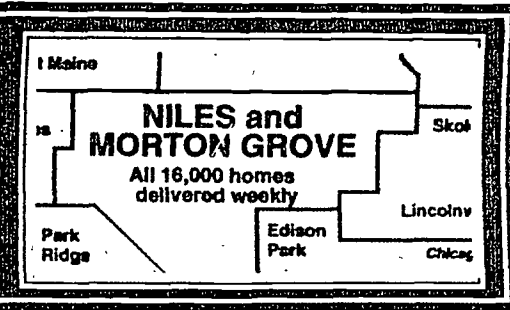

Dist. 63 hopes to begin Gemini addition in Nov.

While construction has yet to begin on Gemini Junior High School's expansion and renovation project, officials at Gemini Junior High School have tentatively set groundbreaking ceremonies for November 1.

Legat Architects, the firm awarded the design bid for the project last month, plans to submit a design development package to Dist. 63 within the next two weeks, and hopes to have

general construction bids awarded by mid-October.

The district has already approved initial designs of the budgeted \$6.5 million project, which includes a brand-new double gymnasium and a two-story addition, which should house as many as 12 new classrooms by construction's end.

The project is expected to be completed in time for the 2001-2002 school year.

Niles scores points in growth survey

When it comes to offering services for new residents, the Village of Niles looks like it's in pretty good shape according to a Sensible Growth survey distributed by the Northwest Municipal Conference.

The survey is designed to discover how local communities maintain services for current residents and attract new ones.

The NWMC commended the village for meeting two of its criteria for sensible growth: providing affordable housing for residents wanting to work within the community and providing

residents with an alternative to automobile transportation.

While Niles' recent boom of multi-family housing is primarily occupied by retired seniors, the centrally located condos and townhouses received the credit for meeting the NWMC housing criteria.

The Niles Free Bus was praised for making residents less dependent on automobiles and is considered unique in the Northwest suburbs. Schaumburg is in the process of considering development of a trolley system to

Police said that Marlena S. Portnoy, 33, allegedly began funneling money in 1998 from a client's trust fund into her personal bank account. She also took money from a company account that she had clients deposit money into on the pretense

This follows revelations that subcontractors working for Nicor neglected to clean mercury spills in area homes when old gas meters were removed.

Nicor has agreed to pay for hospital testing of these Park

Ridge residents.

The homes possibly contaminated in Park Ridge are on Brophy Avenue between Higgins

and Devon.

A number of families have been forced to leave their homes

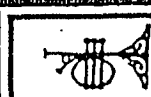
Tam O'Shanter hosts Illinois Junior Golf Association (IJGA) Youth Event

Lutheran General Hospital employees receive promotions

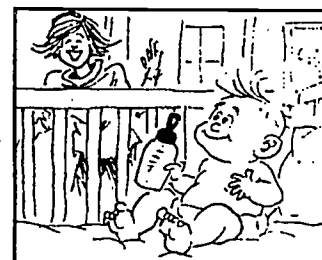

St. Francis announces NEW ERA of saving heart attack patients

Each year in the United States alone, approximately 1.2 million people suffer from heart attacks. Just less than half of those who suffer a heart attack do not survive, many because they failed to heed warning signs and delayed seeking treatment for as long as two hours after symptoms first appeared.

In an effort to narrow the gap between onset of heart attack symptoms and the administration of life-saving treatment, St. Francis Hospital, Chicago's leading center for exceptional cardiac care, is introducing the follow-up phase of the ground-breaking study dubbed, NEW ERA.

The initial study, "Now Evaluate Chest Pain With the Aid of Rapid Assays and 12-Lead ECG for diagnosis of Chest Pain in the Ambulance" (NEW ERA), enabled heart attack patients to be definitively diagnosed en route to the emergency department, thereby reducing time to treatment once that patient had arrived at the hospital. The follow-up phase of the study, which began February 1, emphasizes early treatment of patients who rule positively for a heart attack while en route to the hospital.

Once a patient is definitively diagnosed as having a heart attack or an evolving acute coronary syndrome, highly-trained paramedics transporting the patient will administer the drug Integrilin. Because of its blood-

thinning properties Integrilin is often called a "super aspirin." By preventing platelets from clumping together it promotes the re-establishment of blood flow to the heart, saving precious time and muscle and increasing the patient's chances for survival.

Investigators of the new study will enroll 200 patients over a period of six months to a year. Patients will be enrolled through the Lincolnwood Fire Department's ambulance service, who will transport study patients exclusively to St. Francis Hospital.

The original study was the first of its kind to combine the use of an FDA-approved Rapid Bedside Qualitative Cardiac Marker Assay with a 12-Lead ECG both administered before the patient ever reaches the hospital for the most complete and accurate evaluation of chest pain. The follow-up phase is also evolutionary as it is the first time that a drug of this type has been administered in the

pre-hospital arena.

The NEW ERA studies accelerates treatment, beyond the latest recommendations of the American College of Cardiology, which advises no more than 30 minutes should pass from the time a patient enters the hospital to the moment that patient begins receiving treatment for a blocked artery.

The follow-up phase of the NEW ERA study is the latest step in what has been an ongoing effort to improve the heart attack patient's diagnosis and treatment options. The team of healthcare professionals managing the study includes: Shahnar Dadkhah, M.D.; Glenn Aldinger, M.D., Chairman, Department of Emergency Medicine at St. Francis Hospital of Evanston and EMS Project Medical Director; Mary Ann Marcotte, R.N., EMS Administrative Director and Cynthia Fisch, R.N., research coordinator of the study.

and are now living in hotels. Nicor Gas is accepting responsibility for mercury spills and possible contamination in some of its 1.9 million customer homes.

Problems were first brought to light a month ago when Nicor was notified by a family in Mt. Prospect of a detected mercury spill. Four Mt. Prospect home-

owners were affected and have not returned to their homes.

The mercury spills occurred during a two-year-old Nicor campaign to replace older indoor mercury-regulated gas meters from basements to outside meters. About 2 tablespoons of mercury was contained in these meters.

she had been employed for almost three years.

The firm, which specializes in estate planning and living trusts, filed a civil suit against Portnoy in June and has already recovered more than \$1 million.

As of Saturday, Portnoy was being held at the Metropolitan Correctional Center on \$100,000 bail.

and are now living in hotels. Nicor Gas is accepting responsibility for mercury spills and possible contamination in some of its 1.9 million customer homes.

Problems were first brought to light a month ago when Nicor was notified by a family in Mt. Prospect of a detected mercury spill. Four Mt. Prospect home-

owners were affected and have not returned to their homes.

The mercury spills occurred during a two-year-old Nicor campaign to replace older indoor mercury-regulated gas meters from basements to outside meters. About 2 tablespoons of mercury was contained in these meters.

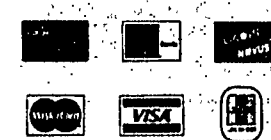
