**Morton Grove man charged in school threat**  
 Patrick Moon, 23, of Morton Grove, was charged with disorderly conduct after he admitted making a threatening call to the Springman School. "You have six minutes to evacuate the building," Moon reportedly told a school secretary on Sept. 5, and then hung up. The school was immediately emptied, but the threat turned out to be unfounded.

Police tracked down Moon using a system from Ameritech Corporate Security which surveys telephone numbers of calls made to the school. Moon returned a message left by an officer, saying that he called the school to reach an employee. However, an additional comment by Moon stating that he feared he

Early one evening, the Christians, a pediatric therapy family, were leaving the Victor Yackman Children's Pavilion of Advocate Lutheran General Hospital when they discovered that their wheelchair lift was broken. They already had the children in

the van, two of whom are wheelchair-bound. Much to their dismay, the wheelchair lift would not return to the proper position to close the door and they could not leave.

To make matters worse, there was no one they could call for ser-

vice at that hour.

One of the hospital's maintenance associates, Rickey Leska, came and worked on the equipment while Beth Reckord, speech pathologist, and Patricia Nootbaar, physical therapist, stayed with the family until 10:30 p.m.

Rick was able to take the lift apart so they could drive home. He was working second shift at the time, but also was busy with a water shutdown in the hospital. As for the therapists, they usually went home by 6:30 p.m.

This family lives nearly 50 miles away in Montgomery, Illinois, and travels to Lutheran General Hospital once a week for physical therapy for two of their sons. The mother, Amelia Christian, was not only impressed by Rickey's patience at trying to do the impossible to fix the lift, but also by the concern of Beth and Patricia. Both stayed on past their shift in the event that Amelia and her family needed a ride home. They even worked out the driving logistics.

What was a very stressful and frustrating incident for this family was made easier by the compassion of Beth, Patricia and Rickey. While Amelia was deeply moved by the act of kindness on their part, she was not surprised. After all, she says that the people at Lutheran General Hospital are the reason she drives all those miles each week to seek treatment for her sons. She could go somewhere a lot closer to home, but has made some really good friends here in Park Ridge.

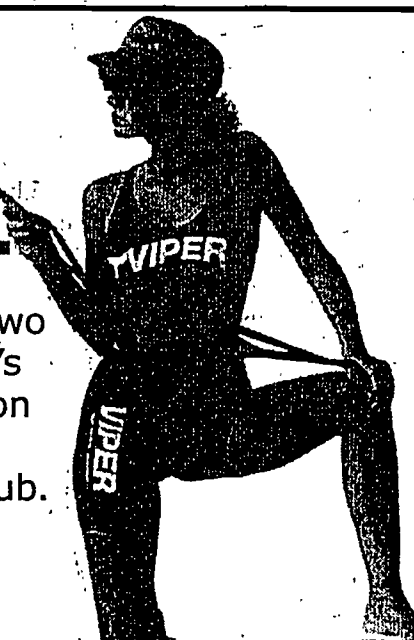

## Laparoscopic techniques used for kidney procedures

Surgeons at Resurrection Medical Center, 7435 West Talcott Avenue, are now using laparoscopic techniques for kidney removal and other urological procedures. James P. Brown, M.D., a urologist, and Gregory Pulawski, M.D., a general surgeon at Resurrection, recently performed the first laparoscopic nephrectomy (kidney removal) in the north-west Chicago area.

"Today, we can offer patients with kidney, ureter, bladder or adrenal gland problems minimally invasive surgery with the same benefits gallbladder patients have enjoyed for the last decade," Dr. Brown said. Patients undergoing laparoscopic procedures experience less postoperative discomfort, shorter hospital stay, briefer convalescence and better cosmetic results.

Dr. Brown learned the laparoscopic

kidney procedure as a resident at Loyola University Medical Center from the Washington University surgeon who helped to develop the technique. He teamed up with Dr. Pulawski, a pioneer in advanced minimally invasive surgery, to use the new techniques for urological procedures. After using laparoscopic procedures for removal of an adrenal gland and other urological procedures, Dr. Brown and Dr. Pulawski became the first in the area to use this technology for a kidney removal outside a university hospital setting.

