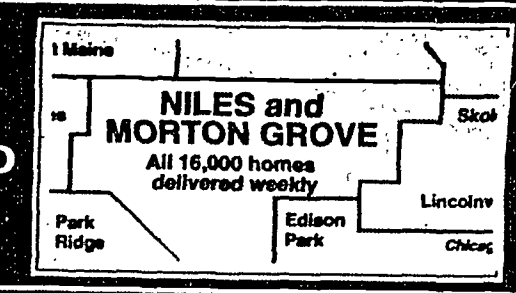

Area family files suit against Nicor

The William Habetler family of Park Ridge, concerned about what long-range effects will result from mercury exposure within their home, has filed suit against Nicor.

The Habetlers, with their three children, vacated their home in mid-August after Nicor detected mercury. They have not been back since.

The children have had sleeping problems, said their mother, Teri. She believes mercury contributed to her digestive problems during a recent pregnancy. The 3-month-old baby also has experienced digestive problems, she said. The family complains of fatigue, anxiety and forgetful-

ness.
The suit alleges that Nicor and its contractor, Henkels & McCoy, were negligent in re-

moving a gas regulator.
Nicor has found mercury at just under 2% of the homes in-

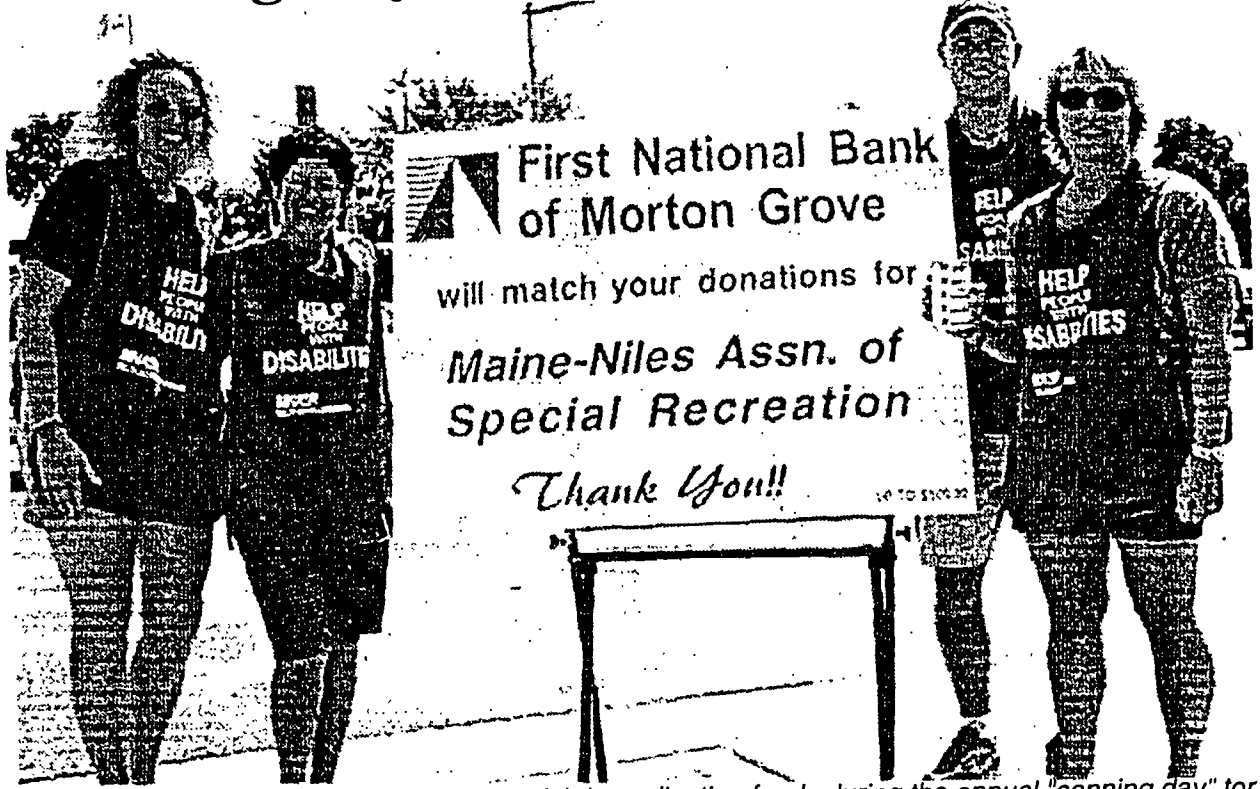

Agency serving adults with developmental disabilities opens new home in Park Ridge

For 38-year-old Mark Amidei, a life-long resident of Park Ridge and program participant of Avenues to Independence, there is no place like home.

