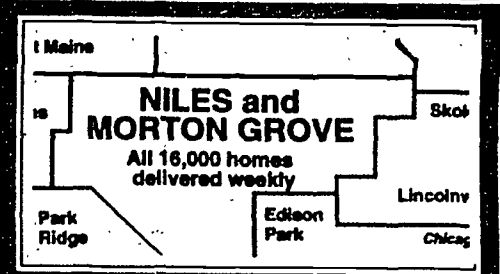

Townhome plan adjoining Abbey Manor is defeated

The address 7456 Waukegan Road is high-profile these days. Thanks to development and zoning issues, interest in this property is higher than one might expect for an unassuming brick bungalow. Zoned B2, this lot could accommodate a small business; however, about three months ago developers requested a zoning change to allow eight multi-family townhomes built on the property. The number of units dwindled

from eight to five after the Niles Plan Commission heard residents protests during its July meeting. In their recent meeting, trustees of the Niles Village Board unanimously denied the request after an hour's discussion. Trustee Tom Bondi expressed his opinion that the area should remain homes and condominiums and that townhomes should not be allowed in that area "at this moment." Trustee Andrew

Ameritech presents MG Park Dist. with easement proposal

Within an otherwise lean agenda, commissioners of the Morton Grove Park District heard an offer to buy easement rights on two district properties from a consultant representing Ameritech. The communications giant requested easement access to sites at Mansfield and Oketo Parks, 5830 Church and 8950 Oketo, to install fiber optic equipment in underground vaults and related HVAC equipment in aboveground cabi-

nets. Eric Baumbach of CRI in Glendale Heights, the agent soliciting for these sites, said that Ameritech is offering a one-time payment of \$14,000 per site, plus an additional \$1,000 per site landscaping allowance for the HVAC cabinet, which stands 3.5 feet above ground. Ameritech has increased its offer from \$7,000 per site, Baumbach said.

Mark Lewis, 33, of Chicago alleged to be rapist linked to Niles, MG attacks; suspect employed at Evanston Hospital

Grand jury returns 212 charges against Lewis

Serial rape suspect Mark Anthony Lewis, who allegedly attacked women in Niles, Morton Grove and nearby communities, heard results of grand jury deliberations last week. He is charged with a string of sexual assaults against nine women, mostly members of the Asian-American community.

With Lewis' mother and sister present in the courtroom, grand jurors returned nine separate indictments with 212 criminal counts against Lewis, according to Assistant State's Attorney Mark Cavins. Because the victims were noticeably targeted from within an ethnic group, an additional hate crime charge is

added to the mix, which will effectively change some misdemeanors to felonies. Lewis' attorney, Robert

Sharp, commented that by seeking over 200 charges against his client, prosecutors show a weak

name only) begged Target's security staff to call the police, but they were reluctant because the individual had committed no offense, so she placed a call to Niles police herself.