The laparoscopic technology allows a kidney to be removed through five small incisions rather than the lengthy incision across the flank in traditional surgery. Surgeons use sophisticated instruments to break the kidney into pieces gathered into a sack for easy removal.

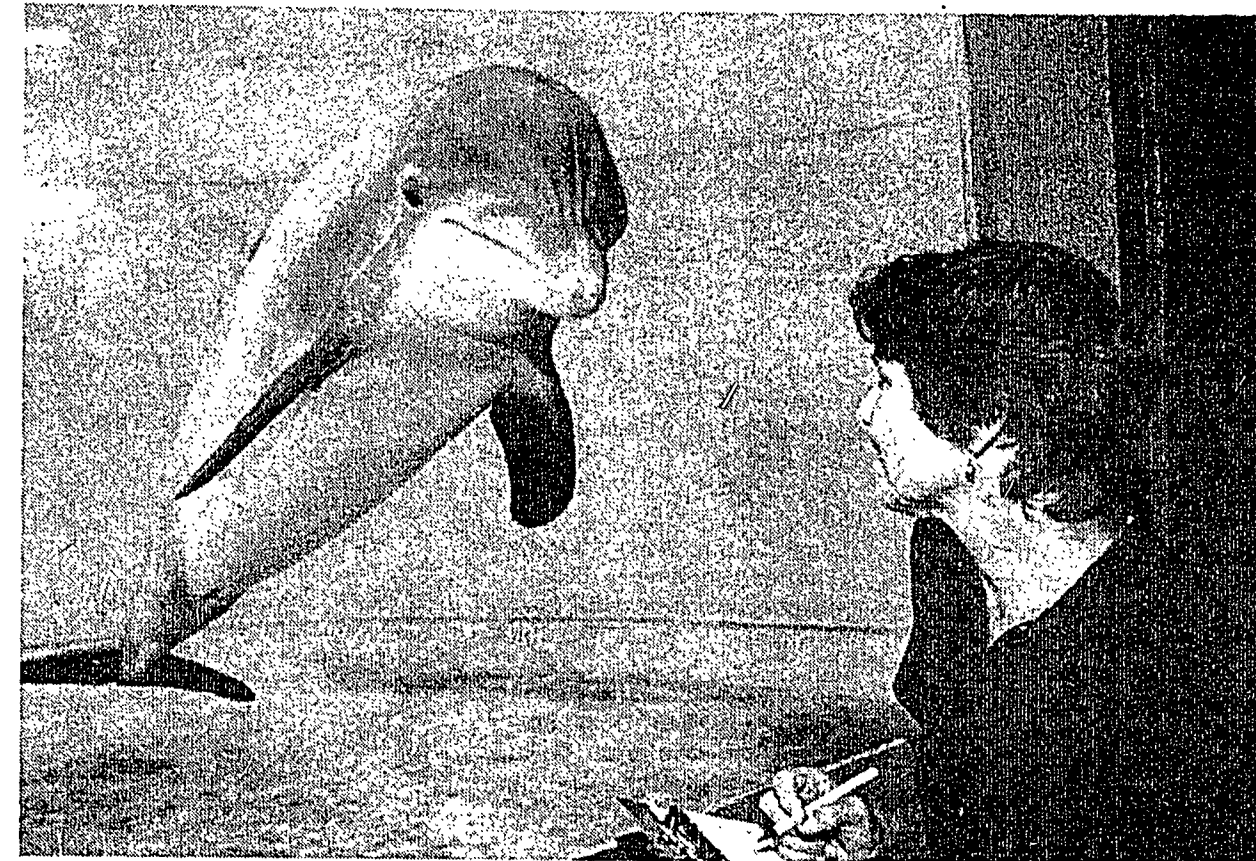

## Heart disease begins at a young age

Although symptoms of heart disease may now show up until a person is middle-aged or older, a new study presented today at the American Heart Association Scientific Sessions finds heart disease actually begins developing in childhood.

The study of transplant hearts from teenage donors found that one in six of them had significant blockages, or plaque, in at least one coronary artery, a blood vessel that feeds blood to the heart.