Amidei, having a developmental disability, was faced with a future of uncertainty after the death of his father in 1998. Because of his disability, he was no longer able to live alone in his boyhood home that he once shared with his father. With the intention of helping Amidei remain in his home, Amidei's brothers contacted Avenues to Independence, a local not-for-profit organization that Mark Amidei was a program participant of that supports adults with developmental disabilities. Together, Avenues and the Amideis worked to resolve the situation, offering Amidei the opportunity to continue living in familiar surroundings, in the community and among the neighbors he knew so well.

As a result of the agency's intervention, today, Mark Amidei shares his home in Park Ridge with two other men from Avenues. Around-the-clock caretakers provided by the agency assist the residents with daily living activities. Mark Amidei's situation is not unfamiliar to the thousands of adults with disabilities living at home with aging parents or family members. As a result of medical advancements, individuals with developmental disabilities such as mental retardation, cerebral palsy or Down Syndrome, who at one time were never expected to live beyond their twenties or thirties, are now entering their fifties and sixties. With this increase in life expectancy arises the issue of who will care for these adults once their parents or family members are no longer able to. With a handful of alternatives, like Avenues, to residing in state-run facilities, the future for those with developmental disabilities is precarious.

According to Joni Kraft, Avenues Social Services Director, over the next five years 85% of the 250 adults the agency serves will be fifty years of age or older. While more than half of the agency's program participants live outside of Avenues residential programs, housing remains a critical issue, with approximately 100 individuals on the organization's waiting list. The significance of the opening of the home in Park Ridge is that it not only benefited Mark Amidei by allowing him to remain in his home, but provided the opportunity for two other adults to live in a community supported setting.

While the social benefits of living in community residences are vast, financial benefits exist as well. According to Kraft, the annual cost to the state to provide housing for one individual at a state-run facility or institution averages approximately \$80,000. Conversely, for organizations such as Avenues which maintain private residences, the cost to state per individual averages less than half that, approximately \$37,000. Living in community settings allows able individuals the possibility of employment and encourages self-sufficiency and productive participation in the community and its economy. Many of the individuals who participate in Avenues residential and work programs are taxpaying citizens and recipients of employee benefits.

Avenues currently supports 83 adults in its residences throughout several northwestern Chicago communities, including Park Ridge, Niles, Wheeling, Des Plaines and Arlington Heights. In addition to providing housing, Avenues maintains work centers in Wheeling and Des Plaines where training and employment is available, in addition to community job placement services. Avenues continually works to insure program participants develop independent living skills and promotes their involvement in community activities.

For Mark Amidei, being able to remain in his home has provided him with a secure future and the opportunity to continue to be a productive member of society. Most importantly, he is able to live his life as independently as possible.

Niles Township founding member of new Community Energy Cooperative

Energy curtailment program could yield over \$1 million for local businesses. Last week, 30 Chicago area businesses reduced their electricity use for three hours, and have the potential to earn over \$1 million from Commonwealth Edison (ComEd) through an innovative new incentive program run by the Community Energy Cooperative.

The Community Energy Cooperative (Co-op) started in June, 2000 and is the first program in the country to address problems of peak demand and reliability using consumer-based strategies at a community level, rather than a utility-wide approach, and to work with mid-sized companies. "Reliability is a local issue, especially in geographical areas that have a history of outages," said Kathy Tholin, general manager of the Community Energy Cooperative.

