which actually helps the seller because of increased exposure to more real estate agents," Welter states. "We didn't have pagers when I started my career, and now most top producers have cellular telephones, voice mail, e-mail, and we have our own websites," Welter adds. "We've seen 700% increases in property values, caused mostly by the baby boom generation and their kids buying real estate over the past 30 years, and the prices are still rising," says Welter. "The biggest change has been the Internet explosion," he concludes.