These findings support American Heart Association recommendations that heart disease and

stroke prevention should begin early in childhood - before smoking, bad dietary habits, and other causes of heart disease and stroke, such as high blood pressure, physical inactivity, obesity and diabetes, become established, says the senior author of the study, E. Murat Tuzcu, M.D., director of the Intravascular Ultrasound Laboratory, at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation, Cleveland, Ohio.

Although evidence of early atherosclerosis has been seen in autopsy studies of young people killed in accidents or by other non-disease related causes, no previous study ever took such a close look into living hearts from apparently disease-free young people. Atherosclerosis occurs when fatty substances, such as cholesterol, or other materials deposit along the inner lining of an artery. These deposits can build up, leading to blockages that restrict the flow of blood in the arteries and can cause a heart attack.

"In this particular study, the focus was not the factors that lead to disease in children," says Tuzcu. "However, these findings should raise the public's awareness that heart disease is not just a disease of the elderly. It is a disease of both young and old. Aggressive heart disease prevention should

begin in childhood, when it's easier to establish healthy habits and correct harmful ones, before the damage begins."

The unique study used ultrasound to look at the arteries of recently-transplanted hearts. By placing a miniature ultrasound device on a tube and building it to the heart via an artery in the transplant patient's leg, the researchers were able to use sound waves to image the heart arteries.

The study examined the heart arteries of 181 heart transplant recipients two to six weeks following transplantation. The donor hearts were from people who were free of known heart disease. Nevertheless, the researchers saw well-developed atherosclerosis in the arteries of hearts from donors in all age groups - including teenagers.

"This study of individuals with no known heart disease demonstrates that heart disease begins at a very young age and well-developed plaque deposits are present in one in six teenagers," says the researcher.

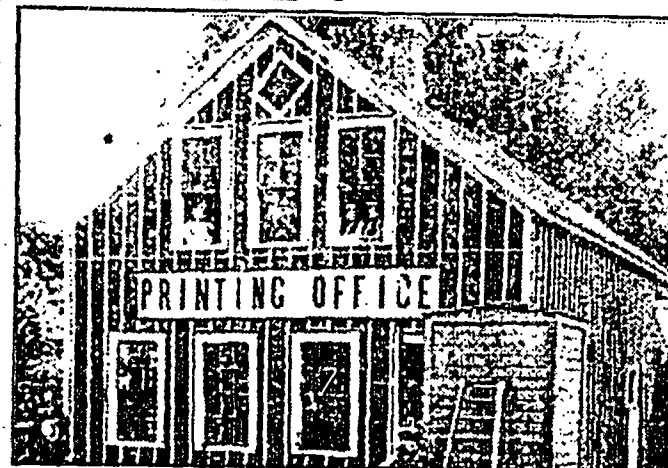

# Happy 150th Birthday Maine Township!

## Supervisor's Statement

By Supervisor Mark Thompson

The year 2000 marks the 150th Anniversary of Maine Township. On April 2, 1850, local residents met in a town meeting moderated by Socrates Rand and voted to establish Maine Township. The township was the original local government for this community. It laid out public roads and built bridges over the Des Plaines River, provided for the needy, and promoted public safety with the election of a constable and justice of the peace. One of the greatest concerns of the day was wandering livestock.

We have come a long way these past 150 years from a small rural community of a few hundred people to one of the largest urban townships in the United States with a statewide and national reputation. We have a heritage of which we can be proud and a legacy to uphold in the years ahead.

The township remains financially sound. However, the township is now feeling the full effects of the real estate caps enacted by the state. The tax caps have a tremendous impact on townships because real estate taxes are the only source of tax revenue for townships. Accordingly, we can expect little revenue growth in the coming years. As a result, the township has already become and will continue to be more aggressive in seeking out and applying for new grants.

After many years of hard work and countless meetings, it finally appears that work to alleviate flooding along Prairie-Farmer Creek may occur. State Representative Rosemary Mulligan secured a \$700,000 grant for Maine Township and the City of Des Plaines for a joint clean-up project of the creek. She also freed up an additional \$500,000 that had been obtained by the late Senator Mary Butler but had been tied up by the state to add to the total, making \$1.2 million available. The state has given preliminary approval to our plans, and we hope to start work this year. The work will not eliminate flooding but will certainly make conditions much better. It is an important first step. It is also notable to have this degree of cooperation between a city and a township for a project of this size.