"When your electricity goes out, so does your neighbors', and the power outages not only affect the quality of life in a community, but they impact safety, too." Co-op members agree to cut the amount of ComEd's electricity they use during peak times, such as hot summer days, and in turn ComEd compensates the Co-op for the reduction. The Co-op compensates its commercial and industrial members at the rate of \$100 per kilowatt of reduction per year. This curtailment was the first test for this new pilot program.

One member, Niles Township municipality, has the potential to earn \$80,000 for its participation. "When I first heard their pitch I thought they were trying to sell me the Brooklyn Bridge, but then I listened and realized that this makes a lot of sense," said Abe Selman, Village Manager for Niles Township. "The Co-op sent engineers over to meet with our public service people to identify strategies that we could use to reduce our energy loads, while maintaining our operational capacity. In addition to switching our biggest facilities off the ComEd grid and on to our own back-up generators, they suggested turning off lights, computers, and coffee makers and showed us ways to save money by raising the set points for our air conditioners. The latter are strategies we now employ daily to reduce energy costs."

Niles Township's two wastewater treatment plants, several pumping systems and the administration building all switched to back-up generators for the three hour curtailment period. "We first got the call from the Co-op at 11:45 a.m. and by 1 p.m. the curtailment plan was in effect. The Co-op installed a special meter and phone line so they can take continuous readings remotely and post them on a web site for monitoring. Our total cost is the ongoing cost of a phone line -- \$12 per month," said Selman. "This is a big win for the village."

Managing diabetes doesn't mean giving up all the foods that one enjoys eating and other activities one enjoys doing. It just means to prepare dishes with relevant dietary information and also learn proper health care ways that can help one take control of the disease before it takes control of him or herself.

The symptoms of diabetes often go unnoticed and therefore untreated. Elevated blood sugar levels can cause gradual damage to many parts of the body, perhaps for years, before an eventual diagnosis.

deliberately injuring or mutilating the body, pulling out hair, road rage, "freaking out" over minor stress, substance abuse and punching walls should never be ignored. Anyone talking about suicide, homicide, violence, hate, or death is also showing signs they may "snap" - particularly under stress.

"If you can spot the person be-

fore he/she cracks, you can help them dramatically and quickly with the right treatment," says Dr. Leland Heller, a Florida family physician, mental health expert, and author of the new book, "Biological Unhappiness" (Dyslimbia Press, 1999). His first book "Life at the Border" is on the recommended reading list at the National Institute of Mental Health.

Dr. Heller says some obvious signs are when a person says things like, "I don't want to live, there's no point to living, everyone seems to have it in for me, life has no purpose, I'm worthless, why bother trying, or others would be better off if I was dead."

"Going over the edge is usually

part of a treatable biologically based problem," explains Dr. Heller. "The trick is to recognize the problem before they snap. Many individuals have more than one diagnosis, and some combinations can be deadly."

Stress at work, home, and even at play is causing more reports of people "cracking" or mentally "breaking down," than ever before. The problem is leading to a staggering amount of murders, suicides, road rage, family abuse, drug abuse, unhappiness, and much more.

Dr. Heller has a free screening test online at <http://www.biologicalunhappiness.com>. The test helps determine if someone has any of a variety of disorders, from the Borderline Personality Disorder or Attention Deficit Disorder, to Bipolar Disorder or Panic Disorder, all of which are treatable biological conditions that can cause even a "good person" to lose control and commit a horrible tragedy.

"If we detect and handle the problems now, we can help keep many people from snapping," says Dr. Heller. "Most of the killing can be prevented and the suffering stopped."

Hot off the grill, new owner takes over Niles diner

If the smell of sausages sizzling on the grill doesn't give away your locale as you slide onto an available stool at the counter, it would be the sounds that would convince you that the Niles Grill, 8850 North Milwaukee Avenue, is one legitimate diner.

Hashbrowned potatoes crackle on the grill just on the other side of the counter. Plates clank together, followed by an occasional crash. And, more quietly,

the dishwasher's gentle hum tells of customers who have already eaten and been on their way.

Dressed in a clean white apron covering a white uniform shirt, owner Zig Balazhi is hard at work on this mid-week workday. On this day, just after the lunchtime crowd has mostly dispersed, several men sat singularly or with a dining companion at the counter or tables, savoring the last of their midday meals and reading newspapers. Amid it all, there's Ziggy,

as many here call him, making an omelet at the counter like an old friend.