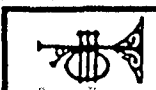

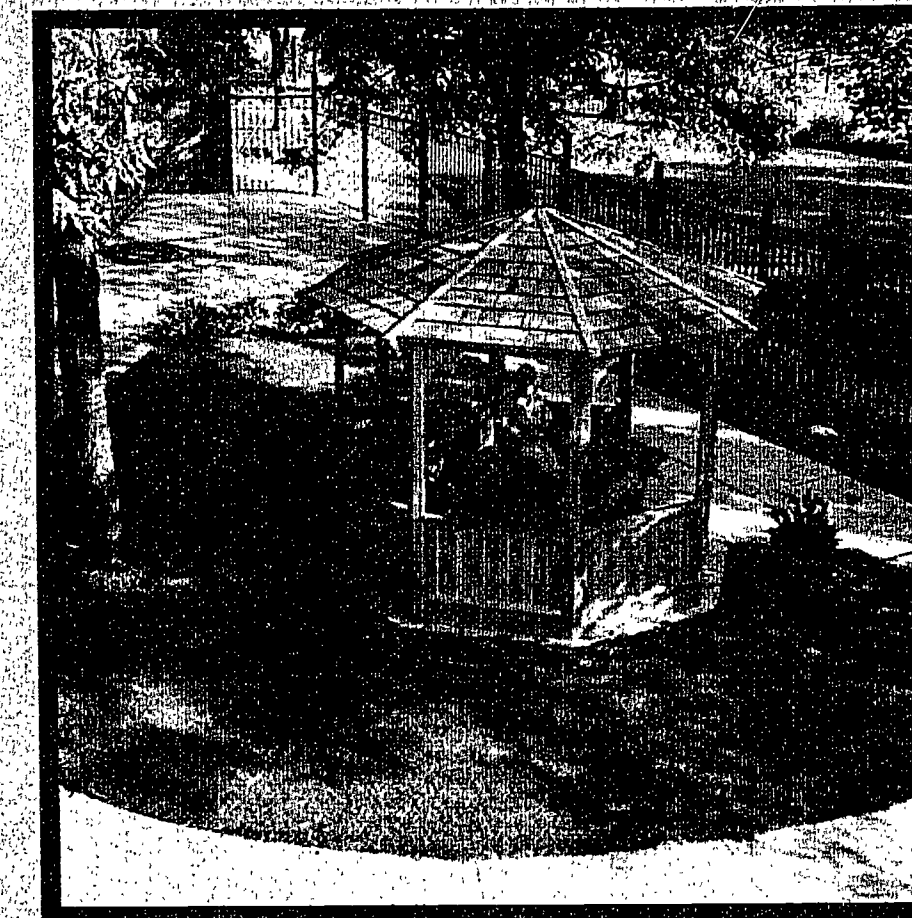

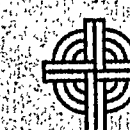

What you should know about club drugs

With school back in session, parents and students alike need to be more aware of the new "SOCIAL" drugs available out on the street. In the family of "DATE RAPE" drugs, there are two (2) drugs whose popularity has been growing due to the misleading talk that it is harmless and safe. The first drug is MDMA (a psychoactive drug), more commonly known as ECSTASY, X or XTC and the other, GHB (a central nervous system depressant), also known as G, LIQUID ECSTASY or GEORGIA HOME BOY.

These drugs are being distributed at local parties, often without the user being aware they have ingested them as it is put in their drink. Both come in various forms including tablets, powder but most commonly in a clear liquid. GHB is easily made from various local household poisons/chemicals and is often stored or unsuspiciously carried in a bottled water container that we see everyone holding.

Ecstasy will provide the effects of relaxation, energy or feelings of trust while GHB's desired effects are intoxication, sedation or a feeling of Euphoria. These drugs are often found in dance

clubs as the user thinks they provide the feeling of energy and enhance their dance experience. Additionally, they are very prevalent at a RAVE, an illegal dance party held at an abandon warehouse where drugs and alcohol are in abundance with the under aged attendees.

Unfortunately, there are sights out there who report benefits of using recreational or club drugs as well as give false tips on using club drugs safely, but in reality there have been numerous reported deaths directly related to these drugs.

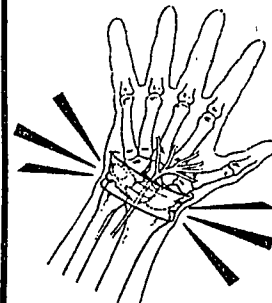

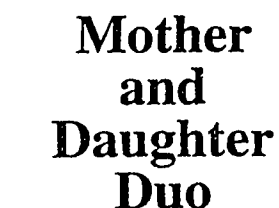

Obsessive Compulsive Anonymous

Often called the doubting disease, OCD is characterized by recurrent, unwanted and unpleasant thoughts (obsessions), and/or repetitive, ritualistic behaviors, which the person feels driven to perform (compulsions). People with OCD know their obsessions and compulsions are irrational or excessive, yet find they have little or no control over them.

Typical Obsessions: Dirt,

germs, contaminations; fear of acting on violent or aggressive impulses; feeling overly responsible for the safety of others -- for example, unreasonable fear of having run over someone with a car; abhorrent religious (blasphemous) and sexual thoughts; inordinate concerns with order, arrangement, or symmetry; inability to discard useless or worn out possessions, overly moralistic.

Typical Compulsions: Excessive washing, checking and repetitive actions, such as touching, counting, ordering or hoarding; mental compulsions (such as replaying a situation over and over till it feels resolved or "right"); needing reassurance from people (asking the same question over and over).

Please note that this disorder takes many forms and the above are some of the typical symptoms seen. If you think you may suffer from this painful disorder, there is hope!

Dear Editor:

My recent experiences on airlines assures me that, if you fly coach, you will receive none of the service the airlines once boasted of.

I have repeatedly seen passengers ring for a steward or stewardess and ask for something simple such as a cup of coffee or a glass of wine. If this request comes before the staff has come down the aisle with their drink cart they automatically ask, 'Would you mind waiting just a few minutes until we come by with drinks?' This is a very reasonable request. Unfortunately, the passenger always has to wait much longer than 'a few minutes.'

At first glance, my complaint seems trite. However, I believe, the airlines now allow their staff to simply not provide service to coach passengers if a request interferes with the sequence of their procedures.

I am told by airlines staff that they are much busier than in the past since the airlines now fill every seat on every plane. If this is so, I believe this refusal to provide service to coach passengers is the agreed upon solution to handling full planes.