In addition, Representative Mulligan obtained a \$50,000 grant for improvements to the Youth Drop-In Center. State Senator Dave Sullivan secured a \$100,000 grant for equipment upgrades for the Emergency Management Agency. We express our appreciation to Representative Mulligan and Senator Sullivan for their efforts on the township's behalf.

Of all the township's services, I see the greatest demand for increases in youth services. With a number of well-publicized cases of school violence, national attention has focused on our youth and that is no different here. The township presently has an active youth services department in MaineStay, but we should expect that we will need to do more. We have been exploring ways to increase program and service cooperation between the township and our local schools.

The township is also facing increased demand for services for the adult-disabled -- from transportation to social services for recreational and social activities. To this end, the Disabled Services Department has added a number of new programs this past year.

The township will continue to push for legislation in Springfield to enhance the authority of the township to deal with modern day urban problems in the unincorporated area.

This past year Maine Township lost two great friends, Jim Reilly and Paul Jung. Jim Reilly served as a Trustee and remained active with the township in the years after his retirement from the board. Des Plaines Mayor Paul Jung was my partner in negotiations with the state regarding Prairie-Farmer Creek. He also was a great promoter of city-township cooperation and actively supported and participated in many of our programs. Mayor Jung served as Moderator at last year's Annual Town Meeting. Both gave so much to us all, and we miss them very much.

This past month we also lost the Reverend David Lasser with whom we worked through the Ministerial Association and the Holiday Food Basket program. His contributions to the community will also be missed. Once again I express the thanks of Maine Township to the many community social service agencies with which the township works. Their work and dedication are outstanding and make a major contribution to our community.