Far from the quintessential greasy spoon, the Niles Grill offers good food, jolly banter for the regulars, a spotless environment and just a bit of the quirky ambience that often designates a diner.

Food here is always fresh and made to order, Balazhi points out, adding that there are no pre-cooked foods waiting to be

served. Breakfast, the premier of the diner's food, is served at any time. And Balazhi, who has been a cook for more than 20 years, personally serves up many of the menu's offerings.

Balazhi has been owner of the Niles Grill for only the last four months but he easily names all the regulars as he scans the restaurant during a rare break from activity. But then, Balazhi used to be one of the "regulars," too. That was before he decided to become

his own boss at the restaurant he used to visit.

The change-in-ownership came unexpectedly, Balazhi explained. While eating in a booth one day earlier this year, the restaurant's former owner told Balazhi that he was looking to sell the place. When Balazhi fantasized about how nice it would be to run the grill, his dining companion, a former boss and friend of many years, encouraged him to buy it. Two months after first hearing of the idea, Balazhi became the new owner of the Niles Grill.

Under his ownership, the menu has been expanded and the place has been spruced up. New blinds have been added and the walls repainted.

What hasn't changed is substantive, good food at reasonable prices. Balazhi kept all the staples — steak and eggs, omelets, pancakes and French toast — but he added some additional selections, including pork chops with eggs and waffles of various kinds. He kept the prices the same, too, with an average meal selling for about \$5.

"I get to meet a lot of people. We get a lot of families, business people, store people," Balazhi says with only a trace of an accent. "It's fun."

The restaurant, which is located just north of Dempster Street, is open from 5:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. daily.

Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Niles Residents,
The Niles Park District continues to offer quality programming while dealing with the rising concerns of any business. We face the same challenges as all businesses. A serious concern is the ability to hire the staff required to run an effective park district. The current robust economy presents the same problems to us as in the private sector.

People are hard to find and positions are a challenge to fill. Qualified aquatics people are becoming a major concern. The safety of our customers will not be compromised. We won't open our pools without the proper number of lifeguards and deck attendants. While other industries offer these young adults more pay we see summer park employees continue to decline.

As I look back on our summer season, I want to share with you some interesting information. The following summer information (from April 15-September 5) will give you a sense of how busy our summers are and how many summer employees are needed:

- * Over 6,500 customers registered for recreation programs.
- * Over 40,000 customers attended our pools.
- * Over 38,000 rounds of golf were played.
- * The following are the staff hours worked:

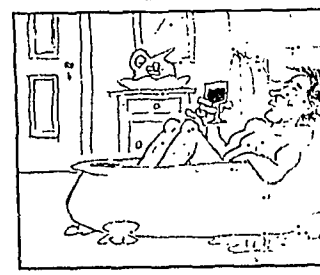

Our mayor claims that internet sales are cutting too deeply into local sales tax revenue to be ignored anymore, and has launched a public relations campaign to convince us not to buy over the internet (and presumably via catalogs which are also normally sales tax free), at least until local governments figure out a way to tax them. Then it will probably be okay again.

When common, ordinary folks lose their jobs (which usually includes their health insurance, etc.) to the changing times and new technology, they're told by the politicians that it's the normal evolution of the marketplace, and that they'll just have to change with the times. When the politicians lose just a small percentage of their income, for the very same reasons, it's not the normal evolution of the marketplace, no, it's a monster that has to be dealt with quickly and without debate.

I wonder if the mayor, and others who have joined his campaign to recoup sales tax

revenues have ever considered this: why would anyone want to shop via the internet instead of in the local marketplace? Maybe it's because they can only find exactly what they need via the internet. Or maybe it's because they've found better prices than those offered in their own home town. Or it could be that instead of fighting traffic and wasting gasoline, they've simply decided to "let their fingers do the walking" as an old Yellow Pages ad once suggested. Whatever the reason, or combination of reasons, it's not anything nefarious, it's practically and it's the normal evolution of the marketplace.