I might also mention, I was on an American Airlines flight from London to Chicago last year when the passenger next to me asked the stewardess for a gin and tonic. When the drink arrived it was vodka, not gin. When the stewardess returned with the correct drink she slammed it down in front of the passenger in disgust.

What amazes me is that we docile passengers are willing to put up with this poor service. Our airline tickets are expensive, and for the price the service we receive is quite inadequate.

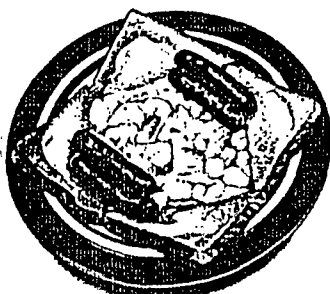

Our Savior Lutheran School was established in 1924 and classes were held in the Our Savior Lutheran Church that was adjacent to the parsonage. A separate school was built in 1928 and expanded in 1957. Most recently, school and church officials have presented plans to relocate the school as an addition to Our Savior Lutheran Church of Norwood Park, 6099 N. Northcott Ave., Chicago, which has been serving the Norwood Park community since 1921. The concept of uniting the school and church again reflects the original plan that began in 1924. 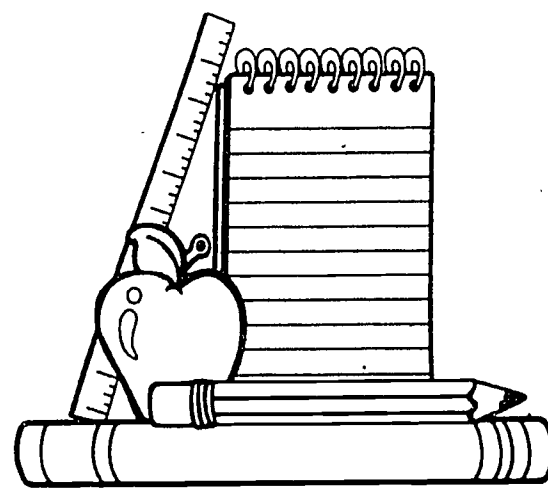

Changing the company style

I am president of a large energy company that has undergone massive changes in recent years. Not only have we had to cope with deregulation, but we've also had several mergers in just two years. It's been chaotic and often required a dictatorial presence just to ensure we remained legal. Now, things seem to be settling down, but we're still seeing a lot of employee turnover. My human resources manager says people aren't happy with the management style at the company. I've always specialized in corporate mergers, so I haven't had the experience of "translating" a company to become more worker friendly. Where should I start?

Timothy

A. Congratulations on recognizing the need for change at your company. As you've discovered, unique situations sometimes require that we just buckle down and get the job done. However, the dictatorial, military model of management rarely works over the long term if you want to continue growing the company. You need every bit of energy and creativity your employees can contribute to remain competitive in today's fast-moving, highly competitive business world.

Change will not occur overnight at your company, no matter what you do. However, if

you take the following steps, employees will notice the difference:

1. Build a core team of leaders in the company. These leaders should be drawn from all ranks, not just top management. Choose the natural leaders as well as those in highly influential positions, such as plant supervisors. Your job is to convince this group of the need for change and to agree on how the change will occur.

2. Communicate the importance of your vision. Make every employee responsible for the changes you will be implementing. Your core team will simply be the role models. Explain how important this is to the company.

3. Listen to the employees. You've already begun this, but I'd encourage you to take it a step further. Take your leadership team out into the plant and all your peripheral offices. Hold meetings with all employees, reassuring them that there will be no repercussions for anything negative that's said. Announce an open-door policy and stick to it. Listen to every idea that's presented without criticizing it.

4. Ensure respect for individuals. The major problem with a dictatorial workplace is that employees feel a total lack of respect. After all, even the smallest decisions were made for them. To turn this around, begin with praise, and encouragement. Let each individual

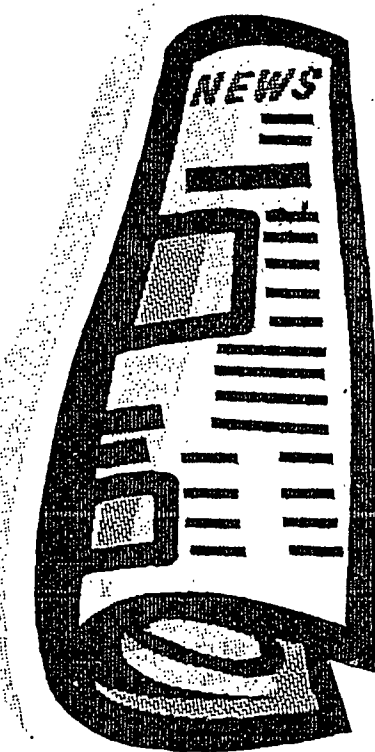