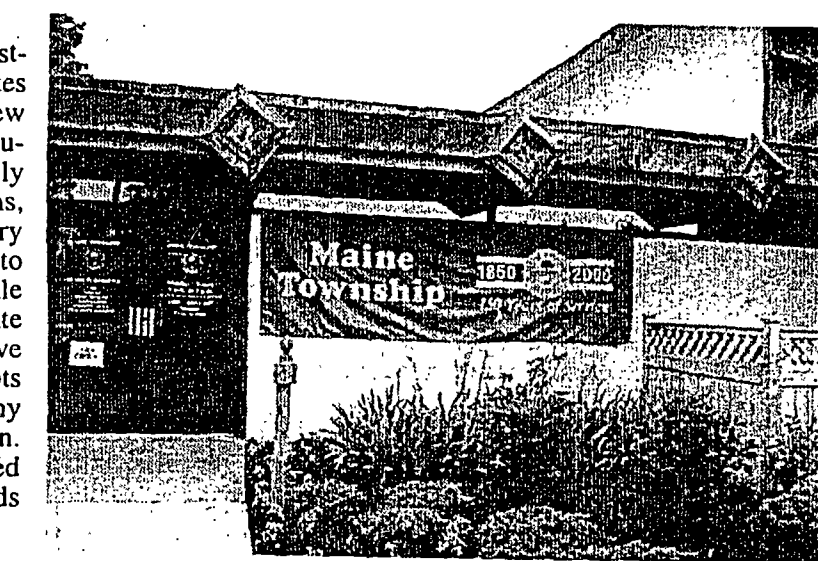

## Special banner greets visitors

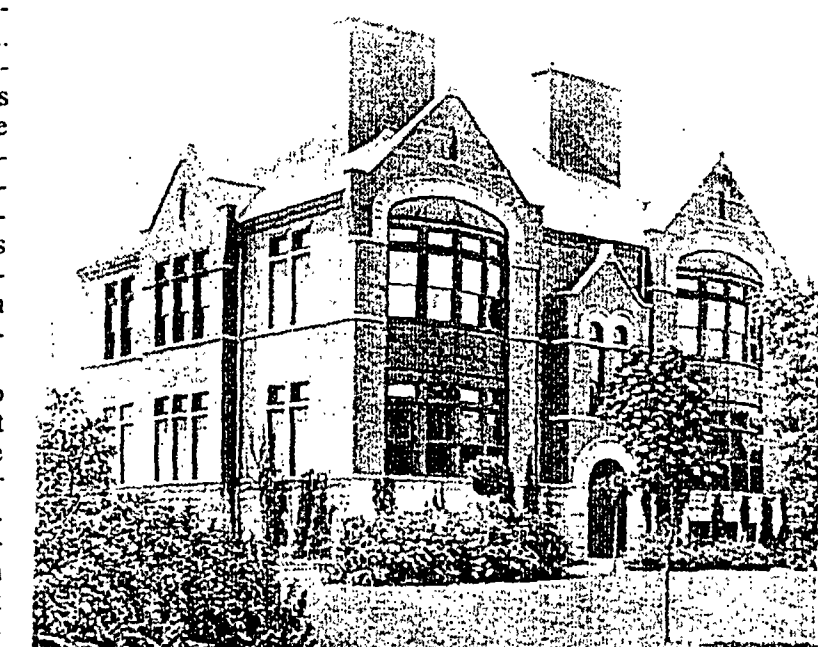

## Emergency Management

The Maine Township Emergency Management Agency (EMA) has become a leader in Northern Cook County in inter-governmental cooperation. Agreements between the township and Morton Grove, Des Plaines and Mount Prospect have improved training, communications and planning for all jurisdictions. EMA members have participated in training for hazardous material response, weather spotting and communications (ham radio) with members of neighboring agencies.

EMA this year continued to plan with various government and private agencies to improve response if a major emergency or disaster should strike the area. The township Emergency Operations Center (EOC) has been equipped with an independent phone system to allow communications during emergencies.

## Access To Care

The General Assistance Department is an intake site for the Suburban Primary Health Care Council - Access to Care program. This program serves residents who either are not insured through their workplaces or have high insurance deductibles they cannot afford to pay. Access to Care provides health services such as office visits to participating physicians, and routine laboratory, x-ray and pharmacy services. Applicants are accepted on the basis of their service area, family income, high insurance deductible and ineligibility for such public programs as Medicaid and Medicare.

## About Rainbow Hospice

Rainbow Hospice is a 19 year old community-based, not-for-profit comprehensive hospice incorporated in 1986.

Mission: Rainbow Hospice enables people to live with dignity and hope while coping with loss and the end of life.

Affiliation: Rainbow Hospice is affiliated with Advocate Health Care and Resurrection Health Care.

Service Area: Rainbow Hospice is licensed to serve in Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry and Will counties. Rainbow's primary service area is Chicago and the surrounding suburbs.

Licenses and Certification: Rainbow Hospice is licensed as a full hospice by the State of Illinois and is certified by Medicare and Medicaid. It is also licensed and certified as a home care agency. Rainbow Hospice was accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations in 1998.

Hospice Services: Rainbow Staff of more than 50 employees and 200 volunteers provides a comprehensive range of services for patients with life-limiting illnesses and their families. These include: consultation with the hospice medical director; nursing visits for pain and symptom management; home health aide visits; psychosocial services, including therapeutic and supportive counseling; spiritual counseling; physical, occupational, and speech therapy; volunteer assistance; bereavement services; respite care; continuous care; admission to inpatient hospice beds for symptom management; medications; and supplies. All of these services and supplies are for conditions related to the terminal diagnosis.

Home Care Services: Rainbow Home Care provides an alternative type of care for people who do not wish or qualify for enrollment in hospice care. Rainbow Home Care provides specially focused palliative care services to people with life-limiting illnesses who have the desire to be at home. Because Rainbow Home Care is a division of Rainbow Hospice, Inc., there are other special services

available beyond traditional home care, including pastoral care support, volunteer support services and bereavement programs.

Patients and Days of Care: With an annual operating budget of over \$4 million, Rainbow provides hospice services to nearly 1000 patients and 5000 bereavement clients each year. Rainbow's average daily census is 80 patients; 95% are hospice patients and 1% are home care patients. The average length of stay in the hospice program is 29 days.

Referral, Admission, and On-Call Hours: Rainbow Hospice accepts referrals and admissions seven days a week, including weekends and evenings. Rainbow Hospice provides 24-hour coverage for patient care emergencies.

Counseling Program: This special program provides short-term psychosocial support to seriously ill patients and their families who do not meet criteria for hospice. It can serve as a transition to hospice and is offered as a service to the community.