If in our travels to other towns, or (heaven forbid), another state, we buy things there and bring them back home to use, are we someday going to be subject to a "use" tax as well? It impacts the Niles sales tax revenue base in the very same way doesn't it? Is the mayor asking us to only shop in Niles, otherwise we're somehow being disloyal to Niles and its merchants? As John Stossel would say, "Give me a break!"

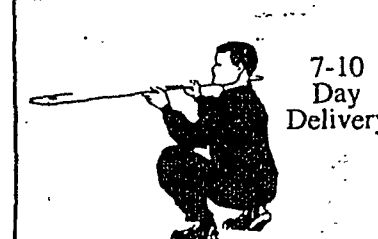

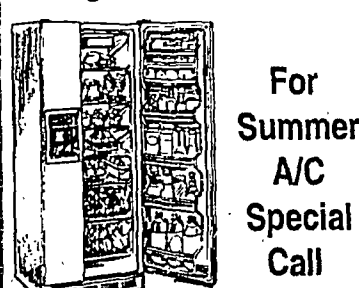

years ago - went back to his home briefly and then returned where he lived with his wife and children in Morton Grove.

The Arvanti's story is a familiar one. The sons came first, emigrating to the United States in the mid-50's and early 60's. Eighteen year old George came first, becoming a waiter at Chicago's Drake Hotel. Five years later his brother, Tom, followed, becoming a cook in another downtown Chicago restaurant. In 1971 Peter joined his children who were then owners of their own restaurant at Oakton Street and Waukegan Road in Niles.

We remember Peter working at the salad bar at the front of the restaurant. A proud smiling man, Peter spoke little English and yet greeted the customers, remembering all their names. After the greeting he would share time with them, somehow overcoming the language barrier. He carried the Zorba qualities of the ancient Greeks, a man of zest and joy.

In Peter's younger days he was a soldier who guarded the Greek royal family and was part of the honor guard at the memorial of the unknown soldier.

At Peter's funeral four priests and a bishop presided. The townspeople were there to honor a good man whose hard work ethic was rooted in the farmlands of Nestand. He was buried alongside his wife of 60 years.

The Arvanti-Arvey story is a success story which has been repeated by many immigrant families. But the hard work that led to their success as restaurant entrepreneurs was handed down from the father to the sons. From working the farmland south of Athens to creating the restaurant in Niles manifested the harmony and individual achievement that were gifts handed down from Ancient Greece.

Peter was a warm and loving man whose 17 grandchildren and great grandchildren would sit at his feet while he sang Greek folksongs which told of bygone days. It was that other world in another time which Peter was handing down to the next generations—the ethic of hard work and the zest for life and the pursuit of individual achievement—which is the legacy of Peter Arvanti as well as the legacy of Ancient Greece.

white male, in his 20s and approximately 5 foot, 7 inches tall.

The man apparently entered the store and looked around for about 20 minutes before asking a clerk where the cat nips were located. After being shown the item, the man came to the check-out counter and placed his items on the counter, according to police reports. He then revealed a black, semi-automatic handgun, pointed it at the manager behind the counter and said, "This is a stick-up." He told the manager not to call anyone or he would shoot, police said.

The man then reportedly ordered the two employees at the front counter, as well as three other

people who were in the store, into a back closet and told them all to remain quiet. He took the manager to the front of the store where he ordered her to open the safe.

After bringing the manager back to the closet, the gunman ordered the one male customer into a separate closet and told the five prisoners to strip to their underwear. Before leaving, the gunman instructed the five to wait 20 minutes before leaving the closets or, he warned, they would be shot.

After a short time of waiting, the five were able to safely find their clothes on a shelf in the store and call police. There were no injuries in the robbery.

standardized at one week: for feature and popular films, non-fiction and DVDs. The intent is to provide a convenience so that patrons who plan weekly trips to the library will benefit from consistent loan periods on all audiovisual products.

The amended policy allows loaning DVDs to non-Niles library cardholders at a fee of \$1.00 per title.

The limit on the number of allowable items per checkout is raised to four each in feature films and nonfiction video categories, plus one DVD.
