School logo change to cost taxpayers \$250,000

The use of an American Indian tive to the idea, cost concerns \$250,000 to remove the school's Americans, but if the attitude at Niles West High School is any indication, the derision for such symbols is becoming mainstreamed.

At last month's meeting of the Niles Township District 219 board, students and board members discussed abolishing the high school's almost 50-year-old Indian mascot and logo.

One of the greatest concerns of the day was wandering livestock.

We have come a long way these past 150 years from a small rural community of a few hundred people to one of the largest urban townships in the United States with a statewide and national reputation. We have a heritage of which we can be proud and a legacy to uphold in the years ahead.