Sites of Service: Rainbow Hospice promotes self-determined life closure for its patients. Eighty-five percent of patients are cared for in their own homes. Rainbow Hospice has contracts with more than 30 long term care facilities to provide hospice care to their residents. If inpatient care is needed, Rainbow has designated beds at Holy Family Medical Center, Lutheran General Hospital, Northwest Community Hospital, Resurrection Medical Center, Our Lady of the Resurrection Medical Center, St. Francis Hospital and Westlake Community Hospital.

Special Bereavement Program: One of Rainbow Hospices finest programs is its Center for Loss and Life Passages which provides grief support to hospice families, as well as to bereaved persons in the community. The Center offers special bereavement support to widows through its Widowed Persons Services, and to children and families through its Good Mourning Pro-

gram. Additional bereavement services include interfaith memorial services, community education and clinical consultation. For example, the Center sponsors an annual "Grief and the Holidays" workshop and co-hosts the Hospice Foundation of America's Annual National Bereavement Teleconference. The Creative Reuse Warehouse is a not-for-profit project of the Resource Center, located at 721 West O'Brian Street in Chicago.

"Our goal is to lessen the load on the landfills," said Ken Dunn, Director of the Creative Reuse Warehouse.

Mr. Dunn continued, "The Creative Reuse Warehouse is set up like a store. Most of our clients are teachers and artists who recycle and haul products that can be used and reused."

The Creative Reuse Center is seeking automotive fluids (anti-freeze, oils and windshield cleaner), cleaning products, glues,

paints and similar items typically collected at an event of this type.

"The Creative Reuse Center is a great cause," said Commissioner Kathleen Therese Meany, Vice President of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District. "In fact, this makes the whole Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Day doubly worthwhile."

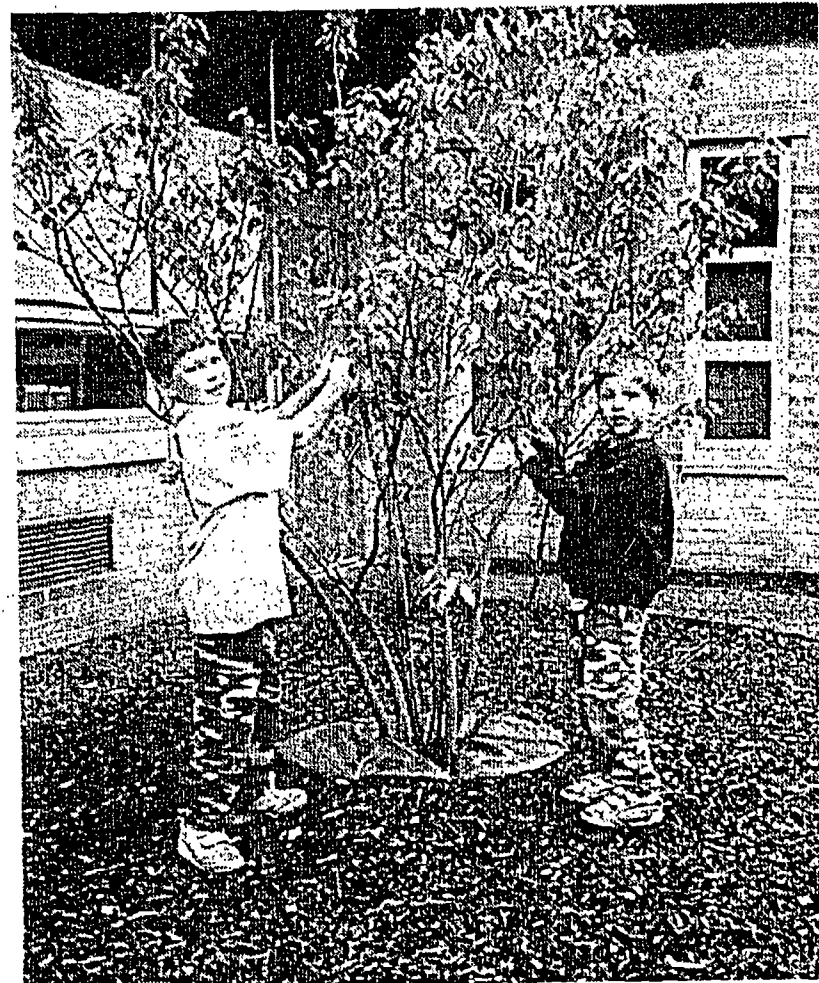

## Free prescription medicine available to those who qualify

Are you one of the financially challenged individuals who is choosing daily between buying food or prescription medication? If so, a new service from the Patient Assistance Network in Washington D.C. may help.

The Patient Assistance Network helps people to apply for enrollment in one or more of the many patient assistance programs now available. This process is accomplished with the cooperation of the applicant's physician. The majority of these programs provides prescription medication free of charge to individuals in need regardless of age, if they meet the sponsor's criteria.

Some of the primary requirements for the applicant to qualify are as follows:

- The applicant does not have insurance coverage for outpatient prescription drugs.
- The applicant's income is at a level which causes a hardship when the patient is required to

purchase the medication at retail.

• The applicant does not qualify for a government or third party program which provides for prescription medications.

"Many drug manufacturers have patient assistance programs that provide free or low cost medication for qualified individuals, but they rarely, if ever publicize the programs," says Paul Richard, a volunteer staff member at the organization. "The majority of our applicants are individuals living on retirement income, welfare checks, disability or are among the working low to middle income. Most of our clients have too much income to qualify for government assistance with their medication but not enough to purchase private prescription drug insurance coverage."

The objectives of the Patient Assistance Network are:

- Inform the potentially qualified applicants.
- Simplify the application process.

"Our goal is to lessen the load on the landfills," said Ken Dunn, Director of the Creative Reuse Warehouse.

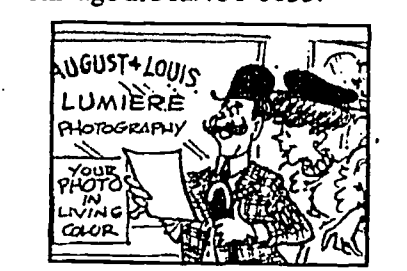

Patient Assistance Network is an organization established by volunteers dedicated to assisting individuals of all ages who are regularly required to take prescription medication, but lack adequate income to fill their prescriptions each month. The Patient Assistance Network seeks to aid those who have exhausted all other sources for help with medication. The primary purposes of the Patient Assistance Network are to inform potentially qualified applicants about the patient assistance programs for which they appear eligible and assist them in the enrollment process.

limits established by his or her particular sponsor. The household income limit requirement varies with each manufacturer.

Decisions concerning which medications are provided free of charge and which individuals are accepted into the program are made solely by the various program sponsors. Each manufacturer has established specific criteria to determine an applicant's eligibility. Examples listed in a sponsor's recent report outlining sponsor's criteria for approval and enrollment relate that individuals with family incomes ranging from below the national poverty level up to \$50,000 dollars annually can qualify. Those qualifying at the highest income are generally patients requiring very expensive drugs.

The funds necessary to support the Patient Assistance Program and distribute these prescription drug information packets are provided by the \$5 processing fee contributed by the applicants.

The Patient Assistance Network guarantees full processing fee refund upon written request to any applicant who is determined to be ineligible for assistance by all applicable manufacturer assistance programs and therefore receives no medications. Although the Patient Assistance Network can not guarantee your approval, if the patient believes that they may qualify to participate, the Patient Assistance Network will be diligent in their efforts to assist the patient.

To be accepted into a patient assistance program, the applicant's income must fall within the

## Culver removes asbestos from locker-room

Recent renovation at Culver School, turned up asbestos in older pipe joints, and it has been removed, said Superintendent Eugene Zaleski.

The asbestos was discovered when the ceiling of the 2,400-square-foot locker-room was removed for the project.

Zaleski added that asbestos was discovered four years ago during a major renovation, so this was not unexpected.

Asbestos was removed in 16 of 20 pipes at a cost to the district of \$15,000 to \$20,000, Zaleski said.

The work was done after the children had left the building for the day.

A spokeswoman for the Illinois Department of Public Health confirmed that the school district worked with a licensed contractor in removing the material, adding, "The school is doing everything accurately, and there are no problems."

Following the asbestos removal, the locker-room renovation can be accomplished by the middle of November, Zaleski said.
